Local coat drive to help needy kids this weekend

Local kids in need of a coat have the opportunity to get a free one this weekend thanks to the local Knights of Columbus of St. Edwards in Cassville. One of the local knights, Jim Brasel, set out to make the dream a reality about a month ago and even in the short amount of time, he's had success.

The idea came from the Knights of Columbus Coats for Kids program. Brasel said, "We had a knight from Springfield come and talk to us and coats for kids subject came up. It struck a strong note with me. I have a passion for children who can't help themselves.

"I decided to take this issue on and see what I could do with it."

First off, Brasel contacted area schools to see if they had a way to identify children in need and let them know about the coat drive. Cassville, Exeter, Purdy, Southwest and Wheaton all referred families for the program.

Brasel also contacted Head Start, OACAC and the local police department to let families know who might need the

He said, "When I contacted Head Start and OACAC, they were having a used coat sale. They were so thrilled it was going to happen. OACAC put a flier out to all of their families."

All of the coats that will be handed out to kids this Saturday will be brand new and the child's individual size. The Knights of Columbus already purchased the coats and Brasel sought community help to pay for them.

He said, "I went into the community to see if I could get financial aid for some of the cost of these coats. The Knights bought the coats, and we are looking for partners to work with us to help offset that cost."

So far, Brasel has 33 businesses who chipped in to help pay for the coats. The group is still accepting donations of any amount to help offset the cost.

"We are prepared with 400 coats, and if we have more kids than we have coats, in seven days, we'll have coats on the rest of the kids who have asked for them. We'll take names, addresses and coat sizes and they'll be delivered to the schools," Brassel said.

He continued, "It is my desire that no child that I can reach will go without a coat."

Coats will be handed out this Saturday. Brasel said, "We have very strict rules for who gets a coat, if you're a parent and you have a child and they need a coat, you qualify.

"Anybody who shows up with a child and needs a coat, we'll put a coat on that child."

YOUR AD REACHES 13,200 MAILBOXES IN BARRY COUNTY EACH WEEK

For many, November 24 was simply the Saturday after Thanksgiving. For the Hmong community, however, it was the mark of the Hmong New Year, a day of food, music, craft and celebration of the fruitfulness of the past year. In Barry County, the Southwest Missouri Hmong Association partnered with the town of Wheaton to help bring the celebration to Missouri for the fourteenth year in a row.

"Part of the mission of the Southwest Missouri Hmong Association is to preserve and promote the Hmong traditions, heritage, arts and cultural unity," said Kelly Lee, secretary for the Association. "I strongly feel it is important for us to do this for our children and future generations and there was no better way to do this than get involved and be a part of the organization."

The Hmong are a nomadic tribe with origins starting in the mountains of Laos, China, and Thailand, with many immigrating to the US in the 1970's after the fallout of the Vietnam war. Although the Hmong people don't have a country of their own, they

She became involved the ministry called Dress A Girl Around the World. The campaign is aimed at bringing dignity to girls and women around the world, according to its mission statement.

Dress A Girl volunteers take dress shirts and cuts and sews them into new dresses. The dresses are then handed out my missionaries all over the world to girls in need.

Cavness said, "We spent the first year at Tropic Winds, and they had a work day and I ended up attending the work days and organizational meetings. They had 12 different stations set up, and

Christmas parades to march this weekend

With Thanksgiving in the past and Christmas fast approaching on the horizon, the county is wrapped up in the holiday spirit. The first big events of any holiday season, the Christmas parades will be starting soon, rockette-ing the holiday spirit through the town with them.

Washburn's parade will kick off the season at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, December 1. They will be followed that same day by Exeter at 1:30 p.m., and Cassville at 6 p.m.

The Washburn parade will travel down Main Street in Washburn. The event will be sponsored by the Washburn Chamber of Com-

"Bands, floats, horses, tricycles, horses, Santa Claus and even walkers (the living kind) will be at our Christmas parade," said Cheryl Floyd of the Washburn Area Chamber of Commerce. "We have six trophies to be given out to six lucky participants."

The theme for the Exeter parade will be the Land of Misfit Toys, with many of the floats drawing inspiration from the Rankin and Bass Christmas classic of the same name.

The Cassville Parade, hosted by the Cassville Chamber of Commerce, will be giving the judging of it's Christmas floats up to the kids this year. Their grand prize, the Kid's Choice award, will be \$1,000. Entries in to the parade are asked to be at Cassville High school by 4 p.m.

"The parade begins at 6 p.m. at the Cassville High School parking lot," said Cassville Chamber of Commerce Director Rachael Freeman. "Those participating in the parade are asked to start lining up at 4 p.m. The parade will go along Main Street in Cassville and will end after the Pizza Hut/Casey's area. Parade entries are asked to turn left onto Clover Street, just past Casey's, and use Sale Barn Road to get where they need

to go when they are done with the parade."

"We will have over 60 entries in this year's Christmas Parade. We are excited to see what the creative minds of our community come up with this year," said Freeman. "I've had the opportunity to get a sneak peak at some of the floats this year and viewers won't be disappointed."

The Seligman Parade will be at 2 p.m. on December 8. Entries in the parade are expected to be at the corner of Highway 37 and Business 37 by 1 p.m. for lineup. Parade officials have asked for three things from those expecting to enter the parade: nothing loud near the band, horses at the very end of the parade line, and no santas, save for the one and only.

Gift cards and trophies will be handed out to first and second place winners of the following divisions: religious floats, non-religious floats, best marching unit, best motorcycle or off-road unit, best animal unit, and first place awards of \$50 and \$25 dollars will be given to the winner of best antique vehicle and best non-antique vehicle, respectively.

The parade will run from the north end of town, at the corner of 37 Highway and Business 37 to the community center on the corner of South Main Street and Joan Avenue. Santa will be at the community center after the parade where he will be greeting children and handing out treats. The winners of the float contest as well as the Christmas take home dinner and the annual lighting contest will be announced at the community center after the votes are tallied.

Wheaton's Christmas parade will be at 6 p.m. on Saturday, December 8. The lineup for the event will be at Body of Christ at 5 p.m. The city will also be visited by Santa who will be available for pictures from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. and then again after the parade. Participating children will receive a free picture and

you work on these dresses. At the end of three months working on them, we had over 200 dresses made."

The original goal for the Tropic Winds group was 25 dresses.

Cavness said, "A few weeks later, I received pictures through an email with pictures of these girls with dresses on. It really made it full circle and hit home. When you see that dress that you helped make and cut and sew, and you see it on these girls in these poverty-stricken areas, it makes a huge impact.

"At this point, I told my husband that when we got home I wanted to ask our pastor if I could use our church's Facebook to get information out to our church family."

The Cavnesses are members of Emmanuel Baptist Church, and she said their pastor was enthusiastic about the project and fully supportive.

Cavness said surpassing that goal and seeing how the program worked really inspired her to share the mission locally.

"I talked to our congregation and put out a Facebook message. I think it was shared around 60 times. It went all over the United States, and more people wanted to know about it and be a part of it and help."

Now, there is a Dress A Girl Southwest Missouri Facebook page where Cavness provides updates and puts out information for those wanting to help. To date, she has collected 350 dresses locally to take down to Texas for work days.

She said, "My goal was, if I could collect one shirt, that is one little girl that will get a dress and hopefully change their destiny in life for the better. My goal then was 25."

Twenty-five was a small goal compared to how many people stepped up to help. She said, "We organized our own work day here in which we cut out pockets and ruffles and shirt pieces, and when it's all said and done, as of today, we have almost 350 shirts now that I'll be taking down to Texas when we go."

Cavness continued, "There is no other explanation of this ministry other than God has

his hand all over it. I can't explain some of the things that have happened. I was worried about how we would be getting nearly 350 shirts down there, and then another friend just left a few days ago and took a big load. Joe and I will take the rest. God has brought me to this, he isn't going to leave me hanging with a problem now."

Cavness said her church has stepped up, but even members of the community had came to her aid any time she thinks there would be a problem. When she worried about covering shipping costs to the missionaries, someone donated \$100. No matter the need, it seems to be filled before she asks.

She said, "Every time a problem comes up, something happens and comes up."

She also said that her husband's support has been integral in keeping the program going locally and supporting her.

Cavness said she didn't expect how much the program has taken off or how many people would see the value. She said, "The mission statement is simple: It's pretty simple. Every girl deserves a dress. They want girls to know they are worthy of respect and they are loved by God."

Cavness added that missionaries have reported that the patch sewn to the outside of the dresses also have come to serve as a warning sign for potential predators who would harm the girls. She said, "Every shirt has the Dress a Girl patch that is sewn onto the front pocket of the dress. It really wasn't the intention at the very beginning, but the village pastor say the patch indicates to wouldbe predators that these girls are under the protection of an organization and prayer and keeps these crazies away from these little girls.

"That's been a huge thing with the dresses, it's helped with trafficking. Some of these girls live in the low of the low and are around all kinds of predators and these dresses not only raise their dignity as how they are viewed by others but as a shield of protection, as well."

Cavness is still accepting shirts to take to Texas to be turned into dresses and handed out to missionaries. Shirts must be men's 100 percent cotton or close to 100 percent cotton button up dress shirts, preferably not white. Shirts should be in good condition with no stains or rips in the main part of the shirt. Long- and short-sleeved shirts are accepted. Donations should be made before Christmas to be included in this load to be taken to Texas.

To make a donation, Cavness said, "Like the Facebook page. Emmanuel Baptist is the drop off place. There is a tub in the foyer of the church. If it's locked, just ring the doorbell. Liking the Facebook page and messaging me is the quickest way. I'm very responsive to those messages, and I'd be glad to pick them up."

November marked another addition to the expanding healthcare options for the Purdy community. Purdy Eyes Optometry joined Purdy Health Clinic on Washington Street in the Barry County town. Dr. Johnny Bowman, O.D., opened the clinic doors earlier this month and is seeing patients currently.

Dr. Bowman comes to the area after operating a successful Arkansas optometry practice for over 30 years. "I had an opportunity to continue my career here after a 30-year career in Arkansas. I sold my business down there," he said.

He said he chose the area because he has familial ties here. He said, "I'm actually coming back home in a way.

I graduated from high school at Aurora and lived in Wheaton when I was a boy. Both of my parents went to school at Purdy and graduated at Purdy. Of all of my relatives, most live in this area."

Moving to the area was a calculated choice, but also one that Dr. Bowman and his family believe was destined. He said, "A big part of this is a lot of things. There were so many things that had to fall in place and had to happen for us to get here and all of them did. We had property to sell and a business to sell.

"We are Christians and try to live that out. I've never been one to challenge God or ask him for a sign, but I do think his hand was in this. Everything just worked out to where we could come here. That has been a big thing on our hearts during this whole thing."

Purdy Eyes will provide a local option for anyone wanting to have a check up on their eye health, and they will also have glasses options on site and will be able to order contacts. Comprehensive care is what Dr. Bowman wants to provide his patients.

Services will include health exams for glasses and contact lenses as well as injury and eye infection treatment and co-management services for cataract surgery and glaucoma. Dr. Bowman said, "For patients who are diabetic or hypertensive or with rheumatoid arthritis, we can monitor any effects that will have on their eyes. Those have the potential to damage eyes from medication."

Patients will also be able to select glasses and order contact lenses through the clinic. Fitting sets of contact lenses will be available for

patients to try, as well. Purdy Eyes will accept Medicare and Medicaid.

Preliminary data from does. the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested a nearrecord 199,427 deer during the November portion of fall firearms deer season, Nov. 10- 20. Of the 199,427 deer harvested, 102,930 were antlered bucks, 19,924 were button bucks, and 76,573 were does.

Top harvest counties were Franklin with 4,021 deer checked, Howell with 3,858, and Callaway with 3,695.

Barry County's numbers were: 907 antlered bucks, 134 button bucks, and 607 does for a total of 1,648.

Last year, hunters checked 192,797 deer during the 2017 November portion of firearms deer season with 100,161 being antlered bucks, 20,267 being button bucks, and 72,369 being

The recent-record season was 2012 with 204,668 deer harvested, including 87,368 antlered bucks, 27,143 button bucks, and 90,157 does.

For current ongoing preliminary harvest totals by season, county, and type of deer, visit the MDC website at on.mo.gov/1jjz7Ew. For harvest summaries from past years, visit on.mo. gov/2fyMaBN.

MDC reported eight firearms-related hunting incidents during the November portion of firearms deer season of which three involved fatalities -- two of which occurred incidental to hunting while at hunting camps and one self-inflicted incident while in the field. Of the five non-fatal incidents, four were self-inflicted and the fifth occurred when the shooter struck a

victim while swinging on game.

Deer hunting in Missouri continues with archery deer hunting from Nov. 21 through Jan. 15, 2019. The late youth portion of firearms deer season runs Nov. 23-25. The antlerless portion of firearms deer season runs Nov. 30 through Dec. 2. Lastly, the alternative methods portion will run Dec. 22 through Jan. 1, 2019. MDC reports young hunters harvested 2,556 deer during late youth portion of season

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that young hunters ages 6 through 15 harvested 2,556 deer during Missouri's late youth portion of the 2018 deer hunting season, Nov. 23-25. Of the 2,556 deer harvested, 1,140 were antlered bucks, 336 were button bucks, and 1,080 were does.

Top counties for the late youth portion were Wayne with 47; Ripley with 46; and Franklin, Macon, and Osage with each having 45 deer checked.

Barry County's totals were: 7 antlered bucks, 3 button bucks, and 10 does for a total of 20.

Last year's harvest total for the late youth portion was 3,115 with 1,299 being antlered bucks, 453 button bucks, and 1,363 does.

Archery deer hunting continues through Jan. 15, 2019. Up next for deer hunting in Missouri is the antlerless portion of firearms deer season, which runs Nov. 30 through Dec. 2. Lastly, the alternative methods portion will run Dec. 22 through Jan. 1, 2019.
