Sidewalk replacement draws question from CHS graduates

After the Cassville R-IV School District issued a press release last week that some of the senior sidewalks will be replaced with a monument, some Cassville graduates are questioning the necessity of the project.

Each year, the Cassville District pours new sidewalks on the school's campus with the names of that year's graduating seniors stamped in the cement. Classes all the way back to 1922 have their names commemorated in the sidewalks.

The news that the district would be replacing some of the sidewalks that feature graduating classes 1922 through 1972 with a monument came following the announcement in March of a sidewalk upgrade. The upgrade will affect Cassville's Main Street from 5th Street all the way to 17th Street. In order to be in compliance with the law, the sidewalks will be brought up to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

Initially, MoDOT representatives informed Cassville Public Works Director Steve Walensky that none of the senior sidewalks would be affected. They assured

him that they would work around the senior sidewalks that lie parallel to Main Street near the J.C. Duncan Gymnasium, the only stretch of them that will conflict with the new sidewalks.

However, now that the project draws near, Mo-DOT has allegedly gone back on the assurance they made to Walensky during the planning stages that the sidewalks would be left intact. Walensky said, "This was something we brought up when they talked about the project. I had not heard that they were going to tear up the sidewalks, and I'll be interested to hear what Mo-DOT says. They assured me they would work around them."

When contacted, project manager Kristi Bachman with MoDOT said, "Our plan at the beginning was to leave the sidewalks intact, but when we met with the superintendent of schools, he mentioned the new monument and that they were fine with them being removed, so that's how that change came about," Bachman said that meeting with superintendent Dr. Richard Asbill was

Two life-flighted in Rte. W wreck

Four people were injured yesterday, December 8, when a Ford F150 ran off the road and hit a tree on Route W.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Janet Santos, 26, of Neosho, was driving the truck westbound about five miles west of Butterfield. Troopers determined that the vehicle ran off the roadway on a curve

and struck a tree, ejecting one of the passengers, Samuel Peter, 44, of Neosho. Around 1:10 a.m., the Highway Patrol responded to the scene where four people were injured. Santos and Peter received moderate injuries from the crash. Santos was transported via ambulance to Cox Hospital in Monett while Peter was taken by private vehicle to Freeman West Hospital in Joplin.

Two other passengers, Matha Hadley, 47, of Neosho, and Elnora Pelep, unknown age, of Neosho, were seriously injured and had to be flown to Cox Hospital in Springfield. Neither Pelep nor Hadley were wearing seatbelts at the time of the crash.

Santos was wearing a seatbelt, and the report lists Peter as exempt from a safety device.

Shell Knob man arrested for alleged child molestation

A Shell Knob man is in custody for allegedly molesting a child for six years. Richard Henry Bastura, 63, is being charged with statutory sodomy in the first degree, child molestation in the first degree and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree, all three felony charges. The Shell Knob School District confirmed that Bastura was a substitute bus driver for the district.

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said, "There possibly may be other children involved."

Epperly said that he was arrested while on a mail route. He stated, "He was on a mail route when we arrested hi, helping a person deliver mail on 76 Highway."

Bastura has been interviewed by the Sheriff's Department, he has been uncooperative, according to Epperly.

In an affidavit of probably cause written by Barry County Sheriff's Officer Terry Meek,

Bastura molested a girl at two different Shell Knob homes between January 1, 2009, and November 22, 2015. The abuse began when the child was eight and continued until after she turned 14. According to Meek's report, Bastura touched the child in sexual areas as well as instructing her to touch him in an inappropriate sexual manner.

Barry County Judge Johnnie Cox issued the warrant for Bastura's arrest on December 4, and he is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only

Alleged arsonist brothers' cases dismissed

Charles Peterson, 44, of Rocky Comfort, and Theodore Peterson, 42, of Rocky Comfort, two brothers accused of arson on Farm Road 9170 in Purdy in April, had their case dismissed by Barry County Judge Woods for lack of evidence, according to Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx.

The Peterson brothers were charged with the crime after the victim allegedly found her dog at Theodore Peterson's home. In the original affidavit of probable cause, the victim saw her dog, which she thought had died in the fire. The Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated, confirmed the dog belonged to the victim and charged the two brothers, along with Norman Baez, 25, of Monett, and Tyler Rubert, 18, of Crane, with the arson.

According to the report, the Peterson brothers committed the arson to settle a debt with the victim, and Charles lit the fire while Theodore kept the match for a souvenir.



in February of this year.

Asbill refuted that statement, saying, "One of the first options that was proposed was going to be a sidewalk next to existing sidewalk, but that was based on MoDOT changing the entrance to Kid Kat Drive. When they decided not to change the entrance to that drive, so that was no longer an option." Asbill also said that the initial person leading the public meetings has since retired and that there were multiple meetings prior to an actual proposal.

"Initially, they wanted additional easement to keep the sidewalks intact. They wanted to increase their easement to another six to ten feet. When we met with the board about that, the concern was that we would lose additional property, and we don't have any control over what they do with it once we give it up. So we started looking at other options," Asbill said.

He added, "We asked them, 'if we're not going to increase the easement, what is going to occur?' They said, 'If you want us to pay for it, we're going to take the sidewalks out, and they'll be ADA-accessible through and through."

To deal with the loss of the sidewalks anticipated to occur next summer, the school district formed a sidewalk committee of ten people, including a school board member, staff and members of the community, to discuss plausible alternatives.

Committee person and assistant superintendent Jill LeCompte said, "MoDOT is taking them up, and we had to figure out something." The solution was a monument that will be erected near the gymnasium close to where the sidewalks will be removed with the names of graduating class members from 1922 to 1972.

However, some members of the Cassville community are upset about the news and

think the school should take a different approach to the issue. Leonard Lowe, Cassville Class of 1971 graduate, said, "I think the alumni could get together and replace the sidewalks. I know I don't want my name on a monument somebody else made and put somewhere else."

Lowe's beliefs have been echoed by a variety of graduates from over the years. Even Facebook posts have generated a lot of response about the way the sidewalks are being handled. Lowe said, "I don't see why they couldn't replace a couple each year when they pour the new ones."

LeCompte said that the project isn't that simple. She said, "The estimate that we got for replacing the sidewalks was going to be around \$187,000." LeCompte said that would be to replace all of the sidewalks, not just the ones impacted by the Mo-DOT project. She did not have the numbers for the cost of just replacing the classes affected by the project. The proposed monument will cost under \$25,000, which they plan to fundraise for and supplement with Capital Project funds if necessary.

She said, "We talked about the options, but most of them cannot be moved, they're just too old and brittle. It would take up all of our maintenance staff, and they wouldn't be able to do other projects." She said it just wasn't feasible to move the existing sidewalks or pour new ones.

"I'll be sad when they take up my dad's sidewalk, but I would rather we have something more permanent and beautiful," she said.

The committee also discussed how pouring new sidewalks would not solve the issue that the sidewalks deteriorate over time making it difficult or impossible to read the names on them. LeCompte said, "I think we should try to make it be a real solution, instead of leaving a problem for the next generation to deal with."

The monument will stay close to the gymnasium with the sidewalks, but for some graduates, it is not the same.

Lowe summed up his thoughts, "When we put our names on that sidewalk, it really meant something to me, and it was something I was proud of. I was proud to have my name with all of my aunts, uncles and cousins stamped in that walk for everyone to see who walked it. Fix it."

After an initial interview, Bachman released the following statement: "As we discussed this morning, it was our original intent to preserve the stamped sidewalk. However, this would require us to build a new sidewalk next to the existing sidewalk. This design idea increased the impact to the school property, and it left an aging sidewalk that could pose a safety concern as the sidewalk deteriorates. We worked with the school,

and they came up with the idea to provide a new plaque or monument inside the school that honors the students at Cassville. With this solution, we are able to construct a new sidewalk that is safer and meets all American with Disabilities Act require-





"As a current football coach, I feel that wrestling is very beneficial in developing the form and techniques needed for football. The strength and agility needed crosses over, too.




Wells scored the last point of the quarter from the line as TJ carried a 40-24 lead into the final break.







Shore takes third in NCHA **National Judging Contest**



Home-bound meal delivery a life-changing experience

For years, the Central Crossing Senior Center (CCSC) has worked to ensure area homebound seniors have nutritious and delicious meals delivered to their homes. The Center took on this important service in 2000, shortly after a few dedicated souls really kicked CCSC into gear. Often confused with "Meals on Wheels," the service we provide to homebound seniors through the Southwest Missouri Office on Aging (SW-MOA) is known as "the Home Delivered Meal Program."

Why is this service important? It goes beyond just providing meals to homebound seniors, although that is its primary purpose. It's also about people and the love that is both shown by and received by the volunteers and homebound seniors. Let me share a story from the recently released book by Glenn Phillips, the author of "\$50 and a Dream" (available at the Senior Center):

Back in 2000, Glenn was a Home Delivered Meals (HDM) driver. He describes his time as a HDM driver as a life changing experience, one which helped him to develop special relationships with each and every person on his route. One such recipient on Glenn's route was

a. Glenn described his association with Etta this way, "In the beginning, I would drop off the packaged meal, and leave. Then Etta found small little duties for me. One day she asked if I could stay for a minute. I told her that I had other deliveries and had to be sure the meals stayed warm, but sure, I could stay. As I sat, Etta began talking, she opened her meal, and with some moisture collecting in her eyes, she told me how much she appreciated the home meals

being delivered.

"We talked about loneliness, how God gave us a gift to help others, and how important it was to do God's work. When I left, I felt a spiritual uplifting. Etta had given me a gift. I now knew why it was so important

that we have a Senior Center in Shell Knob."
