Branson man killed in US 60 crash near Monett

A Branson man lost his life in a single-vehicle crash near Monett Saturday morning. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Ronnie E. Nelson, 50, of Branson, was ejected from his SUV.

On Saturday, December 2, around 10:45 a.m., Nelson was driving a 2002 GMC Envoy westbound on US 60. About two and a half

miles west of Monett, Nelson travelled off the right side of the road and overturned. Nelson was ejected from the vehicle.

Nelson was pronounced dead at the scene by Barry County deputy coroner Charlie McManus at 11:45 a.m. This is Troop D's second fatality for the month and the 103rd fatality for the year.

Stabbing leaves Golden man dead, suspect charged with murder

ALLEGED ARGUMENT LED TO DEATH

An alleged stabbing in Golden left one man dead and another charged with murder. A Holiday Island, Ark., man, Matthew Jackson, 40, is charged with first degree murder in the stabbing death of Steven Gregory Chupp, of Golden.

According to the affidavits probable cause filed by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Jackson told officers that he stabbed Chupp several times with a knife on Monday, December 4. The report goes on to state that Chupp was pronounced dead en route

Major Leonard Collins, Chief Deputy of the Barry County Sheriff's Department, said there were not a lot of details available about motive in the case. He stated, "The only thing I know is they got into an argument and then a fight. And he [Jackson] said he stabbed him [Chupp]."

The murder took place at a residence in Golden on State High-

Collins added, "They'd been in an argument and fight about a month ago, too. I'm not sure where that fight took place." He said the Barry County Sheriff's Department was not dispatched to that argument.

As far as the relationship between Chupp and Jackson, Collins described it is co-workers. No solid information has been provided about the nature of the argument that led to the death of Chupp.

Collins said, "The reasons are hearsay, so we don't know that for sure." Jackson was taken into custody without incident and booked into the Barry County Jail at 7:10 p.m. on Monday evening.

Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx charged Jackson with murder in the first degree, and Barry County Judge Robert Foulke issued a warrant with a \$200,000 cash-only bond on Tuesday, December 5. Jackson is still being held in the Barry County Jail on that bond.

Jackson has a disposition hearing scheduled for Tuesday, December 19, at 8:30 a.m. in front of Judge Foulke.

Gas station employee busted for stealing, drugs

A 23 year old man was arrested on Thursday, November 30, after allegedly being observed stealing from the till at the gas station in Carr Lane.

According to affidavits of probable cause used in filing charges, Nicholas Day, of Golden, was an employee at the Carr Lane Country Store. The Stone County Sheriff's Department was dispatched after the owner of the store allegedly saw Day take money from the cash register over security cameras.

According to the report, video showed Day removing \$20 bills from the register and putting them in his pants. Further, the report states that Deputy Cherry observed Day putting something down his pants when Cherry made contact with him. Day allegedly told the deputy that he put a tube of money down his pants. The tube allegedly contained five \$20 bills. The owner of the store told the deputy that Day took more money and attempted to steal cigarettes before the officer arrived.

Deputy Cherry asked Day which vehicle in the parking lot was his. Through the window, the law enforcement officer allegedly saw a glass pipe on the console. Day was placed under arrest at this point. He allegedly told the officer that there was marijuana inside the vehicle.

A search of the vehicle allegedly found a glass pipe

with burnt marijuana, two baggies of marijuana, a clear bag of mushrooms that Day identified as psychedelic mushrooms, clear straws and a digital scale with a crystal residue. The residue reportedly field tested positive for meth.

Day allegedly had a bag with 31 Clonazepam on his person at his arrest. He allegedly told officers that he "smokes weed and takes the Clonazepam to help with his anxiety," but does not have a prescription for the drug.

Day was booked into the Stone County Jail awaiting charges. He is being held in lieu of a \$25,000 bond. He is charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, one count of possession of marijuana and one misdemeanor charge of stealing \$150 or less.




Reed wins Advertiser Turkey Hunt contest

Each year, the local OACAC office teams up with the community to bring underprivileged families across Barry County a Christmas for their children. This year is no exception. Next week, 133 families will pick up gifts donated by the community to ensure that their children have a merry Christmas.

Gail Reed, supervisor of the OACAC Barry County Neighborhood Center, said that this year's gifts will benefit 376 children, which is similar to most years, and Share Your Christmas has been going since before she started at the center. "I bet we've been doing it 30 some years, I've been involved in it the past 20 years."

Share Your Christmas is a multi-step process that involves a lot of volunteers to bring it all together. Reed said, "It's always a big puzzle with all of these people and things and it all fits together. We do the applications here and a wish list with two or three things that each child really wants and it goes from there."

Christmas trees in offices all over Barry County display ornaments with the toys requested by children on them. Individuals and businesses will purchase toys and then put them back under the tree. Then, a group of

Reed said, "They pack it all and put it in black plastic bags so the kids can't tell what is inside, and then they [families] go around the room where each sack is in alphabetical order."

It's always amazed me because everybody just knows what their job is and does their part. Reward offered for Cassville man hiding from police

A reward is being offered for information leading to the capture of a Cassville man absconding from police. Jared McCracken's photo and information are being shared by Barry-Lawrence County Crime Stoppers and the Barry County Sheriff's Office. Crime Stoppers is offering the

reward for his capture.

McCracken is believed to be in the area, possibly visiting his parents who live on AA Highway outside of Cassville or with his girlfriend, Natasha Keeler, in Pierce City. He has been on the run for several months, evading capture.

McCracken is wanted burglary/receiving stolen property and the

probation violation of absconding, according to the Barry County Sheriff's Department Facebook page. They also posted that McCracken had cut off his ankle bracelet.

McCracken plead guilty to burglary in the second degree in 2016 and was put on probation. The affidavits of probable cause stated that McCracken

stole \$85 and a Husqvarna 455 chain saw valued at \$550 from a resident on Highway W in Wheaton in October 2015.

Then, McCracken has a pending receiving stolen property charge when a 1968 Holiday Traveler 20 foot pull behind camper was found on his property in Purdy. The VIN plate had been removed from

the trailer, according to the affidavits of probable cause. The Barry County Department Sheriff's stated that McCracken was living in the trailer without a VIN and should have known that it had been stolen. The trailer was found at McCracken's property in September 2016 after being stolen from Granby in April 2016.

Tipsters can remain anonymous. To be eligible for the reward, tips must be submitted through the Barry-Lawrence County Crime Stoppers at www. blcrimestoppers.com. Tipsters are offered up to \$1,000 for the capture of wanted persons in Barry and Lawrence Counties.



Letter to the Editor

This is a response to the letter from Mr. Meadows:

We are making the system more efficient and better on a regular basis. Part of that is reviewing calls and we have made a point of emphasis on using some of the tools that our phone system has including volume controls or turning up amplification of mics, etc. Also, we currently are in the process of upgrading this phone system for added functions and tools.

Part of the job of a dispatcher is to ask questions to tailor the type of response needed, provide necessary information to the responders or indicate to the dispatcher that they need to start "pre-arrival instructions". In the event of major bleeding, they can instruct you to control the bleeding, or if someone is not breathing, they can help you start CPR. These are some of the lifesaving instructions a dispatcher may give you, depending on your need. The most important thing to remember is- these questions are not delaying a response. Their partners are coordinating agency responses and providing updates to these units when needed while they are gathering information.

Since you are in Barry Lawrence Ambulance District, we notified their communications center in Monett and they dispatched the ambulance of the call. I reviewed that we notified Monett of the call and your information was given out correctly to them. The 9-1-1 Center has no control over whose jurisdiction you are in.

Barry County E9-1-1 acted in accordance with policy and procedure with notifying all appropriate responders of the call. However, sometimes there may not be a response from volunteer agencies. Unfortunately, that can happen depending on the resources that are available at the time of need.

Barry County E9-1-1 has some of the highest trained and recognized professionals in the industry. We are always here, 24/7, to provide help if needed. Thank you for your letter and I welcome any further questions or comments you may have.

Backpack of meth, syringes leads to arrest







The Cassville cats squandered a big lead, but recovered to claim a 66-59 victory over Neosho on Monday night. 



Young hunters harvest more than 3,000 deer during late youth portion

Top counties for the late youth portion were Franklin with 72, Douglas with 71, and Howell with 69 deer checked. Last year's harvest total for the late youth portion was 2,944.

Barry County's numbers were: 16 antlered bucks, 6 button bucks, and 9 does for a total of 31 deer taken during the late portion of youth season.
