Fire Department breaks ground on new Mano station

Last week, the Eagle Rock Golden Mano Fire Department broke ground on a new satellite station in Mano to offer safer service to around 150 homes that the station will serve.

The new station, called Station Two, is being built on Farm Road 1195 off of E Highway and will be the fourth station for the department. The existing stations for the ERGM FD are in Eagle Rock, Mano (close to Big M Marina) and Golden. Eventually, the department hopes to build two other new stations as well, although according to Fire Chief Mark Pierson, that might be a few years in the future.

Pierson stated, “We’re really happy that we’re able to do this one right now and help out those in the community who need better access to the department.” He shared that part of the determination for building a station in Mano dealt with the issue of insurance for many homeowners in the area.

Pierson said, “We have around 150 people paying class 10 insurance on their homes, and once this station goes up, they’ll be a class 7, which could result in a possible decrease on their premiums.” A home’s class for insurance is determined by the fire department’s quality, including equipment, train-

ing and distribution of fire fighting companies; the water supply system (access to fire hydrants); and fire alarm and communication systems, such as the telephone line reliability, staff dispatching and alarm systems. Both Class 9 and 10 are considered unprotected because of lack of hydrants or distance from a fire station. Most of the homes in the ERGM district are considered class 7.

The building will be a two bay station with an engine and a tanker, both of which the department already owns. To keep costs down, the station will be built by volunteers from the department, but all of the materials will be purchased with district funds made available by a tax increase that was approved in April 2013. The tax rate for those in the ERGM district went from 0.29 per-

cent to 0.3989 percent to help provide for the district. This year parked the first payment that they received from that increase.

The fire department is run mostly by the 26 volunteer firefighters. However, the department does have two full time employees, Pierson and assistant chief Pam Stilwell, and one part-time employ-

The City of Seligman hired a new Chief of Police on May 24. Terry Burgess, a former Barry County Sheriff's Deputy, took over the part-time position when Garry Thornton left.

Burgess stated, “It was an opportunity and I love this little town. I decided to go for the position because I want Seligman to have a continued good police department.” Burgess is familiar with law enforcement after serving as a Sheriff's Deputy from 2010 to 2013 and working part time as an officer for the City of Seligman during the same time.

Burgess left law en-

forcement in 2013 when he bought out his father-in-law's half of the business they owned in Seligman. “I really needed to dedicate all of my time to the business then, but I am still a reserve deputy for the county.”

Burgess, originally from northwest Arkansas, his wife, Shawna, and three daughters, Savannah, Tatum and Ashlynn, have lived in the country outside of Seligman for the last five years. Before that, they lived in Cassville, so he is familiar with the area and has made it his home.

When asked what he is looking forward to most in his new position, Burgess

Abramovitz to take over as Athletic Director

After Cassville High School's former football coach David Large said goodbye to the Wildcats, he left behind a vacancy for the athletic director position.

After searching through candidates in-house, the school district announced that CMS assistant principal Ben Abramovitz would take over the position.

Abramovitz is entering his seventh year at Cassville and has been one of the best utility players for the Wildcats.

Many young faces recognized him as “Coach A” from primary school PE. He has been the CHS head

softball coach for the last six years, the CMS head softball coach for four years and assisted girls basketball for four years. He also spent a season assisting the boys basketball program and the last school year as assistant principal in the middle school.

Before his time with the Wildcats, Abramovitz worked at Southwest R-5 for six years. There, he taught middle school math and was the middle school principal. He also coached softball, baseball and basketball.

Ten years ago, Abramovitz began his coursework toward an administrative position with his heart set on becoming an Athletic Director.

“When I began my administrative course work 10 years ago, this was the position I someday wanted to pursue,” Abramovitz stated.

“Like most things, I knew I needed to develop a skill set and experience over the years that would allow me to be successful in that position.

“Therefore, I have attempted to place and surround myself in situations that would help groom for that eventual opportunity.

“I love the idea of being involved in an arena that involves students in extra curricular activities, working alongside our coaching staffs, and working hard to help develop exceptional programs that this community so sincerely supports.

“The support this community provides our student athletes is one that I am honored to be a part of and hope to only enhance. This will be a new challenge for me that I’m thrilled to take on and learn.”

Abramovitz will continue as head softball coach for the Cassville but will miss the frequency of working with the students and teachers.

“I enjoy working with student challenges and having a direct hand in improving students success in the classroom and in the community. Thankfully, I will still have this opportunity with students but in a totally different fashion.”

The Athletic Director's roles will consist of scheduling for each athletic program, athletic eligibility management, event supervision and

Sheriff's Dept. rolls out new vehicles

This year, the Barry County Sheriff's Department added two new Ford Explorers to the vehicle fleet that is patrolling the streets of the county. The Explorers, purchased locally at Les Jacobs Ford, were two of eight vehicles that the department has purchased over the last few years to replace the higher mileage patrol vehicles.

Sheriff Mick Epperly stated, "We need to be replacing out the old cars as soon as we can. Anytime they get over 150,000 miles, we start to see a lot of wear and tear and a lot more maintenance issues. Before, we'd relied on the Ford Crown Victorias and they had been a really good car for us, but since they stopped making them, we had to go with something different." Six of the replacements have been SUVs and the other two were a Dodge Charger and a Ford Taurus.

Part of the decision to upgrade primarily to a larger vehicle like an SUV for many

of the replacements was because of the space issue in some of the newer cars. Epperly said, "The patrol cars are getting smaller and smaller, especially when you try to put a cage in them. With that and all of the equipment and technology that my deputies use, it becomes a problem."

SUVs also make it easier for deputies to travel, especially in situations where road conditions are snowy or slick during times of bad weather. Epperly said, "Some of those Crown Victorias really took us through some places you wouldn't expect them to, but the all-wheel drive will be really useful in the wintertime."

At any given time, the Sheriff's Department has two to four deputies out on patrol, not counting those working in the office and the Judicial Center. Epperly said, "Dur-

ing the daytime, I've got two out on the roads and at night, it's usually between three and four." During the daytime, the Sheriff says not only is he available, but there are also three detectives, a transport officer and others who travel the county as needed.

The Sheriff's Department still has eight to ten vehicles that will need to be replaced in the coming years, but the time frame will be determined by revenue received and the budget. Epperly said, "We'd like to get back into the routine of switching out three or four cars each year if the budget allows it."

The two Ford Explorers purchased earlier in the year were \$26,689 each, according to the County Clerk Gry Youngblood. Epperly concluded, "So far, we've had really good results with them."

ee. With the volunteer help, Pierson expects the station to cost the district approximately \$20,000 once it is completed. The main difference between the new Mano satellite station and the existing stations is that the other stations are fully equipped. Pierson says, "Even though the other stations are fully equipped, residents will still get a credit for having a fire station within five miles of their home, so it'll help a lot

of people."

Assistant Chief Stilwell added, "We're really grateful and thankful that we were given the opportunity to build this station. It couldn't have happened without Kenneth and Darlene Sherman, who donated the land. They really launched this project."

The fire department hopes to have the satellite station completed by the end of the summer.

Davidson sentencing hearing results in 18 years

Rick Dean Davidson, Sr., 60, the Wheaton preacher convicted of statutory sodomy in the first degree and statutory rape in the first degree in April, was sentenced on May 20 to the jury-recommended 18 year sentence.

Davidson was convicted of the charges related to rape and sexual misconduct with two girls, one being his granddaughter, who he sexually assaulted when they were between the ages of 5 and 10 at the time.

After a three day trial in early April, the jury returned to the courtroom with a

guilty verdict and a recommendation of 18 years imprisonment for each charge.

Davidson's attorney John Lewright made a motion for a new trial which was overruled by Judge Jack Goodman at Davidson's hearing on May 20. Goodman accepted the jury's recommendation, sending Davidson to prison for 18 years beginning the day of sentencing.

According to Missouri State law, the Class A statutory sodomy felony carries a minimum ten year imprisonment sentence and up to life in prison.

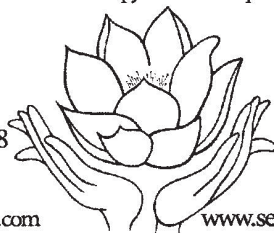

Carol House, prominent long-time resident of Cassville, sent the Advertiser a copy of an article from the Monett Times dated 72 years ago in 1942 about her grandfather, George England, who served 12 years at the County Clerk for Barry County, a position held today by Gary Youngblood.

The ten children listed in the story are all deceased except Mrs. Lillie Phillips, who for many years has lived in California.

Mrs. House is the daughter of Joe England, who passed away recently.

The story follows:
Winner of County Clerk's race is father of ten children - nearly all finish high school

George England, Mineral township farmer, who won the Republican nomination for county clerk Tuesday in a close five cornered race, was in Monett yesterday expressing his thanks for the vote that he received in the election. That he will

make a good race this fall is evidenced by the home-stretch finish that he made in the primary election, coming in first out of a field of strong contenders.

Left an orphan at the age of eight, Mr. England has made his own way ever since and everything that he has achieved has been through his efforts with plenty of hard work. He worked for his board and clothing while attending the Monett schools for four years.

Mr. England has been farming in Mineral Township, 13 miles east of Cassville, for the past 30 years, raising white-faced Herefords, but prior to that he railroaded on the Southern Pacific in California as fireman, 1904-06, then entered the mercantile business at Mineral Springs and in 1912 was in the hardware business for a year in Exeter.

The Englands have raised a large family, having 10 children in all. George Jr. is with the procurement

department at Jefferson Barracks at St. Louis; Pvt. Edward is with the reconnaissance division at Fr. Shelby, Miss.; Joe is a farmer in Mineral Township; Deering is with the forestry service at Cassville; Jack is a glider pilot inspector and ground mechanic at Goodland, Kan.; Amos and Charles are at home; two daughters, Susie and Lillie, are employed in St. Louis; and Hildreth is a school teacher at Shell Knob. All of his ten children have completed high school with the exception of the youngest who enters this year.

Mr. England ran for county clerk in 1930 and for assessor in 1932, getting the nomination and leading the ticket each time, but was pulled under with the Democratic landslides. In spite of his defeats, he went ahead and worked hard for the other candidates in future elections and was a good sport about his defeats.

He said yesterday that he promises a faithful, honest and business-like administration if elected and guarantees to have the best clerical help and deputies that are available within the Republican party.

Cassville City continues to improve sewer treatment

Cassville City Public Works has been working on sewer collection system improvements since 2011. A discovery meeting was held on Wednesday, May 28, at the Cassville City Hall to look into a new technology that might aid in addressing the issue.

The water treatment plant of Cassville pumps out clean Department of Natural Resources (DNR)- approved water into Flat Creek using the outflow 001 line. This is the primary line in use at the plant. Outflow 002 is also used at the plant under rare conditions. The line is used to flow excess partially treated water out of the 18 acre lagoon, and back into Flat Creek when there is a flooding issue and the plant cannot properly treat all of the water.

Steve Walensky, Director of Public Works for Cassville, held the meeting in regards to the sewer treatment solution. John Harris from Missouri Clean Energy District, Doyle Childers and Earl Pabst, from Flotron and McIntosh, community member and real estate owner Gail Purves, and Ron Tracy from Tracy Engineering Tulsa, Okla. were also in attendance to provide treatment options and feedback.

Walensky and the team have been repairing sewer lines in the city in order to eliminate excess clean water

from entering the sewer lines and costing the plant more to process. He is also looking into plans to improve the treatment process for the outflow 002 line. “I fish in Flat Creek, so I want the water as clean as I can get it,” stated Walensky.

During the meeting, Childers and Pabst introduced a water treatment solution powered by algae called the Bio2 Solution. This would provide the outflow 002 line the ability to flow out clean treated water into Flat Creek. This introduces microscopic multi-species, single cell, oxygen producing algae into the primary cell of a lagoon system, which creates a uniform, pure oxygen rich environment, approximately 18 inches to 24 inches deep.

Bio2 Solution however, was to be funded with the Property Accessed Clean Energy (PACE) program. More research will take place to determine if the PACE program would work for Cassville as the funding mechanism. The outcome would result in positive environmental factors, such as no waste in Flat Creek.

The City of Cassville is still looking into a solution while weighing costs and efficiency. Bio 2 will be sending engineers to the Waste Water Treatment Plant so that an estimate can be created and the evaluated by the Public Works team.

Sheriff’s Department holds active shooter training

The Barry County Sheriff’s Department held two active shooter trainings last week at Shell Knob and Southwest Schools. The staged training is intended to help improve the communication between area schools and the Sheriff’s Department in the case that a school shooting were to occur.

Sheriff Mick Epperly stated, “We pray that none of this would happen on our watch, but in the case that it does, I want my officers to be familiar with the layout of the schools and know that the schools know the protocol.”

The set up of the active shooter training begins just as it would in the real event. The school calls 911 and the Sheriff’s Department is dispatched to the scene to begin. At Shell Knob’s training, Epperly sent in four different entry teams with there being three people acting as shooters at the school. Epperly stated, “We go into it as if it were really happening. Both sides learn a lot from this type of training and we get a better idea of what the schools want and expect of us and also how we can carry out the intervention in a safe way.”

Epperly said that area schools have increased secu-

rity to decrease the likelihood of a shooting actually occurring, but the department still wants to be prepared just in case.

Active shooter trainings are not a mandated activity at the state or federal level, but more of a locally controlled practice. Epperly continued, “By having good communication with the principals and knowing the layout, I, or whoever would be in charge, would know where to send our teams.”

All school procedures in the event of an emergency are followed, including lockdown. Assisting at the Shell Knob training was a Cox ambulance team and the Central Crossing Fire Department.

CHIEF from front

said, “I just hope to move this department forward and improve it the best I can. I’ll get to serve the community that I love and live in, and that’s probably the best part.”

Burgess was hired by the Seligman City Council at a special May meeting. He will be putting in a couple hours each day Monday through Friday during the day and plans to patrol one evening a week. Burgess said, “We

already have one full-time officer, and I’m currently working with the Board of Aldermen to get another part-time officer so that the city has seven-nights-a-week coverage.” Seligman’s full-time officer is Ray Earnest.

16 sent to prison for Barry County felonies in May

• **Richard C. Adair**, Bentonville, Ark., had his probation revoked from a charge from November 2011. Adair pled guilty to DWI-alcohol as a persistent offender on December 17, 2012. Adair was sentenced to four years incarceration.

On November 16, 2011, the Missouri State Highway Patrol stopped Adair's vehicle around 11:55 p.m. Trooper Wilson noticed that he had a very strong alcohol odor on his breath. His blood alcohol level, according to a breath test, was 0.153 percent. Adair was also driving with a suspended driver's license and had two prior DWIs.

• **Chad David Alspaugh**, Denver, Colorado, entered an Alford plea for two counts of sexual misconduct or attempt involving a child under the age of 15. Alspaugh was sentenced to two years incarceration.

On May 26, 2012, Alspaugh was babysitting two girls, ages seven and eight years-old, when he exposed himself to them.

• **Natalie Marie Andrews**, of Granby, pled guilty to two charges of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, resulting

in a suspended imposition of sentence. She is to serve supervised probation for five years.

On February 5, Officer Ardock with the Barry County Sheriff's Department was called out to locate a stolen car. Andrews was found to be in possession of the car which was broken down. During a search, Andrews was found to have marijuana in a cigarette package in her pocket. Once at the jail, she removed another baggie of marijuana from her bra. Andrews will serve probation until May 19, 2019.

• **Shane Marshall Beck**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received a suspended imposition of sentence. Beck is to serve supervised probation for five years.

On February 7, 2012, Deputy Danny Crabb with the Barry County Sheriff's Department executed a search warrant at a home at 80 Gravel Street in Cassville. During this warrant, Crabb found digital scales, baggies of marijuana, distribution bags of methamphetamine and a drug ledger notebook. Beck's room at the address

was found to have a water bong, two propane torches, three distribution baggies that field-tested positive for methamphetamine, one hemostat, a digital scale, a glass pipe with burnt residue, and two cut straws. Beck will serve probation until May 19, 2019.

• **David Joseph Corral**, of Cassville, pled guilty to receiving stolen property and received four years incarceration.

On March 8, 2013, multiple items were stolen from a property on Farm Road 1045 north of MO State Highway 248, such as box fans, two inch pipe, a t-post driver, galvanized metal and copper wire. Corral was one of the suspects identified by employees who sold the stolen items to Rebel Recycling.

• **Davie A. Gallion**, Harrison, Ark., had his probation revoked after pleading guilty to sexual assault stemming from an arrest made in 2007. Gallion will serve 120 days of shock time as part of a four year sentence for probation violation.

• **Charles Franklin Gamble**, of Wentworth, pled guilty to two counts of driving while revoked or suspended stemming from incidents in August 2012 and May 2013. Gamble was sentenced to three years incarceration.

On August 31, 2012, Sergeant Misner of the Pierce City Police Department was dispatched to a home on East Newman in Pierce City in regards to an intruder. Gamble was found on the west side of the residence and his truck was across the road. When taken into custody, Gamble admitted to have driven the truck while his license was revoked.

On March 16, 2013, Gamble was stopped again in Lawrence County for driving while revoked. Gamble had four previous driving while suspended or revoke convictions.

Once pulled over, the driver, Harkins, threw a bag of three pills under the vehicle. The pills were later identified as acetaminophen and hydrocodone. Harkins also failed a field sobriety test and admitted to smoking marijuana earlier. Harkins had five prior convictions for driving while suspended.

• **Michael P. Heidgerken**, of Springfield, was sentenced to five years in-

carceration for forgery after having his probation revoked in court on May 19, 2014.

Heidgerken was originally arrested in March 2011 after he admitted to using a stolen credit card to make purchases at Walmart in Monett.

• **Matthew A. Henson**, of Cassville, pled guilty to DWI-alcohol as a persistent offender and received a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence. Henson must also serve 480 hours of community service and successfully complete CRISP.

On October 1, 2013, Henson was travelling 11 miles per hour over the speed limit as well as turning into a designated turn lane when trying to execute an opposite direction turn. Once stopped, Henson admitted to drinking two beers after work. His breath tested at 0.119 percent. He had three prior convictions for DWI.

Hudson was sentenced to three years incarceration for burglary in the second degree from April 2014, two charges of possession of a controlled substance from January 2014, and receiving stolen property in 2011.

In early April 2011, Hudson sold parts stolen off of logging machinery to Rebel Recycling. In January 2014, he broke into a residence on Front Street in Exeter. He was in possession of methamphetamine and paraphernalia in the room where he was staying within easy reach. In April 2014, Hudson broke into a residence on west Commercial Street in Exeter and was planning to steal food and a console game.

• **Jacqueline Rayleen McIntire**, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received a suspended imposition of sentence and five

The growing philosophy of a smart shopper is to never pay full price. Locally, one Shell Knob business is bringing that concept on a large scale with merchandise offered at 30 to 50 percent off of the regular retail cost.

Hootenanny's LLC is a new liquidation outlet that offers shoppers items from electronics and kids toys to home decor items and RV equipment and supplies. Being a liquidation store, not all items are brand new, but everything is sold with full disclosure. For those items that were store returns on the shelves, owner Stevia Hooten said they make sure

customers know exactly what they are getting. For new-in-packing items, they put them right on the shelf; however, if something comes in having been opened, they make sure customers know the details.

Hooten said, "We do everything we can. We put gas in it, batteries in it, plug it in, do whatever we need to do to make sure that it is in good working order. If something has a defect, we make sure to write it on the box so that people know." Since all sales are final, she wants to make sure customers are leaving the doors with a good product and positive experience.

Different areas in the store boast products for any-

one who comes in. Hooten said, "When we first opened, a lot of our shipments included a lot of tools, but I really want to invite people to come back in and see what is new. We have shipments coming in regularly, and I try to put new things on the shelves everyday."

Different areas in the store cater to the tastes of different shoppers. The kids area has kids tablets, dolls, building sets, miniature dirt bikes and more. Housewares is filled with shelves of kitchen pans, dishes, furniture, clothes and shoes. All of those items are priced well below what they would be at Walmart or other stores. Records tumble at Class 3-4 state track meet

Although the Cassville girls failed to make the finals in the 4x100 meter relay at the state track meet on Friday, they were privileged to see one of the best championship meets ever held at Lincoln University in Jefferson City.

Six records fell in the Class 3 girls competition. Two records fell in both the Class 3 Boys and Class 4 girls events. One - arguably the best performance of the weekend - tumbled in Class 4 boys.

Two relay records fell in Class 3 girls competition. Grandview set a new Class 3 mark of 1:40.07 in the 4x200 relay, and McCluer South Berkeley set an all-classes record in the 4x100 event with a sparkling 47.19.

The Cassville quartet of Alesha Cousins, Katie Sewell, Grace Gouvion, and Jade Holloway turned a 52.92 in Friday's prelims but did not

make the finals.

CJ Jones of Cardinal Ritter capped his brilliant career with a new Class 3 record in the 400, posting a 47.01. Jones set the Class 3 800 meter record of 1:49.96 in 2012.

Landon Bartel of Southern Boone tied the Class 3 high jump record with a leap of 7-00.

In Class 4 girls, Hannah Long of Eureka set a class record in the 1600 with her 4:46.21.

Jasmine Barge, a junior from McLuer North, broke the all-class record in the 300-meter hurdles, flying over the barriers in 41.79.

But Blue Springs strongman Carlos Davis wowed the crowd when he spun the discus 212' 5" to set an all-time Missouri state record. His mark is also the best of the year for United States high school throwers.
