### Two more arrested in connection with Butterfield death

Jonathan Renteria-Marquez (20) and Carlos Manuel Gutierrez (19), both of Carthage, were arrested June 7 in connection with the alleged May 28 murder of Daylon Michael Anderson (25), of Monett, near the intersection of Farm Roads 2140 and 1078 southwest of Butterfield.

According to probable

cause statements written by Detective Doug Henry of the Barry County Sheriff's Office, a witness told Henry that Renteria-Marquez and Gutierrez were in the vehicle with Anderson and Dillon Williams on May 28 when the alleged murder took

The witness reported picking the trio up after they allegedly attempted to burn Anderson's car on Farm Road 1090, just south of Monett.

According to the probable cause statement, all four then went to Dollar General in Monett, where they got into a white Toyota Prius and went to Pack & Go in Monett to buy gas.

Detective Henry stated that the Pack & Go security video was retrieved for that date and time, and the witness's story was confirmed. The video allegedly showed Williams in the drivers' seat, the witness in the passenger seat, and Renteria-Marquez emerging from the rear door on the driver's side.

The witness further stated that Gutierrez had crouched in the floorboard and was making a phone call to his girlfriend, who was in jail. According to Detective Henry's statement, phone records were retrieved in which Gutierrez told his girlfriend he couldn't tell her what happened, because the line was being recorded and he might go to prison.

### Former 39th Circuit Judge passes away

Robert (Bob) Wiley, former 39th District Circuit Judge and long-time friend of the late Missouri Senator Emory Melton, died Thursday, June 3, at age 78.

Marty Jenkins, publisher of The Barry County Advertiser - owned by Melton Publications - recalls how Senator Melton and Judge Wiley always worked weekends and were each aware of the other's proclivity for doing so.

"They often got together for a few minutes on those working weekends," Jenkins said, "to talk about things attorneys talk about."

Wiley, a native of Hurley, grew up swimming and fishing in Spring Creek and roaming the woods in Stone County. After graduating as Valedictorian from Hurley High School, he attended Missouri State University (then SMSU) on a scholarship, where he majored in Political Science. He also participated in ROTC, which resulted in a commission as Second Lieutenant in the U.S.

According to Wiley's daughter, Elizabeth Exley, of Crane, after graduating from MSU, Wiley's dream of becoming an attorney (from watching Perry Mason as a child) began to materialize with a full scholarship to law school at Washington University.

"His studies were interrupted by the Vietnam War, though," Exley said.

The hiatus from school proved to have a far-reaching impact for Wiley. While

### COVID-19 numbers on the rise

According to statistics released June 2 by the Barry County Health Department, COVID-19 cases in county have increased.

For the one-week period from May 27 through June 2, 24 new positive cases were reported. The week's positivity rate rose to 6.28 percent, and increase of over four percent from the week prior. Only nine new cases of COVID were reported that week.

Six additional deaths from complications of COVID-19 were reported in Barry County on May 27, the result of a lag in data-processing time on the part of the Department of Health and Senior Services, according to a DHSS press release.

The total number of deaths due to COVID complications currently stands at 59 in Barry County.

According to the health department, 30 percent of Barry County residents had been vaccinated as of June 2, compared to 41.4 percent state-wide.

Reflecting the trend in rising COVID-19 numbers, CoxHealth reports a dramatic rise in the number of COVID patients across their service area.

"In recent weeks, we were encouraged by declining COVID hospitalizations, which had trended downward to less than 20 patients for all of our hospitals, said CoxHealth spokesperson, Kaitlyn McConnell. "However, that has risen back up to nearly 50 as of Tuesday afternoon.

'The rise is likely caused by a combination of factors including the new Delta variant, the end of masking ordinances, and increased gatherings due to things like graduation. We are also seeing younger populations more severely affected than previously, and we are seeing numerous people in their teens, 20s and 30s hospitalized because of the virus.

"We continue to ask our communities to be vaccinated against COVID-19," Mc-Connell added. "This is the

tool that can help keep people safe. We see that firsthand, as very few COVID patients in our hospitals have been vaccinated, and the ones who have been are generally immuno-compromised, with severe co-morbidities which contributed to their hospitalization."

Anyone age 12 or older and who lives or works in Missouri may schedule a free vaccine with CoxHealth by calling 417-269-INFO.

The Barry County Health Department will host a firstdose Pfizer vaccine clinic in Cassville, Saturday, June 26, 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. Appointments may be scheduled by calling 417-847-2114.

"He would like to have worked until his death," Exley said, "because he loved his work."

According to Elizabeth Exley, Wiley was a man of many talents.

"He wrote a book and curated a museum based on his hero, Dewey Short," she said. "He loved history, politics, writing and baseball - especially the Cleveland Indians. He wrote both serious and silly poetry and music and was a student of philosophy and the Bible; he taught others what he learned through

Sunday School classes and lay sermons.

His interest in the Bible, Exley said, stemmed from a lifelong commitment to God, which began when Wiley was a child at Hurley Methodist Church, where he and his father walked down the aisle together.

According to Exley, Wiley's devotion to God and family was unchanging and unshakable, even though his life was anything but easy.

"He gave God the glory for everything," she said. "His last coherent words were, 'I thank God for every day.'

Exley says Wiley is epitomized by Micah 6:8, which asks a question, then gives the answer: "And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

Wiley leaves behind his wife, Jeanelle; his daughter, Elizabeth, and four grandchildren. He was preceded in death one month ago by his son, John Dale Wiley.

A visitation for Wiley will be held on June 17, from 5 - 7 p.m., at Westrip Funeral Home in Crane, with a private service to be held at a later time. Linda Gunter (74), of Monett, died in a Highway 37 wreck Tuesday morning at 11:47 a.m., one mile south of Butterfield. According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol report, a 2009 Freightliner UPS van was being driven south by John Maddux (47), of Springfield, when Maddux turned in front of Gunter's southbound 2015 Ford Taurus. The Ford then struck the Frieghtliner's rear, pushing the Freightliner into 59-year-old Geoffrey Timper's northbound 2015 Chevrolet Silverado.

Gunter was taken by Mercy EMS to

Springfield Mercy Hospital, and pronounced dead at 2:11 p.m. by Dr. Kenneth Larson. Her passenger, Sammie Gunter, 42, was taken to Cox Monett Hospital by EMS with serious injuries. Maddux and Timper (of Crane) were unharmed in the accident, and were wearing safety devices. Linda and Sammie Gunter were not. The Gunters' Ford Taurus and Maddux's Freightliner were extensively damaged, but damage to Timper's Chevrolet was minor.




### Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers



According to the probable cause statement, another witness who was interviewed alleged that he gave Anderson, the victim, \$400 to buy marijuana with on the evening of his murder. The suspects took him out on a drive in order to attempt to rob him, Williams allegedly said.

Renteria-Marquez and Gutierrez are being held in Jasper County Jail, each with a \$350,000 cash-only bond. They are each charged with 2nd Degree Murder and Tampering With Evidence. Their hearings have not yet been scheduled.

Dillon Williams is being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$500,000 cash-only bond. He is charged with 1st Degree Murder, Armed Criminal Action and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. A disposition hearing for Williams is scheduled for June

Dennis was also passionate about building and doing steampunk work. He spent most of his retirement tinkering in steampunk, building things for the grandkids and caring for his family.







First, second and third place prizes will be awarded in the three categories: "Best Catch," "Trout Entree" and "Mystery Basket."

According to Williams, contestants will be judged by local celebrities whose identities will be announced at a later date, Williams said.
