

CHS Football Teams to be inducted into Sports Hall of Fame

Cassville High School's 2008 and 2009 State Champion Football Teams are slated to be inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame during the annual Football Luncheon at the Ozark Empire Fairgrounds in Springfield at 11 a.m. on October 13.

Coached by David Large, the Cassville Wildcats won Class 3 state championships in 2008 and 2009. The 2008 Wildcats beat Cardinal Ritter 31-6 in the finals and finished 12-3. That team won its final seven games after back-

to-back, mid-October losses. Among the late-season wins were 28-14 against Monett in a rematch of one of those losses, plus 26-15 against Logan-Rogersville and a 14-13 semifinal victory against Chillicothe. The 2009 team toppled Bowling Green 24-7 in the finals and finished 14-1. Its only loss was to Branson in the season-opener before the Wildcats won 13 of their next 14 games by an average of 25.6 points. Its closest win was 21-20 against No. 1 Logan-Rogersville in a

Cassville City Council Notes

Cassville City Council met Monday, September 13.

A motion was made and accepted to change the day of the council's monthly meetings from the second Monday to the second Tuesday of every month, beginning Tuesday, October 12. Meetings take place at 5:30 p.m. and are open to the public.

Council approved a Use Tax proposal, which will go before voters on the April municipal ballot. If passed, the use tax will be applied to online purchases in an amount equal to the local sales tax.

According to City Finance Director Isaac Petersen, the use tax will level the playing field for local merchants who have faced competition from online vendors - from whom no sales tax has been collected - in recent years.

According to Works Director David Brock, American Rescue Plan Funds are available for municipalistate treasurer's office."

"If other counties or towns don't turn down the opportunity to use the funds, Cassville's portion will be \$663,875," Brock said.

Brock said many steps including an application process - would need to be taken before the funds would be available for use, but a preliminary plan to use prospective funds for a new public works maintenance facility was presented to council.

"The idea is to get our current facility (located at 7th and Mill Streets) out of the flood plain," Brock said. "Also, such a project will meet the qualifications for the rescue plans funds."

Mark Malance suffered serious injuries and was transported by Mercy Air Ambulance, while Bonnie Malanca suffered moderate injuries and was transported by Barry-Lawrence ambulance.

Moderate damage

sustained by Parvi's Toyota Sienna; the Malancas' Harley Davidson sustained extensive damage. All involved were wearing safety devices.

According to another Missouri Highway Patrol report, at 7:15 p.m. on September 16, Billy Dodd (35), of Aurora, was driving an eastbound 2005 Suzuki VL800 when he failed to negotiate a curve on Highway TT, 3 miles west of Crane. Dodd travelled off of the left side of the roadway and overturned. He was transported by Cox Health Ambulance to Cox South Hospital in Springfield with serious injuries. Dodd was not wearing a safety device, and the Suzuki VL800 sustained extensive damage.

Domestic dispute results in **Shell Knob fire**

Around 9:30 p.m. Tuesday, September 14, a Barry County deputy responded to a domestic dispute in the Stallion Bluff area near Shell Knob. However, "sometime before that deputy arrived," began Central Crossing Fire Chief Rusty Rickard, "the 9-1-1 dispatcher got information from the caller that somebody in the house had set it on fire. The caller at that time was trapped in a third-story bed-

Then, Central Crossing Firefighters were dispatched

"Thankfully, we had a firefighter who lived in the area," Rickard continued. "He and several of our units responded. He was actually able to get the caller on the phone, and she was able to explain to him where she was in the home; he was able to get on the back

porch, which put him on the second story. They used a ladder, had her kick a screen out, and successfully rescued her from that third-story window. As that was taking place, the Barry County Sheriff arrived and successfully rescued (a person) from the living room area of the second floor.

'The female who had been trapped on the third floor had no injuries or smoke inhalation issues - she required little to no medical treatment."

The man found in the living room, unfortunately, suffered serious burns and was transported by helicopter to a hospital in Springfield. "The law enforcement officers' actions were just as heroic as ours," continued Rickard. "Stone County, Barry County - fire and law - (we're all) neighbors."



Rogersville upsets Cassville, 28-13

double-Rogersville's threat quarterback, JJ O'Neal, ran for 153 yards and passed for 105 more to lead the maroon Wildcats past Cassville on Friday night, 28-13.

The Cassville Wildcats never led in this game. With the score tied at 7-7, O' Neal escaped for a 49-yard touchdown run to end the first half. Cassville pulled within a point with a trickeration TD and a missed PAT, but Rogersville scored twice in the final three minutes of the fourth quarter to post the 28-13 final score.

Team and individual matchups favored Rogersville in this game. O' Neal was way faster than any of the Cassville defenders. Time after time, the Rogersville

wideouts ran deep patterns as decoys, leaving open field for O' Neal to run. The Cassville offensive line could not protect Cutter Hicks in the pocket, and he spent much of the night running for his life.

The turnover bug bit Cassville at a critical juncture late in the game. Trailing 21-13 with just under three minutes left to play, Hicks was sacked and the ball came loose. Rogersville recovered at the Cassville 33-yard line, and drove in for the clinching score with just 13 seconds on the clock.

FIREWORKS

There were fireworks on and off the field Friday night. Eight minutes ran off the first quarter clock with no score, but then Hernan Hernandez took a 21 yard loss when fielding a bad snap out of punt formation. Blessed with a short field at the Cassville 19-yard line, Rogersville scored in just five plays, with Patrick Comito scoring on a four-yard run. Thessen Prenger added the PAT for a 7-0 lead.

The Cassville Wildcats answered with their best drive of the night. Hicks directed a nine-play, 75-yard odyssey that ended with a Jake Anthonysz 11-yard touchdown run at the 9:52 mark of the second quarter. Anthonysz joined the running back corps for the first time this year against ing posted a monster game against Mt. Vernon in the season opener, Cassville has relied on running back by committee.

Peter Littlefield tied the game at 7-7 with his PAT.

Then, O' Neal dazzled the crowd with his 49-yard cutback scramble for a score with 2:44 left before halftime. Another Prenger kick gave Rogersville a 14-7 lead.

Hernandez returned the ensuing kickoff to the Cassville 49-yard line. The Wildcats drove down to the 26-yard line, but Hicks was sacked on third down, and the clock ran out.

Cassville drove into the red zone late in the third quarter, but came up short on fourth down and Rogersville took over at the six-yard line. O' Neal led his team deep into Cassville territory to christen the fourth quarter, but his fumble gave the ball back to Cassville at the 19-yard line with 9:15 left to play.

On first down, Hicks was sacked again, this time back at his own three-yard line. On third-and-forever from the 11-yard line, Cassville coaches threw caution to the wind and turned to the last page in the play book.

Cassville lined up in the I-formation, the signal to the defense that a conservative run and a punt would follow. Hicks took the snap and pitched to Anthonysz running left. He handed the ball to Keaton Shellenberger on the reverse, and he abruptly pulled up, set his feet and hurled a long bomb to an uncovered Hernandez at the Cassville 41-yard line. The defenders, who totally bought the run fake, could not recover, and Hernandez raced down the Rogersville sideline and into the end zone with 7:30 remaining.

Eighty nine yards. Wow. But the Cassville crowd went silent when Rogersville blocked Littlefield's PAT try, protecting the 14-13 lead.

Then the visitors made a statement drive, covering 66-yards in 10 plays. Caleb Cole became the third Rogersville runner to score in the game, finding the end zone from five yards out. Prenger connected again for a 21-13 lead with 2:56 left to play.

On the first play following the kickoff, Hicks was sacked yet again, and his fumble gave the ball back to Rogersville at the Cassville 33-yard line.

O' Neal limped off with an injury on second down, and Prenger - the kicker - replaced him at quarterback. On his first snap, Prenger

drilled a third-down slant to Logan White for a 20-yard gain to move the chains. Two plays later, Prenger found White again to set up 1stand-goal with the clock racing under a minute.

Take a knee, let the clock run out, shake hands and go home, right?

Nope.

Rogersville called time out with 17 seconds left, and then Luke Hauer creased the left side for a four-yard touchdown run. Prenger drilled his fourth PAT of the night to ice the game, 28-13.

STATS

Cassville gained 312 total yards on the night, versus 394 for Rogersville.

Rogersville had more yards rushing - 241 to 181 - but Cassville led in aerial yards, 131 to 105, although 89 of those yards came on the one trick play.

JJ O' Neal led all rushers with 153 yards on 21 carries.

Jake Anthonysz led Cassville with 66 yards on 13 attempts.

Cassville only fumbled once but gave up possession on downs three times in critical situations.

Rogersville improved to

1-3 with the win, ending the three-game losing streak.

Cassville dipped to 1-3, and faces a daunting road trip to play unbeaten Lamar. The Lamar Tigers knocked the Nevada Tigers out of the unbeaten ranks in a 48-22 game on Friday night. Springfield Catholic and Mt. Vernon remain winless after four weeks of play.

Cassville will be underdogs against three - if not more - of their remaining five opponents, an acknowledgement of the Bill Parcells quote, "You are what your record says you are." But like Lance Parnell preaches year after year, "We want to be playing our best ball at the end of the season."

under the auspices of Cassville First United Methodist Church and is directed by Derek Cornelius, a former addict himself, who designed the year-long program with the help of a pastor in Springfield. Life Change involves the formation of new daily and weekly habits - including meetings, journaling, classes in financial management and volunteering in the community. After 30 days, participants can meet weekly with a mentor.

Cornelius, now 35, says he was addicted to prescription opioid drugs for about five years when he was in his early 20s.

"After resorting to selling them to support my own habit, I landed in jail," he said. "I figured out quickly that it wasn't how I wanted to spend the rest of my life. I hated the world, life and everything around me.

"After I got out of jail, I returned to my parents' house," Cornelius said, "and with their support, I became involved with a faith-based recovery program at a church in Springfield. That's where I designed the Life Change program, which I've been sharing with recovering addicts for the past four years."

That church is also where he met Jeff Fugitt, the pastor of Cassville United Methodist Church.

"We'd had people inquiring about recovery programs at our church here in Cassville," Fugitt said, "so I contacted Derek several months ago to see if he'd be willing to

come down and start a program here."

Cornelius, who lives in Bolivar, was willing. He now spends three days a week (Sunday, Monday and Tuesday) in Cassville, when he stavs in a room at His House in Shell Knob.

The fledgling Cassville ministry he directs meets Sundays at 6 p.m. and Tuesdays at noon in space at Show Me Plaza at 404 State Hwy. 248, Cassville. Childcare is available.

"We always have a meal," Cornelius said, "then, depending on the day, either life-planning classes, inspirational message and small group discussions.

"We have social activities, too," he said. "Some of those involve helping people in the community."

Cornelius emphasized that although the program is affiliated with a church, a person doesn't have to be churchaffiliated to be a part of it. "I won't preach at you," he

Phil and Valarie Hutchens, who donated to the foundation on behalf of Life Change, feel strongly about helping people in the area who strug-

gle with addiction. "We have to offer people a choice, a way out," Phil Hutchens said.

"Jesus doesn't tell anyone 'three strikes and you're out," Valarie Hutchens said. "He pursues you no matter where you're at in life."

Life Change Ministry offers one more option to those in the community who may be struggling.

"Anything that has been going on for almost four decades has some tradition," said Coach Steve Voyak, who


