Roaring River Spring deepest in nation, no bottom in sight

During their last dive of the year into Roaring River Spring, the KISS Rebreathers team, headed up by diver Mike Young, of Fort Smith, Arkansas, slipped "easily" (according to Young) to a depth of 472 feet into the spring on Saturday, surpassing their state record of 451 feet, set on October 24.


With Saturday's dive, they went deeper than divers at Phantom Springs Cave in West Texas, who reached a depth of 462 feet in 2013. At the time, it was ranked by Caving News as the "deepest underwater cave system known in the United States."

"Roaring River Spring would now be ranked the deepest natural spring in the United States to date," Curt Bowen said Monday by email. Bowen is the CEO and

founder of Advanced Diver Magazine, the world's largest publication for advanced and technical diving, owner and CEO of Rebreatherworld. com, and vice president for the ADM Exploration Foundation, a nonprofit organization dedicated to underwater exploration, discovery and education.

"There was about a 90 percent chance we would have to abort Saturday's dive without reaching our goal of 470 feet," Young said. "Randall (Purdy) and I were both using some new and replacement pieces of equipment, so we were prepared to cut the dive short and come back to the surface if we had any problems. Luckily, we didn't have to. Everything just fell into place perfectly."



Forty-eight new cases were reported on November 11, an increase of 19 new casissued on November 2. Sixtyeight patients were reported as in isolation, an increase of 26 from the November 2 report, and over 75 people were in quarantine after exposure to a person with active CO-VID-19.

sponsibilities. Neill received a particular stroke of luck with a telephone call from a representative with the USDA Office in Columbia, asking Neill if he would like to transfer into the Cassville office in anticipation of Martin Phipps's retirement. Neill accepted gladly.

"Within a few weeks," Renae said, "[Russ] found himself right back where his journey with the agency began when he was just 20 years old."

Neill continued to work for the USDA Farm Service Agency for more than three decades. He will retire Thursday, November 18, with 37 years under his belt.

"Russ enjoyed the variety of roles that came along with the job," Renae Neill said. "Every farm operation is different and, of course, every farm family is unique. The people he worked with in the FSA office became his closest friends and, quite simply, he was happy. God provided a career that allowed him to help others, use his gifts and strengths, and work with people he cared about. Why would he ever leave?





Dr. Larry Quinalty, English professor at Crowder College and Drury University, recently completed his fourth cookbook containing recipes specifically designed to be cooked in a Dutch oven. Of the 268 recipes in the book, 116 of them are gluten-free.

'I've never seen anything like it before," Mike Young said, "not in any of my cave explorations anywhere in the world."

Diver/cartographer Lillestolen submitted a photo and video of the creature to Dr. Michael Sutton, who manages the biology database within the greater Missouri cave database, works with the Cave Research Foundation (CRF), and has

spent 30 years researching Missouri cave life. Sutton responded that the creature is likely the grotto salamander, a blind, cave-adapted salamander which, Sutton says, is common in caves in southwest Missouri. He plans to add a tentative identification to the Missouri cave biology database.

Young said he and Purdy achieved the record depth of 472 feet in Roaring River Cave and were back up to the restriction which exists at a depth of 225 feet below the surface, within 29 minutes. The preponderance of the almost three-hour dive was then spent in decompression (or "deco," as it's called by the divers) at various depths for different intervals of time.

While Young and Purdy dove deep, other members of the team remained above the restriction to continue mapping and exploration efforts. Gayle Orner, of Madison, Wisconsin - the only female member of the team attempted to find a possible passage connecting the

known air bell (the Colossal Dome) in the upper cavern, with the newly-discovered surface air bells in the second

"If such a passage exists," she said, "I didn't find it."

According to Mike Young, after the weekend dive, further expeditions will be on hiatus until their application for a 2022 permit is reviewed and prospectively approved by the Missouri Department of National Resources

"We're not scheduling a dive for December," Young said, "and with the typically large amount of rain we get in the spring, we don't anticipate being able to deep-dive again until June of 2022, and that's only, of course, if our permit is approved."

Young says there is plenty of mapping to do in the caverns without having to dive

"We'd like to find out just how large that bottom cavern is," he said.




Harold "Red" Lavern Scates, 85, of Pea Ridge, Arkansas, died November 9, 2021, at his home.







Farm Succession Planning Workshop Set for November 30

A workshop to help farm families plan for transitioning to the next generation is being held Tuesday, November 30 a the Southwest Research and Education Center in Mount Vernon. 
