# **Fitzpatrick files** bill to stop SWEPCO

State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick filed House Bill 1622 today in response to the proposed Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO) route through Southern Missouri. Representative Bill Lant, R-Pineville, co-sponsored the bill. The route enters Missouri in McDonald County and exits in Barry County near Selig-

If passed, HB 1622 will remove jurisdiction from the Missouri Public Service Commission to approve Route 109, or any similar route which originates and terminates in Arkansas, and

which transverses McDonald or Barry counties.

"I am doing all I can to protect the citizens of southwest Missouri. While I cannot guarantee that this bill will pass, Representative Lant and I will work diligently to see that it achieves passage in the House," said Fitzpatrick, R-Cassville.

The bill includes an emergency clause, which if signed into law and approved by a separate two-thirds majority, will go into effect 10 days after being signed by the gov-

# **Barry Commissioners** approve 2014 budget

At their annual budget meeting, the Barry County Commissioners approved the 2014 budget for the county departments. The budgets proposed by the various departments were fairly similar to the approved budget thanks to additional revenue to be generated by the 1/8 cent tax increase approved by voters in April

Presiding Commissioner Cherry Warren stated, "We've very thankful for our taxpayers for approving our 1/8 cent sales tax last year. We've tried to be very careful that we funded the things we promised them we would."

The budget proposals this year totalled \$3,677,255, including the emergency fund. The Commissioners approved \$3,613,988, around \$64,000 less than asked but still a huge jump from 2013's slim \$3,164,283 actual bud-

The changes for the 2014 put the numbers more in line with the figures approved for years prior to 2013. Last year was the smallest operating budget in more than five

Among the approvals within the budget was the anticipated raise for county employees who had not received a raise since 2007. Each county employee received a six percent raise, but no elected officials received an increase in salary. Elected officials receive raises based on a salary commission meeting which declined to

meet this year under the un-

derstanding that no raises were requested.

The Barry County Jail received additional funding to staff an additional jailer a part-time janitor, a parttime clerk and also to combat rising food costs. County Clerk Gary Youngblood stated, "Grocery increases were pretty significant." The jail received \$55,000 more than they were granted in 2013.

The Prosecuting Attorney's office also received a big budget increase from 2013 to add a new full time prosecuting attorney, clerk and equipment. They were granted \$69,526 to cover those changes. Commissioner Warren expressed how important the sales tax increase was to the County's budget this year, "We want to keep people's trust and do what we said we would do, because we would be in straits without that additional revenue."

Youngblood agreed, "I want to echo the appreciation for our voters on the sales tax issue. We want to take care of our people."

Warren offered insight about concerns for future budget considerations, "One of our major concerns for the future is what insurance premiums will do." The County pays for employee insurance benefits.

Warren continued, "We need to get our reserves built back up so that if we are in a down slide we can offset it until the revenues come back up."

### Mayor proclaims Ronald McDonald House week

Cassville Mayor Bill Shiveley made an official proclamation that the week of February 10 through February 16 be "Ronald McDonald House Week" for the city.

Each year, McDonald's restaurants use the Share a Heart Campaign to raise money for the non-profit that helps ease the burden of parents of sick children all over. The Share a Heart campaign runs January 24 through February 28 this year.

Springfield has two Ronald McDonald houses available for parents with children in the hospital. On average, parents stay seven days at the houses with all of their needs met, including food, funding for emergency expenses, laundry centers and transportation, all at no cost to the family.

There have been 506 Barry County families served by the Ronald McDonald House near Cox South and Mercy in Springfield. Of those 506, 98 of those families were from Cassville, sparking the City's decision to proclaim a week dedicated to helping fund the charitable cause. Last year, Share a Heart raised \$116,500 for the Ronald McDonald House. The non-profit requires \$800,000 to operate

annually through funding from the private sector.

To participate in the program, citizens can donate \$1, \$5 or \$20 to purchase a heart to be displayed at the local McDonald's.

# Sater pushes for propane investigation

Senator David Sater, R-Cassville, and other Senators are calling for an investigation into recent extreme price increases for propane

homeowners. "Many farmers, and small business owners in southwest Missouri depend on propane gas to heat their homes and run their businesses," said Sen. Sater. "We need to find out why the price has spiked recently and what can be done to give Missourians relief from this price-gouging." The wholesale price of

propane climbed \$1.25 in less than 24 hours last week and, in Branson, prices have skyrocketed from around \$2 to over \$6 a gallon. A number of factors are contributing to the price increase but it appears that poor management by the industry has contributed most to the price increase. Between September and October of 2013, exports of propane from the United States rose by 73,000 barrels a day, according the U.S. Energy

Information Administration. With so much of our supply dedicated to foreign exports, it is not surprising that domestic supplies could not keep pace with demand. With an already dangerously cold winter and colder temperatures on the way again this week, it is deeply troubling that manufacturers are taking advantage of the situation and creating an artificial shortage to drive up

Senator Mike Parson, R-Bolivar, and Sen. Tom Dempsey, R-St. Charles, have been leaders on this issue, calling for an investigation by the Missouri Attorney General's office.

"I join my colleagues in calling on the Attorney General's office to investigate why the people of Missouri are being forced into this situation and to take every necessary step in holding those responsible accountable," said Sen. Sater. "We know this problem is coming from manufacturers and not local sellers. After many



# Medicare education help stats announced

The citizens of Barry County participated in an annual savings of \$19,455.00 from the Medicare Assistance Team Helping Seniors 2013 through the Central Crossing Senior Center in Shell Knob. This averaged \$102 in savings for each senior that received assistance from the Team. This was the sixth year for the Medicare Assistance Program.

This program, launched in 2008, helps all seniors in Barry County who need assistance in their Medicare Plans and benefits.

The assistance is free and provided by a trained team of six volunteers and two coordinators. All team counselors receive annual training on Medicare benefit provider plans, including the insurance program called Medicare Supplement Insurance.

The success of this plan over their six year history is as follows:

2008 - 92 seniors counseled saved \$23,969.00.

2009 - 91, \$14,908.00. 2010 - 133, \$43,924.00.

2011 - 130, \$31,218.00.

2012 - 150, \$41,000.00. 2013 - 192, \$19,455.00.

The program is searching for individuals that would be interested in serving as a volunteer for the program in the future. If interested, contact the Central Crossing Senior Center (417) 858-6952. All volunteers will receive training prior to becoming a counselor.

Each year during the open enrollment period for Medicare, the program offers valuable help with the many decisions pertaining to Part D. The open enrollment is between October 15 and December 7. They offer the program to new Medicare recipients and those needing a review.

The program is made possible by funding from the Barry County Senior Services Tax Board, Southwest Missouri Office on Aging and donations.

A local man was sentenced to 30 days in jail, one year unsupervised probation, and 40 hours of community service after blowing a blood alcohol concentration of .234 percent, 0.154 percent over the legal limit.

On Sunday, May 5, 2013, Trooper Monk stopped a maroon 2001 Pontiac Grand Prix for exceeding the posted speed limit and failing to drive on the right half of the roadway. This took place on US 60 in Barry County.

The driver of the vehicle was later identified as Mitchell Lowery, of Pierce City. Monk noticed a strong odor of alcohol coming from Lowery's breath, his eyes were also watery, bloodshot, and glassy.

Lowery agreed to perform several sobriety tests. He received six points during the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus and failed to adequately perform the Walk-And-Turn and the one leg stand balance tests. During the tests, Lowry's balance was uncertain and he was swaying. He was then determined intoxicated based on his odor, appearance, movements, sobriety test and behavior.

After Lowry was arrested, he agreed to a blood alcohol concentration test, resulting in an outcome of .234%.



meeting, Jethro Otto Veatch of Michigan State University knew of the Russian origin of the ABC soil profile when he publicly referred to it as 'the Glinka scheme.' The foreign source of this soil concept was known among the soil scientists and seemed to be less of a problem. Marbut's 1927 presentations at the First International Congress of Soil Science and his 1928 lectures

By the 1924 ASSA in the Graduate School of the USDA represented further opportunities to promote the Russian ideas. The lectures, some of which were published in 1951, contained numerous references to the Russian work and influenced many soil scientists.

The results of his lifelong work on the description and classification of the soils of the USA were published in the 1935 Atlas of Agriculture that included a monumental soil map.

From 1920 until 1935, Marbut assumed the role of an internationalist in the field of soils. His extensive travels and explorations during this period carried him to many parts of the world and gained for him the well-earned reputation as an international authority on soil geography as much at home in the study of the soils of Europe, Africa, and South America as those of his homeland.

### 70th wedding anniversary

Mr. and Mrs Cecil Treat, of Cassville, are celebrating their 70th wedding anniversary. Cecil Treat and Claudia Chloerene (Chlo) Foster were married Jan. 28, 1944, at Mountain View, Ark.

They are the parents of three children, Chelle Catron of Springfield, David Treat and wife, Lori, of Cassville, and Donna Medders and husband, Howell, of Fayetteville, Ark. They have five grandchildren, Corey Medders, Jon Medders, Keisha Catron, Tanner Thompson and Samantha

Woods. They also have five great-grandchildren, Chloe Medders, Lara Medders, Adam Medders, Lilith Woods and Lexi Brooks.

Marbut acquired his firsthand knowledge of soils and landscapes of the world through his exhausting schedule of trips and expeditions. His first trip to Europe was on a sabbatical from UMC in 1899-1900 with colleague Isidor Loeb, during which they studied the Alps, the Hungarian plain, the Mediterranean region, the British Isles, and Scandinavia. In 1918, Marbut and Schantz, who had gone from the UMC to the USDA Bureau of Plant Industry, studied the vegetation and soils of Africa for the American Commission to Negotiate Peace. In April 1919, Marbut and Bureau of Soils colleague Hugh Hammond Bennett went to Latin America to soil survey a disputed boundary between Guatemala and Honduras, sponsored by the American Geographical Society (AGS). He traveled to Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1922 for the International Agrogeology Conference and subsequent field trip. From July 1923 to January 1924, he mapped the interior Amazon basin as a representative of the Brazilian-American Rubber Commission. Immediately afterward, until July, he studied the soils of Argentina under sponsorship of the AGS. Later that year, he traveled to Rome for the meeting of agro-geologists at which he assisted in the formation of the International Society of Soil Science (ISSS). At this meeting, Jacob G. Lipman of Rutgers University and he began preparations for holding the First International Congress of Soil Science in Washington,

DC in 1927. Though Marbut made two presentations on soil classification during the Commission V session of the 10-day First International Congress that lasted from 13-22 June, 1927, his legacy of the meeting was the organization of the postmeeting Transcontinental Excursion. The Excursion was a 12,000-mile railroad train trip of 30 days (commencing on June 22) through 23 states in the USA and four Canadian provinces to examine soils and landscapes at 34 stops. The Excursion advanced the sharing of ideas among soil scientists from around the world through the constant opportunities for interaction on the train, at the individual stops and through the daily Excursion newspaper, the Boden Bull. In early 1928, Marbut visited Bennett's soil survey party in Cuba. In May 1929, he went to Danzig (modern Gdansk) for ISSS Commission V meetings and then to Soviet Russia in mid-1930 for the Second International Congress of Soil Science. The Excursion following the Second Congress meetings gave Marbut a view of the soils of western Russia from Moscow south to the region between the Black and Caspian Seas. He also visited Germany, particularly the Black Forest region, immediately afterward. James Thorp reported that Marbut visited his soil survey party in Puerto Rico early in 1932. This was immediately after attending the Fourth International Congress of Sugar Cane Technologist. In 1933, Marbut accepted

an assignment to advise the National Geological Survey of China in their organizing of a soil survey. To this end, Marbut sent James Thorp, his colleague from the Washington, DC soil survey office, to China in 1933 to train students in soil survey methods. By early 1935, enough progress in the soil survey of China had been made that it was necessary for Marbut to travel to China to render opinions on the descriptions and classification of the soils. In consultation with Thorp, Marbut decided to travel to China following his attendance at the Third International Congress of Soil Science in Oxford, UK. In August 1935, Marbut traveled to England as a delegate to the Third Congress. Immediately after the meetings, he traveled through Europe and then, by the Trans-Siberian Railroad, through southern Russia. During the Siberian leg of the trip, Marbut was stricken with double pneumonia. He was taken from the train in Harbin, Manchuria (now Haerpin in Heilungkiang province), to the German-Russian hospital there. When summoned to Marbut's bedside, Thorp recalled Marbut telling him, as he neared death at age 72, "You've got to get me out of here; I have ten more years of work to do." Unfortunately, he died early the next morning. According to Thorp, the American Consulate held a beautiful memorial service at which a Russian refugee chorus sang. His ashes were sent back to Cassville where they were buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery next to family.

# **BC Silver Spoons awarded**

The Barry County Health Department announced that thirteen food establishments in Barry County received the 2013 Silver Spoon award. The awards are presented to food establishments in Barry County that did not have any critical or non-critical health violations between January 1 and December 31 of 2013.

This is the fifth year that the health department has recognized establishments for demonstrating excellence in public food safety through the Silver Spoon award. The frequency of inspection of each food establishment is determined by public health priority, which is calculated by a risk assessment worksheet. Establishments are rated as high, medium, or low priority.

The Central Crossing Senior Center in Shell Knob and Big Baldy's in Monett are recipients of the 2013 Silver Spoon Award. These establishments are both rated high and are inspected a minimum of three times per year.

Kountry Kitchen Katering in Shell Knob and Roaring River Waterslide in Cassville have medium priority ratings and are recipients of the Silver Spoon Award. Establishments with a medium priority rating are inspected a minimum of twice a year.

A total of nine establishments with a low priority rating achieved the Silver Spoon. Low priorities are inspected at least once a year. In Monett, Barry-Lawrence Development Center, Coffee Cabin, Harlan Fruit Company, Show-Me-Twice the Ice and Modern Variety were recipients. Lakeside Marine in Shell Knob, L & L Stop & Shop in Exeter, Aldavas Aragon in Purdy, and Nita's Cakes in Cassville also received the award.

The Health Department congratulates these establishments and hopes the recognition will encourage all food establishments to strive to provide the safest food to Barry County residents.

# Rep. Scott Fitzpatrick seeks reelection

State Rep. Scott Fitzpatrick announced on Monday January 27, that he will seek reelection to the Missouri House of Representatives in the 158th district, which includes all of Barry County and parts of Stone and Lawrence Counties, including Pierce City.

Representative Fitzpatrick was elected to his first term in 2012 after garnering approximately 42% of the vote in the three-person primary election and nearly 80% of the vote in the twoway general election.

After being sworn in, Fitzpatrick was appointed by the Speaker of the House to serve on the Tourism and Natural Resources committee, which considers legislation that impacts, and provides oversight for, the Department of Conservation and the Department of Natural Resources, which are the departments responsible for the management of Roaring River State

Fitzpatrick's other committee assignments were to the Appropriations Committee for Transportation, Economic Development and



Revenue, and the Budget Committee. Fitzpatrick was also appointed to the Fiscal Review Committee at the beginning of this year.

During his first term, Fitzpatrick was the first legislator in his class to carry a bill to passage. The bill, HB 163, gave the cities of Monett and West Plains more control over their municipal elections, authority which every other city in the state already had. Fitzpatrick also supported and sponsored legislation to reform the welfare system in Missouri, protect Missourians' right to bear arms, protect the unborn, and defend Missourians' civil liberties.

While Fitzpatrick has worked on a variety of legislative priorities, he has found a niche in the House as an increasingly reliable expert on the state budget, which earned him the recent appointment to the Fiscal Review Committee.

"It is hard to believe the time has already come to seek reelection, but it has been a true honor to serve the 158th district for the last year, and I feel that I can make a greater impact in another term as I close the knowledge gap in fully understanding the legislative process and begin to build extremely valuable institutional knowledge," Fitzpatrick said. "If the people of the district send me back for a second term, I will continue to protect their values, and work diligently to ensure their tax dollars are spent wisely and efficiently."

The 97th General Assembly convened on January 8, 2014, for their second regular session.

Michael Blake Green, age 31, of Cassville was killed when the ATV he was driving travelled off of the roadway on East 13th Street and struck a brick post on the front of a residence. Lt. Boyd of the Cassville Police Department was the investigating officer on scene.
