Barry Electric Cooperative: 101

Learn about your local electricity provider

 After moving to Cassville last fall from an area where electricity was provided by Liberty Utilities, I was unfamiliar with the operation of my new provider: Barry Electric, a rural electric cooperative. However, I viewed it as a good opportunity to learn, and Barry Electric CEO, Jennifer McBroom, was willing to provide me with information. Here follows Part One of our conversation.

Barry Electric’s website describes an electric cooperative as a private, not-for-profit company whose purpose is to deliver reliable electricity to its customers or members. It must fulfill The cooperative’s two main requirements are: to re-invest revenue into the cooperative’s service-area communities through stable rates and infrastructure, or to return it to members through patronage capital.

New Barry Electric CEO, Jennifer McBroom, offered clarity.

“Barry Electric is part of a three-tiered cooperative system,” she explained. “We are a distributor of electricity, that electricity is transmitted to our substations by KAMO Power, based in Vinita, Oklahoma.”

KAMO, according to its website, is a generation and transmission (G&T) co-

operative which transmits electricity to 17 distribution cooperatives – including Barry Electric – in northeast Oklahoma and southwest Missouri. KAMO is one of six G&T utility cooperatives, which, in turn, are member/owners of Associated Electric Cooperative, headquartered in Springfield.

In its role, Associated Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Associated) generates the electricity to be distributed and transmitted through 51 cooperatives in Oklahoma, Missouri, and Iowa.

According to Jennifer McBroom, Associated uses a mix of resources to generate power, including hydro, wind, coal, and natural gas. Not all the energy sources can be considered “clean energy,” nevertheless, the mix of options offers advantages to their cooperative members, McBroom says.

“During the cold snap in February,” McBroom said, “when other utility companies ran out of resources and were forced to impose rolling

blackouts on their customers, because Associated Electric has optional resources, we were able to keep up with demands, so that our members didn’t experience those black-outs.”

In Barry County, Barry Electric Cooperative provides electricity to some 7,000 members divided among three districts, with Cassville central to distribution points of the service territory. Barry Electric supplies areas as far north as Butterfield and south of Cassville, near the state line.

Each district has three directors who serve three-year staggered terms. Every year, one of the directors is up for re-election, dependent upon a nomination from fellow cooperative members in their district. Voting takes place during the co-op’s annual meeting every spring. During the week prior to Annual Meeting, members are able to register and vote at the office of BEC. On the day of Annual Meeting, members are able to vote, enjoy live

music, and have the opportunity to meet those who make the local decisions about the cooperative they’re members of.

McBroom was chosen for the role of CEO for Barry Electric in March of this year, after five years as the Chief Financial Officer for the cooperative and prior experience in the banking industry.

McBroom relocated to southwest Missouri from Clarksville, Tennessee, in 2014, with her husband, Tony, and sons, Aiden and Estin.

“My roots in Cassville run deep,” she said. “It’s the place where my grandparents, Don and Margaret Beeson, lived when I was young, and where my mother now lives. I’ve always called it my second home.”

McBroom will soon call Cassville her first home, after she and her family complete a move from Monett.

At 3 p.m., Moss exited the water when she began to feel ill. According to a Missouri

State Highway Patrol report, she was transported by an acquaintance to the Central Crossings Fire Station, where she was pronounced dead at 4:21 p.m. by Dr. Dustin Gammon from Mercy Hospital. Moss was then trans-

ported by Deputy Coroner Todd McCoy, from Central Crossings Fire Station to Fohn Funeral home in Cassville.

This is the seventh drowning in Troop D’s territory in 2021.

This October, the twenty-sixth annual Cassville Show will be performed in the FEMA building. The Show has occurred every year since 1993, except for 2020 due to COVID-19 precautions. Above, the core band rehearses their weekly session in preparation for the concert. "Greg Beck and his wife Brenda are the engine that pushes everything," says Jim Craig, trumpet player for the band. "Without them nothing would happen."

In 1991, Greg missed his years of playing professionally in bands, and decided he'd like to start one. So he sat down with his wife, pencil and paper in hand, and they listed people he'd played with in the past. "Our first show, we practiced from October to October," Brenda recalled. "The Chamber of Commerce and the city sponsored the event. They did the advertising and the food, but the band takes nothing," she continued. All proceeds from ticket sales go to the Cassville Chamber of Commerce, so "everybody here is doing it out of the goodness of their heart," said Craig. "Everybody here works for some-

body; we're just normal folks who are really interested in music. We play because we love what we do, and there's a fair number of people here that could be playing in Branson every week." Although there is a core band, "singers are never turned down, there are no try-outs," Brenda said, "and we want to involve as many school age kids as possible, from all over the county." The Show is a display of local talent, "and there's a lot of it around here," said Craig. The Show will be in the FEMA building this October 21, 23, and 24.

From 9 a.m. - 2 p.m., the Habitat's parking lot was open for crafts to recreate old furniture into works of art. "This is a great way to fulfill our mission," said Habitat for Humanity Board member, Monique Hannam. "To bring the community together and bring funding to build Barry County houses, and to create things that are meaningful, and help the environment."

Hannam moved to Barry County from Carmel, Indiana, where classes could be taken in her neighborhood on upcycling, and where multiple stores sold upcycled furniture. At Habitat, Hannam seeks to use Habitat's steady flow

Local Realtor encourages COVID-19 vaccination

Rob Lotufo, of Exeter, is encouraging residents to get a COVID-19 vaccine after a personal encounter with the virus that left him isolated in the hospital for five days.. "I was kind of riding the fence on this vaccination thing and was a little skeptical," Lotufo said. Lotufo learned, though, that the virus is not a respecter of persons, and, often, those people experience wildly different symptoms. "My wife got sick first," he said, "and had only lower gastrointestinal issues. I had no symptoms whatsoever; in

fact, I wouldn't have thought I was sick, except that I became so weak and fatigued that I couldn't walk to the mailbox without needing a three-hour nap." When it became all Lotufo could do to hold his head up, his wife insisted on taking him to Cox Monett. Upon arrival, medical personnel discovered his oxygen saturation level had dropped to nearly 80 percent. They admitted him immediately.

"They gave me four liters of oxygen through a nasal canula over a four-day period," Lotufo said, "plus a couple of different meds through an IV drip." "When you lie in a hospital bed for four or five days, you think about things a little bit - about the possibility of death, among other things. This has been a reality check for me and several families at church. Whether you think it's a conspiracy or not, you

learn you're not immune to the virus." "Now that I know what it's like, wouldn't wish COVID on anyone. Get the vaccination," he said. "Don't risk getting COVID."

On May 22, the Southwest School sent three squads to compete at the ATA and AIM zone state shoot at the Missouri Trap Shooters Association in Linn Creek. The Missouri Trap Shooters Association offers 60 traps, and is the 2nd largest trapshooting facility in the world.

The rain did not seem to affect the Junior squad consisting of juniors Olivia Ayer, Ty Howard, and Samuel Jennings, as well as freshman Caleb Ayer and Alex Ramirez as they shot their first 100 rounds.

Freshman Caleb Ayer shot his first 100 straight during a rainy morning.

After about a two hour break, the sun came out and a breeze made conditions completely different for the squad's second 100. The squad had little trouble adjusting to the different conditions.

Caleb Ayer walked off the line dropping only four birds all day. He had a final score of 196/200. Fourteen year old Ayer out-shot all the Missouri Sub-Junior competitors and walked away with the championship.

Howard was runner up for the Class B Junior Shooters; Jennings was runner up for the Class D Junior Shooters; and the Junior squad ended the day with a 4th place win.

In other highlights, Teresa Tobey Thompson shot a personal best.

In Barry County, trapshooting is unique to the Southwest school district. The team practices once a week and competes at shoots twice a month from January to August. Teams fire at round, orange clays for targets facing all kinds of competitors. Southwest faces high school, 4H, and FFA teams, as well as shooters of all ages. High school members are

Caleb Ayer, Olivia Ayer, Ty Howard, Sam Jennings, Alex Ramirez, Teresa Tobey, Kai-zer Slinkard, and Lilly Wolf. Middle school members are Levi Carden, Devin Hall, Samuel Lawrence, Hunter Patterson, Colton Phillips, and Bailey Stephens.

Competitors fire a total of 125 rounds at each shoot. They rotate through five different stations, shooting at five clays at each one. The rotation is completed five times, with the first 25 shots considered a warm-up. The clays are shot in squads, with five shooters in each. Southwest has three squads where high school and middle school shoot together.

Shooters are placed in different divisions and classes according to their age and skill. The age groups are categorized as: Pre-sub, 5th grade and under; Sub-Jr, 6th through 9th grade; and Junior, for fifteen-year-olds.

and above. There are other groups for shooters of every age, including adults.

The different classes according to skill are: AAA for the highest skill, followed by AA, A, B, C, and D.

One of Southwest's squads shoots together almost perfectly in-sync. As soon as one member fires, the next in line immediately brings their gun to their shoulder, with no hesitation. The group has even been told to slow down at times. Those members are Caleb Ayer, Olivia Ayer, Ty Howard, Sam Jennings, and Alex Ramirez. Caleb and Olivia Ayer are brother and sister and have a unique bond on the team.

Olivia and Caleb began their trap journey when they were invited to a meeting by Southwest Coach Mike Vining. They had started shooting in 4-H. The duo has only improved since then, with younger brother Caleb

shooting his first 100 straight in a row and winning Sub Jr., overall, as well as the entire Class C in the Missouri State Trap Shoot. The siblings agree that shooting trap is a game of mentality and muscle memory. To them, a successful shooter forgets a bad shot, isn't stubborn, seeks ways to improve, and doesn't over-think.

The perfect conditions can improve performance as well. Caleb's favorite time to

Discovery Quilters Prepare for Fall Show

Discovery Quilters resumed in-person meetings on May 24 at 10 a.m. at Central Community United Methodist Church in Shell Knob.

Anyone interested in quilting is welcome to attend future meetings, says spokesperson EJ Adams.

“Bring a lunch and join us for a few hours,” Adams said. “We welcome all quilters, whether they’re a beginner or an expert. Mentoring those interested in learning is one of our highest priorities.”

According to Adams, the next few months will be busy as quilters prepare for the 2021 judged quilt show on Sept. 25-26.

“Our theme for this year’s

show is “Crazy for Quilting,” Adams said. “We expect to show hundreds of quilts ranging from large to small projects.”

As in the past, Discovery Quilters will support an area non-profit organization with proceeds from the miniature quilt auction on Sunday afternoon during the show.

“Mini quilts can be no larger than 96 inches in perimeter,” Adams said, but they may have hundreds of pieces and take many hours to complete.

“With community support, we have raised thousands of dollars in years past to support Haven of the Ozarks, Lives Under Construction Boys Ranch, Alliance of

Churches and Shell Knob Library Building Fund as well as other non-profit organizations,” she said.

The proceeds from a few of the quilts (comfort quilts and baby quilts) will be dedicated to two separate missions.

Comfort quilts are given to friends and community members who experience illness or the loss of a close family member.

Baby quilts, as many as 200 a year, have been donated to Newborns in Need, an organization that covers five counties in southern Missouri.

“In an effort to concentrate more on local needs, we have begun supporting Barry and Stone County Health De-

partments and Purple Flower Domestic Violence Center in Eureka Springs,” Adams said. “We give them baby quilts for the families they serve.”

Adams said they also work with the VFW to present Quilts of Valor to area veterans.

“We also present a quilt to each young man who graduates from the LUC Ranch program,” she said. “This year, we are making potholders for the Friends of the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky, to support their fundraising efforts.

“Our members put a high priority on making a difference for our community through use of our quilting skills,” she added.

Adams would like to urge people to mark their calendars for Sept. 25 - 26 and attend the Crazy for Quilting

show at the Shell Knob Elementary School.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol, a premier law enforcement agency, is testing for new troopers. The Patrol is encouraging qualified individuals of all backgrounds to apply, and will offer testing at nine different locations in Missouri. Those who successfully complete testing will be eligible to continue in the selection process for the 113th Recruit Class, scheduled to begin training on January 18, 2022. The application deadline is September 18, 2021.

To be eligible, candidates must possess a high school diploma or GED equivalent and be 21 years of age upon graduating from the Patrol's Law Enforcement Academy. Upon graduating from the Patrol's Academy, troopers are eligible to earn 46 credit hours through Mineral Area College in Park Hills, MO, or 30 credit hours through the University of Central Missouri in Warrensburg, MO, toward a degree.

The starting annual salary for trooper is \$49,536, and following three years of service, the trooper first class' salary is increased to \$52,200. Other benefits include group health insurance, contributory retirement, career advancement, and more.

The selection process is a multi-phase testing procedure including: written examination, a physical fitness for duty assessment, polygraph examination, background investigation, and oral interview board. Written and physical examinations take place in each troop area across the state. After a conditional offer of employment, the applicant must successfully complete a medical examination (to include vision and hearing), psychological examination, a psychological interview, drug screening, and final applicant review.
