The City of Cassville swore newly elected officials and a new city clerk during Monday's City Council meeting

Darelyn Cooper, interim City Clerk, swore in Southward Alderwoman Jan Anthony, who will replace Jeff Parsons, incumbent Northward Alderwoman Ann Hennigan and incumbent Mayor Bill Shiveley.

The City recently hired Karen Jennings to take the position as City Clerk. Jennings was also sworn in during Monday's meeting.

During the meeting, the Council heard from Gail Melgren of Tri State Water Resource Coalition. The City of Cassville is a member of the Coalition and Melegren took the opportunity

to update the Council with happenings in the Coalition.

According to Melgren, Tri State Water Coalition is working on water supply issues, not water quality is-

"Mission to make sure we have long-term water supply in this region. The Coalition first started in Joplin due to fear of a water shortage in the next 10-15 years and then the Coalition has expanded throughout the southwest Missouri regions near Stockton and Table Rock Lake."

In other council news, the Public Works Department will begin their meter replacement project on May 1st. Residents should be aware that if they see members of the Public Works team at their property, they

Court ruling makes revenue

Sales tax revenue for Barry County is down from this time last year, but the numbers cannot be compared fairly according to County Treasurer Lois Lowe.

The biggest factor in the decrease in revenue compared to last year is that the county no longer receives sales tax on vehicles and boats bought outside of Missouri. In 2012, the county was receiving that sales tax revenue from those purchases during the first four months of the year.

The Missouri Courts stated that the purchase of a vehicle, boat, trailer, or or from a non-dealer in the state, cannot be charged use tax on said items, unless the county and/or city in which the person resides has a voter authorized use tax. Since Barry County does not have a use tax, the county has

seen an immediate decrease in revenue.

Lowe stated the county loses an estimated \$8,000 a month because of the Courts ruling.

March 2013 figures show an 8.25 percent loss compared to last year's revenue. The county brought in \$138,622.59 for March which is \$12,472.63 less than February's figures.

The City of Cassville is operating with at negative 1.1 percent under what was budgeted in sales tax revenue for 2013.

After suffering a 15.2 percent decrease for the month of February, Cassoutboard motor out of state, ville bounced back in March with a 2.4 percent increase in sales tax revenue compared to last year's figures.

> Cassville brought in \$68,040.42 for March 2013, nearly \$7,000 more than February 2013's figures.



Department of Revenue Offers Tips for Tax Return Filers Before April 15 Deadline

JEFFERSON CITY -With the deadline to file state tax returns quickly approaching, the Missouri Department of Revenue has advice for Missourians who have not yet filed their returns.

The filing deadline for state and federal tax returns is Monday, April 15.

The Department encourages people to file their returns electronically, if possible. This method is more convenient, reduces the chance for errors and usually reduces the time waiting for refunds.

The Department also encourages taxpayers to make sure they sign their returns, double check all math computations and see that all the necessary forms are attached.

If a taxpayer knows that he or she will not be able to file a complete return by the due date, he or she can file for an extension of time to file their return. If citizens receive an extension of time to file their federal income tax returns, they will automatically be granted an extension of time to file a Missouri income tax return. A copy of the federal extension (Federal Form 4868) would need to be attax return when it is filed. A income@dor.mo.gov. taxpaver who receives an extension of time to file a return must still pay the tax on or before the original due date of the return. Information about tax extensions and access to the Form 4868 is available at this link: http://www.irs.gov/ pub/irs-pdf/f4868.pdf

Filing for an extension does not extend the time to pay taxes that are due. If a citizen expects to owe state income tax, the Missouri extension Form MO-60 should be filed with a payment by the original due date of the return. A 5 percent penalty and interest will apply on any unpaid balance not paid by the original due date of the return. The Department also has tax assistance centers located in seven Missouri cities. The centers are in Cape Girardeau, Jefferson City, Joplin, Kansas City, St. Joseph, St. Louis and Springfield. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Citizens who have questions about the preparation of their tax returns can call, email or visit the centers. Contact information and office addresses are available at http://dor.mo.gov/contact/assistance.php.

Missouri tax forms for Tax Year 2012 and other years are available on the Department's website athttp://dor.mo.gov/ forms/. All the forms and instructions for the forms can be printed on demand directly from the website. Some of the forms can also be filled out on the computer and then printed and mailed to the Department of Revenue. These forms print with a 2-D barcode that helps speed up processing.

How to clean dirty windows

Dirty windows are unsightly, and they can prevent beneficial sunlight from entering a home. Cleaning windows need not be done every week, but it shouldn't be overlooked completely, either. While it certainly may be a chore to clean windows, there are ways to make the task much more tolerable.

Having the right tools on hand and a strategy in place will make the job easier to manage.

Cleaning windows

Cleaning windows won't necessarily be easy, but the following nine-step process can make the task less difficult and time-con-

- 1. Choose a day when it is overcast so you will not be blinded by the sun while cleaning. This also helps prevent streaking. Begin by gathering what you'll need to get the task done. Having everything at the ready will enable you to move from one window to the next. Here are the basic supplies you will need: cleaning solution; cloth, newspaper or squeegee; towel; spray bottle; extension pole to reach high windows; vacuum; ladder or step stool; and garden hose
- 2. Take down and clean drapery or blinds when

cleaning the windows. Remove the curtains so you will have an unobstructed surface with which to work.

- 3. Start with the interior side of the windows, as they are easier to access. Place a towel on the sill to catch any drops so the sill or the floor will stay dry.
- 4. Spray a lint-free cloth or the window directly with the cleaning solution. The edges and corners of the window tend to accumulate the most grime, so begin by cleaning those areas first. Once they are clean and you will not exchange dirt to the center of the window, work on the middle. Wipe the windows in a horizontal direction to help alleviate drip-
- 5. To create a streak-free surface, some people prefer to use a squeegee to drag out any pockets of moisture for more even drying. Be sure to wipe the rubber strip of the squeegee after each pass on the window. You may choose to buff out any other streaks with newspaper.
- 6. Vacuum the window sill and frame afterward to catch any dust and debris.
- 7. Repeat the process for all interior windows.
- 8. Move outdoors and start off by spraying the

window with a garden hose to loosen any of the accumulated grime. Use your cleaning solution to dissolve the rest of the dirt. You may want to let it sit on the window if there is stubborn grime. Repeat the cleaning process used indoors for each window.

9. If exterior secondfloor windows are hard to reach, consider using a ladder and extension pole to extend your reach. Upper windows will not be scrutinized as closely as lower windows, so you may have a greater margin for error. If the windows are simply too high up, rely on a professional window cleaner to get the job done rather than risk falls or other injuries.

Mix your own cleaning solution

It may take trial and error to find a solution that works. Here is one recipe you may want to start with.

1 cup white vinegar

1 1/2 cups rubbing alcohol

2 drops of dish soap

Pour into a clean and empty spray bottle. Remember: Never mix bleach and ammonia together to create a cleaning solution, as toxic fumes will result.



The week of April 1st was abbreviated by a day to allow members who traveled with family for Easter to make it back in town, thus we went into session on Tuesday, but kept the wheels turning until around 10 P.M. Tuesday night as we went back to the House Bills on the consent calendar. There were several bills on the calendar, too numerous to name here, but I will address a few that impact our district.

HB 440 was passed along to the Senate. This bill will except cottage food producers from inspections by the health departments. This will allow home-canned foods, like jellies, etc., to be sold at farmer's markets and fairs among other things, without government intrusion. I think this is a step in the right direction, and I supported the bill.

HB 334 exempts children, working on family farms, from child labor laws, which will allow children who live on farms to help out in the family business without being in violation of labor laws. The House passed this along to the Senate as well

Currently, counties are allowed to increase their budgets when revenues coming in exceed expectations. However, if there are revenue shortfalls, counties cannot decrease their budgets. HB 451 fixes this. In business, I have had to decrease my budget when I had revenue shortfalls. Our local governments should be able

to do the same thing.

Some of you may be aware of a court case in the not too distant past, which determined that people who purchase a vehicle, boat, trailer, or outboard motor out of state, or from a nondealer in the state, can not be charged use tax on said items, unless the county and/ or city in which the person resides has a voter authorized use tax on the books. This ruling resulted in immediate and significant revenue losses for counties and municipalities all over the state. In addition to the impact it had on local governments, it has put in state car dealers and boat dealers at a huge disadvantage. I understand and am totally supportive of a fix to this problem, however, I am of the opinion that the only Constitutionally correct way to do it is for each county and municipality that does not have a use tax currently authorized, to put one on the ballot and allow the people to adopt one. Anything less will almost certainly be litigated in court and ruled unconstitutional, and if that happens we will be back at square one.

A bill passed this past week (HCS SB 182), which is considered the "fix" for this problem, but the bill was riddled with problems of its own. What the legislation did was essentially repeal the use tax on said items, and create a new tax on the privilege of titling said items in the state of Missouri. The bill also required every county or city that does not currently have a use tax on the books to place on the ballot, an initiative that would discontinue the collection of the "sales tax on the privilege of titling" these items. In my opinion the legislation presumes that those counties and municipalities that do currently have a use tax approved and on the books, would be just fine with this tax, since they cancel each other out, given that they are not required to vote on the issue at any time.

Case law regarding the commerce clause in the U.S. Constitution prevents one state from establishing a sales tax rate in another state. Therefore, the state of Missouri cannot apply their sales tax rate to any item bought in Kansas or any other state. A sales tax is levied on the sale of a product. A use tax, which is on what the state, and some counties and municipalities rely, is a tax on the use or storage of any tangible personal property on which sales tax would be owed if it were purchased in state. This new "privilege tax" as it is referred to in one section of the bill, or "sales tax on the privilege of" as it is referred to in another portion of the bill, is not straightforward, and there are different problems that would take me the rest of day to explain in writing.

All of that being said, I wanted to vote to fix this problem for the counties and cities, and most importantly the BUSINESSES who are on the losing end of this deal, given that the system worked fine forever, until the Supreme Court handed down this ruling; but I had to vote no. This bill was not ready to be passed. There were too many problems, and they weren't fixed before the bill came to a vote. The best thing that could happen would be for the localities to put a use tax on the items in question on the ballot, and I would encourage everyone to vote "yes".

MoDOT promotes safety in work zones

MoDOT wants to partner with Missouri drivers on safety in highway work

This will be a major focus during Work Zone Awareness Week April 15-19 and throughout the road construction season.

Here's the plan:

- 1. MoDOT will set work zones in ways we think make sense, with easy-to-read static signs, understandable messages on electronic signs and reasonable speed limits.
- 2. MoDOT asks drivers to slow down in work zones, avoid cell phone use and other distractions, drive sober, obey signs and pay attention to flaggers if present.

The goal is to make sure that workers with the Missouri Department of Transportation and employees of highway contractors can get their work done safely while drivers and their families can travel safely.

At the end of the day, everyone gets home safe.

Work Zone Crashes

The dangers in work zones are real. This is why MoDOT focuses on Work Zone Awareness every spring when the weather warms up and work on streets and highways picks

up.

In 2012, eight people were killed and 623 people were injured in Missouri work zone crashes. In 2011, 11 people died in Missouri work zone crashes while 712 people were injured.

The top five contributing factors in work zone crashes in 2012 were following too closely, inattention, improper lane use or change, failure to yield and driving too fast for conditions.

Rate Our Work Zones

MoDOT wants work zones to be safe while keeping traffic moving as smoothly as possible despite lane closings, reduced speeds and delays. That's why MoDOT asks drivers to fill out "Rate Our Work Zone" surveys.

The surveys give drivers a chance to say what they like or don't like about a given work zone, providing

MoDOT with information that can be used improve work zones.

Here's how to com-

Go to the MoDOT web site -- modot.org - to fill out and submit a MoDOT Work Zone Customer Survey. If you don't have access to a computer, call the Customer Service Center at 1.888.275.6636 and give input over the phone.

If you have a smart phone and can text from the road, please DON'T. Complete the survey and submit it AFTER you get to your destination to avoid distracted driving.

Road Work in 2013

the deeper river is really changing the way we fish this year, the egg and worm fisherman are really having to put on extra weight to get down to where a lot of the trout are

Water is mostly clear right now, more rain a coming but the river looks great right

With the deeper water heavier jigs are really working better this year.

If you are fly fishing the heavier woolybuggers are working most of the day now, and the heavier nymphs are working very well this year, #14's with a tungsten head will help get you down, sometimes when fishing a heavier nymph we will use two flies both with tungsten beads to help get down a bit quicker.

We are using sink tip and sinking lines a bit more in the fly area right now, been a long time since the water was deep enough to use a sink tip line, we fish cracklebacks,

River is still in good shape, small buggers and streamers on a sinking line.

Black, olive, and dk. brown buggers have been working very well the past few weeks, #14-#18 pheasant tails, copper johns, burlaps, and sow bugs have all been working well, Y2k, and glo balls are good also, and the chamois, and san juan worms are still working as well as ever.

If you are spin fishing, small spoons, crankbaits and black, brown, or olive roostertails work well first thing in the morning, then it is probably best to switch to cheese, orange, white, or pink worms, or use the power eggs, in brown, white, fl. yellow, and the flo., orange.

> If you don't want to fish power bait or other plastic baits, 1/32 and 1/16th jigs are good also, olive, black, brown and black/yellow are going to be good colors.

> If you are fishing in zone 3, night crawlers, corn, and power bait paste will work great for you, minnows will work well also.




