

Roaring River State Park is celebrating the 80th Anniversary of the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) on May 4th, 2013, at 3:30-4:30 p.m. The event will be held next to the CCC Pavilion on Highway F and a spaghetti dinner will follow.

During the event, the park will be dedicating a new bronze statue honoring the CCC workers. The CCC was instrumental in making Roaring River State Park what it is today due to the camp that was present in the 1930's.



than just the statue dedication, it's a way to celebrate the "boys" involved in the first Civilian Conservation Corps.

Naomi Shaw, Project Coordinator, has been working with her father Richard Chrisinger, a former CCC boy, for the past two years in hopes to raise enough funds for the statue. And finally the dream is coming alive.

Bill Bryan, the Director of Missouri State Parks, will be the MC and Joan Sharpe, President of CCC Legacy, will also be in attendance and speaking. A few CCC boys are also hoping to attend the event: Richard Chrisinger, a former CCC boy; Walter Atwood, past-president of NACCA; Herschel Hubbard, former CCC boy of Springfield; and Norman Nichols, a surviving CCC Boy that served at Roaring River State Park.

RR Park number 1 in state of Missouri for trout fishing

Gov. Jay Nixon today announced that Roaring River State Park near Cassville has been selected by Missourians, through an online poll on Missouri's state website, MO.gov, as their favorite state park for trout fishing. Out of more than 150,000 votes cast, Roaring River received 73,344, or 46 percent, edging out Bennett Spring State Park for first place. The online poll asked visitors to choose between Roaring River State Park, Bennett Spring State Park near Lebanon or Montauk State Park near Salem as their favorite state park to catch rainbow trout. Roaring River State Park received 46 percent of the vote, Bennett Spring State Park received 44 percent and Montauk State Park received 10 percent of the

A lifelong trout fisherman, the Governor also signed proclamation

naming 2013 as Missouri's Year of the Trout, encouraging Missourians to take advantage of the opportunities to enjoy premier trout fishing in Missouri State Parks. Missouri State Parks will commemorate the year with Troutapalooza, a series of events designed to engage experienced anglers and introduce new participants to the activity.

Troutapalooza will take place until the end of trout season on Oct. 31 and feature activities to promote fishing for all ages and skill levels. Activities include a passport program, fishing clinics, weekly drawings, tournaments, coloring contests and special programs.

CCC Monument Dedication City of Cassville to begin meter replacement project

On March 25, 2013, the Cassville City Council approved two purchase orders for its upcoming meter replacement project. A total of \$285,000 was included in the 2013 budget for the proj-

The aldermen approved a \$210,000 purchase order to HD Supply Water Works, of St. Louis, for the Sensus meters and parts. A second purchase order of \$75,000 was approved for RTS Water Solutions, of Parkville, for labor costs associated with the project.

The Public Works Department has been replacing broken and failed meters with the Sensus iPerl technology over the last two years. Now with this current funding available, the larger project to replace and upgrade the remaining water meters installed at homes and businesses throughout the city can commence. The meter replacement work will begin on May 1st in the city and progress in a systematic manner over the summer. The completed project will greatly improve the efficiency and accuracy of water meter reading operations. The new water meters feature digital registers which will provide enhanced information regarding water use and potential leaks. This technology change will move Cassville from a "manual read" to "touch read" environment and will position Cassville to migrate to AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) which is the longer range strategic goal.

RTS Water Solutions, who specializes in mass installation of meter replacements, will be switching the meters with support from the Cassville Public Works Department staff. In some cases, the City will need to gain access to the water meter inside the customer's home or business to replace the old meter with the new meter. The installation process typically requires 20 minutes and there is no cost to the customer for this meter change-out.

The City is pleased to inform customers that the Sensus' new metrology products comply with and

exceed requirements set by The Safe Drinking Water Act and NSF/ANSI 61 Annex F and G that became standard in 2012. Changes to the Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act are taking effect on January 4, 2014, reducing the amount of lead permissible in water meters from 8.0% to 0.25%. The Sensus iPerl meters are zero-lead composite meters contain absolutely 0.00% lead. Water utilities will be acting now to implement zero-lead alternatives that are strong, durable and reliable. The completed meter replacement project will provide significant benefit and enhanced service to Cassville's water customers. Additional information on this project will be provided in future news releases. The City of Cassville appreciates the cooperation and patience of its customers during the course of this monumental project.

"The greatest memory of this place is summed up by the picture that hangs in my office of me hugging my son Aaron after he and the football team won state. It's been a great ride."



Cassville at Roaring River that same month.

This was when Roaring River started attracting attention and over the next seven years the CCC made many improvements to the area including: 83 buildings, 17 acres of beach improvements, six acres of landscaping, roads, trails, bridges, and much more.

The Civilian Conservation Corps had a humble beginning. In 1933, the depression crippled the economy so President Roosevelt asked the Congress to pass a bill in which young men could find employment helping conserve the national resources of the nation. The legislation was passed on March 31st. The first man was enrolled on April 7th and the first camp was established only 10 days later.

The CCC enrolled young men to help the unemployment problem, and after seven years the camp had members from almost every state

The workers had to be at 1713 at Roaring River won

least 17 years old and each man received \$8 per month in cash while \$22 was sent home to his family. Clothing and food were furnished and the men only got six days off per year. This small amount of money was actually great help to men and their families in the 1930's.

Within a matter of weeks from the program's beginning, 150 men arrived at Roaring River. About 1,500 men moved through the Roaring River camp during its years of operation. The men in the CCC were expected to keep clean and tidy. Also, many of them, during their time at the camp, took classes to get their high school diploma or courses towards their college education.

On October 12, 1933, the new quarters were ready to occupy. The men worked hard to build these "homes" and the buildings at Roaring River are still sound struc-

In 1934, CCC camp

the Seventh Corps Area award for having the best camp in the entire area.

Then on November 1, 1939, all members of the CCC, along with their equipment, were transferred to Pershing Memorial Park in Laclade County to assist in the development of the camp in that area.

The transfer left the CCC camp buildings at Roaring River abandoned. Eventually, the national youth administration, with the help of Cassville businessmen, civic organizations and Hugh Brixey, Superintendent of Roaring River State Park, joined the effort to save the CCC buildings.

Their help was successful and the buildings are now used for Camp Smoky. These buildings, along with all the other improvements made to Roaring River, leave a lot to remember from the Civilian Conservation Corps

Tim's Trout Tips

Roaring River flooded on Thursday the 18th, but, as usual, it was up about 6 1/2 feet real quick, and then right back down to only a few feet over where it was before the

In water like we are experiencing right now, the power bait fisherman does very well, you just need a lot of extra weight. With the high, dingy water we can use 4, or even 6, pound line for a few days, maybe even a few weeks, until it the water clears.

When I speak of extra weight, I mean two or three 3/0 split shot. Normally one is plenty, but right now a 1/8th ounce weight by itself is good; in the faster holes, we may use even more weight.

Power bait floats, so place the sinker about 24" from the hook. Cast out into the river with enough weight to hold the bait in place, and just wait till something grabs your egg, or worm, and swims off. Then set the hook, hoping the trout has the bait well into its mouth so the hook can be set effectively.

Water will be off-colored for a few weeks, but the water will drop a bit everyday, and we will be back to normal conditions in no time. Good luck on the river.
