Proposed electric lines outrage residents

A recently proposed electrical power line could damage the natural beauty through southern Barry County, and residents are not happy about it. At the Seligman City Council meeting on August 13th, residents had a heated debate about the proposed electrical line route slated to go through southern Missouri and into Arkansas. The possible effects from this project could uproot residents from their homes, lower their property values and damage tourism to the area through land devastation.

Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEP-CO) is introducing a project that would claim a path of 150-foot-wide of land to be cleared for a new power line. In southern Barry County, 150-foot-tall electrical transmission towers will follow just north of the state line for about 25 miles, damaging the landscape. The effects of this 345,000-volt line could be devastating.

Seligman residents argued that they would not be able to live under the power lines, it would de-value land along its route and go directly through the city. Northwest Arkansas has already been battling this company to keep the 48 miles of power lines out of many tourist destinations.

SWEPCO states on their

website, "The proposed facilities will provide increased reliability and overload relief in eastern Benton County and Carroll County. They address long-term upgrades to the grid for north Arkansas and south Missouri region, as identified and mandated by the Southwest Power Pool." However, Barry County residents claim it is unnecessary for the area.

Dr. Pat Costner, a native of Arkansas and public interest scientist since 1978, has many concerns regarding SWEPCO. Costner is in possession of a list of the 165 land owners in Missouri whose land is being traversed by SWEPCO's proposed route 109. She states, "I excerpted this information from SWEPCO's list of property owners that they allegedly notified. It now seems evident that no Missouri landowners were notified."

Costner is also informing landowners about the meeting on August 26th in Little Rock. She is encouraging residents to get involved. "Tell the Arkansas Public Service Commission's (APSC) Judge Griffin that they are traversed by route 109 but received no notification," she urges.

On July 25th, representatives of the Missouri Public Service Commission stated they were unaware of SWEP-CO's proposal to build the high-voltage transmission line in the southwest corner

of the state. SWEPCO did apply to the Arkansas Public Service Commission to build the line, but no application has been filed with the Missouri Commission.

If SWEPCO chooses to proceed with route 109, the approval process is said to take several months, and this largely depends on the number of landowners wanting to intervene in the case. Route 109 was chosen by SWEP-

CO to provide an opportunity to avoid the congested Interstate 540, appeasing larger cities, but taking advantage of smaller communities.

Missouri's District 158 Representative Scott Fitzpatrick stated his opinion on the matter, "I am extremely concerned with the potential impact the proposed power lines would have on local property values. Very little information has been made

available on the issue, but I have been in discussions with other Representatives from the affected areas, and we are in agreement that there is no positive impact that could be realized in the event this line is installed in Missouri.

"The idea that a line beginning and ending in the State of Arkansas, in order to serve Arkansas customers, should cross into Missouri in order to preserve property values in Arkansas is unacceptable, and void of concern for affected Missouri citizens. I am awaiting information from regulatory authorities in Missouri, and will be working with Senator Sater's office as well as our federal legislators offices in order attempt to mount opposition to this proposal."

Barry County residents are eager to continue their opposition against SWEPCO and defend the natural beauty that is the Ozarks.

Barry County weekly court cases

Many citizens were tried this past week by Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox. The following three cases range from resisting arrest,to assault and drug possession.

Maria Camille McNeill from Exeter, age 23, was convicted for resisting arrest. On January 12, 2013, between State Highway 37 at Farm Road 2090 and State Highway W at Farm Road 1040, McNeil fled in her vehicle after four law enforcement officers attempted to make a lawful stop. McNeil created a substantial risk of injury to other persons by speeding on numerous city streets with her headlights off, as well as fleeing on Highway 76/86 in excess of 80 mph. McNeil was finally apprehended after hitting spike strips. A tire from her vehicle struck a Missouri Highway Patrol car causing severe damage to the front end. Repair costs for the vehicle exceeded \$750. McNeil then received a suspended imposition of sentence (SIS) resulting in two years unsupervised probation and must pay \$150.00 restitution to the City of Purdy.

• Thomas Jason Holland, age 36, from Monett, was charged with three misdemeanors on October 7, 2012, including domestic assault in the third degree. The defendant attempted to cause physical injury to the victim by grabbing her and throwing her out a door. He was also charged with possession

of a controlled substance (marijuana). Holland's third charge was possession of drug paraphernalia with intent to use. He possessed a pipe with intent to use it for inhaling a controlled substance

• Christopher Shawn Ferguson, age 29, from Noel, was charged with two misdemeanors on May 24, 2013. The charges were driving while intoxicated and driving with a suspended license. The crime took place four miles before County Farm Road 1040 where the defendant was found operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated and in full knowledge of his suspended license.





Table Rock Master Plan controversy

The Tri-Lakes Board of Realtors is expressing concern about the future of Table Rock Lake and property along its shoreline prior to the reveal of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers master plan in December.

The master plan for Table Rock Lake hasn't been updated since the 1970's. Recently, the Corps initiated a year-long building moratorium for new docks on the lake.

Board President Shannon Duvall said Tri-Lakes became concerned when the Corps of Engineers scoping meetings began late last year. The Board was not involved in any of the planning discussions. Duvall stated, "We found that of 365 members, the Tri-Lakes Board of Realtors actively engaged in buying, selling and developing real estate adjoining Table Rock Lake...none included in the invited focus groups."

There are 217 pages of information in the four proposals of the master plan, and Board Chairman Booker Cox III says the one chosen could affect the area for decades.

'The next step will be the shoreline management plan,"

Cox said. "This will handle the specific use of permits for new docks and how the shoreline

will be managed in the future." Cox continued, "We have concerns that the Corps could use this new plan to restrict the use of boat docks on our lake. If allowed, this would affect property values and the local economy."

Cox says he received a statement from the Corps of Engineers that claims, "Ownership of land adjacent to government-owned land does not convey any rights to the adjacent landowners that would allow private and exclusive access to government property," Cox said. "We believe that wording, such as this, that is included in the plan, could restrict future uses for our lake.'

The purpose of last week's press conference was to urge the community to get involved and voice their opinion as to what happens to the area, said



Ramey, and other Price Cutters all over the state, are carrying locally grown tomatoes through their distributor, Pyramid Foods. Pyramid buys tomatoes from Ozark Agriculture Farmers Co-Op

of West Plains, headed by Craig and Patrice Jennings. The tomatoes are then labelled as Missouri-grown and sold to groceries in the

The Jennings' co-op has twelve farmers contributing with a total of 10,000 plants. For their first year, the sole focus is tomatoes. Next year they plan to expand to 25,000 tomato plants and also add green beans. Craig said they are in conversations with Price Cutter management as to how much acreage they will need to fill the needs of the stores in the area with other varieties of crops.

Craig stated, "We are in the process of recruiting more farmers. The biggest plot anyone has is 1/2 acre with 3,000 plants. A full aacre will grow 7,000 plants."

As with any type of fruit and vegetable, the importance of quality cannot be understated. The co-op gets the tomatoes they grow to the market within 48 hours to ensure freshness. Without cold-storage available, the window of time is shortened to 24-36 hours.

Craig went on, "Larger chains really want local produce, but no one has the quantity that they need. That's where the cooperative comes in." With more farmers, the demand can be met, still satisfying the desire for locally grown.

When asked what Craig considers "local" to mean, he said, "Anything within the state, as long as you can get it out of the field to the market in a reasonable amount of time. Once you go beyond 150 miles, that probably isn't

When buying local produce, the consumer is ensured a product that is picked fresh. All local tomatoes are defined as "vine-ripened." If the tomatoes aren't ripened on the vine, that means they've been picked green and then gassed to get their color. In that case, the quality

Cooperative locally-grown tomatoes at Ramey don "Vine-Ripe Missouri Home Grown" produce stickers. and taste really suffer.

"We need to support our own local economy. The farmer used to be able to make a living on 40 acres... You only need 3-4 acres to make a living, and we need to bring the small farmer back," Craig continued.

When chopping at the local store, many consumers don't notice the signs that sav, "Product of Chile" or "Product of Mexico". What farmers like the Ozark Agriculture Farmers Co-Op are trying to do is bring awareness to the importance of real, fresh produce versus the commercially-grown piece of fruit or vegetable that's travelled thousands of miles.

By pooling resources, farmers can collectively meet the larger demands of grocery store chains, but also carry the multi-million dollar liability insurance they

need to be able to compete in the market against commercial farms.

Craig and Patrice Jennings got the idea of starting a local, regional growing cooperative while taking classes at the West Plain campus of Missouri State University. The idea blossomed, just like their tomato plants, and now locally-grown can be a part of everyday purchases, making a big impact on the environment, and more importantly, the local farmer.

Unfortunately, the growing season for Missouri farmers has been affected by the recent rains and flooding. However, locally-grown produce has found its niche and it won't be going away anytime soon. Expect to see big increases in cooperativegrown fruits and vegetables available in bigger groceries.

Why local?

The average American meal travels 1,500 miles before it ends up on its plate, according to the Center for Urban Education about Sustainable Agriculture. Travelling negatively affects the nutrient content of the foods. The fresher the vegetable, the more nutrient-dense and the healthier it is.


Pollution, fuel consumpion, and spoilage are also factors with long-distance

shipments of produce. While produce may be able to travel the distance, the cost is much higher because of the resources used in transporta-





McQueen recounts Wheaton story and joining the CCC

DeVere McQueen lived in Cassville from 1988 until his death on July 4, 2013. He passed while at the Mt. Vernon Veterans Home. De-Vere, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harrison McQueen was born and raised in the Wheaton community.

In going through his father's papers recently, De-Vere's son, Barry McQueen, found an account his father had written relative to his service in the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC).

The CCC, a federal relief agency founded early in 1933, has been in the news recently since celebrating its formation 80 years ago. Roaring River State Park and Shell Knob are two sites of the CCC.

Mr. McQueen's letter is self-explanatory and a re-



minder of the extremely hard times of the 1930's when the CCC camp at Roaring River State Park was in full opera-

Although Mr. McQueen was never stationed during his CCC days in Barry County, the camps were all structured about the same throughout the 48 states.

The Barry County Advertiser carried an extensive story on the Roaring River CCC in its May 8th edition recently which may have prompted Mr. McQueen's story which

Seeing the article about the restoration of the Train Depot in Wheaton prompted me to write this short story about my departure from and return to that Depot. August, 1934, I departed from there, by train, on my way to Grand Marias,

8:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Minnesota, which is on Lake Superior and near the Canadian boarder.

At that time I was 15 years old 5'11" tall and weighed 115 pounds. I had never been farther from home than Cassville and Purdy, MO.

The 3-C's (Civilian Conservation Corp) had been in existence for a few months. This program was implemented to provide employment for young men ages 17-23. Due to the financial hardship of my parents, my Uncle Silas McQueen who was the Barry County Representative, was able to get a waiver at the minimum age limit for me.

My mother wanted me to have new clothes to wear (my wardrobe was limited to worn

overalls and shirts). Saving her egg money, she used it to buy me a pair of seersucker (98 cent) trousers, dress shirt, shoes, bill cap, jacket, and socks. She also bought a cardboard suitcase, plus a tooth brush and tooth paste (which I had never owned or used before). I'm sure she put a towel and washcloth in my suitcase. I also had sandwiches to eat when I felt hungry. I now have some idea of how mom and dad might have felt when they saw me leave and not knowing how I would get along at return.

The only memory I have of the train ride was a large area of land under water. I guess it was in Missouri and/or Iowa. When the train arrived at

Duluth, the driver of a camp truck was there to take me to the camp. I was taken to my assigned barracks and later to the supply room to receive my clothing. That evening I ate my first meal in the "mess hall," and I felt like I was in "hogs' heaven." My job was to pick up tree limbs which had been cut and carry them to a

We were not allowed to go out on the lake which was across the road from our camp. However, we could see the fishermen, their fire pots, and small tents.

February 1935, the camp was disbanded and transferred to a camp on a site near Medford, Oregon. We left from Duluth on a troop train and arrived in the Medford three or four days later. One of the cars was equipped with a kitchen, and we were served a morning and afternoon meal. The new camp bordered on the Applegate River and was to be my home until I left for home September or October '36.

I won't go into any detail about my time spent in the new camp other than it was very rewarding. During this time, I became a skilled heavy equipment operator, which included: bulldozers, caterpillars, dump and stake body trucks. My foreman was my



friend as well as my instructor, and I hated to leave him.

Before leaving for home, I had gone to Medford to buy some new clothes. I had saved money from the \$5.00 per month pay, which I was allowed to keep, and had enough to buy a pair of charcoal gray trousers, gray dress shirt, gray suspenders, black shoes, socks, underwear, and a suitcase. I packed all of my new clothing in it and planned to change in Kansas City. For the trip, I would wear my 3C uniform. I was fortunate to have a friend from Wheaton who would be traveling with me.

We were given transportation to Medford where we would take a train for our journey home. When we arrived in Topeka, Kansas, we were told there would be a 20 minute stop. Most everyone went outside to stretch, and after a short 10 minutes, the conductor called "all-aboard." As my friend and I started back to board, a lady and her children were making a mad dash for the step. Being the gentleman that we were, we stepped aside. By the time we started to step up, the train had barely started to move and the conductor would not let us get aboard.

We were yelling that our suitcases were on the train. He yelled that they would be left in the K.C. station. We arrived in K.C. about four hours late and missed the train to Wheaton. This meant we would be delayed until mid afternoon the next day. My friend decided to hitch hike and took off. I stayed in the station waiting for the train to Wheaton. I arrived there about 3 p.m., 26 months after

60 pounds and was no longer a teenage kid. By using sign language, I asked if they knew me. You can imagine how excited and happy they were to be taking me home with them. I hadn't eaten anything but a candy bar since my last meal on the train. After buying my new clothes, I had 25 cents in my pocket. In K.C. I bought the biggest candy bar I could get for a quarter. When mom learned I hadn't eaten a meal in the past 36 hours, she prepared a big feast for me. My parents had moved and now lived close to Wheaton.

The '36/'37 school year had started, and I immediately enrolled for my sophomore year.

To end my story, I want to point out that members of the CCC's were paid \$30.00 per month. \$25.00 of my pay went to my parents for their use. This was literally a Godsend for them; they had no cash income and depended on the government-provided commodities for most of their groceries. I hope my children never experience such hard-

Imagine moving from subzero temperature and six-foot snow drifts, to a mild 50 degrees temperature, surrounded by beautiful mountains. I felt sure that being an experienced traveler and wearing my new clothes would attract the girls like flies. Little did I know.





Sheriff to issue conceal carry permits

Beginning August 28, 2013, county residents wishing to either apply for a Conceal Carry Permit or renew their existing permit should do so at the Barry County Sheriff's office. Recently passed SB75 shifts permit responsibility from the Department of Revenue to local sheriffs' offices.

Existing permits are still good until their original expiration date. New permit request paperwork should be filled out and returned to the sheriff's office of the county of residence with the application fee of \$100. Renewals will still be \$50.

Permits needing a name change, address change, or that have been lost or stolen should also be reported to Sheriff Mick Epperly's office, where a new permit will be issued for a \$10 fee. Conceal Carry Permits are valid for five years and must be renewed after six months or are consid-

Sheriff Mick Epperly stresses that any records pertaining to Conceal Carry Permits are closed records and any unauthorized release is a Class A misdemeanor. For more information, contact the Sheriff's office.
