New tick-related disease strikes in Barry County

Living in the Ozarks means regularly checking for ticks this time of year for fear of an itchy reaction, or worse, Lyme disease. However, a new threat has emerged in Barry County, and it could prevent you from enjoying some of your favorite foods.

Lone star ticks, common to this area, are carrying a new threat that causes people to develop an allergy to red meats. This month, Dr. Michael Payne, of Cox Health Center in Cassville, has seen five cases of varying reactions. However, he stressed that it is difficult to diagnose.

It can take weeks to months for the symptoms to appear, and the connection of the allergy to the lone

discovery. The strange biteinduced allergy doesn't yet have a name.

Dr. Payne explained that it isn't an actual disease that causes the allergic reaction. "Missouri only has six or seven tick-related diseases," he stated. This allergy is actually caused by a sugar protein carried within the ticks.

When the lone star attaches itself to its host, the sugar protein gets into the person's blood. The body then creates antibodies against the sugar protein as a protection mechanism.

The downside to the body's reaction is that the antibodies also attack red meat in the digestive system. Symptoms of this odd allergy

star tick bite is a fairly recent range from nausea, abdominal cramping and vomiting to difficulty breathing and even death after consuming beef, pork or lamb.

When asked how long the allergy lasts or if it is curable, Dr. Payne explained that was part of the issue. There is little known about this new problem, and there is limited research to go on. Treatment is tricky as well. Payne said, "I recommend an antihistamine before they eat their burger. As far as how long it'll last? I don't know."

Usually when people are concerned about tick bites, deer ticks, carriers of Lyme disease, get the bad reputation. Many people with a bull's-eye reaction to a tick bite assume that they have



Lyme disease, but it isn't as common as we are led to be-

Dr. Payne said, "I personally don't think that there's a true increase in cases [of

Two charged in meth bust

Two were arrested in Seligman late Tuesday, August 20, on five class C felonies. According to the affidavits of probable cause, Jeremy Rusher and Charlotte Frazier were charged with possession of chemicals with intent to create a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance and three counts of child endangerment.

Drug Task Force Agent John Luckey executed a search warrant at the residence for a complaint that the pair allegedly cooked methamphetamine while the children of the home slept. Sheriff Mick Epperly, Seligman Chief Officer Gary Thornton, Seligman Officer Ray Earnest and the Barry County SWAT Team led by Detective Doug Henry assisted in the investigation.

Upon entering the resi-

dence at 7783 E. Roller Ridge, Seligman, officers found three children under the age of five with Frazier and Rusher. The officers collected evidence of chemicals necessary to manufacture methamphetamine as well as paraphernalia testing positive for methamphetamine

The three children, ages 14 months to 4 years, were placed in temporary custody with Frazier's sister. Followups will be completed to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the children.

Both suspects were transported to Barry County Jail where they were each held on a \$25,000 cash-only bond. Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox filed charges against the two on August 21st.

Frazier bonded out of jail, but Rusher remains in police custody.

Each check written by Lowe on behalf of RL Transport, she personally deposited into her business account. According to the affadavits of probable cause, she knowingly wrote the checks with the intent of stealing the money and putting it into her



Lyme disease], just more awareness of it." Instead of the deer tick, the lone star is usually to blame for the over reporting of Lyme disease.

Lone star ticks also carry STARI, a disease that manifests similarly to Lyme, but doesn't have the same duration of complications. The typical bull's-eye reaction occurs, but STARI has no lasting effects. Lyme disease carries lifelong chronic consequences.

True Lyme disease occurs only when an infected tick has been attached for at least 24-36 hours, giving enough time for it to cross into the host's bloodstream. The new antibody-related allergy could have a similar time frame for infection, but no one knows for sure.

The best way to prevent the disease is to avoid be-

Like most people, I was totally unaware of SWEPCO's plans to run a massive power line through southwest Missouri. I live just north of Seligman, so my property would not be directly affected, but everyone who lives in this area is affected whether your property is under the proposed lines or not. Most of us live here for the natural beauty, away from the sort of industrial ugliness the huge metal towers of the proposed line would cause here.

This line, which is supposedly needed for possible future use in Benton county, takes a jog north into Missouri and runs along the Arkansas border for some 25 miles before heading back south again to Bentonville. The only explanation I can think of for this route is that they think they have a better chance of taking the land away from landowners in southwest Missouri than from landowners in northwest Arkansas.

Every Saturday, part of Cassville's square is blocked off for the Garden Sass Farmers' Association to set up their weekly farmers' market. The market is the area's longest running farmers' group in Barry County.

Sater-sponsored vetoed

During the 2011 Joplin tornado crisis, volunteer medical personnel were essential to helping those in need. However, many medically-trained volunteers were turned away during the crisis for lacking of licensing. Senator David Sater worked this year to change that, only to be met with a gubernatorial

Governor Jay Nixon vetoed Cassville's Sen. Sater's recently passed Volunteer Health Services Act, aimed at easing the difficulty of being an approved health care provider in times of crisis. Nixon claimed the law would provide "blanket immunity" for those wishing to volunteer in times of crisis, and that it is "inconsistent with the balanced approach that Missouri law already takes".

Nixon's primary concern is that volunteers would not be able to be held legally responsible should they be negli-

Sater's bill allows for volunteers licensed in other states, as well as retired medical personnel from Missouri's health systems, to serve victims of tragedy without Missouri licensing. The Act would apply only to those not charging patients in need for their services. Nixon's complaint was that the bill allowed for no legal discourse in the event that a volunteer provides subpar care.

When questioned about a possible veto override, Sater said he was in the planning stages. "It's interesting that Governor Nixon has travelled the state, promoting Medicare expansion, but vetoes this bill that would provide

free healthcare to thousands of people throughout Missouri," Sater said.

The biggest opposition to Sater's bill were trial attornevs. Sater speculates that Gov. Nixon is more in favor of litigation for malpractice in these situations, making volunteer healthcare services more difficult to navigate. He said they will know in September if Nixon plans to fight the veto override on the bill, but he is optimistic that they will get it through.

Sater noted that the sponsoring organization for volunteer healthcare services can turn down any health care provider wishing to work under them that may be unfit. He is hoping that would provide enough of a buffer ensuring that only those qualified would be working with those in need.

Other states, including Virginia, Tenneessee and Illinois, have passed similar bills without any ill effects to the level of care residents receive.

"The jamboree is always a great learning experience for us. We saw a lot of good things, some bad things and a few ugly things," stated head coach Lance Parnell.


"The most important thing is that our kids can now see themselves on film against someone else and we can learn from our mistakes."






