Cassville Free Lunches Discontinued, but an Alternative Remains

Free lunches have been provided to students by Cassville schools for the bulk of the Covid-19 pandemic. However, with the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year, this will come to an end. The free and reduced lunch program will remain in effect, but parents and students will have to sign up before the beginning of the next school year.

“The US congress did not see fit to extend the waivers we’ve benefitted from into the next school year,” states Dusty Reid, Director of Facilities and Operations for the Cassville school district. “We were reimbursed by the United States Department of Agriculture for each breakfast and lunch that we served. This was for students only, not staff. These waivers went into effect for 2021-2022 school year. This will obviously impact families in the community who are struggling for one reason or another, because we will have to start charging for lunches again. What we really need people to realize is that they can still apply for the free and reduced lunch program. There are ways to mitigate this, but they have to fill out the paperwork.”

This paperwork Reid mentions is for the free or reduced lunch program, a program that is based on income level, and provides more affordable, or entirely free, lunches to students. According to Reid, approximately 48% of students are signed up for this program, however, he says many more could qualify.

“It’s a one or two page form that asks your income, and we can make a determination. A lot of people don’t like giving that information, but only one person in the whole district sees it. A lot of our funding is based on people who qualify for free and reduced lunch, so it’s important to get those forms filled out.

“In this situation where we’ve been giving out free lunches for two years, there’s a lot of people who haven’t filled these forms out, so when the year starts, they’re going to accrue lunch balances.”

These forms must be filled out annually, says Reid.

“Unfortunately, we still have \$10,722 of outstanding lunch balances,” states Reid, “and next year when we start charging again, that number will rise rapidly.”

Depending on the percentage of students who sign up, this could also give the school access to grant money for various improvements, such as a salad bar, according to Reid.

Lunch prices for the 2022-2023 school year have not been finalized as of this publication, however, the most recent cost for a high school lunch was \$2.40, and even if someone did not qualify for the free lunch, the reduced price would be 40 cents for the meal.

 I will be 65 and eligible for Medicare in a few months and am interested in getting a Medicare Advantage plan to cover my health care and medications. What tips can you provide to help me pick a plan?
 Ready to Retire

Dear Ready,
 Medicare Advantage plans have become very popular among retirees over the past 15 years, as nearly half of all new Medicare enrollees are signing up for Advantage plans, which accounts for about 42 percent of the entire Medicare market. Here are some tips and tools to help you pick a plan that fits your needs.

First, let's start with a quick review. Medicare Advantage plans (also known as Medicare Part C) are government approved health plans sold by private insurance companies that you can choose in place of original Medicare. The vast majority of Advantage plans are managed-care policies such as HMOs or PPOs that require you to get your care within a network of doctors.

If you join an Advantage plan, the plan will provide all of your Part A (hospital insurance) and Part B (medical insurance) coverage like original Medicare does. But many plans also offer extra benefits like dental, hearing and vision coverage along with gym/fitness memberships, and most plans include prescription drug coverage too.

Medicare Advantage plans are also cheaper than if you got original Medicare, plus a separate Part D drug plan and a Medigap policy. Many Advantage plans have \$0 or low monthly premiums and don't always have a deductible, but they also typically have a high out-of-pocket maximum. In 2021, Advantage plan participants on average were responsible for a maximum of around \$5,100 for in-network care, and about \$9,200 when out-of-network care is included.

How to Choose
 To help you pick a plan, a good first step is to call the office managers of the doctors you use and find out which Advantage plans they accept, and which ones they recommend. Then go to the Medicare Plan Finder tool at Medicare.gov/plan-compare to compare Advantage plans in your area. This tool provides a five-star rating system that evaluates each plan based on past customer satisfaction and quality of care the plan delivers. When compar-

ing, here are some key points to consider:

Total costs: Look at the plan's entire pricing package, not just the premiums and deductibles. Compare the maximum out-of-pocket costs plus the copays and co-insurance charged for doctor office visits, hospital stays, visits to specialists, prescription drugs and other medical services. This is important because if you choose an Advantage plan, you're not allowed to purchase a Medigap policy, which means you'll be responsible for paying these expenses out of your own pocket.

Drug coverage: Check the plan's formulary – the list of prescription drugs covered –

to be sure all the medications you take are covered without excessive co-pays or requirements that you try less expensive drugs first.

Dental, vision and hearing: Many Advantage plans come with dental, vision and hearing benefits, but are usually limited. Get the details on what exactly is covered.

Coverage away from home: Most Advantage plans limit you to using in-network doctors only within a service area or geographic region, so find out what's covered if you need medical care when you're away from home.

Out-of-network coverage: Check to see what's covered if you want to see a specialist in a hospital that is not in

a plan's network. You can get a list of doctors and hospitals that take part in a plan on the plan's website.

Call Or Click Before You Dig

Warmer weather usually means an increase in outside projects that may require digging or excavation work. If you are planting a tree, building a deck or completing a large project, Missouri law requires anyone digging underground to notify the Missouri One Call System by calling 811 or 1-800-DIGRITE, or placing a locate request online at www.mo1call.com at least three working days before excavation begins. The call will be taken by the Missouri One Call Center, which then notifies all relevant utilities in the project area. During this three day period, utility companies will mark the approximate location of their underground lines, request additional information or advise you that they do not have facilities at the excavation site. Hitting an underground line can cause serious injury, it could disrupt service to you and other customers and it could potentially result in fines and repair costs. "Before you start digging

on any project, it is important you contact the Missouri One Call Center at 811 or 1-800-DIG-RITE (344-7483) or go online to place a locate request at www.mo1call.com so that underground utility lines can be marked," said Missouri Public Service Commission Chairman Ryan Silvey. "Help protect yourself, your family and

your property by making sure you call or click before you begin a project that requires any digging." Call before you dig. It's free and it's the law. For more information, please go to Missouri One Call at www.mo1call.com.

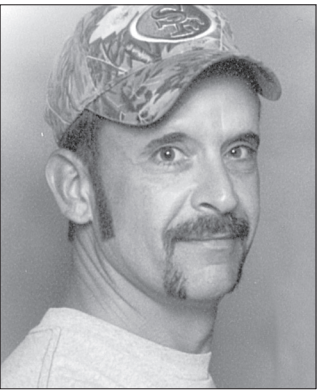

Spring Wildflower Workshop held at Roaring River State Park

Spring is upon us and with her comes an abundance of wildflowers to the Ozarks, and there is no better place to view wildflowers in the area than at Roaring River State Park. Myself, along with thirteen other students, attended a Spring Wildflower Workshop on April 2, held by Roaring River State Park Interpreter Kelly Koch. The workshop started at the Ozark Chinquapin Nature Center, where students learned the basics of plant identification, such as color, shape, size, petals, patterns, leaves, habitat and the difference between native and invasive plants. We then moved onto Eagle's Nest Trail, located at the end of campground two where we identified several local flora which are currently in bloom, including rue anemone, toothwort, Dutchman's breeches, bloodroot, Jacob's Ladder, Liver leaf and walking fern, all which were within a short distance from the trail head.

I will mention this is a short list of viewable flowers in the park, as Missouri is home to more than 1,800 native flowering plants, which mostly bloom during the spring months. Wildflowers assure the continued existence of many species and provide food for insects and other plant eating-animals; it is best to view their beauty and not pick them. The Spring Wildflower checklist provided by the nature center includes over 80 wildflowers which will bloom between March and June and over fifteen trees and shrubs that can be found in the state park such as spicebush. Spicebush can be dried and ground down and used as a replacement for black pepper. We also took a short drive, approximately two miles, down F Highway from the park to Chute Ridge Glade, a 40-acre track owned by Missouri State Parks. Chute Ridge is a dolomite glade and is home to many species of grasses and flowers which will start to bloom within the next few weeks. Interpretive programs are held every day during the summer season and on weekends during the spring and fall seasons. If interested in learning more about the interpretive programs offered at Roaring River State Park, contact the Ozark Chinquapin Nature Center at 417-847-3742.

As of writing this report the water level is still 125 CFS. The water is very good, and the fishing has been wonderful all week. The water has remained murky, but we have been catching lots of fish on power bait. The yellow and the pink have been very good. Plastic eggs in the natural fish oil, and the natural shrimp

color, have both been very good if you were up around the Hatchery. The chocolate brown Hatchery eggs work very well, as they look a lot like the food the trout have been fed in the Hatchery for 12 months. Fluorescent orange, cheese yellow, and Bubble gum pink worms were good all week. Spinners have caught lots

of fish this week; blue, black, skunk, and fluorescent pink, have been pretty good. Fly-fishing has remained very good. We are still catching lots of fish and dry flies, blue wing olives, Elk hair caddis, Griffiths gnats. Still catching several fish on Trico's in the morning. Pheasant tail nymphs and Sowbugs have been working very well all week, flies with a little extra shine work very well when the water is murky. Flies like a holographic crackle back, and a rainbow warrior work very well when the water is murky. We are still using 6X Tippin material when fishing nymphs and small streamers. I am using 7X tippet material when fishing most dries.

Fish can be caught very easily when the water is up and murky, fishing larger streamers and larger woolly buggers good colors are black, olive and brown anything that will resemble a crawdad or minnow. When fishing these types of flies, I will usually use five or 4X tippet material. We are expecting more rain, and the river may come up. If that happens anytime, we have more water, and you will have to add more weight. There are still some areas where you can fish without the extra weight, so you have to look for the back eddies, and the slower areas at the edge of faster runs of water.
