

Retired Patrolman writes of 1941 shootings

For three men's families, the bombings at Pearl Harbor were not nearly as significant as news that hit closer to home. On December 7, 1941, a Missouri State Highway Patrolman lost his life during a murder investigation at a unique little place called the Coffee Pot Tavern in Galloway, now a part of Springfield.

Retired Missouri State Highway Patrolman Donald Richardson, of Cassville, had been fascinated by the story of the shooting, and after his retirement, pursued researching and writing about

His new book's title, Don't Eat My Pie, Squirt, references Trooper Vic Dosing's parting words he told his daughter before leaving the house to attempt to apprehend Milan James Nedimovich, an AWOL soldier that killed two other men leading up to his final stand-off on December

Nedimovich had also killed a man from Little Rock and a Cassville man, Ernest Newman, travelling home from St. Louis to visit his sick mother. The book details the days leading up to the standoff with Troopers at the Coffee Pot, an interesting building shaped like a coffee pot itself. Inside are also details about Dosing's life, his memorial and transcripts of interviews of those there that sorrowful day, including Nedimovich's girlfriend Margie Smith, a waitress at the Coffee Pot. Nedimovich also shot another trooper, who survived, before taking his own life in the apartment above the tavern.

Richardson didn't write the tale to gain wealth or fame, but instead is selling the book and donating the

profits to MASTERS (Missouri Association of State Troopers Emergency Relief Society) to assist families of Troopers killed in the line of duty. Locally, copies are available for purchase at the Barry County Advertiser for \$14.95 plus tax. A variety of bookstores in Missouri also carry the book, including Springfield, Jefferson City and Carthage.

Meth bust results in probation sentence

A drug bust that took place on in September resulted in probation for one.

Barry County Chief Deputy Leonard Collings and Sergeant Randy Kalbough arrived at the residence in question at 11:04 p.m. There was movement inside the house as stated by the officers. Deputy Collins spoke through the window to Tara Beck, asking her to come to the front door.

Once she opened the door,

she allowed the officers inside and was informed as to why they were at the residence. Two males were also located in the house along with Beck. Deputy Collins then asked her where Jerry was, to which she replied out for cigarettes and confirmed he did not run out the back door.

While searching for Jerry, the officers found chemicals and paraphernalia used to manufacture and ingest methamphetamine in plain view. Austin Townsend, Tara

Beck's son, and Jimmy Merrit were the other people present at the residence. Jimmy had pseudophedrine pills on him and a list containing ingredients to manufacture meth. Beck then signed a consent to search the property after Merrit fled from the house.

The officers continued the search and found a two liter 7Up bottle that tested positive for methamphetamine. In the master bedroom bathroom, a clear plastic bottle and a blue mesh bag also tested positive for methamphetamine. Also taken from the residence were small distribution baggies, one green pill and six syringes. More evidence was found all around the house to either distribute or make methamphetamine.

All evidence was photographed where it was located and then transported to the evidence room by Agent Luckey. It was then processed for delivery to the Missouri State Crime Laboratory and the hazardous waste disposal

Jimmy Merrit of Springfield was sentenced to five years incarceration. However, he then received a suspension on his sentence and now must serve five years supervised probation.



The audience will have



JACK CURTIS ENGLAND

Jack Curtis England, age 93, of Shell Knob, Missouri, passed away on Monday, December 2, 2013, at the Mount Vernon Veterans Home in Mount Vernon, Missouri. Jack was born in Shell Knob, Missouri, on June 6, 1920, to George H. England and Minerva Brock England. He grew up and attending public schools in Barry County.

Cassville High School in 1938, Jack spent a year working with the Civilian Conservation Corps in Missouri, one of the first New Deal public works projects environmental conservation and public service. With brothers Edward and Briar, Jack lived and worked in CCC camps throughout Missouri doing reforestation work, building wildlife shelters, stocking rivers and lakes, and clearing campgrounds. The Shell Knob Recreation Site on Highway YY is one of the local projects on which Jack worked in 1939.

U.S. Coast Guard the U.S. Merchant Marines, Jack joined the U.S. Navy in 1942 and was trained as an Aviation Engine Mechanic at the U.S. Navy Great Lakes Training Station before being shipped to Australia with the 7th Fleet. He received an Honorable Discharge in 1945, and Reserves until 1957.

training at Spartan College of Aeronautics and Technology in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and was of Tehachapi, CA. hired as an aviation mechanic

he worked until his retirement. Jack married Opal Willadean Dunlap, from Washburn, Missouri, on December 3, 1944. They lived in Barry County until moving to Tulsa, Oklahoma, in 1950, where they raised three children and were active in a variety of church, scouting and political organizations and activities. Jack maintained memberships in the Tulsa Masonic Lodge, National Rifle Association, the Republican Party, Veterans of Foreign Wars and the National Association of Civilian Conservation Alumni.

In 1975, after retiring from American Airlines, Jack and Willadean returned to Barry County where they spent several years designing and building a home themselves working on the family farm near the original England family farm in Shell Knob. They were active members of After graduating from the First Christian Church in Cassville and enjoyed family gatherings, school and CCC reunions, as well as travel throughout the U.S. to visit children and grandchildren.

In 2005, Jack participated created to promote soil and as a re-enactor in "The Trail of Tears: Cherokee Legacy" in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, where he was the oldest Cherokee descendant depicted in a documentary about the Cherokee removal to Oklahoma in 1838-39.

In 2007, Jack moved to the Missouri Veterans' Home in Mt. Vernon where he was active in the Resident Council until 2010. While living in Mt. By offering sportsmen the ability to donate their harvested deer to certified meat processors and covering all or most of the costs, Share the Harvest provides hunters with a way to help needy families. The donated venison, once processed, is distributed to thousands of needy Missourians through food pantries across the state.

Thanks to Missouri Food Bank Association, Missouri Department of Conservation, Bass Pro Shops, Shelter Insurance, Wal-Mart Foundation, Allan P. and Josephine B. Green Foundation, many Conservation Federation Affiliates, and the continued generous financial support of many other partners, our program is looking forward to a great year. Meat processors also play a key role in the success of Share the Harvest and we thank them. The Conservation Federation pays sixty dollars towards the processing fees of each donated animal and in many instances, local contributions to certified meat processors result in little or no expense for hunters





to donate their deer to the program other than the costs for permits, equipment and fuel. The 2013 Conservation

Federation budget allows for

10,000 whole deer donations.

Once again, hunters need to legally harvest and tele-check their deer before bringing them to an authorized processor for donation. A list of authorized processors is available online through the Missouri Department of Conservation website www.mdc.mo.gov and in the current brochure of deer hunting regulations, available wherever permits

Deer hunters have donated over three million pounds of venison since the program started and we hope you will make plans now and consider donating a deer to Share the Harvest. Even if you are not able to donate an entire deer, we hope you will at least consider donating a package or two of venison. There is a great need out there! Usually the tons of venison the program produces only lasts a few weeks in the food pantries.

Do your part to help maintain a healthy Missouri deer herd and, at the same time, provide venison to Missourians in need. Together, we can make a difference!

Throughout the years, the College of the Ozarks has acquired a national reputation as a fundamental Christian school and it attracts college students who pay for their tuition and education by working fifteen hours a week at the College. It is supported largely by donations and has a college student body of approximately 1600 stu-
