#### Cassville R-IV hires two new teachers

The Cassville school district has been monitoring the class size in the first and fourth grade classes since the beginning of the year. As numbers increased, it became evident that the classes needed new teachers to support the learning of the number of students enrolled, so beginning in the second semester, Cassville is welcoming two new teachers to their staff

Superintendent Richard Asbill stated, "This year, we just have had a unique experience that the numbers have been increasing in the first and fourth grades specifically. We have been providing some base room interventions to help accommodate some of this growth, but it became evident as numbers continued to increase that we needed to look at adding an additional teacher to each of

these grade levels."

Currently, first grade has a 27:1 ratio of students to teachers, and fourth grade's ratio is 27 or 28:1. With the addition of new teachers, that number will lower to 23:1 in first grade and 23 or 24:1 in fourth grade.

Asbill continued, "The Board of Education has been very supportive of our needs and has been monitoring the situation for several months. The Board asked the administrators to look at options and meet with teachers on possible plans to adjust or provide new classrooms. When we discussed the possible solutions in October and November, they were supportive of the plans.

"We came back to the Board this month with everything in place to appropriately provide a transition that was good for students, parents and teachers to start of second semester with the new classrooms."

The two new teachers for the Primary and Intermediate schools are Rachelle Weatherly and Natalie Ward. Weatherly will be teaching fourth grade, is a 2009 Monett High School graduate and a 2013 Missouri Southern State University graduate. Ward is a 2009 Cassville High School graduate and a 2013 Missouri Southern State University graduate.

"Cassville R-IV School District is fortunate that we can make this adjustment at this time of year. Our Board of Education members have really worked hard to establish fiscal foals that put student needs first. So, planning for this fiscal need was important to them and assisted us in reaching this goal and adding these two positions mid-year," Asbill stated.



# Highway 37 is now 80 years old

It was in late December 1963 that a contract was let by the Missouri Highway Department to begin construction of the new Missouri State Highway 37 on the west edge of Cassville, bypassing Business 37 which had existed since the 1920s.

A portion of the original Highway 37 (now Business 37) had been operated since Highway 37 was built in the 1920s and followed Main Street south through the business district of Cassville on the east side of the Courthouse which had been a city street since Cassville was shown as the County seat in 1845.

When it became apparent that the by-pass was being considered by the state, it aroused fear and consternation, approaching panic among some of the business community that it would inflict irreparable injury to what had been the heart of Cassville.

Actually, what it did was to get rid of the bulk of heavy truck traffic off Main Street which never intended to stop in Cassville in the first place. The dire prediction of the naysayers never materialized to any extent.

A contract for the construction of Missouri State Highway 37 from Monett to the junction of Highways 86 and 76 south of Cassville, including a new entrance to Cassville from the south, was awarded to the Peter Kiewit and Sons Construction Company of Omaha, Nebraska. The firm was apparent low bidder when bids were opened at Jefferson

One of the bids covers the 18.2 miles of grading, bridging and concrete paving from U.S. Highway 60 in Monett to the junction southwest of Cassville, and the other called for approximately one mile of grading and paving on Missouri 76 to connect with Missouri 37 south of Cassville.

The bid on the 16.2 miles project was \$2,580,375 and the Omaha firm was also low bidder on the 1 mile portion with a bid of \$330,636.00.

Construction began shortly after the first of the year.

Sher Yang was born on August 8, 1950, in Bongna, Laos. He has five brothers and six sisters. In 1961, he moved to Long Cheng, Laos, to finish high school. In 1967, he completed high school and went to continue his education in Udon, Thailand. While learning English in Thailand, he was one out of seventy students that the Americans drafted as a CIA First Operative working for the late General Vang Pao for the Secret War. In 1969, he returned to Laos as a First Operative. He was in charge of giving exact locations for bomber planes to drop bombs using text, radar, and radio controls. After the war, in 1975, he left Laos and went to Nong Khai, Thailand, and met up with Yang Lue and Jerry Daniels at the refugee camp. He worked for the Americans in the refugee camps for five

In February 1976, he finally immigrated to the United States and settled in Chicago, Illinois. As he settled in the States, he worked in various factories while translating and interpreting on the side to help other Hmong families settle in the US. In 1981, he moved to Sheboygan, Wisconsin, and for eleven years, he drove a forklift for Wigwam Mills. In 1992, he decided to work for himself as a truck driver and went back and forth to Chicago and other parts of the United States. Being a driver, he was able to travel and experience different things in life. In 2006, Sher became ill and was unable to continue his career as a truck driver. On December 6, 2013, he passed away peacefully with his family members by his side.

Sher is preceded in death Yang.



# Eighty years ago at Roaring River State Park

It was eighty years ago in the last part of the depression, 1933, when the CCC Boys at Roaring River State Park held a celebration for completion of the installation of the camp's first year of operation.

The mess crew of Sergeant F. Iseley strutted their stuff again at Roaring River State Park and made the boards groan when a dinner was spread in celebration of the completion of the Civilian Conservation Corps

No story of Roaring River would be complete without the chronicle of the Civillian Conservation Corps. What Roaring River State Park is today is, in large part, due to the CCC camp which was there in the 1930's.

Company 1713, CCC, was organized at Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas, in June 1933, and was moved to its location at Roaring River State Park, eight miles south of Cassville, in the same

During the next seven years, the CCC built 33 building units, mostly of logs or stone quarried by the men, 17 acres of beach improvements, six acres of landscaping, many, many miles of roads and trails, topographical completed and linear surveys, built bridges, fire guards, fences, drinking fountains, fish races, garages, and a hatchery building. The list could go on and on.

The establishment of the CCC was a great thing. It took the boys off the streets and gave them useful lives. It built not just Roaring River, but many parks and improvements all over the country. But, most important, it built self-respecting

It is almost impossible

to separate the history of Roaring River and that of the CCC in this area. Events of the era linked the two together for all time.

1933 was not a good year. The country was beleaguered by depression. President Franklin Roosevelt asked Congress for authorization to set up an organization in which the young men could find gainful employment in helping to conserve the national resources of the nation. The initial legislation was passed on March 31; the executive order setting up the program was April 5; the first man was enrolled on April 7; and the first camp established only ten days

In these days of slow moving bureaucracy, the speed at which the project moved seems unbelievable. Less than two months following the initial legislation, the first contingent of CCC moved into Roaring River, as they did in other camps all over the United States.

Looking backward, it seems almost impossible. Within a matter of weeks from the program's inception, a company strength of 150 boys arrived at Roaring River. There was no housing. They had to be fed. Clothing must be available. Supervisory personnel must be chosen and on hand. Plans for projects had to be compiled. Tools to work with had to be provided. The sheer logistics of such an operation in so short a time seems almost unbelievable. But it worked.

An advance detail of 45 men set to work clearing space for a "tent city" for the 150 corps members who were shortly to follow. The camp was on the hillside by

the Shelter Kitchen. Sawhorses and boards were used for the dining tables and for the cooks to work on. And cook they did. Veterans of the CCC camp report that the food was wholesome and good, and the tables were always full. Full tables were not taken for granted

Many local residents recall when the first group of "shiny new green trucks" bound for the CCC camp moved through the area. There were not a lot of shiny new vehicles about in those days. Then the first 150 boys came, and were promptly decked out in new uniforms and boots. "They really looked spiffy!" one man re-

And some 1,500 boys moved through the Roaring River camp during its years

Possibly projects were chosen in order of their urgency. Norma Brixey, who lived at Roaring River through all those years when her husband, Hugh Brixey, was Superintendent, recalls well that the very first project was the building of new walls around the spring to replace the earthen walls which were rapidly eroding and in danger of caving in.

Hugh Brixey had been appointed Superintendent on April 15, 1933, a position he held until 1943. At that time, the management of the hotel, dining room, and cabins had been busy years for the Brixeys.

And the CCC Boys

worked with a sense of pride. As soon as the first temporary camp was built, the men began clearing away undergrowth, building paths, roads, bridges and other improvements. Orders were received in the summer of 1933 to construct a permanent camp, so the erection of tar-paper covered barracks began on a hillside near where Camp Smokey now stands. Logs were used in the construction of a large mess hall and recreation hall, giving a rustic appearance to the camp, which harmonized with the natural grandeur of the surroundings. All the subsequent buildings had this in common - they still look like they belong. The pumphouse and latrine were built of native stones.

On October 12, 1933, the new quarters were ready for occupancy. The unceiled buildings seemed luxurious to the men after spending several months in tents which at times were inhabited by every native "varment" from wood-ticks to copper heads. Running water, electric lights and meals served family style were among the other improvements to the camp. The fact that the buildings at Roaring River are still of a sound a structure as when they were built and so architecturally pleasing is a marvel, considering the fact that the crewmen were without building experience and that most tools consisted of hand-tools. The teachers and supervisors must have been good ones.

Rock was quarried on the park grounds and chipped out in building blocks by hand. Shingles for roofing were made in the sawmill at Roaring River from blocks of wood cut from timber on surrounding mountains.

What Roaring River might have become without the CCC, we will never know. What it is today is in large part due to their ef-




#### **Exeter students collect food for 17 families**

Hettinger, who was paralyzed in a drunk driving accident in which he was a passenger, confessed to the students, "I could've played college basketball, but I partied away the opportunity."

FBLA member Jayse Henderson observed, "I think when students hear from somebody who has been there it makes a big impact." FCCLA member Jessica Ball added, "I was amazed to hear him talk about how difficult even the small things are for him. Something as simple as a wrinkle in his bed sheets causes him problems."

To wind up the program, FBLA and FCCLA sponsored an obstacle course in which students drove pedal cars wearing special goggles that simulated buzzed driv-

Students also visited a drunk simulation station where they attempted to work a simple puzzle, first without simulation goggles and then with them, observing a marked difference in their success.

Henderson revealed, "We learned about the two second rule. That's how long your mind needs to process and react to something while driving. When you're buzzed or drunk, you don't have it."

Summing up the semester-long project, Ball noted, "I think we did well this year. We greatly increased students' awareness of the importance of seatbelt usage and avoiding distracted driving." They also increased seatbelt usage. The October check found 79 percent of observed drivers and passengers buckled up.

In the November check, the usage jumped to 92%. According to MO-DOT, the Missouri teen seatbelt usage average in 2012 was 66 percent. Purdy FBLA Advi-



#### State Treasurer debuts new unclaimed property program

State Treasurer Clint Zweifel announced last week that Missourians can donate their unclaimed property to charity through a new online search tool. The tool also allows the person to cash in for their unclaimed property as well.

Currently, the treasurer holds more than \$810 million in unclaimed property. That property belongs to 4.7 million account owners. The southwest region, where Barry County lies, holds over 461,000 accounts with \$40.7 million of property that has yet to be claimed.

property Unclaimed held by the treasurer comes from bank accounts, stocks, bonds and abandoned safety

deposit boxes. State law dictates that banks, insurance companies, public agencies and businesses turn any properties over to the treasurer's office if they have not had contact with the owners for five or more years.

The treasurers office holds monetary assets forever until they are claimed, but the state law also states that abandoned non-monetary assets be auctioned off from safe deposit boxes. However, as of August 28, 2010, military medals and honors are not auctioned or sold but rather held for the owner or their heir.

There is no time limit for when someone can claim their property. If the assets were turned in to Treasurer

Zweifel as an interest-bearing account, they will also pay up to seven years interest with the claim.

With the new program, anyone can go to the unclaimed property website an complete a search at www. ShowMeMoney.com. average return for a claim is \$300. Many accounts are worth just a few dollars, but some hold quite a bit. Approximately 65 percent of people can file a claim through the website without having to mail in a paper form. Missourians can then choose to donate as much or as little as they wish to the 20 charities on the site.

"These charities provide invaluable services to the people of Missouri and now, with this program, we have created a simple way to give back to the citizens in our state," Treasurer Zweifel stated. "This new program was created in response to requests from constituents to donate their unclaimed property. My team and I are focused on creating innovative ways to serve the needs and wishes of Missourians and this program is an example of that. I am proud of the good it can do for our communities at no cost to taxpayers," Zweifel continued.

Examples of the charities benefitting from the donations through the unclaimed property site are: the American Heart Association, CureSearch for Children's Cancer, Muscular Dystrophy Association and others. Since January 2009, Zweifel has returned \$176 million to unclaimed property owners from more than 605,000 accounts.

Zweifel stated, "I receive new unclaimed property every day, meaning thousands of dollars and hundreds of accounts are added to my database each week. Whether your claim is \$5 of \$500, consider donating to a charity where it can have a real, positive impact on our fellow Missourians' lives."




