Eagle Rock brothers charged in kidnapping and burglary

The two brothers sought for the kidnapping and robbery of a Washburn woman are both in custody facing charges.

Mathew Jeffrey Miller, of Eagle Rock, was taken into custody around 11 a.m. on Wednesday, January 8, for the crime that left a Washburn woman injured and burglarized. Mathew's brother Michael Jeffrey Miller was taken into custody by the Allegheny County Sheriff's Office, outside of Pittsburgh,

Pennsylvania. According to Sheriff Mick Epperly, Mathew was the passenger in the car while Michael was the driver during the kidnapping and robbery of the 47-year-old woman.

Michael and Mathew Miller lived in the Eagle Rock area and advertised as supposed handymen under the business name The Brothers' Handyman Service. Their business cards and ads claimed that they specialized in roofing but also did general labor and house cleaning,

to Superintendent Richard Asbill, noting to the crowd that the overall project cost \$2.5 million, with \$1.5 million of that from a FEMA grant. among other services.

When Sheriff Epperly was asked if their handyman service was related to the abduction, he replied, "That's a big part of it."

The brothers have been charged with a class C felony felonious restraint, class C felony of tampering of a motor vehicle in the first degree, misdemeanor assault in the third degree, and fraudulent use of a credit device in Barry County. McDonald County has also charged them with class C felony kidnapping, class B felony burglary, and class A felony tampering with a motor vehicle.

The Miller brothers allegedly arrived at the victim's house on foot on Friday, January 3, around noon. The two men demanded her money, medications and car, eventually throwing her into the trunk of her 2011 Chevrolet Malibu and driving off.

The men attempted to make a withdrawal from her Arvest account in Cassville unsuccessfully before making a successful transaction at First State Bank.

The brothers then allegedly took the woman out of the trunk, struck her in the face and head, and threw her down a hill on Farm Road 1180 in Eagle Rock.

The victim had to walk about a mile barefoot to find help and contact authorities.

The victim's car was found partially submerged in the Roaring River arm of Table Rock Lake. Sheriff Epperly believes that the men were picked up there by Michael's girlfriend, a woman from Pennsylvania, in a white panel van with Pennsylvania plates.

The three then withdrew more money from ATMs in Berryville, Arkansas, taking a total of \$1,125.00 from the victim.


The Sheriff's Department originally thought that the FBI would need to be involved because she was taken over the state line into Ar-

A public hearing turned heated as the Barry County Health Department (BCHD) fielded questions and comments regarding a proposed change to the wastewater ordinance on Thursday, January 9.

The meeting began at 7 p.m. at the FEMA shelter and event center at Cassville Schools with around 75 people in attendance to hear the Health Department's reasoning behind a change planned for 2014 regarding septic systems in the county. If the ordinance changes, property would need to have a thirdparty inspection of their septic system when they sell their house.

Kimberly Scritchfield, with the BCHD's environmental services, presented a slideshow to explain the importance of functional, nonleaking septic systems. She explained that Barry County is primarily karst topography, meaning the limestone results in numerous caves and sinkholes. That is an important factor when dealing with wastewater.

Scritchfield stated, "Because of all of the holes and tunnels, water recharges much faster in karst topography." In simple terms, a leaking septic system could feed directly into groundwater or the lake, leading to an increase in illness and disease if not caught.

Scritchfield went on, "If a septic system is installed near a sinkhole or cave, that water receives practically no treatment and all of the pathogens are dispersed in the lakes, springs or wells." The treatment she referred to is the way soil can help filter out pathogens as the water trickles back down into the groundwater during the water cycle. Barry County has 169 caves and 89 reported with many more unreported.

Scritchfield gave examples that ranged over the last 40 years regarding groundwater contamination by septic systems leading to serious

illness and disease, including a case from Barry County in 2012 when a little girl became ill with E.coli from a failing septic system at the home.

Jan Cox, also with environmental services, addressed the proposed ordinance itself and how it could improve the health and safety of residents within the county. Cox stated, "The goal is to clean up some of the failing septic systems in the county and promote public health."

Cox went on to discuss the specifics of the proposed addition to the Wastewater Ordinance regarding on-site wastewater treatment systems. The new ordinance would require that properties have their septic systems inspected by a third party prior to the sale to another party. If a system was installed in the last ten years and had a permit, they would be exempt from the ordinance along with a few other situations, such as a transfer on death or inheritance of a property.

The ordinance change would only affect the sale of property and would stay on file for four years after its issuance.

Community members mostly showed up to voice their concerns about the proposed reform. Sharon Ott-Deal, realtor from Shell Knob, raised her concerns over the property transfer in the case of inheritance or from one family member to

another as opposed to sale.

Roger Brock, BCHD administrator, assured that those types of transfers would be exempt from the inspection. Ott-Deal also asked about the turnaround of the permit paperwork, concerned that it could affect or delay home sales. Cox assured that the turnaround would be no more than five days as long as all of the paperwork was filled out cor-

kansas but discovered that they released the victim prior to going to Berryville. Epperly stated, "They are lucky that they didn't cross over that line because that would have been one more charge on the list."

Michael Miller is being held pending extradition back to Barry County in the Allegheny, PA County Jail. It was originally thought that there were pending felony assault charges in Allegheny County, but authorities with the department stated that he is only being held for his warrants in Barry and Mc-Donald Counties. It is possible that charges will be filed against him at a later date.

Sheriff Epperly confirmed that they have identified Michael's girlfriend, but there is not currently a warrant out for her arrest for her connection with the case.





Curtis Marbut, Barry County's Most Famous Son

Continued from last week lifelong The correspondence between Louise and her father gives an insight into his life not possible through his published works alone. The family moved to Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1893 so that Marbut could enroll as a graduate student in geology at Harvard University. Although his major professor and adviser was the eminent pioneer geographer geomorphologist William Morris Davis, Marbut revealed in his

correspondence to Louise that Nathaniel Southgate Shaler, a pioneer geographer and agricultural geologist, was his academic and professional inspiration to study soils.

Just prior to and during Marbut's tenure at Harvard, Shaler had become highly regarded for his publications on soils and natural resources conservation. Shaler was a compelling lecturer who promoted the education of the whole student: mentally, physically, and spiritually.





Marbut received an MA in 1894 under Davis. In 1895, he completed the residence requirements for the PhD and returned with his family to the UMC with a faculty appointment. Although he finished and published his PhD dissertation in 1896 with Davis' approval, he never returned to Harvard for his oral defense exam and the PhD was never awarded. Marbut served the UMC Geology Department as instructor (1895-1897),professor (1897- 1900), and professor (1900–1910), and was simultaneously appointed assistant geologist in the Missouri Geological Survey until 1904. His PhD dissertation Physical Features of Missouri, published in 1896 by the Missouri Geological Survey, was a pioneering study in physiography and surface hydrology. While at the UMC, Marbut published numerous studies, including: erosional remnants Crowley's Ridge, Cote Sans Dessein, and Grand Tower (1898); coal stratigraphy of areas of northern Missouri (1898); the lowlands of Southeastern Missouri (1902); the geology of Morgan County, Missouri (1908); and the soils of the Ozark region (1910).

In 1904, Marbut and Agriculture College Dean Henry J. Waters collaborated on a large-scale plaster physiographic map Missouri that won a gold medal at the 1904 Louisiana Purchase Exposition in St Louis. In addition, Marbut and Waters coauthored the first attempt at a general soil map of Missouri that, together with two geological maps and a chapter on geology and physiography by Marbut, were published in the Exposition's volume, The State of Missouri. The following year, due to the influence of Waters and Cyril G. Hopkins of the University of Illinois, the University of Missouri Board of Curators organized the Missouri state soil survey and named Marbut as director. For the next five years, Marbut oversaw and contributed to the preparation and publication of individual county soil surveys. Thus began a lifelong interdisciplinary collaboration between Marbut and UMC faculty members Merritt Finley (known as M.F.) Miller of the Agronomy Department and Homer L. Schantz of the Botany Department.







For the month of December, both Cassville City and Barry County sales tax experienced a decrease from last year's revenue.

The City of Casville had a 12.2 percent decrease in tax revenue when compared to 2012. This year, the City received \$117,041.57. Last year, that total was total was \$133,343.96.

The County also had a dip, but not to the same extent. Barry County received 4.34 percent less than the same amount last year. In December 2012, the County received \$137,114.42 in tax revenue. This year, that number was only \$130,579.03, \$6,535.59

One man is in custody facing an assault charge after a stabbing at 335 W. Pine Street in Monett.



Witnesses told police that he lives in that home as well as in Purdy.

Winsea is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 bond. He has been charged with class B felony assault in the first degree.



Continued from January 8's built there but at Mt. Vernon. Mr. and Mrs. Brandon tell of when the mail was carried on pack horse from Cassville each day by a Col. Will Holiday who "ran" the route, which at that time was the Shell Knob Route, but is now the Cato Route. They say that their mail service in those days was very prompt and it upset the old Col. greatly if he was even a few minuets late in dashing through the countryside with the mail.

And, according to Mr. Brandon, the G.A.R. Post at Mineral Springs was very active during the early years and in 1886 or 1887 there were 135 members enrolled and the G.A.R. hall was over one of the store buildings. Each year, the Mineral Springs Post held annual campfires and reunions with large attendance; however, sometime previous to the year 1890, the Post there combined with the Cassville Post and from that came our American Legion Annual Reunion of today.

Mr. Brandon recalls that about the year 1885, a man by the name of Henry Lohmer arrived in the community and lived in one of the boarding houses there.

Council approves judge, discusses website

Cassville's City Council got their first glimpse into the success of the new City website that debuted in December at the Monday, January 13, meeting.

The new website gives the City a dedicated site instead of the shared site they used to partner with the Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce. Cityofcassville.com had 242 visits from 215 visitors for the month of December, with 34 people signing up for the online water/sewer bill pay option and 13 of those using it to pay their December bills.

Bills from the City have the new website on them to alert customers to the new option. The electronic op-

tion allows customers to pay in their own time frame. Alderman Darrell Ledenham asked Steve Walensky, Public Words director, if partial payments will be available soon. Walensky replied that they hope so.

Walensky also reported to the council that, as this time, it does not make financial sense to enter into a kiosk agreement that would allow the City to share the Fasttrip payment kiosk with Barry Electric. Walensky stated, "It would cost us more to set it up than what we would stand to make. We just don't have the customer base to support it like Barry Electric does."

The council had considered offering a bill-pay kiosk

option to decrease cost to the City when it comes to processing monthly payments.

The council also approved resolutions to sell the old Cassville D.A.R.E vehicle, accept a bid from Decker and DeGood for the 2013 audit, annex property at the request of homeowners and also allow the Cassville Police Department to accept a grant from Walmart for equipment and promotional materials.

The Council also approved the required retirement of Municipal Judge Andrew Hager effective February 14. The new judge to be appointed is Randee Stemmons.

County processes tax payments

Of the 40,000 tax statements mailed out by Barry County Collector Janice Varner, the County has received payments in the amount of \$15,067,328.38 by the December 31 deadline.

Last year, the County received \$14,375,802.76 by the deadline, roughly 70 percent of what was billed. This year, \$21,124,969.14 was billed, so the County received about 71 percent of that figure.

Previous years' totals were \$14,520.582.31 in 2011 and \$14,289,725.57 in 2010. Despite a slow start in payments within the County, numbers are comparative to previous years. Payments not received by the December 31 deadline are subject to a late penalty on the amount taxed.

City cautions against insurance letters

The City of Cassville did not provide the company with the names and addresses of their customers, nor does the City endorse the services. People may purchase the service if they choose, but it is not mandated, required or recommended by the City of the Public Works Depart-



Many were concerned with the cost of the inspection, but also the cost of replacing a failing system if it were not to pass. Daniel Schaefer, an inspector from Shell Knob, stated that his inspection runs from \$175-250, not out of line with other inspection costs during the sale of a property.

David Casaletto, the president of Ozarks Water Watch, offered some relief regarding replacing septic systems in the area. Casaletto stated that 2/3 of Barry County is located in the upper White River Basin, an area that allows for grants to replace septic tanks. His nonprofit organization can provide a grant for 49 percent of the replacement of a system, plus an additional 49 percent of the loan at zero interest if one meets income guidelines.

Even armed with information about grants, it still did not put the group as a whole at ease. Many were concerned with the government overstepping their boundaries by regulating or requiring inspections. A few voiced opinions that inspections should remain voluntary.

A primary concern over the voluntary system currently in place is that people can purchase a home without realizing that the septic system is failing. Brock stated, "Septic systems don't last forever. Period."

Brock emphasized how important community feedback is to the process of the Health Board making a decision in this matter. He stated, "If you have positive comments on how to improve this, or how to make this policy better, we would love to hear that."

Some from the crowd wanted to call for a ballot measure for a public vote. However, Brock stated, "It is not something we have to have a vote on, it is an addition to the ordinance already on file. It's not beyond our scope because we already regulate waste water treatment systems, but this is not decided. We want to hear the public's opinion before we make a decision."

If the wastewater ordinance change goes through, the county hopes to have it in place by January 1, 2015, at the latest. The whole ordinance will be available to view on the Barry County Health Department's website at barrycountyhealth.org in coming weeks.



Wheaton murder case in high court

Christopher Collings, the man convicted of the 2007 rape and murder of nine-year-old Rowan Ford at Wheaton is appealing his death penalty sentence on claims that his statements made in a video tape confession were not voluntary.

The Missouri Supreme Court heard arguments on Wednesday, January 8, for the appeal of his death penalty sentence and an assessment of life without parole

Ford was abducted from her home near Stella late at night in November 2007. Her body was found a week later in the bottom of a cave in McDonald County. There was evidence that she had been raped and strangled.

David Spears, 31, the girl's stepfather, was also charged in the murder. After Collings was convicted, Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox allowed Spears to plea guilty to a lesser charge of child endangerment in which he was sentenced to 11 years in prison. The two men had conflicting confessions, and Collings always insisted that Spears was not

involved in the crime.

Collings admitted to officers that he took the girl from her home to his mobile home, raped her and then strangled her with a piece of cord from his truck when she recognized him after the sexual assault. Collings stated that he had attempted to commit the rape in the dark and without her knowing his identity.

An attorney with the Office of the State Public Defender stated that Collings did not understand his Miranda Rights. The attorney also argued that the trial

court should have admitted a video-tape of Collings and Wheaton Chief of Police Clint Clark which showed that he was pressured to give up his constitutional rights and continue to talk to investigators.

Appeal paperwork also argues that the prosecution did not prove that he had coolly reflected before killing her, a necessary aspect of a first-degree conviction. Other accusations include the collection of evidence from his property that was admitted into court in a speculative, misleading and preju-

dicial manner, like a piece of cord that was unrelated to the murder.

Attorney General Chris Koster and assistant Richard Starnes submitted paperwork to the high courts stating that Collings was aware of his actions prior to the rape and murder, even taking a different road to beat Spears home after they had been out drinking so that he could have time to take the girl before Spears arrived.

The medical examiner who testified in the trial stated that Collings would have had to strangle Ford for two to three minutes to kill her, the state argued that allowed plenty of time for Collings to reflect on his actions. The state also argued that Collings was read his Miranda Rights before every conversation with Chief Clark.

Also in the paperwork filed by the state is argument that the disposal of evidence by dumping the girls' body in a remote location as well as burning his mattress and her clothes "supports a reasonable inference of deliberation."






