Sheriff seeks tips for Washburn kidnapping

The Barry County Sheriff's Office is looking for tips in regards to a kidnapping that occurred in Washburn on Friday, January 3, around

Two men wearing bandanas and using fake Russian accents entered into the house of a 47-year-old white female on Trent Road in Washburn. The men demanded the woman's money, medications and car.

The Washburn resident, who lives on social security and disability, told the men to take what they wanted and to just leave her alone, according to Sheriff Mick Epperly, but the men grabbed the woman and threw her in the trunk of her car before driving off.

Sheriff Epperly stated, "They had a goal in mind of taking her car to use her PIN at the ATM. They arrived on foot, so they had a plan."

The men drove the victim's car, a 2011 Chevrolet

Malibu, into Cassville while she was inside the trunk and attempted to withdraw money from her Arvest bank account using the ATM. According to the Sheriff, the men had their bandanas pulled up to conceal their faces at the ATM and when funds were not available, they drove around for around 20 minutes before successfully withdrawing \$350 from the ATM at First State Bank.

Epperly stated, "At one point, the victim used the trunk release latch to open the trunk. When she refused to shut the trunk after the men yelled at her, one got out, struck her, and then slammed the trunk shut

After withdrawing money from the ATM, the men drove the victim's car to a remote area on Farm Road 1180 in Eagle Rock, took her out, and threw her down a

The Sheriff's Department received a call around 3 p.m.

from the woman who had walked around a mile barefoot before finding a farmhouse that let her in to call

The men weren't finished when they dumped the victim off. The men went on to draw more money out of her bank account.

"Four Epperly stated, more transactions made in Berryville, Ark., between 3:09 and 3:30 p.m. I've sent a subpoena for the videos from Arvest down there, and we have had a few leads that we are looking in to."

The kidnappers stole \$1,125.00 total from the victim's account with all of the transactions in Cassville and Berryville.

Later in the afternoon, Missouri Department of Conservation agents received a call about a car parked near the water's edge on the Roaring River arm of Table Rock Lake. Daniel Shores, conservation agent, stated, "I'd heard the notice

about the missing car sent out by the Highway Patrol, but I assumed the car someone called about was going to belong to a fisherman or someone like that."

When Shores investigated, he found the victim's Malibu submerged in the water. The Sheriff stated that water was over the hood and was already inside the cab of the car when they arrived.

Epperly said, "We want these people off the street. We've contacted the FBI because they crossed the state line to drop her off, so they may become involved with this."

The victim told authorities that she did not know the men who abducted her. However, considering they knew when her social security/disability was to be de-

posited, that may not be the case. Epperly stated, "They may know her since they walked on foot into her residence, knowing she had a car and medications. They also might have ties to Eagle Rock because of the area that they dropped her off in,. You'd just about have to be familiar to get down there."

Epperly went on, "It's a very brutal crime. The victim had to be transported to the hospital for treatment for moderate injuries with a lot of bruising."

Filings begin for city councils, school boards

Filings for positions on both the area city councils and the school boards have been somewhat slow this year, perhaps due to the weather and closures.

The City of Cassville has two alderman positions up for reelection, the seats held by Terry A. Heinz in the south ward and north ward's Darrel Ledenham. Heinz has already refiled for his seat, but Ledenham has yet to refile. No new residents are seeking those seats thus far.

The City of Purdy has two openings before their January 21 deadline. The two seats are Ken Real, ward 2, and Larry Rickman, ward 1. Neither men have refiled for their positions yet.

In Wheaton, Nancy Rosentreter has filed for the position of Mayor, currently held by Mayor Pro-Tem David Shockley. Shockley will step down back to his position on the council after April's election. The two

County tax

County preps for 2014 budget meeting

The Barry County Commissioners received budget requests from the different departments last week. Proposed increases by the departments came in at \$3,570,150, an increase over 2013's approved actual budget of 3,059,283.

The county sales tax that was approved in April 2013 allows the county more operating revenue than in prior years, but no decisions will be made regarding budget approvals until the Commissioners meet for their annual budget discussion on Thursday, January 23, at 11 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room at the courthouse in downtown Cassville.

Despite an increase in taxes billed for the year, tax revenue collected by December 30 was down comparatively for the year.

Janice Varner, Barry County c\Collector, mailed out over 40,000 tax statements to Barry County residents on November 4. As of December 30, the numbers were down significantly from last year on taxes paid.

All taxes collected in the county are due by December 31 to avoid penalties. Less money received for the time frame could be a sign of the economic times for the year.

Last year, Varner sent out \$20,558,830.11 in tax state-

Firefighters with area districts had a busy few days last week with multiple calls for structure fires. Purdy, Cassville and Central Crossing Fire in Shell Knob all had calls for fires, but there was only one minor injury. Butterfield, Monett and Jenkins all assisted on those calls as well.

The Purdy Fire District responded to two fires on December 29 and 30. One of the fires was in an occupied house, but there were no injuries sustained from the fire.

Around 8:17 a.m. on Sunday, December 29, the firefighters were called out to a property owned by Randy Wormington on Farm Road

When the crew arrived, there was no fire showing externally at the residence, but family members had used a garden hose to control burning insulation in the attic of the home. According to Purdy Fire Chief Mike Redshaw, "Indications are that the blown-in insulation in the attic had been smoldering for several hours unnoticed. It wasn't until smoke was coming from between the walls and trim, setting off the smoke detectors, that the longtime occupant knew there was a fire."

The house in question suffered only moderate damage, but the Purdy Fire District had to remove a large area of the ceiling and insulation to prevent the fire from spreading to other areas within the

Firefighters from Monett City and Butterfield assisted at the accidental fire.

The district made their second call around 6:01 a.m. to a possible fire north of Mc-Dowell. While en route, another called confirmed that a structure was on fire. When the firefighters arrived, the structure had already collapsed and there was a blazing fire present.

The structure was located on Farm Road 1150 and is owned by Phillip Reidle who was not at home during the

Barry County, as it exists today since 1840, has produced a great many memorable people but one person, Curtis L. Fletcher Marbut, stands out in a class by himself.

Virtually all of this article comes from a story written by John Tandrich and published in the "Encyclopedia of Soils in the Environment," who worked with Lynn Morrow, daughter of local record, in the office of the Secretary of State in Jefferson City.

The patriarch of the Marbut family, Phillip Marbut, a native of South Carolina, settled on Little Flat Creek near McDowell about the year 1841 and, ultimately, he had six sons and six daughters who had families. Scores of his descendents still live in Barry County including Fletcher Marbut, who was a grandson of Phillip.

The brilliance that characterized the life of Curtis Fletcher Marbut, dedicated to soil science in the service of humanity, ended on August 25, 1935, in what was then Harbin, Manchuria, China. He was the best-known soil scientist-geographer of his day and his reputation was worldwide. Marbut was a pioneering soil scientist in the classroom, office, field, and laboratory. More than that, he was a disseminator of ideas, an internationalist who did not let politics, ideology or his personal health and welfare stand in the way of scientific advancement and friendship. The biography of Marbut is a remarkable story of a 'selfmade' man who came from a progressive Ozarks family in Barry County to become one of the foremost agricultural geologists, geographers, and soil scientists in the world during the formative period of modern soil science in the early twentieth century.

Modern soil science has its origins in late eighteenth and early nineteenth century agricultural chemistry and agricultural geology.

This short narrative summarizes the highlights of Marbut's life as a native of the Missouri Ozarks, an academic, a scientist with the US Soil Survey, an explorer and internationalist, and a scientist with a Unitarian philosophy of service to humanity for which he ultimately gave his life.

Marbut was born during the American Civil War, on July 19, 1963, to Nathan and Jane Browning Marbut, along Little Flat Creek near Verona in Lawrence County, Missouri. After surviving whooping cough in the first weeks of life, he grew up in an atmosphere of love, learning, and a concern for others, largely fostered by his Quaker mother. His school attendance began in the oneroom Marbut family school, and continued at a school in McDowell, Missouri, where he also taught when he was 17.

Using his teacher's earnings, he enrolled in the Collegiate Institute of Professor Noah Lee Maiden at Cassville, Missouri, an experience that led him ultimately to enroll in the University of Missouri at Columbia (UMC) in 1885. He went on to receive a BS degree from UMC in 1889 and, in 1890, was appointed to the Missouri Geological Survey. In 1891, he married Florence L. Martin of

Cassville, the daughter of the Martins who occupied a home where the Cassville Chamber of Commerce is now located and established residence in Jefferson City, Missouri. They had five children: Louise Marbut Moomaw, Thomas Fiske Marbut, William Martin Marbut, Helen Marbut, and Fredrick Browning Marbut.



Sheriff's Dept. to receive new patrol cars

In a decision approved by the Barry County Commissioners just after Christmas, the Barry County Sheriff's Department will receive two new patrol vehicles in March 2014.

The Commission opened the sealed bids for two new Ford Police Interceptor Utility Vehicles on Monday, December 23. On Thursday, December 26, the Commissioners approved the only bid submitted to the county which was made by Les Jacobs Ford of Cassville. The county approved the purchase of the vehicles in the amount of \$58,378.00 for both. Funds of the two new patrol vehicles were approved in the 2013 budget from general revenue funds.

According to Sheriff Mick Epperly, the new vehicles were needed for some time. Epperly stated, "A lot of the patrol cars have over 200,000 miles on them and

that leads to a lot of maintenance. We're looking to replace a lot of the older cars with more reliable ones."

Ideally, the department is hoping that the first two cars are just the beginning and that the 2014 budget will allow for three more to add to the force. Epperly stated, "The patrol cars are under the county budget, so we have to submit that to them to see what they say. We've also asked for one more deputy to be added to the force to bring us back up to three deputies during the day and three at night."

Currently, the Sheriff's Department has only two deputies on their night shift, which Sheriff Epperly stresses is an important time to have more help available. "Night calls are usually the high priority calls for us, like intoxication and domestic disturbance calls."

According to the Sheriff, the department hasn't been fully staffed since they had to lay off four deputies in 2010 due to economic issues.

"We really need the officers and reliable vehicles to go out on these calls," Epperly explained. In one night between Thursday evening and Friday morning, the department responded to two different fires, an attempted suicide and a shooting during a domestic disturbance.

When asked about the proposed new vehicles and deputy for 2014, Gary Youngblood, Barry County Clerk, stated, "The county just received the requests from all of the departments, but we've made them aware that there will have to be some cuts made to save funds for other projects. We won't make a final decision until the budget meeting." The 2014 budget meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 23, at 11 a.m. in the Commissioners' room at the courthouse.

Proposed MO bill could nullify Obamacare

When lawmakers in Missouri reconvene, one of the items on their agendas is to discuss a bill that could possibly nullify the Affordable Care Act for Missouri resi-

In 2010, Missourians passed the Health Care Freedom Act and, last week, Representative Jason Spencer and Senator John Lamping pre-filed Senate Bill 546 to update Health Care Freedom

The bill would ban Missouri from taking any action that would "compel, directly

or indirectly, any person, employer, or health care provider to participate in any health care system."

South Carolina was the first state to attempt to fight the Affordable Care Act within the state's legislation, with Missouri quickly following suit.

The Washington Times says the proposed bills have some strong legal merit based on the anti-commandeering doctrine. "In four major cases from 1842 to 2012, the Supreme Court has consistently held that the federal government cannot "commandeer" states, requiring them to enforce or expend resources to participate in federal law or regulatory programs."

Now that it has been introduced in the state senate, SB546 will first be assigned to a committee. It will have to pass that committee before the full Senate is given an opportunity to pass the bill on to the House for con-

At least ten other states are expected to filed similar bills in the coming months.



Mineral Springs was once a flourishing health resort town, part II

Continued from January 1's edition.

By Murial Ash, published in The Cassville Republican on March 3, 1955

Letters testifying to the curing powers of the waters were published as an advertising medium in the year 1880. These letters were from various places and were written by people who had visited the spring and benefitted greatly from it. Some of the statements printed as testimonials read in part as follows:

Under date of September 28, 1880: "I took my son to Mineral Springs in Barry County, Missouri, and he was so afflicted with inflammatory rheumatism that he was almost unable to walk and had been so for several months. He remained at the Springs two months and came home perfectly cured." Another letter addressed to the "Proprietors Mineral Springs, Barry County, Missouri" reads in part: "Allow me to say that after spending hundreds of dollars for remedies, and suffering for fifteen years from dyspepsia and rheumatism, I have, after three weeks use of the Mineral Springs' water, become as stout as when a boy, and now make a regular hand at work, and feel as well as ever in life." Still in another letter the writer states that he has been unable for more than three years to do any work whatever and at least half the time confined to his bed with dyspepsia, torpidity of the liver and consumption. He used the water for six weeks and was so thoroughly restored that he could be up all the time and work and "while only 19 years old, feels confident that by the use of the water he could yet realize what it is to live." There seemed to be almost nothing that the waters could not heal as another visitor to the Spring stated that for four

years he had been suffering from "indigestion, vertigo, and almost an entire depletion of his nervous system, and after having tried the virtues of the sulphur waters of Texas, Nashville, Tennessee, Indian Territory, Missouri and Arkansas without relief," he came to Mineral Springs and derived greater benefits from the use of the water there than any and all remedies he had ever found. A carpenter used the water in 1880 to restore his eyesight which was so impaired that a great portion of the time he was entirely blind. And, according to his testimonial, his sight was restored to that he could return to work after eight months' use of the wa-

There was also good fishing and hunting in that area during those days even as there is now, and the promoters of the town and owners of the businesses entertained the guest with these sports. It was stated that the sportsman or hunter who desired to penetrate the wilds of the West and chase the panting deer in its accustomed home could here find a field in which to amuse and delight himself scarcely excelled. Without having to encounter any rough and rugged mountains, he could find on every hand, in every quarter, the finest specimens of fish and every character of game.





Barry County's December hearings send nine to prison

Shannon Wayne Barwick, age 23, was placed on supervised probation for receiving stolen property on February 18, 2012.

Barwick was originally charged with two counts of receiving stolen property after selling items to Rebel Recycling. A water heater, three-point attachment for a chicken house, lawn mowers, and scrap iron was stolen from two different properties in Exeter.

Barwick received a suspended imposition of sentence on March 19, 2013. His suspended imposition of sentence on five years incarceration was revoked and he was placed on supervised probation for the two charges on December 16, 2013, set to end on December 16, 2018.

Podie W. Beeson, of Aurora, received a suspended execution of sentence after pleading guilty to a DWI-Alcohol, persistent offender charge from May 4, 2012.

Beeson crashed his car into an embankment and barn on Route U in Star City around 2:22 p.m. on May 4. Multiple persons witnessed Beeson leaving the wreck, and Beeson smelled strongly of alcohol when questioned by officers.

Beeson has been placed on supervised probation for three years in accordance of his suspended execution of a three year sentence, set to end December 16, 2018.

Ronnie Paul Christy, of Monett, is serving a four-year sentence of a possession of methamphetamine following an arrest from April 2011.

Christy pled guilty to an April 8, 2011, charge of possession of a controlled substance on September 19, 2011. Christy was found to be in possession of two ziplock bags of methamphetamine in his vehicle by Monett Police Officer Jeffery Martinson.

Christy served shock incarceration time before being placed on supervised probation. His probation has since been revoked and he is serving remainder of his four

year incarceration sentence.

Kellie N. Clark, of Exeter, received a suspended imposition of sentence for a theft charge from June of 2013.

Clark was confronted by asset protection at Walmart in Cassville around 3:30 a.m. on June 30, 2013. Clark and Stephen Worley III placed food, clothing and a Toshiba laptop in their cart before exiting the store without paying for the items. The laptop was worth around \$550.

Clark was sentenced to five years incarceration for theft/stealing. She pled guilty, receiving a suspended imposition of sentence and was placed on supervised probation set to end December 17,

Raymond Edward Donovan, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance following his August 10, 2013, arrest.

Donovan was arrested after Missouri State Highway Patrol troopers found paraphernalia, marijuana and methamphetamine at a residence he was living in on Farm Road 1170 outside of

Donovan was sentenced to five years incarceration, but received a suspended imposition of sentence and was placed on supervised probation set to end December 16,

Kenny Wade Felton, of Pierce City, pled guilty to second degree assault following his March 10, 2012,

Felton struck a victim on Farm Road 1050 in Monett several times in the head with his fist, causing severe lacerations to the victim's facial area and knocked him to the ground. When Barry County Sheriff Deputies arrived, the victim was not breathing, and they had to administer CPR before the victim was airlifted to the hospital.

Due to the severity of the crime, Felton was sentenced to six years incarceration which began December 16,



Shawn Lee House, of Exter, was placed on supervised probation following an arrest from August 23, 2011.

House was originally charged with resisting/interfering with an arrest after hiding under a trailer when officers went the residence after being alerted to a suicidal person with a firearm. House proceeded to flee on foot from officers attempting to detain him.

Worley, Steven A. III, of Exeter, pled guilty to theft/ stealing after his arrest on June 30, 2013.


Worley and his girlfriend, Kellie Clark, stole a car full of groceries, clothing and a laptop worth \$550 from the Walmart in Cassville.
