According to Jennifer McBroom, CEO/General Manager with Barry Electric Cooperative, the cooperative only had two instances with power outages since overnight Thunderstorms moved through Barry County last Thursday, bringing with it an artic blast.

On Thursday night a tree fell though the three-phase line just south of the Mineral Springs substation. Crews were able to reroute power in just over an hour to members and make repairs.

A similar instance ocured around 6:30 p.m. on Saturday night, when a large tree located near Oak Hill Cemetery fell through the three-phase lines knocking out power to portions of Cassville. Crews worked quickly to reroute the power in single digit temperatures and had the broken pole replaced by 1 a.m. on Sunday.

One person killed in Seligman house fire

Seligman firefighters battled the elements during a structure fire on Sunday morning. According to a Facebook post from the Seligman Fire Department, on Sunday, January 14, just before 11 a.m., the department was dispatched to a

2-story structure fire with one person possibly still inside the home. Upon arrival crews found the house 40% involved and made an aggressive attack to control the fire. They were met with freezing fire engine pumps,

hand lines, as well as frozen hydrants and were unable to fill their 2500 gallon tankers. With the assistance of Washburn Fire, crews were able to fill the tankers from the Seligman Fire

Just over two hours into the blaze, Seligman requested aid from Pea Ridge Fire, out of Arkansas, and NEBCO Fire, out of Garfield, Arkansas. With the additional crews, they were able to get the fire under control. All units cleared the scene just after 5 p.m.

One person lost their life in the Sunday fire, but has not been identified.

Oak Ridge fire a total loss

According to a Jenkins Rural Fire Department Facebook post, on Friday, January 12, just after 4 p.m., Jenkins Rural Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire in the Oak Ridge area. The structure was a total loss, but all residents made it out safely. Firefighters had to fight the fire for a total of eight hours in the below freezing temperatures and gusting winds.

Mercy EMS provided standby medical care for the residents and volunteers. It was a long fire but they stated they were very thankful to have great neighbors to work with from Cassville Fire Protection District and Mercy EMS. They also thanked volunteers who risked getting frost bite and fought through the frigid temperatures.

Nomination deadline is February 29 for Missouri Public Safety Medals honoring heroic first responders and civilians

Nominations are now open for the State of Missouri's highest awards honoring first responders for heroic actions beyond the call of duty performed in 2023.

The awards are the Red, White and Blue Heart Award, Missouri Medal of Valor, and Governor's Medal. The state will also once again be conferring the Public Safety Civilian Partnership Award. The awards will be presented during a ceremony in Jefferson City in late 2024.

The deadline for leaders of public safety agencies to nominate a member(s) for any of the Public Safety Medals for actions performed in 2023 is Feb. 29, 2024. Nominations must come from the leader of the public safety agency.

Nomination forms and additional information about the awards, including who is eligible to make a nomination, is available at: <http://dps.mo.gov/medal/>. There is a different nomination form for each award.

For the purposes of these awards, a public safety officer is defined as a person serving a public agency, with or without compensation, as a firefighter, law enforcement officer, or emergency personnel or emergency management personnel. The term "law enforcement officer" includes a person who is a state or local corrections or court officer. EMS personnel are eligible.

Here are summaries of the awards:

The Red, White and Blue Heart Award may be presented to any Missouri peace officer, firefighter, paramedic, EMT or emergency first responder who under honorable circumstances is critically, seriously or fatally injured while performing official duties in the line of duty. It is conferred in recognition of first responders seriously injured and sustaining permanent impairment of health or death. The injury or condition must require long-term treatment by a medical professional and considerable loss of time from duty. In a fatality incident, the award will be presented to a family member.

The Missouri Medal of Valor recognizes heroic service by first responders in an effort to save a life. The Medal of Valor is Missouri's highest award for public safety officers and is awarded to those who exhibit exceptional courage, decisiveness and swift action without regard for their own safety in their attempt to save a life. Law enforcement, fire and emergency medical services, state and local corrections officers, court officers and emergency management personnel are eligible.

The Governor's Medal recognizes extraordinary actions by an organized or ad hoc team of first responders for brave actions above and beyond the call of normal duty during a critical situation in which their teamwork was essential to the successful resolution of the situation. Law enforcement, fire and emergency medical services, state and local corrections officers, court officers and emergency management personnel are eligible.

The Public Safety Civilian Partnership Award honors a civilian who has provided valuable or courageous assistance to first responders in an emergency situation, without regard for their own personal welfare. It may also be bestowed on a civilian or team of civilians who train public safety officers in life-saving techniques which are later utilized to save a life.

A Fresh Start for Your Finances

The first day back to work in January, I thought my wife had shrunk my dry-clean-only pants in the dryer. She hadn't; I guess I had too many peanut butter balls between Christmas and New Year's Day. The headlines say inflation is dropping, but most Americans still feel the pinch as everyday expenses wreck their budgets.

The pinch is coming from two different problems: inflation and what is called "Lifestyle Creep." Lifestyle Creep is where a person either makes more money or receives more money (such as the pandemic stimulus) and starts making a habit of spending more money.

Hopefully, some of our everyday expenses will come down, and maybe TV will get easier, too. But until they do, let's focus on the essential expenses that allow us to reach our investment goals and eat a few more salads.
