

Mercy Hospital-Cassville provides \$60K to Crowder Nursing program

Administrators from Crowder College met with Mercy Hospital- Cassville board members and administration at the Cassville hospital last week to accept a donation of \$60,000 which will fund the college’s Cassville Instruction Center’s nursing program.

“Partnerships with clinical sites are significant to our nursing programs,” stated Sandra Wilson, Director of Nursing, Crowder College. “Our faculty, staff, and students are grateful for the support and opportunities Mercy Cassville has provided through this donation as well as clinical experiences and employment of our students.”

The funds will be used in two parts in Crowder’s Clinical Simulation Lab in Cassville according to Wilson. \$32K will cover the cost of their new “Anne” High Fidelity Simulator which helps strengthen student skills and clinical judgment. This will be the second working simulator in the Cassville program.

The other \$28K will go towards the \$38K bill to install audio and visual equipment allowing students to review clinical observations as well

The Horner Ridge Runners 4-H Club was the recipient of the 2023 FCS Financial Shaping Rural Missouri Grant. This grant is awarded to 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters to provide positive change in their communities.

Several of our members brought up the problem of the net wrap in our area. They said that they see it everywhere on the highway, in the ditches, on the fences, and in the fields. There were concerned for our community. Cars run over it on the highway and it gets caught up under there on the mufflers and such. Mowers run over it in the ditches, and get it hung up

in their blades. When it’s stuck in the fences or blowing around in fields it’s a danger to livestock as they can eat it and potentially die. Not to mention when it’s blowing

around everywhere it looks tacky and gives people in agriculture a bad image.

care of!

Though all lanes of Route 248 will be closed, drivers will have access to driveways and entrances on both ends of the bridge but will not be able to cross it during the above hours. Lanes will be open during night time hours and weekends. There will be no signed detour so drivers should find alternate routes. Weather or construction delays could alter the work schedule.

Kentucky man brings his Godly mission to Cassville

Kentucky native Greg Jones hit the Cassville streets last week on a mission to share the Word of God.

Last week, a stranger walked into our small part of the world to show the community the meaning of unconditional love, kindness, hope and forgiveness.

His name is Greg Jones, he is from Lexington, Kentucky, and according to Jones, on November 22, 2019, he gave up his worldly possessions and began his mission to walk to the West Coast, spreading the Word of God along the way to those that may feel lost, need a kind word, or a bit of inspiration. He began his journey on that November day after asking God in prayer what he could do to reach out to more people and bring them closer to Him. Jones states he heard God’s voice tell him to “drop it all and go”, so he did.

Armed with his cross, one of seven he has carried for over 4,000 miles through sixteen states in the U.S., Jones estimates he have given his testimony that “God Always Provides” to over 10,000 people and has shared his story at over 300 churches, rehabs and shelters.

“Anywhere I can bring hope and inspiration to people, that is where I go because there is hope in Jesus and he is our only Savior,” Jones said at a recent gathering at the Fishers of Men Family Resort in Cassville where he spoke to an area mens group. He shared many stories of his travels and how God places him in people’s life when they need him and vice versa.

According to Jones, he has never slept a night outside and has never been hungry. When asked where he plans to travel to next, he stated he is not sure, but he knows he is heading west.

When asked how long he plans to do this, Jones said, “Til the day I die. I’m going to keep going until He tells me to stop or until the day I die because I already know where I am going.”

Monett Police perform cold water rescue

According to a press release from the Monett Police Department, on Thursday, January 25, at approximately 7:20 p.m., Barry County Emergency Services E-9-11 dispatched Monett Police Officers to the Monett City South Park to check on the well-being of a 20-year old white male of Mount Vernon.

As offices attempted to speak with the subject, he fled in his 1998 Chevrolet S10 pickup, driving the vehicle into the ice covered South Park pond.

The subject was unable to exit the vehicle due to being trapped partially submerged in the ice on the surface of the pond.

Monett Fire Department and Barry Lawrence County Ambulance personnel responded to the scene to assist. The vehicle started sinking before assisting agencies could arrive, so officers entered the water and were able to break a window and pull the

male subject from the vehicle moments before the truck was fully submerged under the icy surface of the water.

The subject was uninjured and transported to the hospital for evaluation.



BOB MITCHELL
Bob Mitchell passed away peacefully in the presence of his family on November 7, 2023, at Kansas City Hospice House, Kansas City. He was 94.
Bob was born in Cassville on July 15, 1929, to Leonard J. Mitchell and Kathryn (Ray) Mitchell. He graduated from Cassville High School and attended Southwest Missouri State for two years. Before the start of the Korean War, he was offered a job by Springfield industrialist John Q. Hammons, who had been his sixth grade basketball coach. Believing Uncle Sam needed his services more, Bob enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He married Anita Sue Brown on January 3, 1949.
Bob attended Great Lakes Naval Training Center Journalism School, followed by assignment to the Naval Commander Atlantic Fleet Headquarters in Norfolk, Virginia. During this early work in Navy public affairs,

he accompanied Admiral W. H. P. Blandy to news conferences in Washington, D.C., and covered the rescue of the USS Missouri when she went aground off Hampton Roads, Virginia.
Bob was assigned a post in Key West, Florida, where President Harry S. Truman vacationed at the Little White House. His duties included publishing a monthly newspaper, providing news releases on presidential visits and coordinating with the White House press corps. During press conferences, President Truman would often mention that “it was good to have someone from the ‘Show Me State’ in the room.”
As the Korean Conflict heated up, Bob was assigned to Japan and as part of his Far East orientation tasking, he interviewed the Japanese Empire’s Jersey Cow herd master, due in part to his milking experience with the Mitchell family livestock.
Once in Korea, he was dispatched upriver toward Inchon and disembarked from the amphibious flagship USS Mt. McKinley, as General Douglas McArthur’s efforts proceeded to support

United Nations forces in the south. After picking up the First Marine Division for transfer to Wonson, the ship neared the beach where a large banner read “Bob Hope Welcomes First Marine Division Ashore.” Bob joined his shipmates for the afternoon show. As the Amphibious Forces continued the mission, Bob provided press reports and photographs back to the U.S. that chronicled the situation, including a captured Russian MiG fighter jet. He accompanied Vice Admiral I.N. Kiland to the United Nations camp in Mun Son Ni for peace talks, where he witnessed a portion of the long-running negotiations to end the Korean Conflict. His Navy career ended in 1953, just 12 days short of four years. He returned to San Diego to reunite with Sue. Once back in Barry County, Bob joined his Uncle Means Ray at The Cassville Democrat.
As newspaper editor for the next 42 years, Bob “covered Barry County like the morning dew” to bring the latest area news to readers of the Democrat every week and promote the community he loved. He covered countless civic, educational, sports, community events and business activities. In the late 1950s, Bob joined a group of local civic and business leaders in a campaign to overturn a federal decision not to build a bridge across the emerging Table Rock Lake at Shell Knob; their successful efforts resulted in the completion of the \$3M Central Crossing Bridge. He was involved in the Cassville Industrial Development Corp., leading the group for 15 years. During that time, relationships with businesses were formed that brought new industries to Cassville, including Wells Aluminum, Vaisey-Bristol Shoe Co., FASCO Industries, Justin Boot Co. and varied other diverse firms. He was involved in the establishment of the Cassville Golf Club’s grass green course, the first of its kind to be constructed in Missouri under FmHA financing. He also helped to establish the Little Joe Lung Transplant Fund and subsequent scholarship program. He was a faithful member of the First Christian Church.
Active in local and state Democrat party politics during most of his long career, Bob participated in several liaisons with local and state government both as a citizen and a journalist. He served as an honorary Missouri

National Guard Colonel in the inauguration events of two Missouri Democrat governors. He was a proud supporter throughout his life of many generations of Cassville Wildcat athletics, the Rotary Club, Boy Scout Troop 76 and the local, long-running, annual Hillbilly Golf tournament. He was a 70-contiguous year member of The American Legion.
After he and Sue sold the newspaper to Mike and Lisa Schlichtman in 1996, they enjoyed traveling through every state in the U.S., except Alaska, to enjoy the sights and to visit grandkids and friends.
Bob was an avid fisherman and walked many an Ozark mile hunting quail with friends, and traveling throughout Kansas and South Dakota, almost always accompanied by beloved English Setter companions.
In 2017, he was inducted into the Missouri Southern State University Media Hall of Fame. Months later, he was selected for induction into the Missouri Press Association’s Hall of Fame.
Bob is survived and will be greatly missed by son Bruce (Janice) of Colorado Springs, Colo., and daughter, Shelley Bartkoski (Dennis) of Leawood, Kan.; grandchildren who loved him as Pop, Sean Mitchell (Carrie), Lindsley Grebenik (Dole), Andrew Parsons, (Janna), and Carly Mitchell

(Rob Sumner); nine great-grandchildren; nephew Stann Sutton (Beverly), of Tulsa, Okla., and Neely the cat. He was preceded in death by his parents and wife of 74 years, Anita Sue Mitchell.

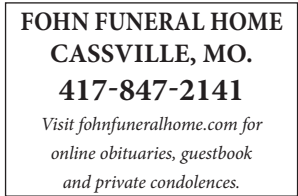

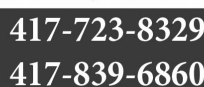
