Council discusses City's sign ordinance

The Cassville City Council met Monday evening for their regularly scheduled meeting.

The highlight of the meeting was discussion on the City's sign ordinance.

Alderwoman Anne Hennigan addressed the council with her concerns over the ordinance.

Hennigan stated, "I read through the ordinance and it was very dry. I didn't quite understand a lot of it or see definitions of things such as for a temporary sign. What exactly is that?"

She also questioned why the city had an ordinance against off site billboard signs.

"I really think we should consider repealing this. We

could be losing lots of traffic from Highway 37 by not having a billboard saying come visit our town."

She also indicated that the 10ft. sign restriction should be raised to 15 or 20

"If we change the height of signs maybe then the view wouldn't be so obstructed. It would also give us a little more variance around Cass-

aged the council to review definitions and fees within the ordinance. She stated that temporary signs, wraparound signs and signs on wheels should all be defined.

The Board of Aldermen were all in agreement that the ordinance lacked detail and needed to be thoroughly



examined.

Mayor Bill Shiveley proposed that the City should assemble a committee of Councilmen, Planning and Zoning members and Cassville citizens to discuss the direction of the sign ordinance for the community. The City would provide guidelines for the committee members to meet.

Man pleads guilty to federal child pornography charges

A man from Monett pleaded guilty last week to federal child pornography charges almost a year after an international investigation was launched into him downloading child pornography.

Authorities in Germany, who were investigating a website operated by

a German citizen who was distributing child pornography, contacted the FBI about Donald A. Rise, 57, who was downloading kiddie porn from the site.

When investigators went to Rise's residence, he admitted that he had viewed child pornography on his desktop computer the night before and admitted that he

had images of child pornography on his computer. He said the average age of the children depicted in those images was 12 years old and some of the images depict children in obvious distress.

Investigators conducted a forensic review of Rise's computer and found 1,681 images of child pornography, including numerous

images of children from 2 to 10 years old. The images depict children as young as toddlers being sexually assaulted by adult men and other children. Some images depict the children being restrained and gagged while being sexually abused, and the children appear to be in distress and crying.

Under federal statutes,

Rise is subject to a mandatory minimum sentence of five years in federal prison without parole, up to a sentence of 20 years in federal prison without parole, plus a fine up to \$250,000. A sentencing hearing will be scheduled after the completion of a presentence investigation by the United States Probation Office





Man sentenced after electronics theft

On Thursday, January 24th, 2013, Sergeant Kermit Howell was dispatched to the Wal-Mart Store in Monett on a complaint of property damage. He then contacted asset protection manager Erin Graham and he received the following report.

By that point, Myers recognized the man as a suspected shoplifter. After, Myers and the other employee found a shopping cart loaded with merchandise hidden out of view, and damage to the fence amounting to approximately \$350 worth of dam-

The merchandise in the cart totaled in a value of \$2,123.04 with such items as a laptop computer, Nintendo WII U game console, an Xbox 360 and several computer hard drives.

Later Rick Pixley was identified as the suspect and was booked on a 24 hour

investigation hold for burglary, attempted felony, stealing and property damage. Pixley was sentenced to confinement in the Barry County Jail for two years.

However, the execution of sentence was suspended and he received unsupervised probation for two years. During this time, he must not violate the law in any manner, pay restitution in the sum of \$700.00 within six months and must not be on the premises of Wal-Mart. If this is broken, he will have to serve his original sentence of two years in Barry County Jail.

Early migratory bird seasons approved

Approval of early season hunting regulations and a change to the federal framework for migratory game birds by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) means Missouri hunters will have a 16-day early teal season and larger limits on most early migratory birds.

The FWS action gives the green light to the following early migratory bird seasons and limits, which were approved by the Missouri

Conservation Commission in

Mourning doves, Eurasian collared doves, and white-winged doves: Sept. 1 through Nov. 9, daily limit 15 in the aggregate, possession limit 45.

Blue-winged (BWT), green-winged teal, and cinnamon teal: Sept. 7 through 22, daily limit six in the aggregate, possession limit 18.

American woodcock:

Oct. 15 through Nov. 28, daily limit three, possession limit nine.

Wilson's (common) snipe: Sept. 1 through Dec. 16, daily limit eight, possession limit 24.

Sora and Virginia rails: Sept. 1 through Nov. 9, daily and possession limit 25 in the aggregate.

Missouri's 2013 early migratory bird hunting regulations increase possession limits from two to three times the daily limit for all species except rails. The possession limit for rails remains 25. This year's daily limit for teal represents a two-bird increase from past years.

Conservation Department Resource Scientist Doreen Mengel says state and federal waterfowl biologists approved the changes after careful consideration and analysis of possible effects on migratory bird popula-



Many of you are aware of the concerns raised recently about the White River being named a National Blueway by the Obama Administration. For those of you who are not aware of the recent designation, here is brief account and timeline of what has occurred. In 2010, President Obama announced the America's Great Outdoors Initiative and on May 24, 2012, then Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar issued Secretary's Order 3321 establishing the National Blueways System. In early 2013, the White River was established as the second National Blueway by the Department of the Interior. The National Blueways program was set up to employ "integrated land and water management techniques to conserve and restore a river from its headwaters to its mouth, and across its entire watershed." In addition, the program states that "a large scale is needed... to successfully address 21st century challenges posed by changing patterns of resource use

and climate." This description of the program immediately troubled me. When the federal government begins discussing land and water management, it usually means someone in a faraway place, like Washington, D.C., is issuing orders and regulations to people who live and work next door to the designated area. Most of us agree that we should be good stewards of the natural resources we have been given. Missouri is a beautiful state with many natural wonders that contribute to our state both recreationally and economically. The White River, a 700-plus mile body of water that runs from Arkansas into Missouri, is one of these natural treasures. The White River is important to many in the 29th District, from property owners to businesses to water enthusiasts. Most of us recognize that property owners, farmers, and businesses near the river are also vital to our economy in southwest Missouri. Therefore, these interests should be balanced and proposals and solutions made by cooperation of all those involved.

Here we encounter the first problem with this process: The people who would be most affected by this found out about it because of a government designation. This wasn't something pursued by the people living and working around the river or even by their elected voice in Congress or in the State Legislature. Instead, federal agencies, working from the top down, imposed the designation without public input and, in large part, without public knowledge. No public meetings were held, no informational groups were formed, and no property owners within the watershed were consulted or informed.

This leads to the second problem: Of all the environmental interests and

from Missouri and no groups representing or with an interest in property rights or property owners were included. It only seems obvious that those who potentially would be most affected by changes to the watershed, the property owners, should have a voice in the process and be considered when and if any decisions are made. If they had been consulted, I am sure property owners would have communicated their concerns about the designation's effect on farming including use of their soil, treatment of their crops, and where their livestock can graze. This leads to the third

problem: The designation was written in such generalities that it could be interpreted very loosely and allow for unwanted federal oversight and intrusion in Missouri's part of the White River. However well-intentioned these regulations might be, we recently learned from the TSA, the IRS, and the Missouri Department of Revenue what government regulation can become.

These concerns prompted many of you to get involved. You wrote letters, made phone calls, and organized meetings to educate your fellow citizens about this issue and the problems with it. I attended such a meeting a few weeks ago, and was convinced that the circumstances under which the White River National Blueway designation was made was not consistent with our democratic form of government where the people make these sort of determinations from the bottom up. Because of these grassroots efforts, I am pleased to report that the U.S. Department of the Interior rescinded the designation of the White River as a National Blueway. I am not opposed to voluntary conservation programs, but they should be done with the proper authority and with adequate public input. I want to commend our area federal delegation, Sen. Blunt, Congressman Long, and Congressman Smith, as well as my colleagues in the Missouri Senate and House who stepped up for Missouri and opposed the program. It is important we con-

Exeter says goodbye to winningest basketball and volleyball coach in school history

Exeter school says goodbye to a long time high school coach this summer, Jason Cole. Cole left Exeter high school after ten years of being the athletic director, transportation director, head girls basketball coach and previous girls volleyball coach. Cole accepted a principal position at Joel E. Barber Elementary in Lebanon.

During his time at Exeter, there were ten consecutive winning seasons for the lady tigers program. This was a turning point for the basketball program, given that in the 30 years of existence prior to 2003 there had only been two winning seasons.

Cole states, "I feel confident that the program is very strong with all but three points per game returning

next season; and an incoming group of freshmen that finished 13-0 last season coming into challenge for starting positions and key playing time."

This is a great accomplishment considering the past year was considered a rebuilding year, with over 95 percent of the scoring gone from the previous year.

Cole states, "It was thought that the team might struggle to win five games, but exceeded that by finishing with 15 wins and 10 losses."

Other accomplishments during his time at Exeter were: in 2009 they broke the basketball school record with 30 wins, broke the volleyball school record in 2008 with 26 wins and broke the baseball school record in 2004

with 12 win

Cole is the winningest coach in basketball school history with 194 wins and the winningest coach in volleyball school history with 84 wins. Under Cole's supervision, the girls volleyball and basketball teams accomplished a lot.

Girls volleyball from 2007-2011 had 85 wins, 28 losses and eight ties. They were also two time Ozark 7 Conference champions. During his time as head volleyball coach, Cole received Ozark 7 Coach of the Year in 2010. Cole took over a program that had won 20 games in the previous eight seasons.

Girls basketball from 2003 until present also had many accomplishments over this ten year span. The varsity record was 194 wins and 81 losses. They were three time Ozark 7 champions, Class 1 State Quarter finalists in 2008, Class 1 State Champions in 2009 and Class 1 Runner-up in 2011.

Cole was also deemed four time Ozark 7 Coach of the Year, three time Missouri Class 1 District Coach of the Year and two time Missouri Basketball Coaches Association Coach of the Year.

Cole left Exeter with positive remarks, "I enjoyed the support from the community and administration during my 10 years at Exeter. Also, I feel that the program will continue to stay strong for the foreseeable future with hard work and community support."



Barry County Health Department June Food Service Report

A report for each establishment that is inspected shows the number of critical violations, along with a short statement as to the nature of the violations. The report also shows the number of non-critical violations but doesn't list the nature of those violations.





Landowners Have a Responsibility for Thistle Control

After the recent years of drought, thistles have taken advantage of weakened grass stands and full-bloomed plants are visible in many fields through the area.

"Many tracts of land in Southwest Missouri are inundated with heavy populations of musk and bull thistles," said Tim Schnakenberg, an agronomy specialist with University of Missouri Extension. "Some landowners have taken extra steps this year to keep the problem in check, while others have done nothing.'

As a reminder for all Missouri landowners, section 263.190 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri read: "It shall be the duty of every owner of lands in this state to control all Canada, musk or Scotch thistles growing thereon so often in each and every year as shall be sufficient to prevent said thistles from going to seed."

"Thistle control can be very difficult but it is not impossible," said Schnakenberg. "I know farmers who spot sprayed thistles throughout the spring and still have a few patches of thistles that slipped through. It is common to have a few here and there, but large tracts of uncontrolled thistles make it more challenging to neighbors who have worked hard to keep thistles on their side of the fence from going to seed."

BEST METHOD NOW

What is to be done at this point in time? Since the majority of the seed for the growing season is already produced, control measures at this time are after-the-fact. Most thistles are biennials, meaning they germinate in the fall, bolt with a seed head in the spring, produce seed and die by mid-summer.

"Since the plants that have seeded out are almost dead because of the proximity to the end of their lifespan, spraying is almost fruitless now," said Schnakenberg.

Mowing is the first impulse of many to control it now, but one risk of mowing is the spreading of the seed to other areas on the mower deck, making matters worse for the fall germination period. Sometimes this is what it takes however to clean up a

WEEVIL CONTROL

Over 30 years ago, University of Missouri Extension and USDA introduced the flower head weevil and rosette weevil to Missouri fields. These weevils specifically target thistles.

"There is lots of evidence that these weevils are doing a massive job of consuming many of the seed in the flower heads scattered across our county. There is no way that they can keep up with all the seed produced, but if they are getting perhaps 30-40 percent of the billions of seeds that are produced each year, they are having an impact," said Schnakenberg.

Schnakenberg says to watch for dried up seed heads and cut them open for evidence of weevil damage. Many times, a person will find two to four flower head weevils in the heads.

"At this time of year, the weevil is probably the best control," said Schnakenberg

"Biological control does not take us, as landowners, off the hook for keeping thistles from going to seed. Obviously the weevils need our help."


SPRAY OPTIONS

Other control options include spraying at appropriate times of the year with products such as 2,4-D, dicamba, Grazon P+D, GrazonNext, Chaparral or other registered products.

Schnakenberg says the best times to spray are when the plants are still in the rosette stage which is the stage these plants are in for 70-80 percent of their lifespan. This corresponds with an ideal time of the year to spray being in the fall (October) or early spring (March-April). Sometimes widespread broadcast spraying is necessary for control over spot







spraying. Mowing multiple times is also an option in the spring or early summer. A Kansas study found that only 11 percent of the musk thistles mowed at the early bud stage were killed. When mowed a second time four weeks later, 79 percent of the thistles were controlled.

The best time to start mowing is within two days after the terminal flower head blooms in order to inhibit seed production and prevent rebolting. Remember however, that viable seed can start to develop within seven days of the first pink coloring in the heads.

"Let's all do our part to keep thistles from going to seed," says Schnakenberg. "It is challenging but it will make our property more productive, keep our neighbors happy with us and improve property values in the long-run."




