Shell Knob fire engine catches fire in Springfield

Last Thursday, on a trip to Springfield for repairs, Central Crossing Fire Protection District's Engine 1 caught fire on the James River Freeway in Springfield.

The truck ended up roadside and caught on fire, forcing traffic to one line from 11:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

According the Central Fire Protection, the lone driver was able to put the fire out by using several fire extinguishers from the truck.

Since the truck could not run, the water, foam and pumping system could not be used.

The driver of the truck was transported to a local truck to be evaluated for smoke inhalation but was later released with no injuries.

The truck sustained major damage to the engine compartment and cab areas according to Central Crossing. Some equipment was damaged as well.

In a statement made on the Central Crossing Fire District's Facebook page, the district wrote, "The cause of the fire is being looked into.

"The truck and equipment are insured and we are working with the insurance company to acquire a rental truck and determine if our truck can be repaired or if it will have to be replaced. Ladder 2 will be used in place of Engine 1 until further notice."

Central Crossing thanked Battlefield Fire and Firemaster for their assistance during the incident.

Monett man sentenced for receiving stolen property

In June 2012, Don Masengill, of the Monett Police Department, was dispatched to the Monett Justice Center in reference to a 2nd degree burglary incident.

When Phillip Knepper, arrived at the house he was remodeling. he discovered many tools missing totaling approximately \$370 in losses. Knepper suspected the residents across the street from his property were responsible for the stolen property.

The following day, Daniel Cox came into the police station reporting he may have unknowingly purchased stolen property.

Cox then stated he traded items with Justin Schmidt, 36, of Monett, earlier that week. He then spoke with an

acquaintance who informed him the items might be stolen.

Knepper positively identified a Skil Saw, a circular saw, three cordless drills, a fiberglass handled hammer and a hammer drill Schmidt had stolen.

On June 24, 2013, Justin Schmidt was convicted of the class C felony of receiving stolen property. Schmidt was sentenced to the Barry County Jail for one year but received a suspended execution of sentence with unsupervised probation for two years and was ordered to pay restitution in the sum of \$391 and pay total court costs of \$218.50 by July 17, 2013.

Summertime hair repair

Tim's Trout Tips

Fishing is still very good at Roaring River State park. The river is low and clear, 2lb line is best right now, if you are fly fishing you'll have a great time right now, the dry fly action is very good. Beetles, ants, hoppers, blue wing olives, caddis, griffths gnats, small cream midges are all a good choice. Use 7X on dries, if you are going to nymph fish, 6X works pretty well, but you'll get more hits if you use 7X and your leader should be 9' or longer.

Nymphs that are working, would be caddis larva(burlaps), sow bugs, pheasant tails, copper Johns, small zebra midges (black, olive, and brown) #18 and smaller are best right now.

Baby buggers and cracklebacks are both working, stripping these flies can be very effective in the heat of the day.

Worm and Egg fisherman will do best on white, cheese, orange/white, john deere green, electric chicken, and the pink/yellow have been good colors on the plastic baits.

Roostertails, small spoons, 3" and smaller crankbaits, and the wooly spinners are all working in the mornings. Marabou jigs are very effective right now, Roaring River Specials are great, olive, white, black/yellow, tan and the brown with the green body (crystal chennile) have all been working.

Micro jigs in tan, white, olive and black/yellow good right now, you need 2lb line when throwing the small micro jigs. In zone 3 night-crawlers and corn has been working, and the yellow powerbait has been good also this past week, good luck on the water this week.

Local food pantries receive grants

Ozarks Food Harvest awarded \$250,000 to nearly 50 food pantries and hunger-relief programs at a press conference at the O’Reilly Center for Hunger Relief held last week.

Cassville United Methodist Church Food Pantry and Eagle Rock’s Helping Hands Food Pantry both received coolers valued at \$2,600.

The infrastructure grants, ranging in value from \$1,300 to \$10,000, went to the purchase of industrial-sized freezers, coolers, shelving and other supplies to help expand the capacity of Missouri’s emergency food system.

“Strengthening our 250 partner agencies to serve more hungry Missouri

families is part of our three-year strategic plan, and doing so means Ozarks Food Harvest will grant more than \$200,000 in funding annually to our food pantries and programs,” said OFH President/CEO Bart Brown. “These infrastructure grants will help improve pantries and feeding sites across the Ozarks so that they can store and distribute more fresh produce and perishable product.”

The regional food bank’s Strengthening Partners infrastructure awards were part of a \$1 million gift received earlier this year from the Missouri Foundation for Health—one of the largest healthcare foundations in the country based in St. Louis.

Ozarks Food Harvest was the first of six food bank in Missouri to previously grant awards to its partner nonprofits—in addition to providing food, training and other services—and has been recognized nationally for being a food bank that provides funding to its partners.

More than 75 pantries and feeding sites requested funding, totaling nearly \$560,000—more than twice the grant funds available.

The original gift from the Missouri Foundation for Health was awarded to Ozarks Food Harvest to help expand the capacity of Missouri’s emergency food system.

The first fireworks

The history of fireworks goes back thousands of years to China during the Han dynasty (200 B.C.), even long before gunpowder was invented. It is believed that the first “firecrackers” were likely chunks of green bamboo, which someone may have thrown onto a fire when dry fuel ran short. The rods sizzled and blackened, and after a while, unexpectedly exploded. Bamboo grows so fast that pockets of air and sap get trapped inside of

the plant’s segments. When heated, the air inside of the hollow reeds expands, and eventually bursts through the side with a long bam!

The strange sound, which had never been heard before, frightened people and animals terribly. The Chinese figured that if it scared living creatures so much, it would probably scare away spirits - particularly an evil spirit called Nian, who they believed to eat crops and people. After that, it became

customary for them to throw green bamboo onto a fire during the Lunar New Year in order to scare Nian and other spirits far way, thus ensuring happiness and prosperity to their people for the remainder of the year. Soon, the Chinese were using bursting bamboo for other special occasions, such as weddings, coronations, and births. The “bursting bamboo”, or pao chuk as the Chinese called it, continued to be used for the next thousand or so years.

Shoot wild hogs on sight, but not for hunting

It is estimated 10,000 feral hogs root up and roam the Ozarks and the Missouri Conservation Department wants to get rid of them. Back in the 90’s their numbers exploded after people began releasing them for sport hunting. That number is quickly growing because sows can reproduce at six months and typically have two litters of 4-10 piglets each year. Consequently, feral hog numbers can double or triple in just one year.

Left unchecked, feral hogs will spread throughout Missouri, causing millions of dollars in agricultural, environmental and property damage.

Hogs harm native wildlife, especially deer and turkey, by eating and destroying crucial food sources. They also prey on the eggs and young of ground-nesting birds, such as quail and turkey, and also on fawns and other small animals.

In a single night hogs can destroy acres of pasture, hayfield, cropland and gardens. They can spread diseases such as swine brucellosis, pseudo-rabies, leptospirosis, swine fever and foot-and-mouth disease. A disease outbreak from feral hogs could devastate Missouri’s pork and other livestock industries. Also, hogs may carry swine brucellosis and other diseases that can infect humans and pets.

The reason why hunting is discouraged is that when MDC identifies a group of wild hogs on public land or when we get a request from a private landowner, we begin the baiting process. Considerable effort is spent conditioning a group of hogs to come to a specific location so they can be eliminated in a single action. If during that time, a hunter kills one or maybe two of the hogs, the rest of the group moves to a new area, which means that the lengthy and expensive eradication process must begin again at a new location.


Hunters afield for other game are encouraged to shoot feral hogs on sight when they are encountered. During most of the year no permit is required and any method is allowed, but special restrictions apply during the spring turkey and fall firearms deer and turkey seasons.

On Wednesday, June 26, legislation sponsored by Sen. David Sater, R-Cassville, combating scrap metal and copper theft, was signed by the governor.

Scrap metal and copper theft is a very real problem throughout the state. Last Christmas, more than \$10,000 worth of copper wire was stolen from a Christmas light display in Monett. In 2010, air conditioner units, containing copper, were stolen from more than a dozen churches in Greene and Lawrence counties, costing one church as much as \$30,000. In 2010 and 2011, there were more than 50 incidents of wire theft in Greene County. The thefts caused phone service and cell tower interruptions to thousands of citizens and the Greene County Sheriff's Department worked about 300 hours of overtime on these investigations.

"Metal theft continues to affect many of our communities and costs our neighbors, businesses, homeowners and churches," Sen. Sater said. "We need to give law enforcement

the tools necessary to go after these criminals and our courts the means to punish those making it easier for them to commit their crimes."

Senate Bill 157 creates additional documentation requirements for scrap metal purchases, such as the gender, birth date and photograph of the seller and establishes new penalties for dealers who knowingly buy stolen metal. The bill also adds catalytic converters to the types of scrap metal items requiring documentation.

"SB 157 will help our communities fight scrap metal and copper theft and will level the playing field for law-abiding metal dealers by going after those breaking the law," Sen. Sater said. "This is a big step in the right direction but we need to continue looking for ways to protect property owners and businesses from metal theft."

Dos and don'ts of fireworks

As the mercury rises, the parties and festivities that have come to signify summer excite revelers far and wide. Summer has become the season of pool parties, trips to the beach, barbecues, and, of course, fireworks.

Love it or hate it, warm weather seems to beckon neighbors out of hibernation and incites a desire to set things on fire. When cooking over an open flame doesn't satisfy that desire, many take to shooting off bottle rockets and whistlers. But fireworks can still be dangerous and not everyone is equipped or legally allowed to ignite fireworks. Therefore, to avoid potentially dangerous injuries, fines or arrests, it pays to follow these fireworks dos and don'ts.

DO find out if fireworks are legal in your area. If you have to travel over state lines or into another country to purchase fireworks, there is a good chance you are not allowed to use fireworks in your community. There are many regulations regarding the sale, transport and use of fireworks, so be sure you're not breaking any laws before buying any fireworks.

DON'T buy fireworks from just anyone. You want to ensure you are purchasing them from a reputable retailer of legal fireworks.

DO check any safety guidelines and warnings on the wrapper of the fireworks before lighting them.

DON'T light fireworks near people, trees, homes, or any combustible materials.

DO keep a fire extinguisher or water hose nearby in the event of a fire. The National Fire Prevention Association notes that the Fourth of July features more reported fires than any other day of the year.

DON'T forget that sparklers and firecrackers are no safer than other types of fireworks. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1200 F, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns and is hotter than the temperature it takes to melt glass.

DO leave fireworks to the professionals to avoid injury or fire.

DON'T light more than

one firework at a time.

DO wait 15 to 20 minutes after lighting a firework to see if it has ignited. If not, dump the firework in a bucket of water and move on to a fresh firework.

DON'T let small children handle and light fireworks.

DO make every attempt not to store fireworks. If you purchase them, use them all up. However, a cool, out-of-the-way place may suffice for a day or so.

DON'T have any part of your body over the firework when lighting it. Try to use a lit stick or butane lighter to keep as far away as possible.

DO say no to alcoholic beverages when lighting fireworks. Your perception and dexterity can be compromised by alcohol.

DON'T shoot fireworks off in windy conditions. Otherwise, make sure the prevailing wind is blowing away from the audience.

DO wear eye protection when lighting fireworks.

DON'T shoot fireworks off of uneven ground. To ensure stability, always light

them on a hard, flat and level surface.

DO use common sense at all times when in the presence of fireworks.

DON'T assume pets and children will enjoy the loud noises. Make accommodations for a quiet respite.

DO make sure spectators keep their distance. They should be 25 to 40 feet away from ground-based items and even further for aerial products.

Fireworks can be beautiful to watch and often signify special moments and celebrations. Safety should always be on the minds of people spending time around fireworks.
