Beeson Family Bluebird Trail takes hard hit

At least fifty bluebird boxes along the Beeson Family Blue Bird Trail were destroyed in a heartbreaking act of vandalism last weekend--a loss felt deeply by both the family and the community who have come to love the cheery blue boxes that line our rural country roads.

Bluebirds nest at least twice a season, and many of the boxes in the area are being nested in right now. Some of the boxes that were destroyed contained second nests, and likely had babies in them. Even if they survived the violent destruction of their home, the young birds would have been defenseless against predators and quickly eaten. The sadness of this reality pales only in comparison to the anger

at those who would do such stupid and pointless act.

The Beeson Blue Bird Trail is one of those rare things that exist simply to make the world a better place. The blue boxes are not built in some overseas factory, bought with tax dollars, or maintained by the conservation department. They are hand built, painted, and maintained just as they were in 1962 when Laurance Beeson first helped some kids build bluebird boxes for a 4-H project. Eventually the local clubs lost interest in working on the houses, and Laurance took it on as a family project.

Four generations later, the trail is now 200 hundred boxes strong and lines 33 miles of rural roads. Once the birds leave the boxes in the fall the family works all

winter to clean out the old nests, repair broken boxes and build new ones to expand the trail.

"The hard thing for us is the fact that materials are getting so darn expensive," Edna Beeson said. "We've been using screws to put the lids on so that we can clean

them out easier; the screws have tripled in price since we started doing it and the paint is getting out of sight." Each box costs around \$5 to build, but scrap 1x6 or 1x8 boards are welcome donations to help get the boxes back in place.

Laurance Beeson passed away in 2008. Once scarce in Barry County, the bluebird can now be seen through the winter, something unheard of in 1962. Known as the "bird of happiness," it is hard to

think of a better legacy to leave your children and your community.

The vandals destroyed all of the boxes between Y Hwy. and C Hwy. north of Cassville, on Farm Road 2140 going up Hungry Hollow, and several other rural roads in the Cassville and Butterfield area. If you have any information on who is responsible for the vandalism, contact the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

At 12:25 p.m. on Thursday, July 25, on the Viola Curve, four miles south of Shell Knob, a pickup truck driven and owned by Elize Allen was pulling a trailer that was loaded with four round bales of hay. The trailer and hay caught fire from a tire that had blown and shredded itself coming from the Windsor Bay area

on Highway 39 south.

Elize and his friend Toby Koehler pulled over at the first available turnoff, a driveway on the south side of Highway 39 curve. They attempted to disengage the trailer from the diesel pickup truck and were unable to and fight the flames.

Passersby stopped and assisted in loosening the truck from the flaming trailer.

Mrs. Karen Allen, wife of Elize, was driving behind him and saw the flames. She pulled off just ahead of him at the next driveway, raced back to get into Elize's truck as the good Samaritans disengaged it and she drove it off the highway to safety. Her quick actions saved

Elize's truck.

Karen said, "I didn't get the name of those men who helped us and called 911 but we are forever thankful for their actions. We are also thankful that we have such a fine group of Central Crossing Fire Protection volunteers and Fire Chief to help us put out the fire. Those bales weigh over 400 pounds and are not easy to move."

Sales tax holiday

Missouri's annual sales tax holiday begins on Friday, August 2nd, and runs through Sunday, August 4th. During this time, the state sales tax will not be assessed on certain purchases, including school supplies, personal computers and some clothing. Local governments can also participate in the holiday and increase the savings for shoppers during the holiday.

"The annual sales tax holiday is a perfect opportunity to get some or all of your back-to-school shopping under way and save some money," said John Mollenkamp, acting director of the Missouri Department of Revenue. "When local governments participate in the holiday, the savings can add up to as much as 8 or 9 percent."

The state sales tax will not be charged on the following items during the holiday: Clothing that does not have a value of more than \$100. Eligible clothing includes standard items of apparel worn on or about the body, and includes footwear. It also includes material to make school uniforms or other school clothing. It does not include accessories such as watches, jewelry, handbags, handkerchiefs, umbrellas, scarves, ties, headbands and belt buckles.



They received a silver medal with a score of 89.75 out of 100.







School supplies include textbooks, notebooks, paper, pens, pencils, crayons, art supplies, rulers, book bags, backpacks, handheld calculators, chalk, maps and globes. School supplies do not include CD players, headphones, equipment, telephones, copiers or other office equipment.

Personal computers that don't cost more than \$3,500. A personal computer can be a laptop, desktop or tower computer system which consists of a central processing unit, random access memory, a storage drive, display monitor, keyboard and other related devices. Peripheral devices include items such as a disk drive, memory module, CD drive, microphone, modem, motherboard, mouse, speakers, printer, scanner, sound card or video card. Computer software is considered a school supply and is free from sales tax if its value is less than \$350.

The sales tax exemption

is commonly referred to as the Back-to-School Sales Tax holiday because it occurs near the beginning of the traditional school year for most students. Any person -- including those who live outside of the state of Missouri -- who makes a qualified purchase may participate in the holiday. An individual does not have to be a student or be purchasing for a student to participate.



During July and August, matching funds grant checks for rural fire departments are being distributed by the Missouri Department of Conservation, Forestry Division

Southwest Trap Team finishes season 10th in the nation

CTP, which stands for the Scholastic Clay Target Program, is an organization designed for youth athletes to compete in a variety of shooting sports that include the disciplines of American Trap, Olympic Trap, American Skeet, Olympic Skeet, Sporting Clays, Rifle, and Pistol. The National Shoot-Sports Foundation, (NSSF) developed this program as a pipeline for developing and introducing promising young shooters the U.S. Olympic Shooting

Southwest competed with 1,883 other trap shooters and 159 teams from 30 states. There are five divisions in which the athletes compete and they are: Senior Varsity, Senior Junior varsity, which are high school levels. The Intermediate advanced and Intermediate entry levels include 6th - 8th grades, and the Rookie division is for shooters 5th grade

The senior varsity team finished 10th in the nation out of 95 teams shooting a team score of 966/1000 targets. Seniors Eric Anderson, Johnathon Wolf, and Kordell

McNabb led the high school team with scores of 197, 196, and 195 out of 200.

"Our goal each year is to place in the top three at our state shoot and crack the top ten nationally. We won the state title at the Missouri State SCTP Championships in June and finished 10th in Sparta, so I was pleased with how we shot all year," said Head Coach Mike Vining.

The senior JV team shot a combined score of 901/1000 to finish 14th out of 42 teams nationally. Senior Eithan Still led the squad with a 200 target score of 190, while freshman Hayden Fox carded a 187.

Other members of the high school team that contributed greatly to the 10th and 14th place finishes were Tommy Sickles, Garrett Hobbs, Jesse Hayworth, Alex Cook, Brent Anderson, and Jacob Wolf.

"Out of the 11 members

of our high school team, we had six freshmen and one sophomore, so I am already very excited about the next three years. I always have mixed feelings about our seniors and this year was no exception. On one hand, it was

sad to think that we would be without these four seniors after Nationals. They have been as talented a bunch as we have ever had go through our program. Then, on the other hand, I know that these four guys will move on to the next chapter in their lives, and become successful in anything they set their sights on. For that, I am very happy for them. It has truly been a privilege to have them with us," said Vining.

On the Junior High side of things, the intermediate entry squad posted a 799/1000, good enough for a 16th place finish out of 30 other teams. Levi Moore led the team with an awesome two day total of 192/200, which was good enough to put him tied individually with 3 other shooters for 3rd. Unfortunately, with the tiebreaker system they used, Levi wound up 5th in the final standings. "This was Levi's first year with us, so I was very happy for him to be able to finish so well." Chance Black, also a new shooter, was second high on the team with a 168.

Other Junior high shooters chipping in to help with a top 20 finish were: Skyler Willer, Emily Snyder,

Heather Windes, Elizabeth Wolfe, Charlie Henderson and Michael Banks, and Jarrett Pike. Shooting in the Rookie division were Jake Taylor, Hunter Stanley, Leland Colf, and Garrett Stanley.

"Out of the 13 shooters on our junior high team, only three had had competitive shooting experience. So, when you factor in that nearly 80% of the team were first year shooters this season. I believe we had an extremely successful season. Three of our young ones, Skyler, Chance, and Charlie, shot their first 25 straight while at Nationals, so in keeping with our tradition, we got to "air condition" their hats while there. Even though our 4th and 5th graders shot some of their best rounds of the year, I really felt bad for our four rookies, as we just lacked one shooter in that age group to have enough for a full Rookie team.

"All of these junior high shooters are absolutely ate up with the sport. It has been so great to see the enthusiasm on their faces when they come to shoot, and I can't wait to see what they are able to accomplish in the years to come.

"As always, there are so many people to thank for their contributions to our


Rain keeps cowboys from competing

3) Don't exaggerate the item's condition or features. Make your pitch attractive, but believable. People shun claims that sound too good to be true.

4) Include price. Advertising the price draws greater response because people are interested in what they can afford. If price is negotiable, say so.
