CHS alumna graduates from United States Naval Academy

At her high school graduation, Cheyann Essley stood before her classmates and delivered her valedictorian speech. While giving words of encouragement to her peers and their futures, she couldn't help but be nervous about hers.

Second Lieutenant Essley, a 2009 graduate of Cassville High School, was accepted into the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, upon high school graduation.

Both of 2nd Lt. Essley's parents were Marines and she knew at a young age that was her destiny as well.

"I remember being five years-old and looking at my mother's photo from boot camp and I knew I wanted to be just like mom," Cheyann stated.

Although her parents wanted her to try going to college first, 2nd Lt. Essley wanted to go straight into the Marines. Her compromise was that she would apply for the Naval Academy and if she didn't get accepted, she was going to find a Marine Corps Recruiter.

Of the 16,000 that applied for the Naval Academy that year, only 1,200 were accepted. 2nd Lt. Essley was one of them.

"I was shocked when I found out. I thought to myself, how could a girl from Cassville be accepted into the United States Naval Academy? I wonder what it was that they saw in my file that made them say 'that girl should come here."

Once arriving in Maryland, 2nd Lt. Essley had to go through six weeks of boot camp. She experienced the drilling, the workouts, the marching and even the drastic haircut.

During her four years at the Academy, 2nd Lt. Essley's most rewarding experience was leading her "plebes" through Sea Trials.

Freshmen Naval Academy students, known as "plebes," participate in a Sea Trials exercise at the end of their first year. During Sea Trials, plebes face a series of obstacles on water and on land.

"It was so rewarding watching my team put together everything they had learned their first year and put it to use during their Sea Trials.

"It is both physically and mentally challenging. I asked them what their goal was and it was to finish together. They finished together and I had never been so proud."

2nd Lt. Essley stated she finally felt a real change in herself during her last year at the Academy.

"I had it in my mind for so long that I wanted to be an enlisted woman in the Marines, I wasn't seeing how rewarding being an officer was."

On August 13th, 2nd Lt. Essley will start her journey as an officer in the Marines. Her graduating class was 1,065 and of that, 265 were selected to be Marines.

After graduating the Academy, graduates must join either the Marines or the Navy. Of those 265 selected to join the Marines, only 40 of them were women.

"I am not worried about moving on to the next rank or anything like that. What I am most looking forward to is serving that young Marine and help them be whatever it is they are wanting to be."

"If I could give any advice it would be that there is nothing a girl cannot do. I've seen it. Also, it doesn't

matter if you're from a big city or if you're from Cassville, if you have the confidence and the drive you can achieve whatever it is you set your mind to."

Currently, 2nd Lt. Essley has 30 days leave. She is spending time catching up with friends, helping out with local karate classes where she earned her black belt and running in 31 mile ultramarathons.

2nd Lt. Essley is the daughter of Billy and Lisa Essley, of Butterfield.

Young gets 12 years for assaulting an officer

Chris Young, of Monett, was sentenced to 12 years in the Department of Corrections after pleading guilty to Assault of a Law Enforcement Officer, a class A felony.

According to Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox, Young attempted to cause serious physical injury to Officer Gary Snook by throwing him to the ground, pinning his left arm down with his knee and then punching him in the face two times.

The assault occurred on March 13, 2013, just after noon in Monett.

According to a probable cause statement completed by Barry County Sheriff officer Gary Snook, he stated he went to serve a warrant to Young.

"I heard people talking in the residence and I knocked on the door. Chris asked who it was and I advised him that it was Gary.

"He opened the door and asked what I needed. I advised Chirs he had a warrant and that he was under arrest and to put his hands behind his back," stated Officer Snook.

According to Snook, he was able to get Young's left hand in cuffs and then Young became tense.

"I was about to get the right hand cuffed and then he swung around and tried to get away from me. I kept my hands on the cuffs and we began to struggle."

Snook stated that Young threw him to the ground, pinned his left arm down with his knee and then punched him in the face two times.

"At that point, I feared for my safety and I pulled my duty weapon to shoot the subject. Chris then grabbed my gun and he tried to get it

away from me.

"We continued to struggle on the floor and he attempted to turn the gun to my face but he was not able to. We continued to struggle and he finally was able to get my gun out of my hand. He then left the residence in an unknown direction."

When Young fled the scene, it started a five-hour man hunt that finally lead to Young's capture and arrest.

Southwest High School FCA officers recently held a canned food drive and money collection to benefit the victims of the Moore, Okla., tornado.


The goods and money were collected at the Cassville and Seligman branches of Freedom Bank. In addition to collecting several canned goods, \$520 was raised.

• Shaylinn Freeman, of Pierce City, is being charged with Burglary in the 2nd degree. Lonnie Fulp stated that around 9:00 p.m. on July 20, 2010, and 5:00 p.m. July 21, 2010, an unknown person(s) broke into the Chapel of Grace Church and stole a Fender bass guitar. Several burglary cases tried during Barry County Court's May Law Day

On August 29, 2011, Officer Greg Brandsma, with the Monett Police Department, responded to the unauthorized use of Michael Hagar's debit card. Hagar stated that due to his deteriorating health, he had allowed Scott Good, an acquaintance, to use his debit card to purchase groceries for him at the Rameys Supermarket in Monett. Scott Good returned the debit card to Hagar but was reluctant to provide a receipt for the grocery purchases and said he would have to look for it. Since then, Hagar has not seen Scott Good. Hagar stated that on August 16th he checked the activity account on the card. After obtaining a copy of the transaction history, Hagar discovered many unauthorized transactions during the

time period of August 1st-12th. After officer Brandsma received many survalance videos and pictures of Good using Hagar's card, he filed a report. Scott Good was sentenced to five years probation on May 21, 2013 supervised by the Missouri Board of Probation and Parole. He must also pay restitution of \$789.81 to Michael Hagar at a rate directed by Probation and Parole to be paid in full on or before May 21, 2014.

· Officer Travis Hilburn arrived on the scene of a one vehicle collision on August 24, 2011. A Taizhou Chuani was lying in the south ditch of eastbound Farm Road 2049. The driver was on a gurney and being loaded into the rear of a Barry Lawrence Ambulance and several emergency personnel were at the scene. The driver stated that he, "thought he had blacked out." Officer Hilbrun spoke with the driver

inside of the ambulance. The driver had many apperent injuries and had a strong odor of intoxicants. He was later identified as Eugene Daugherity of Purdy, 49 years old. Daugherity submitted a shallow breath test which indicated his blood alcohol content was well above 0.080%. Daugherity was then released to ambulance personnel to be transported to Cox Monett Hospital. Once Officer Hilburn exited the ambulance, he was contacted by two emergency workers, Jon Egleston with the Purdy Fire Protection District, and Brandon Pennington with Monett Fire Department. Egleston informed the officer that Daugherity struck him in the temple with a closed fist when law enforcement arrival was mentioned. Pennington stated that Daugherity had struck him in the groin with his knee around the same time as Egleston was assaulted. Officer Hilburn contacted Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnny Cox, explained the

circumstances and Mr. Cox requested two blood samples within an hour interval from Daugherity. He later received SIS probation for five years and must do 30 days shock in County jail; this can be done on weekends.

· On Tuesday, April 16th, Lisa Seabolt assaulted an officer and attempted escape from confinement. Officer Tamara Arnold was attempting to move Seabolt to clean the cell intentionally flooded by Seabolt. After Arnold opened the cell door, Seabold tried to take the jail keys away from Arnold and a scuffle took place. During this event, Arnold was injured, a small cut on her right middle finger and bruising to her left forearm; Seabolt then took possession of the keys. She ran to the booking door and attempted to open it using the keys, with no success. Seabolt then ran to the back kitchen area, where she was then found hiding in the bathroom. 



ahead, even when the school year begins once again. Parents should limit how much time their youngsters spend in front of the television or the computer during summer vacation, keeping track and turning the TV or computer off if they suspect kids are spending too much time staring at the screen instead of being active. Kids might not

love it when you turn their video games off or minimize their access to social media, but explain the limitations at the onset of summer and let kids know you expect them to be physically active even if it is summer vacation.





It was a beautiful day, with a light (most of the time) breeze and we had a great turnout.



Missouri State Highway Patrol reminds the public about flooding dangers

Colonel Ron Replogle, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, would like to remind the public that flooding continues to affect safety on both the waterways and roadways. Flooding, due to the recent heavy rains, has proven to be extremely dangerous and even fatal.

The weekend's storms created flooding issues all across the state. Three fatalities have resulted from the flooding so far. One fatality involved an individual trying to cross a flooded roadway and the other two involved individuals standing near flooded areas. Many of the roads across the state which are near or cross over waterways are still under water, and should be considered impassable and extremely dangerous to cross.

For their safety and that of their passengers, drivers are reminded to stay alert while driving in areas known to flood. Barricades closing a roadway are there to protect you. Drivers must respect barriers or barricades put in place by MoDOT -- it is extremely dangerous and a violation of state law to drive around them.

Never drive through fast-moving waters; even a small amount of fastmoving water can sweep a

slow-moving vehicle off the roadway. If your vehicle becomes stuck in rising water, get out quickly and move to higher ground.

The Patrol also asks boaters across the state to take extra precautions when boating in flooded areas. Many areas of Missouri have experienced large amounts of rainfall over the last week causing rivers and lakes to become swollen. Many times the right decision is to stay off the water.

In areas where lakes or rivers have spilled over the banks, erosion and damage can occur to flooded structures, docks, or water laden levees by boat wakes. Boaters should avoid operating in these areas. If operation in these areas is necessary boaters should operate at idle speed so as not to cause a wake.

Flooded rivers and with streams moving

currents present some of the most dangerous situations a boater can encounter. Fast moving water can easily capsize or flip a boat, especially when combined with fixed objects such as trees and buildings. Boaters should avoid any operations in these swift flowing waters.

Many lakes and rivers across the state have only seen routine increases in water levels. It is for the safety of the public and to minimize damage to property that the Highway Patrol requests boaters avoid waterways that have been impacted by the most severe flooding.



Dairy Field Day in Mt. Vernon

June Dairy Month is an exciting month that includes many events that recognize the importance of the dairy industry. This year, a new Dairy Field Day offering sound farm management practices for dairies in Southwest Missouri as been scheduled for June 20, 2013. Making silage from big round bales gives qualityminded producers a tool to harvest forage at it's peak. An outdoor classroom and hands-on field session will demonstrate how to make and store high-quality baleage. 10:50 a.m., Optimizing Dairy Rations, Tony Rickard Feed costs can represent more than 50 percent of the cost of production, This session will focus on feeding the right ingredients at the right time, eliminating overfeeding of expensive nutrients, and controlling feed waste. 11:10 a.m., Ozark Dairy Profitability, Joe Horner This session will focus on the four

profitable dairy producers, whether they are confinement or grazing dairies. Drought and poor margins have hammered many Ozark producers for the past three years, but future trends point to increased profitability. 11:30 a.m., Synchronization Protocols, Scott Poock In any type of dairy, the value of a pregnant cow has been quantified and should not be underestimated. There has been research that indicates a pregnant cow is worth \$200 to \$500 more than an open cow. One way to get more pregnant cows is to use estrus synchronization programs. 


