Arkansas man held in Barry County Jail on felony drug and firearm charges

A Bentonville, Arkansas, man remains behind bars at the Barry County Jail on felony drug and firearm charges.

According to a probable cause statement issued by Barry County Sheriff Deputy Joshua Remenar on March 3, 2024, at approximately 11 minutes after midnight on March 3, 2024, the deputy was traveling eastbound on State Highway 76 and witnessed a black 2008 Nissan Sentra bearing no visible plates and performed a traffic stop at the intersection of Farm Road 1098.

Deputy Remenar made contact with the driver, Glen Michael Bise, 39, of Bentonville, Arkansas, who according to the statement had no vehicle registration, no insurance and a revoked Missouri driver's license. Deputy Remenar advised Bise he was towing the vehicle and citing him for the violations.

During inventory of the vehicle prior to towing, the deputy discovered a set of digital scales and a used hypodermic needle laying in plain sight on the floor inside the driver's door and a bottle cap with cotton inside containing a crystalline substance. A total of four bags totaling a weight of approximately 50 grams containing a crystalline substance were also dis-

Barry County Commissioners merge special road districts

New playground officially opens at Roaring River State Park

Representatives with Missouri State Parks and the Cassville Community Foundation officially opened a new playground at Roaring River State Park.

According to Dr. Chad Johnson, with the Cassville Community Foundation, in 2020 the Foundation began the collaborative effort with Roaring River State Park to replace the unsafe structure located on Hwy. F, across from the Roaring River Park Store.

Funds for the structure were provided by a grant from Mercy Hospital's Rural Health Initiative. The total cost for the Miracle Playground was \$25,000. Installation of the playground by Missouri State Parks staff saved the park approximately \$20,000.



The Barry County Commissioners held a public hearing on February 22, 2024, at the Barry County Courthouse to receive input about the consolidation of Shell Knob Special Road District #9 and Viola Special Road District #21. During the meeting it was agreed to merge the two special road districts and be known as the Shell Knob-Viola Special Road District #9.

"It makes sense to merge these smaller road districts," said Northern Commissioner Gary Schad. "By the time these districts pay their expenses, like bonding, insurance, equipment and administration, a third of the district's money is gone.

"When Cherry Warren was in office, he pushed to have a bill set up with (retired Senator) David Sater on this," Schad added. "This is the first time that we have done this and it was relatively easy and that's what Cherry, Wayne Hendrix and I wanted for these road districts, an easier path to consolidation."

Barry County currently has 24 special road districts and one common district. Schad stated he wanted other districts present at the hearing to see how easy consolidation could be.

According to Barry County Clerk Joyce Ennis, special road districts that would like to seek consolidation will need to contact her outside of tax or voting season (before March and before August, and not during September or December) to start the process.

"Both special road districts will need to be in agreement and the levy will be at the lower of the two districts," said Ennis. "Depending on the districts, it could take longer to merge districts that have additional road bridges."

On April 8, citizens across southern and southeast Missouri will have the chance to see a rare celestial event – a total solar eclipse.

The moon will block the sun's light and cause a total solar eclipse to be visible across nearly 115 miles of Missouri. Visitors will come to the Show-Me State to witness the event, and numerous community events and festivals are planned along the path of totality. Missourians should make plans early to determine where they will view the eclipse, where they will stay and how best to avoid the extra traffic congestion after the eclipse.

"We anticipate large crowds with possible heavy congestion on the interstates and major highways especially after the eclipse is over," said Missouri Department of Transportation Chief Safety and Operations Officer Becky Allmeroth. "If you are traveling for the event, leave early, stay put as long as possible and plan to stay after the end of the eclipse to avoid the peak traffic."

tips to drive safely on the day of the solar eclipse:

- Don't stop along the interstate and no parking on the shoulder.
- Find a safe location to view the event and get there early.
- Watch out for inpedestrian creased traffic along smaller roads. People may be randomly parking and walking alongside roads in the hour before the total eclipse to get the best viewing.
- Don't take photographs of the eclipse

- Turn your headlights on and do not rely on your automatic headlights during the eclipse.
- Avoid travel during the eclipse or in the area of the main path if you can.
- Prepare for extra congestion, especially on interstates and other major roadways for the hours immediately following the eclipse.
