

Water is running 62 CFS right now. This is great water to fish. It is clear and running well.

Still great dry fly fishing this week. Caddis, BWOs, and midges, starting to see more tricos in the morning, and with the warmer weather we are already doing well on beetles and ants.

Pheasant tail nymphs worked very well all week. Green cracklebacks did extremely well all week. Black wooly buggers and wooly worms were very effective all week also.

Pink san juan worms, and cheese yellow san jaun worms were good all last week.

Orange glo-balls were good, as were the apricot glo-balls.

Dry flies I am using 9' 7X leaders, and for nymphs I am using 9' 6X leaders.

Mega worms, mop flies, and blob flies also did well this week.

Plastic baits were great this week. The yellow Powerbait grubs were working all week, and the pink is still pretty good; the brown

works sometimes.

White eggs were very good this week, as were the natural fish oil fish eggs.

White worms, cheese worms, and mint green worms were good all

Spinners were good early in the morning; the black, skunk, pink, and the brown spinners were good choices this week.

2-lb line will work better than 4-lb right now. The fish are spooked by heavier line, you can get away with 4-lb for the first 30 minutes or so, just like the spinners (30-minute wonders), then you'll be better off switching to 2-lb line. Try to avoid white, blue, yellow or red lines, as these will spook the trout, and good moss green or clear line like p-line or gamma, or seagur is great also, but the Gamma mono or the Maxima ultra green line work best here when the water is this clear. Barry County Health Department February Food Service Report



McDonald County detectives solve decades old cold case

McDonald County Sheriff's Office Detectives Lorie Howard and Rhonda Wise announced during a week that they have identified a suspect in the October 31, 1990, murder of Shauna Garber.

According to a press release from the Mc-Donald County Sheriff's Office, on December 2, 1990, human remains were found outside of an abandoned farmhouse located on Oscar Talley Road, in McDonald County.

The McDonald County Sheriff's Office and the Missouri State Highway Patrol conducted the initial investigation and were unable to identify the remains, which would became known as "Grace Doe" as detectives who continued to work on the case were

told that it may be by the Grace of God that her identify would ever be found.

The Sheriff's Office press conference last received several leads between 1990 2020, but it wasn't until 2021 with advancements in DNA technology that the Sheriff's Office were able to ID "Grace Doe" as Shauna Garber through DNA extraction and a familial match. The investigation continued for three more years after Garber was identified.

> "Through statements, sources, witnesses, pounding the ground and driving people absolutely insane for 30 years, we finally have the answers that we need," said Detective Lorie Howard during the press conference.

> Howard stated that Talfey Reeves, who died in November 2021, was a long stand-

ing suspect in the case.

"I can tell you that Talfey Reeves was a suspect in this case for years, I just couldn't get anyone to talk to me on the record, in an affidavit, I couldn't corroborate their story until years later and I had nobody who had the missing piece until he died," Howard add-

According to Howard, it is believed that Talfey Reeves picked up Shauna Garber from the Tanglewood/Ginger Blue area of Missouri State Highwway 59. After restraining her, he transported her to an abandoned farmhouse where it is believed that he sexually

assaulted her and overdosed her with drugs.

Detectives that Reeves had several charges dating back to the 1980's which included drug trafficking and assault.

According to press release, Shauna's case has been changed from an open murder case to cleared by exception.

Mills describes the

multiple benefits that the new units will provide. "The freezers replace aging units with new energy efficient ones and will increase our frozen storage capacity and energy efficiency. The enhanced frozen storage capacity will allow the pantry to store on site more frozen meat, vegetables, and fruit, which are highly desirable prod-

ucts. Trends in food packaging have transitioned beyond reliance just upon canned products alone. We are able to inventory more freshly frozen packaged produce product items such as frozen blueberries and strawberries for example."

Rising grocery prices due to inflation have placed a heavier burden on low-income individuals, leaving them with less disposable income for other necessities. As a result, many new visitors are compelled to seek assistance from the food pantry to bridge the gap and ensure basic nutritional needs are met. The Pantry provides an average of 550 - 600 food boxes each month to the food insecure community. Individuals served monthly range between 1,400 - 1,550 persons.




Rep. Burlison introduces the Table **Rock Lake Property Protection Act**

On Tuesday, March 26, Congressman Eric Burlison (R-MO-07) introduced the Table Rock Lake Property Protection Act to protect residents from overburdensome regulations implemented by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE).

"I am honored to introduce the Table Rock Lake Property Protection Act. Table Rock Lake is the cornerstone of the Ozarks, which attracts residents and vacationers alike who want to enjoy its natural beauty. However, despite being a source of such pride for our community, proper-



ty owners on the lake continue to face the burden of costly and inconsistent mandates imposed by the Army Corps.

"Previously, the Army Corps allowed property owners to keep their septic tanks on Corps land, given that they were not causing any significant issues on the lake. Unfortunately, the Corps changed course on this policy and now is requiring property owners to move their septic tank off of Corps land by 2030, which will come at a significant cost to these families.

"The impact is unacceptable, and that's why I've introduced the Table Rock Lake Property Protection Act. Together, we can preserve the beauty of the lake and Corps land without harming the residents who call it home," said Rep. Burlison.













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
