# Fire destroys diner in Exeter



## Monett Career Center says it's not closing

With conflicting reports on the closing of the Monett Career Center, the center has stated that it did not close on April 30th as the State has reported.

Jasen Jones, a member of the Workforce Investment Board of Southwest Missouri, stated that the center will remain open at it's Monett location.

"The state is removing their employees and some specific compliance programs out of Monett, but our Workforce Investment Board will keep providing basic services at the Monett location."

"We know we are good through June 30, 2013. We are awaiting final bud-

grants from U.S. Department of Labor and have high confidence that we will be able to remain open through June of 2014."

From July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012, the Monett Career Center served 5,941 people. The Center served 429 people from Cassville and 252 people from Purdy during that time frame.

According to Missouri State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, the Missouri Department of Economic Development is losing federal money and is withdrawing employees from centers based on volume of business and proximity to other centers

"I have tried to find out how much money it would

and I am still trying to find a way to get the budget amended to line out an appropriation to keep the office open," stated Rep. Fitzpatrick.

"But, the Economic Development Department told me that it would be unlikely that they could bridge the gap from the end of April to July 1, which is when the next fiscal year starts, which is the first year of appropriations which I would have the opportunity to approve. That is assuming I was able to get money in the budget to keep them open," stated Rep. Fitzpatrick.

The Monett Workforce Investment Board plans to continue to provide the services it can while waiting for the budget to be reinstated.

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly has made arrangements to conduct the second active shooter training exercise for local law enforcement. The second exercise will take place at Shell Knob Schools on Thursday, May 9, at 1:00 p.m.

"We do these exercises to train school staff, law enforcement and emergency personnel on different scenarios that could happen in the event of an active shooter entering a school," stated Sheriff Epperly.

The first active shooter

training exercise was held in February at Wheaton Schools.

According to Epperly, the exercise will include a complete simulation from the time a shooter enters the school building. There will be no students at the school on this day, just school personnel.

Agencies scheduled to participate in the exercise are: Barry County Sheriff, Wheaton Police, Cassville Police, Purdy Police, Exeter Police, Missouri State Patrol, Missouri Conservation, Central Crossing Fire Dept.,

Central Crossing First Responders, Barry County 911 and Cox Ambulance.

> Law enforcement will hold a briefing at 12:30 p.m. to discuss the procedure of the training exercise with those involved. The briefing conference will take place in the Shell Knob gymnasium.

> "This is an exercise only to be used for training school staff and emergency services on how to deal with an active shooter in the school," stated Epperly.




\* Request a table near the bathroom. While looking at the restroom doors may not make for the most inviting ambiance, it does reduce the hassle of snaking through tables and rows with

a child who needs to use the restroom



# Managing difficult yard situations

Manv homeowners aim for a picture perfect lawn complete with rolling acres of soft, green grass. But Mother Nature may have other things in mind, providing homeowners with growing less-than-stellar conditions for their lawns, plants and other foliage. Frustration can mount when a yard is muddy, is especially shady or has soil that doesn't seem to grow a thing. In such instances, homeowners may have to go the extra mile to get the yard they desire.

#### **Irrigation issues**

Improper drainage or low-lying areas in a yard may contribute to a muddy mess. Soil that is inhospitable for grass also may end up causing muddy patches because the grass simply does not grow. In some cases, remedying a muddy yard is easy and inexpensive. Some homeowners find that tilling the soil and amending it with a fiber mulch helps to absorb extra water and make the conditions better for lawn seeds to sprout. This also helps to aerate compacted soil that can hinder grass growth. Adding soil fill also may help to level low-lying areas that can be puddling.

Some homeowners find that they need to do a little more work and spend some more money to fix irrigation issues. Installing a draining system or having the property sloped to draw water away can sometimes be done by a homeowner but is often best left to a professional. You may need to dig trenches, and the property may need to be regraded to make a difference.

#### Sandy soil

Grass and other plants may not grow well with sandy or clay soil. Again, amending the soil is one way to remedy the problem. Although it will take some work at the outset, amending the soil can improve conditions and reduce how much maintenance the lawn needs. Digging down several inches and adding nutrientrich filler soil will help create conditions that are better for growing. Those who are interested in planting vegetables could opt for raised garden beds above the challenging soil.

#### Shade

Sometimes a yard is problematic because of the amount of sunshine it receives. Too much sunshine can scald certain grasses, while inadequate sunshine may result in bare patches where grass won't grow. If cost is no object, removing or planting trees to establish better growing conditions could be an option. However, today there are many grass blends that are tailored toward specific sunlight scenarios. Homeowners may find that low-light blends will grow better in shady areas.

For those who are finding no luck with grass blends, it may just be necessary to think creatively. Plant shade-loving plants, such as ferns or ground cover, where the grass won't take. Design the landscape so it looks intentional. Flagstone and slate placed in certain areas also may mask temperamental growing areas.

There are different options for managing various situations in the yard that can make growing lawn or other plants challenging. If projects are difficult, it could be smart to call in a professional.





With a little more than three weeks remaining in the legislative session, bills are coming up quickly and the Senate is spending long days and nights debating the important issues of our state. Lawmakers are looking for "vehicles" in which to attach their priority legislation, and I am watching each amendment and bill carefully to determine how it affects the 29th District.

In the middle of a busy week, I handled House Bill 163, sponsored by Rep. Scott Fitzpatrick, R-Shell Knob, who asked me to carry it in the Senate. Currently, the cities of Monett and West Plains are required by state law to hold a primary election in a municipal election even if the number of candidates filed is less than or equal to the number of available seats. This costs the city of Monett approximately \$6,000 for each election. House Bill 163 would fix this inconsistency in the law by allowing these cities to opt out of holding a primary election for city council and mayoral races if the number of candidates filed is less than the number of open seats. Monett and West Plains just want the same flexibility other cities currently have and to save their local taxpayers the cost of an unnecessary election. House Bill 163 passed with a few amendments from other members and now returns to the House for consideration.

The Senate also passed another of my bills this week, Senate Bill 205. Under this bill, each child who is a ward of the state or in the Missouri foster care system would receive a visit to a state university or institution higher education. of Unfortunately, many of our state's foster children are not going on to college or technical or trade school. This means they are far less likely to make a living wage and are more likely to remain dependent on the state. During their school visit, the child would receive information about financial aid and the application process, and would have the opportunity to tour the school. I believe SB 205 will encourage more of our young people to seek higher education and, as it will not cost any taxpayer dollars, it is a no-cost investment in their future. It passed the Senate with bipartisan support and now moves to the House for similar consideration. Many people continue to contact my office about the recent revelation that the Missouri Department of Revenue (DOR) and Missouri Highway Patrol ignored state law and communicated the personal information of Missourians with conceal carry permits. Like many

of you, I was outraged and insisted it immediately be addressed. In response, the Senate passed Senate Bill 252, legislation that would require DOR to destroy any scanned documents and prohibit them from scanning documents in the future. Perhaps most importantly, the bill would give county sheriffs sole authority over the issuance and approval of CCW permits. I worked with my colleagues to make this change because I think most of us trust our local sheriffs more than an unelected bureaucrat in Jefferson City. The Legislature is also considering if the taxpayers of Missouri should continue to fund activity that compromises our personal information and violates state law. In the Senate version of the budget, the Motor Vehicle Division of DOR's allotment for FY 2014 is \$0.

Another issue on the minds of many Missourians is Medicaid. ObamaCare required every state to expand Medicaid to cover all adults at 138 percent of the poverty level. However, the U.S. Supreme Court decided last summer that the states could not be required to do this. While we would receive funding from the government federal to expand Medicaid, Missouri taxpayers would have to put in at least \$1.2 billion over the long run. Some estimates put the cost to the state even higher. These figures do not take into account annual growth to the Medicaid rolls that occurs already. We are already responsible for more than 900,000 recipients currently on the program, and the state spends nearly half of all state general revenue on Medicaid. Frankly, I don't trust the federal government to hold up its end of the bargain and with \$17 trillion in debt, I don't believe our country can afford the increased spending. The Senate has consistently said the Medicaid system must be fixed before we even consider committing more than a billion dollars in future state dollars that might otherwise go to core services like transportation. education, and public safety. The most likely outcome this session will be the creation of an interim committee to carefully study the issue and make recommendations to the Legislature on ways we can fix Medicaid. 


