Legislation could provide funding for improvements to the old CCC Lodge

An amendment to House Bill 19, made by Governor Jay Nixon, could provide \$121 of surplus revenue for capital improvement projects. Another proposal that passed the House last week is the Fifth State Building Fund, a \$1.2 billion statewide bond issue for capital projects.

Included on both lists for possible funding would be the restoration of the original Civilian Conservation Corps Lodge at Roaring River State Park.

Representative Scott

Fitzpatrick, a member of the House Budget Committee, is supportive of the amendment but doesn't foresee the bond issue making it to the ballot this year.

"Revenues have outpaced anticipated collections for this fiscal year, and by completing some of these capital improvement projects with the excess revenues, it will decrease the size of the bond proposal," said the Representative.


"The bond proposal passed the House last week, with my support, but I am certain it will not pass the

Senate this year. It will be introduced again next year, with the projects that are completed with the funding from HB 19 being removed from the proposal next year.

"I think there is a fairly good chance that the initiative will pass next year, and the measure will be sent to the ballot, though one can never know for sure.

According to Steve Nagle, president of the Missouri Park Association it would take over \$400 million to bring everything up to speed throughout the park system in Missouri.

Cassville Council discusses leash law

Nadine Davis, of Cassville, addressed the Council for the third time since 2007 concerning issues with dogs within the city limits. Davis asked the Council to address a leash ordinance and asked that the Council do something about the stray dogs that roam around town.

Davis stated she spends lots of time picking up trash around the community and is constantly being chased by dogs, has been bitten and picks up trash after stray dogs and cats have gotten into around the square in Cassville.

The discussion of a leash law ordinance was already

on the Council's agenda for Monday evening. Alderwoman Anne Hennigan lead discussion stating that something needed to be done.

Hennigan stated that since October 2012, there has been 58 dog complaints made to the Cassville Police Department and six reported dog bites within the Cassville city limits.

Mayor Bill Shiveley stated, "We aren't going to be able to stop it, but we need to do something about it."

Alderman Terry Heinz stated, "This has been going on for years and we have never rectified it."

Shell Knob man honored by Lt. Governor Kinder

"Glenn is a person to look up to and emulate. He is 83 and spent his whole life helping others."


Lt. Governor Kinder presented Phillips with an official declaration and a Senior Service Award lapel pin at a ceremony in the Capitol.

Melton guest speaker at Courthouse celebration





Alderwoman Hennigan suggested asking residents to license their dogs for a nominal fee like some surrounding towns do.

"Some of the bite calls are our officers being bit. We are putting our officers at risk and it's driving up cost, such as for insurance. Maybe if we had an ordinance in place it would help cut down on some of these issues," stated Alderwoman Hennigan.

"I wonder how we enforce it? How can the city afford to take care of these dogs we take in such as strays or violators of a leash law. I don't have a problem with a leash law, I think all dogs should at least have a tag, but charging \$5 to register your dog isn't going to take care of it," stated Mayor Shiveley.

In Alderwoman Hennigan's rebuttal, she stated, "So we're just going to sit back since we can't control it the way you want so we're not going to do anything?"

Alderman Darrell Ledenham stated that if citizens knew they had to register their dogs for a fee, then it might encourage people not to take in so many.

An ordinance was not decided on during Monday night's meeting. Mayor Shiveley appointed Alderwoman Hennigan and Alderwoman Jan Anthony to looking into more options for the City, a timeline was not established for the issue to be brought back to the Council.

100 years: Bond issue passes

Courthouse

The report that the bond proposition had carried Saturday, July 6, 1912 had reached the most distant parts of the county by Monday noon. Farmers were busy with their harvest and their plowing but in many places these tasks were put aside with the news of victory.

At 5:00 Monday afternoon, July 8, a large number of the citizens of Wheaton and community, led by the Wheaton band, arrived. This was the first that people of Cassville knew that there was to be something going on in town that night. Until late in the evening citizens were coming from far and near and by 8:00 the court yard that now was an empty square was filled.

The citizens of Cassville were completely surprised but a program was hastily made comprising of the singing of music by the Wheaton band and of contemporaneous speaking.

Judge McNatt of Aurora. Silas McQueen of Wheaton, Henry Edgar of Monett, James Sapp and W. Hankins of Butterfiled, W. Irby of Jenkins, R.A. Ellis of Ozark Township, George Hailey of Cato, Q.D. Davis of Washburn, Judge O'Dyer of Purdy, S.J. Sayler, A.L. Galloway, J.T. Brattin and J.S. Davis of Cassville. William Henderson and Frank Archibald of Purdy all made what the local paper said were "excellent talks." Each speaker was given all the time he wanted and nothing was said that would cast a poor reflection upon any town or any citizen of the county.

Celebrations were held in several other places in the county. It is the greatest victory Barry County has ever gained and the people were rejoicing as they have never before over the result of an election.







the national average of 85%. Teens and pick-up truck drivers are among those least likely to buckle up at 66% and 63%.



The staged active shooter event that took place Thursday at Shell Knob School left several issues to be addressed by Sheriff Mick Epperly of Barry County.

In his debriefing session after the three-hour event, he declared, "That didn't go well due to several issues and some bad luck."

Over 40 officers and Central Crossing Fire Protection District volunteers took on the task of removing teachers and students to safety and capturing four masked "Bad Guys" who had hidden in the building.

These men were volunteers from various departments and there were four victims that were either wounded or dead. Local EMS units from Cox participated by making up the wounds and then removing the victims from the event.

Over seven county and Missouri police units took part in the staged active shooter event. They were from Wheaton, Exeter, Barry County Sheriff's Department, Barry County 911, Cox Ambulance, Missouri Department of Conservation, and Central Crossvolunteers.

Sheriff Epperly looking for situations that would cause the team to sharpen their problem solving skills in the take down of a shooter and rescue of staff and students. Pre-planning consisted of giving team leaders, Barry County Officers Carl Cosper and Randy Kalbaugh, a plan of the building and an outline of the event.

They broke the group of officers into four teams and all guns were unloaded as a part of this type of practice procedure.

At 1 pm, Sheriff Epperly went to the school gym and briefed the building teachers on the components of the intruder's invasion. A code word given and the process of how to let students exit and enter were provided. The alert went off and 911 called. Six Sheriff officers and Cassville police cars arrived within minutes. The teams took positions at doors of the building. At a signal, they entered and proceeded to clear the building.

The first event, a stolen bus with a bus driver shot, set the pace for the event. The officers took over an hour to clear the building with one officer suffering an injured knee while taking down a fugitive running from the building.

In the search, officers were alerted that two bombs


were in the building; this heightened the intensity of the situation and forced officers to slow and search through clothing, closets, and cubbies. The building has been added onto several times over its' 90 year history; this added to the confusion and the fact that parts of the building were steel sheeted cost officers their commu-

Fire Chief Rusty Rickard operated his Command Post in the parking lot and guided his men and equipment into the entrance of the Shell Knob School gym to form a lane to protect children and teachers as they exited their classrooms outside to safety. Cox Ambulance removed the four victims and took the injured police officer to Cox South Hospital.

nication links to one another.

Sheriff Epperly summarized the operation as a drill with the "intention to identify what was needed to make the building safe from intruders and to determine what additional efforts needed to be made to stop an active shooter.

"We have learned a great deal from this afternoon's drill and we need to practice this again. We will be back in the fall. I appreciate the efforts of the Shell Knob community, CCFPD, Cox and all the departments that took part in this drill."

The Macedonia Quartet...They Made **Beautiful Music Together: Part II**

Continued from last week's Barry County Advertiser; first printed in in March 1979.

"Quartet Days" Were **Happy One**

"I doubt very much if any four men could have more things in common as did our group," Spencer Smith says. "We all grew up and spent our lives in the same community. We talked and believed the same things. Three of us had taught school in Barry County. Our lives were so closely woven together it was no wonder it was so easy for us to sing and harmonize. We dearly loved it!"

Among Rev. Calvin Henderson's personal papers, now in the possession of his daughter, Mrs. Wilma Hawk of Cassville, is a "journal," written on tablet paper and containing many memories of his life and work. Mrs. Hawk shared the pages dealing with the "quartet days."

Henderson wrote, "These were some of the happiest years of my life. Every member of the quartet was congenial and considerate and we went along together without friction. We sant conventions, political meetings and many and varied occasions. Often being called many miles from home."

All of the Macedonia Quartet's songs were written for male voices. That is quite different from music used by modern day quartets, Smith points out. Today the quartet music is written for mixed

voices.

First Gospel Quartet Records

The four men made the first gospel quartet record every made by RCA Victor in 1927. They were invited by the recording company to come to Memphis, Tennessee, for a recording sessions. Henderson's journal recalls, "They proposed paying our expenses if we would go for the try out. When we arrived there we were immediately admitted to the recording department where we discussed the matter with the company representative. After some discussion, he asked us to render one or two numbers, which we did. He located us before the microphone and went away into the recording room with the instruction that when he gave us a buzz we were to sing our number.

"Well, this was a new experience for all of us and of course we were very, very nervous. However, after immediately finished the number the manager came in and said, "That came through fine." We thought he was aware of our nervousness and was trying to relieve the tension, so we sat down to talk. Presently, to our surprise, the song was reproduced from the record and came in over the loud speaker. Thrilled? I should say we were! I an unable to describe our feelings at that moment. We had no idea we would hear the record so soon. Of course, we thought it was good and the manager complimented us highly."

The record proved a real favorite. The name of the record was "The House by the Side of the Road," written by Walter Foss and John Roy Harris. On the backside was the song, "Sweet Little Girl of Mine," composed by Adgar M. Pace and James Rowe. The quartet made another recording with "Who'll Be To Blame?" which was written by Fred McPhail, on the top side, and "I've Been Redeemed" on

While in Memphis, the representatives Victor advised the quartet to advertise and call themselves "Victor Recording Artists," which they did. Later, they had posters made which included their pictures. Both records are popular collector's items.

The Victor company also asked the quartet to go back by Hot Springs, Arkansas, to do a radio show, which they did. The show was well received there too.

No one had promised any pay for these recordings, but Rev. Henderson's journal notes, "The records must have had a big sale, for the company later sent us a check for \$100. Our friends from various states wrote to us telling about purchasing our records."

Wherever the quartet appeared to sing, whether locally or far away, they were almost always requested to do "The House by the Side of the Road" and "Sweet Little Girl of Mine."

Reavisville contestant wins music recording contract

Local musician Caleb Reavis has won the First Place award in Southern Gospel Music Talent Contest 2013, sponsored by the Springfield radio station KWFC. The contest, now in its second year, selects a winner and runner up from a wide listening area that covers nearly 30 counties in Southwest Missouri and northwest Arkansas.

The songs that Reavis performed for the contest were a traditional hymn, "Hide Thou Me," and a modern gospel song, "I Bowed On My Knees." Both of them were accompanied by karaoke versions of the Gaither Vocal Band arrangements for

Although he has been living in Springfield for the past four years, Caleb Reavis was raised in the Crane School District and is a sixth-generation resident of the area. He is the son of Russell Reavis and the great grandson of the founders of Reavisville. Locals also may recognize his name as a member of the Roaring River Sound, a band which plays traditional country songs at outdoor events in Roaring River Sate Park near Cassville.

As part of the award, Reavis will receive a \$10,000 recording contract with a Nashville, Tenn., studio owned by Pathway Records, as well as 300 compact disks of the recording to be distributed free in promotional efforts. Although he has been offered concert tours across the U.S. more than once in recent days, he has declined them, explaining that he wants to remain a local artist and be able to stay close to home.

Asked about his musical influences and favorite artist,

Reavis said that he enjoys listening to David Phelps, the Gaithers, Michael English, and Gold City.

Reavis new album is expected to be recorded this fall and released by the end of the year. If all goes as planned, the first radio single from the recording will debut in early 2014, with KWFC being the first station to air the song.




