Appellate court rules in favor of Monett in TIF suit

The Missouri Court of Appeals affirmed Judge Neal Quinto's ruling siding with the City of Monett in the TIF Case involving Monett, Barry County and the Barry County Emergency Services E-911 Board.

The Court affirmed the ruling that a county cannot watch tax increment financing (TIF) projects be undertaken and completed, and collect, distribute, and retain TIF monies related thereto. all for years without protest, then claim the TIF action were void from the begin-

The appellate court also affirmed the ruling that an E-911 tax is subject to TIF allocation if voters approved the tax after the TIF district was created.

According to the City of Monett, Barry County owes Monett an estimated \$2,393,290, which has been set aside by the county from the tax, and Barry County E-911 owes \$380,081.

E-911 Board President Jon Horner stated that E-911 currently has \$377,616.60

set aside in escrow.

Barry County Clerk Gary Youngblood stated that the County also has the money set aside in escrow as well.

"Approximately percent of the money in escrow is from the real-estate tax levies for these political subdivisions which are in the TIF area such as the Monett School District, all County wide districts including the Barry Lawrence Library, Barry County Health Department, Senior Services Board, Developmentally Disabled Board and special districts such as Barry Lawrence Ambulance, Monett Road District. The other 40 percent is half from the road sales tax and half from the county sales tax," stated Youngblood.

"All of the money is not coming from the county sales tax," Youngblood rein-

Although the court has ruled in the City of Monett's favor, no order has been sent to disperse this money to TIF at this time.

Sales tax revenue figures for Cassville were up for the month of April by three percent compared to April 2012. For the month of April 2013, Cassville generated \$56,531.26 compared

to \$54,874.01 at this time last vear.

This puts the City's budgeted sales tax revenue down less than half of a percent for the first five months of 2013.

Barry County courts send several to prison

Several prisoners were sentenced by Circuit Court Judge Jack Goodman to prison early this week in Barry County at the Judicial Cen-

Chris Young of Monett was sentenced to 12 years in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections after his assault on a police officer. The assault took place when Deputy Gary Snook arrived at a residence where Young was staying; Snook advised Young that he had a warrant out and was under arrest. At first, Young cooperated with the officer, he then began to assault Deputy Snook by striking him in the face twice and stealing his gun then leaving the residence in an unknown direction. The defendant is given credit for all jail time awaiting disposition of charge.

Leroy Feeney of Purdy was pulled over by officer Darin Jones on January 23rd for displaying passenger vehicle license plates on a pickup. Officer Jones then called in State Trooper Travis Hilburn after the realizing Feeney seemed impaired and had a strong odor of intoxicants.

Once State Trooper Hilburn arrived at the scene, he noticed the odor of intoxicants and Feeney's slurred speech. He then asked Feeney how much alcohol he had consumed today; Feeney replied that he had drank one beer. Officer Jones had performed tests on Feeny and detected six indicators of impairment.

Feeney agreed to take a preliminary breath test and his blood alcohol content was above 0.080%. Feeney was also driving while revoked, driving with an open





of when they were younger and working outside before there were computers and cell phones," said Gary.


Gary's strawberries are as fresh as can be with no in-

Off. Dennis Goss with Monett Police Department pulled over Mitchell Place, of Purdy, after a MULES check showed Place's drivers license in a revoked status. He then found a black duffle bag containing more drug paraphernalia, the bag of white powder tested positive for methamphetamine. 

Cassville Schools approves general obligation bond refunding with net savings of \$932,206

At a regular meeting of the Cassville R-IV School District Board of Education on May 16, 2013, a refunding bond resolution was approved. It authorized the sale of \$5,350,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds at an average interest rate of about 1.43%, compared to the Series 2006 Bonds which carry an average interest rate of approximately 4.26%. Through this refunding, the District reduces the future interest expense by \$932,206 and shortens the final maturity by two full years on the original Series 2006 Bond issue. This \$932,206 plus the savings of \$1,226,337 from the four previous refunding and prepayments means that the district has saved \$2,158,543 of interest expanse since 1997. The superintendent of Schools, Richard Asbill, expressed enthusiasm and support for the refunding option selected by the Board of Education.

"We have been fortunate that the Board of Education has been focused on fiscal responsibility that the parents and patrons of our District provide us when they support bond issues.

"I am honored to continue the good work the Board and previous superintendent Jim Orrell began on managing the district finances to support short and long term financial needs while also focusing on the economic needs of our community and taxpayers.

"This plan achieves good savings and allos the District to capture better conditions in the municipal bond market for the benefit of our taxpayers. It also preserves considerable flexibility for the District in the future for our building improvement plans that will be needed in the future," Mr. Asbill remarked.

The Board President, John Sullivan, pointed out that the \$932,206 of interest savings for the Series 2013 refunding is not all the District may realize due to the Series 2013 Refunding Bonds having a call feature on March 1, 2016 at no penalty.

"If interest rates are lower in 2016 or later, we can take advantage of that. Meanwhile we are looking in these levels that are more than two and three-quearters percent (2.75%) lower than they were in 2006," stated Mr. Sullivan.

L.J. Heart & Company of St. Louis, Missouri prepared the refunding proposal and Larry J. Heart, President and CEO of the firm, explained how it can fit into the long range plans of the District. The significant factors making the Series 2013 refunding possible were the lower interest rates than in 2006, the fact that a \$1,760,000 proportion of the Series 2006 Bonds maturing from March 1, 2015 through March 1, 2019 are subject to prepayment on March 1, 2014 at no

penalty, the \$3,590,000 portion of the Series 2006 Bonds maturing on March 1, 2022 through March 1, 2026 can be prepaid on March 1, 2015 at no penalty, and the District's ability to participate in the State of Missouri's Direct Deposit Program. This program makes it possible for the District to receive an "AA+" rating from Standard & Poor's Corporation on the Series 2013 Refunding Bonds. Mr. Heart complimented Mr. Asbill for his prompt and through preparations to supply the data necessary for the rating application and official statement.

The bonds were marketed to local financial institutions, with the Security Bank of Southwest Missouri purchasing \$450,000 and Commerce Bank acquiring \$485,000 of the bonds to support the District. Mr. Asbill mentioned that he was pleased efforts were made to accommodate local investors. "It is nice that our marketing procedures facilitated the local involvement while still receiving attractive interest rates," he commented. The \$5,350,000 of bond proceeds from the Series 2013 Refunding Bonds will be placed in an escrow account with Commerce Bank in Kansas City and reinvested in U.S. Treasury Securities. The earnings from this escrow account will cover interest payments on the Series 2013 bonds through March 1, 2015, and prepay the respective portions callable on March 1, 2014 and March 1, 2015 of the Series 2006 Bonds.

The closing for the Series 2013 Refunding Bond issues is to occur on June 5, 2013. Several board members commended L.J. Hart & Company and Mr. Asbill for developing the attractive refunding plan. "It is nice to be able to save \$932,206 of our taxpayers' money, boost our total interest savings to \$2,158,543, and shorten the final maturity by two full years," commented Greg Allen, Vice-President of the Board of Education.

The Series 2013 Refunding Bonds were underwritten by L.J. Hart & Company and the legal documents to complete the issuance of the bonds were prepared by John W. Brickler, Esq. of Spencer Fane Britt & Browne LLP in its role as bond counsel for the District.

Becky Henningson, and David Haddock, who are on the Board Capital Projects Committee, also reviewed the importance of saving the District and the taxpayers interest costs. "Our goal has always been to provide outstanding facilities and ensure that our current facilities are well maintained. In the near future it will be important to ask our community to support efforts to continue those plans. We have been looking at several needs that our school will have in the future and we need to take action now to prepare for those improvements" said David Haddock. Becky Henningson expressed, "we will have needs, like electrical improvements for our classroom, technology needs, roof repair, and improvements to our heating and air systems to ensure that our facilities are safe and effective for our children to learn."

Richard Asbill, explained that emphasis on planning for future needs and taking advantage of costs savings measures now will improve our opportunities for the future planning needs.

"When we have a need our school community has always been overwhelmingly supportive. When we have facilities that range in age, like ours, we have to be proactive in our maintenance plan to ensure that we take care of what we have. We do not want to overlook roof or other maintenance needs and then try to catch up and repair facilities. Many of our facilities will need electrical upgrades to accommodate the current technology needs. Our facilities will need repair to heating and air systems to improve efficiency

and help with annual cost savings needs. Many of our short term projects can be achieved with proper planning and our staff however, we believe that in the coming year or two we will need our voters to support our efforts to improve facilities, classrooms, and make additions to accommodate student needs."

The Board of Education has worked very hard to be good stewards of the taxpayer's investment into our Cassville R-IV School District. As an alumnus, parent, and Board member I know that saving the District this interest on our bond debt is very important, said Jon Horner. Cassville R-IV School teachers and administrators work hard to achieve the expectations that the federal government, state, and community have for our children. I am honored to be a part of that and know that these efforts will help future generations of Cassville students achieve success and have greater opportunities.



Barry County Courthouse 100 Years: Part IX

In the last issue of the story about the Barry County Courthouse we carried a celebration of the citizens in Barry County who gathered at Cassville on Monday, July 8, 1912, to celebrate the victory for the \$40,000.00 bond issue to build a new county courthouse.

This was simply the beginning of a series of actions by the county commission who at that time was composed of Judges J.F. Montgomery, E.H. Holman of Mano and Pat O'Dwyer of Monett.

To say that there was harmony in the county commission would be the exact opposite of what was

underway at the time.

Up to that time, Judges E.H. Montgomery and Holman had made the decisions and Pat O'Dwyer usually dissented.

The passage of the bond issue only intensified the problems which were arising in the county commission, fueled by some citizens of Monett, Purdy and Exeter.

Judge Montgomery who lived in the Capps Creek Township area of Barry County, and E.H. Holman were always on the moving side and Judge Pat O'Dwyer was always on the defensive. The people who were supporting the Monett, Purdy, Exeter combine,

which were defeated on the July 6th election, were constantly on the attack and Holman and Montgomery were taking the action which they felt was necessary to get the project of the construction of a new county courthouse underway.

Between July 6, January 1, 1913, Montgomery and Holman would largely be in charge of letting the contracts for the construction of the new building. O'Dwyer and his followers were in the minority but that did not deter them from taking all sorts of delaying actions which had to be brought to fruition before the term of Judge Holman expired on December 31.

Judges Montgomery and Holman began by getting the plans of C.E. Hair & Co. of Oklahoma City adopted along with the employment of J.H. Otterman who would be the superintendent of the construction of the building. Otterman had been empowered by the two judges on the county commission as superintendent and the Hair plans were readopted.

This resulted in a law suit being filed against Montgomery, Holman and Otterman, who had received \$1,500.00, which it alleged have been illegally appropriated for the plans and specifications for the new courthouse which had been drawn by Hair & Co of Oklahoma City.

That law suit was heard in March of 1913, but despite the fact that various actions had been filed during the interim from July 6 up to January 1, also muddled the proceedings.

The petition in the Barry County Circuit Court, which was filed prior to December 31, alleged that the defendants Montgomery and Holman had wrongfully, fraudulently and in violation their trust and duty to the county entered into an agreement and conspiracy understanding with the defendant Otterman by which it was agreed and understood that Otterman the superintendent

alleged that through these acts by the two members of the county commission Barry County was defrauded out of \$1,500.00.

The prosecuting attorney at the time John Burgess of Monett, Jake Davis of Cassville and Jim Sater of the Monett firm of Mahu, Sater and Gardner represented the protestors. D.H. Kemp and Fielding Sizer of Monett represented the Defendant which was Barry County.

The law suit would still be pending when the Circuit Court met on March 22, 1913. Circuit Judge McNatt of Aurora had denied a motion to dismiss which was filed by Kemp and Sizer.

This rhubarb continued after the victory of the \$40,000.00 bond issue up until after the first of the year in 1913. No action was taken as far as the groundbreaking is concerned, until 1913.

Judge Holman went out of office on December 31, 1912, and at that point in the afternoon all the steps had been taken to award the contract for the construction of the courthouse with

and that the lawsuit further J.H. Otterman named as a construction superintendent.

> In the 1912 general election R.H. Elam of Eagle Rock (who was elected to replace E.H. Holman) had teamed up with Pat O'Dwyer leaving Judge Montgomery as the sole survivor on the county commission who had piloted the \$40,000.00 bond issue to victory on July 6,

> This threw a whole different light on the actions from thereon prior to the groundbreaking in August of

> In the meantime, a vendetta was inaugurated against Judge Montgomery, who by all accounts was a respectable citizen of the Capps Creek community, for being drunk at a meeting of the county commission and for having spent the county's money illegally by paying \$1,500.00 to J.H. Otterman and also he was named as defendant in slander suits filed by some of the patrons of the Monett and Purdy community relative alleged statements he had made in the bond election and the aftermath.







The Macedonia Quartet...They Made Beautiful Music Together: Part III

Continued from last week's **Barry** County Advertiser. First printed in

California, Here We Come!

Spencer Smith was a rural mail carrier and he arranged for the quartet to go to the 1931 annual association of letter carriers in Eldorado Springs in Cedar County. While at that meeting Smith was elected to go as delegate to the National Rural Letter Carriers Association in Los Angeles, California. The understanding was that he take the quartet along and as an inducement, the association voted to pay \$200 to defray expenses. They eagerly accepted the offer. The four men from Macedonia Community were off to sing at the Hollywood

The enjoyed group singing. They enjoyed each other's company. And they certainly enjoyed the trip to California.

They made the trip in Smith's car, stopping along the way to visit family members and friends. Rev. Henderson's journal contains several pages of memories of the trip. The excitement of the four young men and the thrills they experienced as they traveled across the U.S. is plainly revealed in the yellowed pages. He recalss crossing the Rio Grand River into Juarez. Old Mexico. on an electric railroad and the sense they felt of being "entirely out of one's own country." He remembers finding a worm in his cornbread muffin in Abilene.

Texas. They were astounded to see cattle roaming the streets of a "typical western town." They crossed the Painted Desert. When they stopped just outside Phoenix to fill their thermos, they found the thermometer registered 115 degrees. The young men were fascinated by the temperature change as they gained elevation. Finally came the Pacific coastline. Henderson wrote, many years ago, "Here we stopped the car and walked along the beach, stopping occasionally just to put our hands in the water and look out across the Pacific Ocean. It was a wonderful sight to see the great waters and so many strange sights."

They wondered at "oil derricks so numerous they almost touch each other." They went on an excursion trip to Catalina Island. The Henderson journal relates, "It was a wonderful trip. Catalina's surface is covered with desert growth, sage brush and mesquite. From a distance it resembles a large stone rising up from the water. We took an ocean ride on the glass bottom boat. The sights were wonderful to behold. We saw untold numbers of fish, mussels of very large size, and tame sea lions lying on the rocks in the bay."

young, They were enthusiastic, unsophisticated enough to enjoy every new sight and sound.

But, when the time came to entertain, they looked and sounded professional. A good friend of the group, Harry Osborn of the Osborn Clothing Company of Monett, had tuxedos made for each of the four, and when they sang at the Hollywood Bowl they wore them for the first time. They also had an engagement at the Alexander Hotel in Los Angeles and were a hit at all the California performances.

Guests of Will Rogers

How did they becomes guests of Will Rogers?

Once again they had Harry Osborn to thank. It seems that Osborn and Will Rogers were old time school chums. Osborn wrote to the film start, introducing the four men and telling him about the Macedonia Quartet. Will Rogers responded with an invitation for the four to visit his home in Santa Monica. This they did. The visit was, however, short, for the quartet had other singing

engagements, and as Smith puts it, "In the 1920s it was a long way from California home by motorcar...and we were anxious to see our families."

The quartet returned home, as Henderson's journal recalls, "Tired and worn from the trip, but agreed that we were much wiser for having gone."

Upon arriving home though, the quartet found that Osborn had received a letter from Will Rogers expressing his disappointment that the quartet hadn't stayed longer. He intended, he said, to take them to the Fox Studios for an audition.

Smith relates that they all four many time regretted that missed opportunity. "If we had just had a manager who knew his way around and promoted us...," Smith muses. "Its was simply a case of four country boys that could sing...but we did need a manager."

But, the regrets are said philosophically by the surviving member of the quartet. After all, there is little to regret about the good old days when the Macedonia Quartet was in its heyday.

"We all loved to sing...and we were so happy doing it," Smith summed up.

Smith, who retired as a rural mail carrier from the Monett Post Office, now lives on his Shannon Springs Ranch near Stark City.

Rev. Fred McPhail was a Baptist minister and was pastor of the Aurora Baptist Church at the time of his death on February 8, 1966. Rev. Calvin Henderson had served as pastor of Methodist churches in this county for over 40 years before his death on January 3, 1968. Judge Floyd Inman made his home in Cassville before his death some twenty years

In 1926, Rev. Henderson, who lived in the Purdy community at the time, was elected Recorder of Deeds of Barry County and served in that position four years. In 1946 and again in 1950, he served as County Treasurer of Barry County.

At the same election in 1926, Inman was elected County Treasurer and served a four year term. Then in 1941, he was appointed Presiding Judge of the County Court on the death of Judge Fred Cole. Inman was elected to two four-year terms in 1942 and 1946, retiring in 1950. For many years he continued to live in the Macedonia community where he served as choir leader at the church until his death in February of 1961. He taught "singing schools" over the county during the 1930s and 1940s.

Smith concluded his memories of the group, "I shall cherish the memory of these fine men and our association together over the years...some day I expect to meet them again and perhaps sing a few number with the heavenly choir for our Lord."

There's a lot of people in this area who hope to be in the audience that fair day.


