Seligman water tower to be demolished

The skyline in Seligman will soon change with the demolition of the water tower that was erected in 1959. Seligman's mayor, Jerry Montgomery, stated that the water tower has not been in commission since 1999, when it was replaced by a 64 foot tall, 320,000 gallon stand pipe.

The water tower held 25,000 gallons of water and stands 104 feet and six and a half inches tall.

SK man sentenced to 20 years

A man who pleaded guilty to involuntary manslaughter in March has been sentenced to twenty years in prison.

Barry County prosecutor Johnnie Cox says Kulhanek was drunk when he turned his truck into the path of motorcyclist Aaron Poston on Highway 39 last July.

According to the probable cause statement, "Kulhanek told Trooper Kyle Knight that he had "a couple of drinks, not that many" before getting behind the wheel. When Knight attempted to have Kulhanek perform a series of field sobriety tests the man could "barley walk and needed assistance from three officers to stand." A warrant had to be issued so authorities could have Kulhanek's blood drawn to be tested after he refused to voluntarily provide samples.


Kulhanek, who was charged as a prior and persistent offender, also pleaded guilty to charges of leaving the scene of an accident and resisting arrest. He was sentenced to 4 years in prison on each of those convictions, which will be served concurrently (at the same time) as the 20 year sentence.

"This water tower is old and we hope to eventually replace it with something that holds far more than 25,000 gallons," stated Mayor Montgomery.

On May 14, the City of Seligman accepted a bid from Iseler Demolition, Inc. for \$12,300 to demolition the tower. Iseler's bid was the lowest of three bids.

"We feel that this water tower has been landmark for longtime residents of Seligman. We aren't sure if many people know it is coming down soon and want them to be able to go take pictures by it before it is demolition," said Mayor Montgomery.

The City has not been given a definite demolition date but expect the tower to come down in the next 90 days.



John Q. Hammons passes

Out of college, Hammons began his teaching career teaching students at Cassville's junior high school and was also a basketball coach during his time at Cassville.

Hammons had resided at the Elfindale Manor in Springfield since 2010 and is survived by his wife of 64 years, Juanita K. Hammons.

Larry Gene Taylor Bridge re-opens after extensive repairs

Last September saw the closing of the Shell Knob area bridge to one lane traffic for nine months. The bridge, built in the 1950, has needed considerable repairs to the deck and some of the substructure. In August, Mo-DOT officials conducted two meetings with community leaders to organize the removal of lead paint and worn structural elements from the 60-year-old structure.

On Wednesday, MoDOT engineers, community members, Barry County State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, and Missouri State Senator David Sater met at the south end of the bridge to conduct a ribbon cutting reopening the bridge.

Becky Baltz, District Engineer in charge of Customer Relations located in Springfield, said, "Thank you for partnering with us in planning and completing this project. Thank you for your patience. We know many of you changed your routines and even reduced the number of trips you made across the bridge. And on behalf of our contractors and our MoDOT workers, thank you for your good driving during



Joy Taylor-Moss, widow of State Senator Larry Gene Taylor for whom the bridge has been named, assisted in the ribbon cutting. State Senator David Sater welcomed the group and thanked MoDOT for their performance in completing the extensive repairs to a bridge within budget and on time. Scott Fitzpatrick acknowledged the efforts of MoDOT and emphasized the essential economic needs to the local community that the bridge serves.

Shell Knob depends on Table Rock Lake to fuel its' economy. Larry Gene Taylor Bridge is a major part of Highway 39 access. Becky Baltz, District Engineer, said, "Ease of travel in a tourist area is good for the Barry County economy. However, in the bigger picture, Mo-DOT has 210 other bridges like this one. These are our "major" bridges, each 1,000 feet long or more. Many of them need the same kind of repairs. But because of MoDot's funding shortfalls, it will be harder and harder to find the money we need to repair or replace these bridges."

Local comments range from, "It is great to have our bridge back" to "I have no excuse for being late again!" The mild winter weather helped workers stay on schedule for this project. MoDOT, the Phillips Construction company, and all involved finished the project on time and within budget guidelines.

The Barry County Judicial court and Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox saw several alcohol related court cases this week.

Barnes. Christopher from Pierce City, was charged with a DWI on February 27th after driving while intoxicated on US 60 and Missouri 37. Barnes received Suspended Imposition of Sentence (SIS) unsupervised probation for two years. He must also perform 20 hours of community service, supervised by Ozark Regional Court Services, and must also pay \$383.50 in charges. According to MO Highway Patrol, Haynes was driving a 2000 Honda Shadow motorcycle when he struck a stopped vehicle, driven by Austin Selee, 18, of Selig-

Selee was stopped in traffic attempting to make a left turn when he was struck from behind by Haynes. Haynes was pronounced dead at the scene.

Nomines must participate in a program administered by FSA, be eligible to vote in a county committee election and reside in the local administrative area (LAA) in which the person is a candidate. To become a nominee, eligible individuals must sighn form FSA-669A. The form and more information about county committee elections are available online at: www. fsa.usda.gov/elections.

"In order to have fair representation of the demographics and agricultural interests in the community, I encourage all producers, including women, minority and beginning farmers and ranchers to participate in the nomination and election process," said Blount.





Sobriety checkpoints are a part of the Sheriff's Office efforts to remove intoxicated drivers from Barry County highways and are conducted at various locations which have been found


to experience a higher than normal number of alcoholrelated contacts.

Barry County Courthouse 100 Years: Part X

On the first Saturday in March 1913, one of the Cassville newspapers carried the following announcement: "members of the county court will meet in Cassville today to examine the plans of H.H. Hohenschild for the new \$50,000.00 Barry County courthouse. If the plans meet with their approval, the plans will be adopted and advertisement ordered for bids for the construction of the building.

C.H. Funston, who has been named as superintendent for the court, states that the plans are completed in every detail.

'The building will be fireproof,' said Mr. Funston. 'It will be constructed of reinforced concrete with stone veneering for the outer walls. All floors will be reinforced concrete with a composition covering for the offices. There will absolutely be no wood floors. The roof will be reinforced concrete covered with asphalt. The plans and specifications will call for a building complete in every detail. This successful contractor will furnish all vault doors and electrical fixtures. We realize that \$50,000.00 is the amount to be expended on this building and have arranged plans for a completed building at this figure."

The article continues reporting that many people of

the county have been anxiously awaiting developments of the lettings of the contract for the new courthouse by J.H. Otterman on February 27, but neither has been done as yet. Aside from the fact that many claim Otterman has the right to let a contract as superintendent, it is now claimed that irregularities crept into his last actions. The contract was prepared by C.G. Minnre of Wilberton, Oklahoma, at his bid of \$46,000.00. In his contract, he has 30 days to file a bond for \$90,000.00 while the advertisement stated that bond should be filed on or before 10 days after the contract was let. It is also claimed that the bid was not submitted in the proper form.

The controversy raged back and forth between Judge Montgomery and the two proponents of the Hohenschild agreement, Pat O'Dwyer of Monett and Commissioner Elam of Eagle Rock.

Then on May 3, 1913, one of the Cassville newspapers in big black headlines noted "Court House Contract Awarded". A second headline under the first noted that "Hambley & Hanson of St. Louis are Successful Bidders at \$45,720.00. Are Reliable

The article went on to note that the county court

met Wednesday morning and extended the time of receiving bids for the construction of the courthouse to 2 p.m. and at that hour court met and about 75 taxpayers assembled to learn how such things were done.

After opening the bids, the court held an executive session and found that Hambley & Hanson were the lowest bidders and awarded that firm the contract to build the Barry County courthouse. On their bid, they stated that the building would be completed in 220 working days. Bonds were drawn up and will be signed and made at once.

H.J. Hanson of the firm of Hambley & Hanson, the successful bidders, said after being awarded the contract that they would assemble their machinery and material just as quick as possible. That the structural steel would have to go through the mills and possibly a delay might possibly be incurred, but he thought active operations would be commenced in at least thirty days and the building rushed to completion

This firm comes highly recommended as being thoroughly reliable. They constructed some of the Sanitarium buildings at Mt. Vernon.

of bidders that competed for the coveted prize as all of his acquaintance are first-class gentlemen.

Hambley & Hanson did not bid on any other stone but Barry County, notwithstanding some Carthage stone men gave figures, but the same figures were not given all the bidders from the way the bids read. Barry County has plenty of fine building stone and it is being recognized by the business world. Carthage wants to crush out all competing plants, and their effort was fully displayed here Tuesday and Wednesday.

The estimate made by

Architect Hohenschild on the cost of the county court-house was \$48,000. The bid of the successful contractor was \$2,280 less than the architect,s estimate.

The difference between highest and lowest bids was \$13,070.

Hambley & Hanson, the courthouse contractors, made a surety bond through the Equitable Bond & Surety Co. of St. Louis, by their authorized agent Aubry Landis of this city, in the sum of \$91,440.00, double the contract bid. Barry County retains 20 per cent of the contract bid, amounting to \$9,140, until the completion of the building and after evidence is shown that all bills for material and labor have been paid. This will give Barry County a bond of \$100,580 for the faithful performance of the contract.

Producers must report prevented planting acreage

Brian Blunt, Executive Director of Barry County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA), reminds producers of the requirement to report prevented planting acreage for FSA program eligibility.

Producers must report crop acreage they intended to plant, but due to natural disaster, they were prevented from planting. Prevented planting acreage must be reported on an FSA-576, Notice of Loss, no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting date. For Barry County, the final planting date for corn was May 15th.

If a producer is unable to report the prevented planting acreage within the 15 calendar days following the final planting date, a latefiled report can be submitted. Late-filed reports can only be accepted if a farm visit can be made to assess the eligible disaster condition that prevented the crop from being planted. A measurement service fee will be charged.

Filing an accurate and timely report for all crops and land uses can prevent loss of benefits for a variety of FSA programs, including the Direct and Counter-cyclical Payment (DCP) Program and Marketing Assistance Loans.

FSA announces Conservation reserve program general sign up

Brian Blunt, Executive director of Barry County USDA Farm Service Agency, announced that general sign up for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) begins on May 20, 2013, and will continue through June 14, 2013. During the sign up period, farmers and ranchers may offer eligible land for CRP's competitive general sign up at their county FSA office.

Landowners enrolled in CRP receive annual rental payments and cost-share assistance to establish longterm, resource conserving covers on eligible farmland. enrolled in CRP can be offered during sign up if all eligibility requirements are met. CRP participants with contract expiring this fall can make new contract offers during the sign up period. Contracts awarded during this general sign up will become effective Oct. 1, 2013.

Blount said all CRP offers are evaluated and ranked using an Environmental Benefits Index (EBI) that indicates the environmental benefits of enrolling the land in CRP.

In addition to the general sign up, the continuous CRP program sign up opened May 13, 2013, and remains ongoing.
