Cassville assembly honors area Veterans

Cassville High School held their annual Veterans' Day assembly on Monday. The school saw a large gathering of students, veterans and community members to honor those who have served their country in the armed forces.

A large group of veterans gathered on the floor of the gym in a special section for those being honored. The rest of the gym filled with high schoolers, middle schoolers and others for one of Cassville High's largest assemblies of the year.

Mr. Redmon, CHS principal, welcomed the group as the JROTC Color Guard presented the colors. Lane Mt-

Castle, Mikka Sturgell, Nate Travis and Nakia Zamniak marched into the gym bearing flags.

Cassville's band performed the *Star Spangled Banner*, *Taps* and collaborated with the mass choir on *Armed Forces*, *The Pride of America*, a medley of the individual songs for each branch of the United States military forces. The choir also performed *The American Dream* without band accompaniment.

Two students, Robyn Robbins and Jericca Russell, read their winning essays written for Veterans' Day about what being a veteran means. As Mr. Redmon recognized each of the veterans

with their name, branch of military and length of service, students handed out certificate to each, thanking them for their service to our country.

The assembly also presented the thirteen folds flag ceremony, explaining what each fold of the flag represents. Before the close of the assembly, the folded flag was presented to the parents of Sargeant First Class Sam Lawson, a 2003 Cassville graduate currently serving in an undisclosed location. Art for a heart, raising funds for a transplant

Cody Mabry never wanted to be seen as sick. For most that know him, including his family, the fact that he was born with pulmonary atresia with a hypoplastic right heart is either unknown or a distant memory. The fact that he had four heart surgeries by age six is shocking considering how exuberant Cody is. Cody's brother, Wes, stated, "He has dealt with this his entire life, but if you didn't know about it, you'd never guess."

However, in the past year, Cody's health began to

decline, resulting in a drastic weight loss and a variety of ailments. As he was passed from doctor to doctor and hospital to hospital, they originally thought that it was finally the time for a heart transplant, but as doctors looked, it appeared that bodily stress was causing liver damage, meaning he would possibly need a liver transplant, too.

To compound the issues, Cody lost his Medicaid coverage due to being too healthy to qualify. When the news spread that Cody was facing two transplants, the

community stepped up to lend a helping hand, just as Cody did for so many years when he had to make hospital visits growing up. Wes said, "When he was in Arkansas Children's Hospital, he was the one comforting the other kids. He has the biggest heart."

Cody's family set up a donation page on GiveForward in hopes of getting help with the \$100,000 his transplants would cost. Thanks to Arkansas Children's Hospital and Jewish Barnes in St. Louis, Cody continued to be seen without insurance, but each day meant a larger bill.

Cody's luck seemed to take a turn when Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, along with Cody's doctors, helped him to regain Medicaid coverage, including coverage for some of the costs when he was uninsured.

As doctors evaluated his condition in hopes of putting him on the transplant list, they found the root of Cody's problems for the last year. It was not his heart nor his liver

Sheriff's Dept. gets a new ride for drug busts

The Barry County Sheriff's Department is boasting a new ride thanks to the Department of Defense. The 1991 army surplus Hummer found its new home in Barry County a couple weeks ago following approval from the DOD.

Sheriff Mick Epperly stated, "We got it for the purpose of the eradication of marijuana and patrol of the mark Twain National Forest which we have thousands of

acres in. It also will be useful in times of extreme weather if the road conditions get really bad." The Hummer will be used by the Barry County Sheriff's Department as well as the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force and SWAT team.

Epperly explained that when the Department goes on marijuana busts, they often have to travel through fields and timber, making some vehicles impractical for traversing the questionable

terrain. With the use of the Hummer, not only can law enforcement officers reach the contraband, but they can also transport it in the back of the vehicle without making multiple trips. The vehicle also offers up plenty of room for equipment and supplies, as well.

The Hummer was provided to department free of charge, they just had to travel up to Jefferson City

that was making him so sick. Instead, he was found to have stage 4 Hodgkin's lymphoma. For most, a cancer diagnosis would devastate. Thanks to Cody's strength, stubbornness and drive, he began the first of his chemotherapy treatments the next day. One year ago, Cody was a healthy young man, in love with a girl named Jennifer Jackson, and planning the rest of his life. It was a matter of months before the cascade of health problems set up a roadblock, but Cody isn't quitting, and neither is the

community who knows and loves him. For one local family, the actions of their daughter really spoke of how a community can pull together and step up for another, even when they haven't ever met him. When 9 year-old Zoe LaCaze, of Cassville, started selling her artwork to raise money for Cody, the family never guessed at how rapidly the idea would take off. Zoe has always liked art and drawing. When asked why she decided to sell her artwork for Cody's benefit, she stated, "I just like to draw pictures, and I like to pretend to sell things to my family.

So I thought maybe I'd try to really sell things. My mom suggested that I sell them for Cody, and I thought that was a good idea. So my mom puts my art on Facebook for me." According to her mother, Lindsay LaCaze, "She has always had an entrepreneurial spirit, but has also been very giving. It didn't surprise me that she wanted to do this, but it did surprise me how quickly people bought them. I think they are more willing to give to a cause like Cody's." Zoe's art is priced at 35 cents per piece or best offer. Her highest paid work brought in \$20, but not at her request, that just hap-

pened to what someone was willing to give for it. Most of her art has been sold to family friends and people within her grandfather's church. To date, she has raised over \$100 for the Mabry family's fund. The LaCaze family originally heard of Cody's struggle from his sister-in-law, Niki Mabry. Zoe's art ranges from animals to Bible scenes and more creative pieces. Her favorite to date is a swordfish she did last month. Between 15 and 20 pieces have sold so far, but she doesn't have a set goal for when she will stop. She stated, "I just want to raise as much money for Cody as I can."

Many in the community feel the same pull to give that Zoe does. When the family

set up a GiveForward donation page, over \$8,000 has been donated of the \$100,00 original goal. Medicaid is not going to retroactively cover all of Cody's medical bills during the period he began to decline, so people continue to give and the Mabrys are overwhelmed by the blessings and prayers they have received. Even so, Wes said, "Cody doesn't want any favors, pity or sympathy. He just wants a normal life." Time-lapse video shows Chili Cook-off start to finish

This year at the Chili Cook-Off, Jeremy Huse, local photographer, was hired by the Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce to cover the Chili Cook-Off and make a video that they could play at functions they attend during the year.

While Huse took many photos during the event, he also set up a GoPro camera, a small, innovative camera, on the second story of the Barry County Abstract building on the square. He set the camera up to take a photo every 10 seconds for 7 1/2 hours. At the end of the day, he had over 2,700 photos to put into a video.

The best part about the video is that you can get a better grasp on just how many people shuffle through the Cook-Off each year, a concept hard to understand even if you stay all day at a booth.

When asked why he chose to shoot the Cook-Off in that way, he replied, "It allows you to put a long span of time in photos in a short viewing time." The effect is pretty amazing.

Huse took each of the

individual photos and put them into a video that lasts one minute and 29 seconds. You can watch the vendors set up booths, people gather and disperse and the breakdown at warp-speed.

to retrieve it. They have also received military-grade boots and computers free to the county from the same program.

Epperly stated that they will soon equip the rig with a radio, but aside from a couple of new batteries, the vehicle was ready to go, complete with new tires. "We were lucky we were able to get it to use in our force. We won't drive it every day, but it'll be good to have it ready for when we need it."

New, the vehicle would have cost around \$41,000. Currently, it shows 39,000 miles, but Epperly hasn't received the complete history of the vehicle. Since the condition is so good inside and out, the Sheriff guesses it may have been used in the National Guard.

While the community might not see the impressive, heavy duty Hummer driving around town, Epperly hinted that they may bring it out for parades on occasion.

Mallet-wielding man sentenced

A resident of Barry County received two years unsupervised probation after hitting another man with a hard rubber mallet before the victim overtook him and held him until officers arrived.

Deputy Kevin Myers arrested Gavin Cody Mease after a statement was given by the victim and a witness of an altercation. On February 24, 2013, Mease attacked the victim and struck him three times on the back of his head with a 16 ounce hard rubber mallet causing contusions, bruising and swelling to the head of the victim.

The victim was eventually able to gain control over Mease and hold him down on the floor until police arrived on the scene and arrested him.

Mease had no prior criminal history on file and was put on 24-hour-hold until February 25, 2013.

who felt the measure excessive and that money could be moved and appropriated from other places.

Alderman Jan Anthony stood in strong support of Heinz's measure, stating, "We are only talking 38 cents for every \$100. It's nothing." She also expressed that she has heard the community voice concerns about their roads and the condition they are in. While the aldermen seemed to agree that road work needs to be completed, there was no consensus about the best way to allocate funds.

Cassville citizens will vote on the resolution on the April ballot. The tax would fund transportation efforts in the City of Cassville and also allow the City to use funds to pay off a bond should major work need to be completed.

Slight revenue increase for Cassville

Cassville's sales tax revenue saw a slight 2.4 percent for October over last year. This year, the City received \$124,968.18 whereas last year they only received \$122,013.17 in October.

The City is still down for the year by about 1.1 percent. This time last year the City had \$372,168.92 and this year the total is \$368,165.92 for the year-to-date.

Book featuring RRSP planning update

Exploring Missouri's Legacy: State Parks and Historic Sites was originally published in 1992. The book, featuring Barry County's own Roaring River State Park, showcases various parks and historic sites around the state.

For a number of years it was apparent that the book needed an update. Some of the essays within the book were written as early as 1984. In almost thirty years many things have changed, including the addition of eleven state parks.


The Missouri Parks Association is pairing with Missouri Life Media to update the book in an effort to reflect the changes that have taken place. Like the original edition, the book will contain and essay on photographs of each park or historic site.

However, the book will be an additional 50 pages, making it 400 pages with 200 full-color, large format photographs. The new edition will be written by five life-long conservationists who, along with photographers will capture the history and beauty of the Missouri State Park system.

Many state park and historic sites were preserved to help reflect the unique nature and cultural value of the state and ensure that it is available for younger generations.

In order to update the book that serves as a guide to teaching about what parks Missouri has to offer, the project is seeking pledges. The project's goal is \$25,000 to cover the costs of the update. Currently, their donation page has received just over \$3,200.

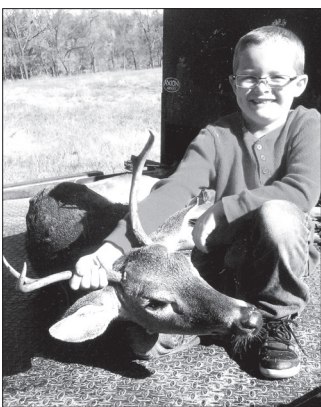
A local man arrested and charged with trespassing in the first degree after kicking in an apartment door last year had his day in court, receiving probation for his crime.

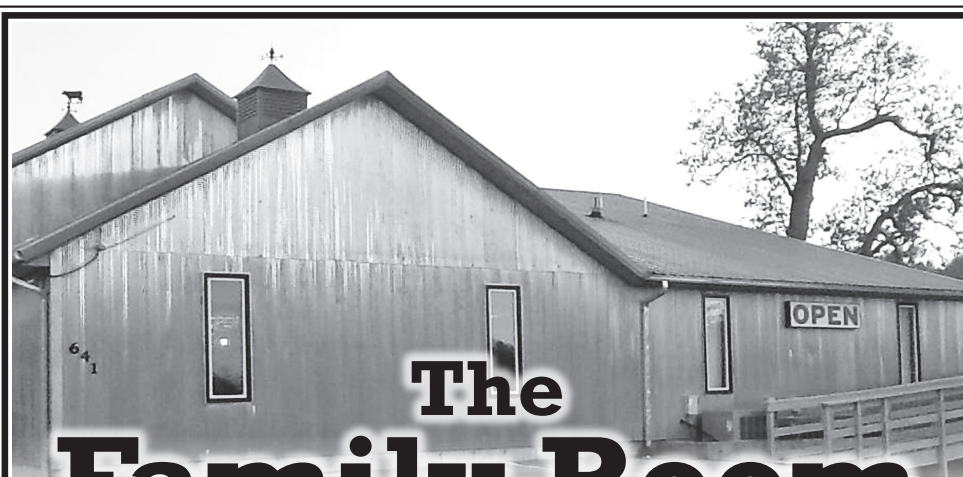

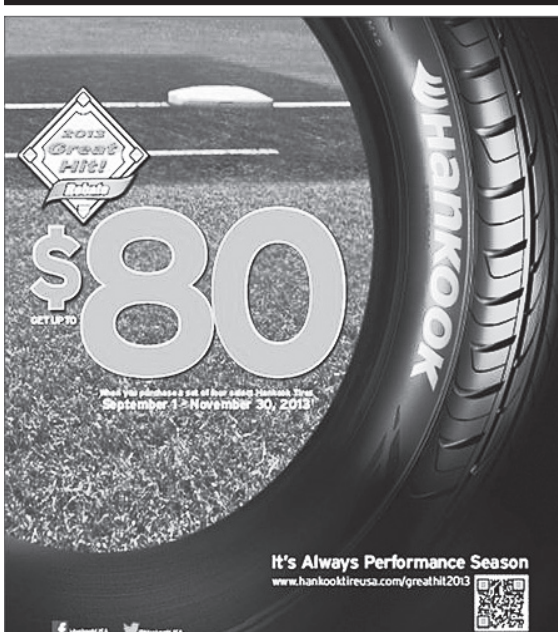

Museum book signing, Christmas showcase

Each time the Barry County museum publishes another book in their *Lifetimes of Memories: Voices of Barry County* series, they gather the narrators of each volume at the Museum to sign books at the first opportunity the public has to purchase their copy. This year, the book signing falls on the same day at the Museum opens their Fifth Annual Christmas Showcase.

In 2005, Schrediah Mahurin, oral history coordinator, began interviewing longtime Barry County residents for the series. Residents shared their memories of life in the region and each story was transcribed for print.

This November 22 marks the release of the 19th volume of the series, featuring the stories of Bill and Adella (Gowen) Horner, brothers Leo and Kenneth Patton, and John and Betty (Baker) Seely.

The first volume was printed in October 2007. Each book contains three to five stories depending on length of each narrative. The books each sell for \$9.95 and goes to fund the operation of the museum.

Kathy White, museum director, shared how the Christmas Showcase began. The first year the museum opened, the museum staff worked tirelessly to decorate the museum for the special holiday season. White stated, "The first year we decorated for Christmas, it was just too much. We just didn't have the manpower and hours to put into it. It was a very, very large undertaking for the staff."

The museum tried a couple of other methods before figuring out the best way to bring the festivities of the season to their displays without exhausting staff and volunteers. In 2009, the first Christmas Showcase opened for a variety of local, home-based businesses.

Local home-based businesses can decorate a showcase with their wares for the holidays at the museum free of charge. From November 22 until January 1, museum patrons vote for the showcase they think is the best.

Business displays range from handmade hats, candles and wreaths to popular individually-sold brands like Thirty-One and Origami Owl.

However, it isn't just businesses that can set up displays. Museum volunteers also offer up their collections this time of year to show the public. Some volunteers showcase their collections of vintage Christmas decorations, ornaments and bells.

After January 1, the museum will count votes and award each of the individual and business with the most votes with their prizes. This year, each winner will receive a rechargeable SHO-ME light.

White emphasized that by allowing home-based businesses to get their name out to the public through free advertising, it can jump start their exposure in the community. She stated, "We try to help get their business off the ground and show them to the public." For a few businesses, that meant the differ-

ence between selling things on the side and needing to dedicate full time hours to their home-based business.

Narrators for the 19th volume of *Lifetimes of Memories* will be available for autographs on Friday, November 22, from 3 p.m. until 5 p.m. For more information, contact the Barry County Museum at (417) 847-1640.

Rt. 39 bridge night work to begin Nov. 20

Drivers in Shell Knob or travelling through will need to arrange for a possible delay should they need to cross over Table Rock Lake on Highway 39 November 20 through 22. From 6 p.m. until 6 a.m. on that Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, crews will be using a diamond-grinding machine to grind down the top layer of the concrete on the bridge deck where ridges were responsible for the roughness of the pavement since the work on the bridge before Memorial Day this year.

Construction that replaced the bridge deck created congestion and delays, as well as a narrowed lane preventing some trailers from crossing the lake, was completed earlier this year. By grinding down the pavement, the life of the bridge deck will be extended, according to MoDOT's South-

west District.

The smoother ride will reduce the impact of vehicles on the concrete joints, making them more stable for a longer span of time. Penhall Company, of Anaheim, California, is the prime contractor for the construction that will cost \$40,000.

The schedule of work may be affected for bad weather or unexpected construction delays.

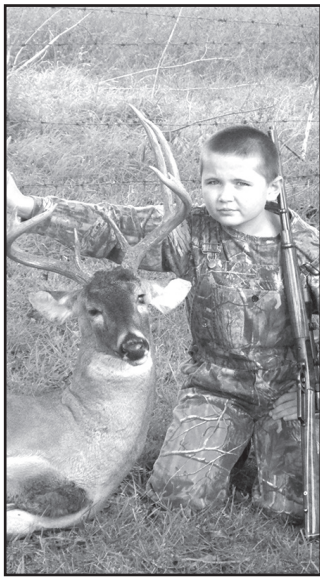

A Veterans' Day essay: The Real Superheroes



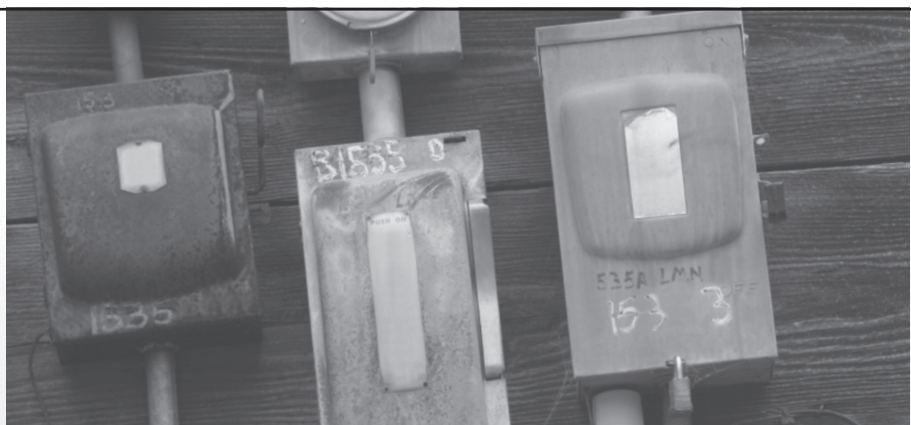
