Silver Leaf Benefit Club celebrates 105 years of service

The Barry County Museum bustled with a large group of ladies wearing their finest hats on Tuesday, November 19. The occasion was the 105th anniversary of the General Federal of Women's Clubs Silver Leaf Benefit Club of Cassville.

The club is dedicated to volunteering and service to the community. Founded in 1908, the club's projects over the years have included sending books and magazines to the army camp at Crowder, sponsoring dental and wellness clinics, various community improvement projects, and scholarships.

Today, the group of 19 women is always seeking more members. Jean Marney, president, mused, "When I am asked how they chose the name Silver Leaf, I have always thought it was from the Silver Maple tree, but some of the younger members relate it to the 'older silver haired ladies club." Marney stated the club was never an older women's club, but a club for all ladies.

They initially started as there was a need for women



Public Works strives to make sewer plant more efficient

Charlea Mills For the City of Cassville's Public Works Department, a key element to their job is

161,204 feet (30.53 miles) of gravity sewer lines with 537 manholes. Of those manholes, 85 percent are constructed with brick. The City bought an Aries Camera System in 2011 to aid city staff in its inspection of the sewer system, pinpoint problem areas efficiently, and make

creating issues with groundwater influx.

The Edison Road manhole had been covered with dirt and metal backfill, making finding it difficult with their ground-level detection device. Four risers had to be installed to bring that particular manhole up to grade, but the savings to the city are worth the effort.

Through the of Public Works, the city stands to buyback Wastewater Treatment Plant capacity over the years by repairing the cause of infiltration and inflow to the sewer system and keeping that storm water out of the water treatment process. The city employees continue to inspect

Sen. Sater a Champion for Children

Cassville's State Senator David Sater received the Missouri Coalition of Children's Agencies' (MCCA) 2013 Champion for Children Award for this work in the Missouri General Assembly on behalf of Missouri's children.

Sater sponsored and passed Senate Bill 205 this year, which gives every child

cared for by the state a visit to a state university or a military recruiter. The bill also extends the age that a child may willingly re-enter foster care from 18 to 21. The bill was signed by the governor in June.

"I am honored and humbled to receive this award," said Sen. Sater. "In Missouri, through education and hard work, we believe that every child can reach his or her greatest potential. This should be true for those young people in foster care as it for any other student. I am proud we were able to make this no-cost investment in our future that will give our state's foster children the tools they need to succeed."

Area arrests for thefts, child endangerment

• Local resident, **Ty Thompson**, is being held in lieu of a \$10,000 bond in the Barry County Jail after being charged with tampering and receiving stolen property. The alleged crime took place in Purdy against Enterprise Leasing, headquartered in Waterloo, Iowa.

According to affidavits of probable cause, on October 4, Thompson received a 2012 Toyota Corolla from Tennile Frey in Waterloo valued at \$25,000. Thompson then drove the vehicle to Missouri without permission from Frey. While Thompson was in Missouri, he allegedly dismantled the vehicle and sold all the parts at scrap yards in Barry County. He removed doors, wheels, trunk, the hood and parts of the engine. Thompson had no previous criminal history.

• Earnest Clow was arrested after allegedly stealing thousands of dollars worth of goods from a mini storage located in Butterfield.

On September 30, Clow took approximately \$5,000 worth of Native American Indian collectibles, pictures and furniture, according to affidavits of probable cause. All of the items belonged to Nancy Nunez. Clow then sold the merchandise to Douglas and Ola Brattin in Purdy.

The stolen Native American Indian items were recovered. Clow is currently being held at the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$20,660 bond.

• Christopher and Jamie England, of Washburn, were arrested on November 5 on charges of endangering the welfare of a child. On Monday, August 19, Deputy

Angela Cole with the Barry County Sheriff's Department met with Katie Meek of the Department of Family Services.

Meek told Cole that she had received a call on the child abuse hot line regarding the England family. The witness that called in stated that he encountered many times where the Englands were neglectful and abusive.

The Englands lived with the witness when he noticed that the parents neglected the child by leaving her in a play pen for days without attending to her and letting her cry endlessly. The witness stated that in the time span of two months, the baby was only given a bath maybe four times.

The witness also stated that Christopher England kicked the car seat while the baby was in it because she was crying, causing it to flip over. According to the statement, she also had a bad diaper rash that was not treated.

Cole was informed by Meek that Jamie England has had eight children taken away by the State of Missouri. The Englands were held in the Barry County Jail until posting \$3,500 bonds each.

to play as hard or harder than everyone we play all season. We will continue to work on the little things and grow as a basketball team," said Shore.



Coach Powers expects that confidence to help the









Aurora was the next team to come to Cassville. The Lady Houns had beaten the Wildcats easily in their




"The girls had a great season," Coach Pollreisz said.


"What more could a coach ask for out of their players? They worked hard each and every minute they were on the floor whether it be practice or a game.
