Silver Leaf Benefit Club celebrates 105 years of service

The Barry County Museum bustled with a large group of ladies wearing their finest hats on Tuesday, November 19. The occasion was the 105th anniversary of the General Federal of Women's Clubs Silver Leaf Benefit Club of Cassville.

The club is dedicated to volunteering and service to the community. Founded in 1908, the club's projects over the years have included sending books and magazines to the army camp at Crowder, sponsoring dental and wellness clinics, various community improvement projects, and scholarships.

Today, the group of 19 women is always seeking more members. Jean Marney, president, mused, "When I am asked how they chose the name Silver Leaf, I have always thought it was from the Silver Maple tree, but some of the younger members relate it to the 'older silver haired ladies club.'" Marney stated the club was never an older women's club, but a club for all ladies.

They initially started as there was a need for women

to do something to fill their time because they didn't work outside of the home. However, the demographic has changed. Women of all walks are welcome, and the mission for community service is the same as it was back when they started.

Mayor; and Emory Melton, former State Senator, shared congratulations and sentiments about the importance of the club over the years.

Each of the distinguished speakers commented on the achievements of the club and its importance to the community. Melton concluded, "Frankly, I was a bit shocked that this club is 105 years old."

She leaned in for the first kiss with cheers and laughter from the residents who clearly enjoyed the fundraiser even more than the staff who paid to have each other (and sometimes their bosses) show their affection to the pig.

Eschbach offered his advice before taking his turn with Peek-a-boo, "This is how you're supposed to do it. Woo her first," as he scratched her behind her ears

Public Works strives to make sewer plant more efficient

For the City of Cassville's Public Works Department, a key element to their job is inspecting the city's sanitary sewer system to ensure that it is functioning properly. Over the last few years, it was apparent that water was leaking into the sewer system from manholes in need of repairs.

The way the sewer system of Cassville works is to transmit wastewater to the treatment plant so that it can be treated and reintroduced without harming the environment. Any cracks occurring due to the aging infrastructure of the sewer system mean an extra toll on the lines and also at the Wastewater Treatment Facility. When additional water leaks into the cracks around manholes, that means additional groundwater is having to be processed at the facility unnecessarily.

According to Steve Walensky, director of Public Works, water can infiltrate a typical manhole from .20 to

five gallons of water per minute, potentially adding a lot of excess water to the sewer system. The easiest and most cost-effective means of eliminating that issue is to locate, inspect and repair any manholes needing attention.

The City of Cassville has 161,204 feet (30.53 miles) of gravity sewer lines with 537 manholes. Of those manholes, 85 percent are constructed with brick. The City bought an Aries Camera System in 2011 to aid city staff in its inspection of the sewer system, pinpoint problem areas efficiently, and make repairs where needed.

So far this year, 20 manholes have been rediscovered with the camera system and brought up to grade, the most impressive being a manhole that was located approximately 50 inches deep near Edison Road. Some of the manholes in the city have been unable to be located due to being buried for a number of years, making it difficult to know which were

creating issues with groundwater influx.

The Edison Road manhole had been covered with dirt and metal backfill, making finding it difficult with their ground-level detection device. Four risers had to be installed to bring that particular manhole up to grade, but the savings to the city are worth the effort.

Through the efforts of Public Works, the city stands to buyback Wastewater Treatment Plant capacity over the years by repairing the cause of infiltration and inflow to the sewer system and keeping that storm water out of the water treatment process. The city employees continue to inspect

and repair the manholes and the sewer lines as needed throughout the year.

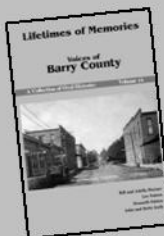

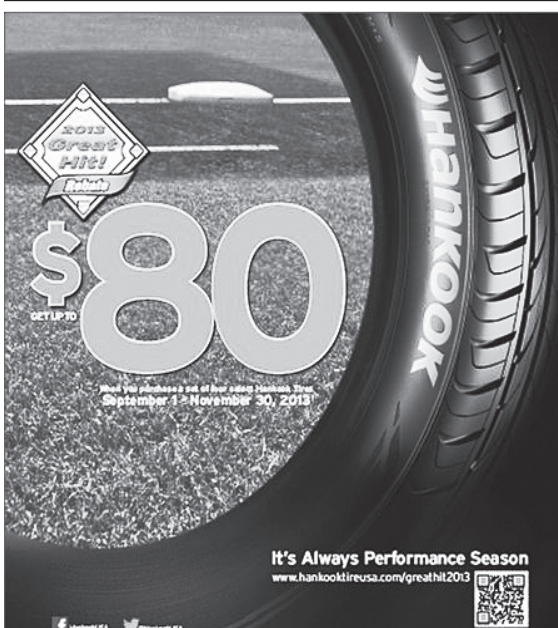

Cassville's State Senator David Sater received the Missouri Coalition of Children's Agencies' (MCCA) 2013 Champion for Children Award for this work in the Missouri General Assembly on behalf of Missouri's children. Sater sponsored and passed Senate Bill 205 this year, which gives every child

cared for by the state a visit to a state university or a military recruiter. The bill also extends the age that a child may willingly re-enter foster care from 18 to 21. The bill was signed by the governor in June. "I am honored and humbled to receive this award," said Sen. Sater. "In Missouri, through education

and hard work, we believe that every child can reach his or her greatest potential. This should be true for those young people in foster care as it for any other student. I am proud we were able to make this no-cost investment in our future that will give our state's foster children the tools they need to succeed."

Area arrests for thefts, child endangerment

Local resident, Ty Thompson, is being held in lieu of a \$10,000 bond in the Barry County Jail after being charged with tampering and receiving stolen property. The alleged crime took place in Purdy against Enterprise Leasing, headquartered in Waterloo, Iowa.

According to affidavits of probable cause, on October 4, Thompson received a 2012 Toyota Corolla from Tenable Frey in Waterloo valued at \$25,000. Thompson then drove the vehicle to Missouri without permission from Frey. While Thompson was in Missouri, he allegedly dismantled the vehicle and sold all the parts at scrap yards in Barry County. He removed doors, wheels, trunk, the hood and parts of the engine. Thompson had no previous criminal history.

Earnest Clow was arrested after allegedly stealing thousands of dollars worth of goods from a mini storage located in Butterfield.

On September 30, Clow took approximately \$5,000 worth of Native American Indian collectibles, pictures and furniture, according to affidavits of probable cause. All of the items belonged to Nancy Nunez. Clow then sold the merchandise to Douglas and Ola Brattin in Purdy.

The stolen Native American Indian items were recovered. Clow is currently being held at the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$20,660 bond.

Christopher and Jamie England, of Washburn, were arrested on November 5 on charges of endangering the welfare of a child. On Monday, August 19, Deputy

Angela Cole with the Barry County Sheriff's Department met with Katie Meek of the Department of Family Services.

Meek told Cole that she had received a call on the child abuse hot line regarding the England family. The witness that called in stated that he encountered many times where the Englands were neglectful and abusive.

The Englands lived with the witness when he noticed that the parents neglected the child by leaving her in a play pen for days without attending to her and letting her cry endlessly. The witness stated that in the time span of two months, the baby was only given a bath maybe four times.

The witness also stated that Christopher England kicked the car seat while the baby was in it because she was crying, causing it to flip over. According to the statement, she also had a bad diaper rash that was not treated.

Cole was informed by Meek that Jamie England has had eight children taken away by the State of Missouri. The Englands were held in the Barry County Jail until posting \$3,500 bonds each.

Coach Powers has noticed his team's chemistry improving over summer workouts as well as during November practices.

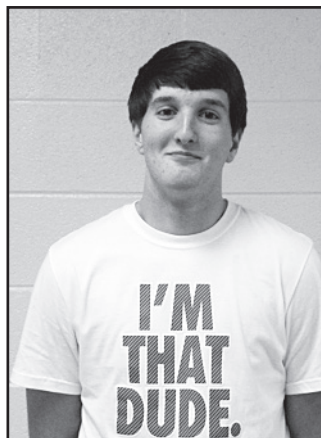
"I believe our strength as a team is how well our players seem to get along. I noticed our team chemistry this summer has been better than in past.

Coach Powers expects that confidence to help the



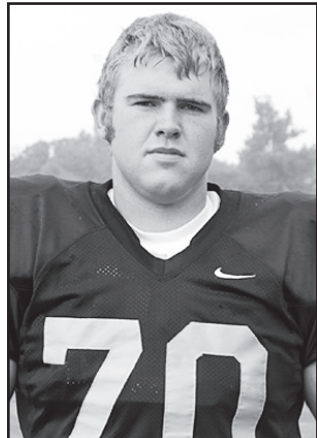
