Season starts for eagles soaring in to Roaring River

As the weather turns cooler, residents in the Ozarks are lucky to have the opportunity to experience watching the bald eagles soar back into the area. Different parks and sites have eagle viewing opportunities in northwest Arkansas and Southwest Missouri, including Roaring River State Park.

For Barry County residents, Roaring River State Park offers monthly guided eagle viewing. Each session begins with a video about bald eagles in Missouri, then participants will venture outdoors to the nature center to watch the bald eagles coming in to roost for the night. They recommend you bring binoculars and warming clothing.

When asked what makes Roaring River such a desirable location for the eagles, Dusty Reid, park superintendant stated, "The wooded terrain, steep hillsides and the proximity to Table Rock Lake and the Washburn Prairie."

The eagle viewing programs began in November 1996 and have been popular ever since. Reid and park staff estimates that six to 15 eagles make Roaring River their winter home each year.

The first eagle watch session is Saturday, December 21, from 3 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. Other sessions will be at the same time on January 18 and February 15. For more information, call (417) 847-2539.

If you are unable to make the viewing sessions, Reid said there are many other opportunities to watch them on your own. Reid stated, "In the morning between 7:30 and 9:30 a.m., visitors can usually spot a few bald eagles sitting in trees above the river through the picnic area. In the afternoon between 4 and 5:30 p.m., the parking area in

campground 3 is a good spot to sit and watch them come into roost on the hillside across the river."

One arrested on drug trafficking charge

One was arrested on Thursday, November 21, on drug trafficking charges following a drug investigation by Monett Police Department

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Detective George Daoud approached a man identified as Tong Yang, of Stella, at 210 North Kyler in Monett. Yang told the officer that he was waiting for the resident to contact him about a possible job offer and that he was self-employed.

Det. Daoud observed Yang's pupils to be constricted and not adjusting to anything. When the detective asked if Yang was on any prescription medications, he answered no, but then changed his answer to yes, referencing muscle relaxers.

Yang did not consent to a vehicle search at first, but then changed his mind while grabbing an item from beside the seat and putting it in his coat pocket before exiting the pickup. Det. Daoud ordered him to place his hands on the side of the vehicle, but Yang reached into his pocket again. The officer grabbed his hand, finding a blue case inside of his pocket.

When Daoud opened the case, it contained four grams of methamphetamine and paraphernalia, including a glass pipe. After searching the vehicle, he discovered an additional 31 grams of methamphetamine, two digital scales and numerous bags for distribution. All samples field-tested positive for meth.

Prosecuting attorney Johnnie Cox charged Yang with class B felony trafficking in the second degree. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$35,000 bond.

BC Health Dept. approves 2014 budget

The Barry County Health Department approved the 2014 budget at their board meeting on Thursday, November 21. The Department expects to see a small profit decrease for the 2014 year

compared to 2013.

For the year, 2013's budget estimated a profit of \$8,893. However, for 2014, it is estimated to only receive \$6,120 profit. The budget for 2013 and 2014 are predominantly the same for both revenue and expenditures save for the cost of medical insurance for employees. Medical insurance is expected to cost an additional \$11,000 for 2014 versus 2013.



Cassville's License **Office contract** up for bid

The Missouri Office of Administration is now management accepting contract bids for the Cassville License Office. Interested individuals and groups must submit their bids to operate the Cassville License Office by December 6.

Prospective bidders had the opportunity to tour the office on Tuesday, November 19, to gain perspective on how a license office is operated.

In fiscal year 2013, more than 43,490 transactions were conducted at the Cassville office, generating \$143,675 in agent processing fees.

The Missouri Department of Revenue oversees 182 license offices which are each operated by independent agents. All of the license offices were put out or bid under the competitive procurement process in 2009. Contracts were awarded for one year with three oneyear renewal options. The move toward a competitive procurement process of the license offices overhauled the way local motor vehicle and driver license offices are awarded and was one of the first actions of Gov. Jay Nixon's administration.

Bids will be evaluated on areas such as expertise of the personnel proposed, methods proposed for performing the services and whether the individual or entity is a not-forprofit, political subdivision, a Missouri Certified Minority Business Enterprise)MBA), a Women Business Enterprise (WBE) or a Missouri Service-Disabled Veteran Enterprise.


Toys for Tots donations needed in BC



New 4-H club comes to Purdy

A new 4-H club is forming in Purdy. Their first meeting was November 19. Nathan Witt has volunteered as the community leader.

As the largest out-of-school youth organization in the world, 4-H is open to all boys and girls ages 5 to 18. Children who are five to seven years old (by Jan. 1, 2014) are eligible for 4-H Clover Kids, an introductory program.

Youths who are 8 to 18 years of age (by Jan 1, 2014) can select from a variety of 4-H projects and activities that encourage social and life skills in areas such as decision making, communication, social interaction, civic responsibility and physical skills.

Parents and child work in partnership to create learning opportunities through 4-H projects, project leaders and members. 4-H creates a unique opportunity for youth to explore mastery in their project areas by being able to enroll in the same project yearafter-year, which allows youth to get a deep understanding of their area of interest.

There are opportunities for adults to volunteer and for parents to be involved with the 4-H program.

"You do not have to live on a farm to join 4-H," said Jeremy Elliott-Engel, 4-H youth development specialist with University of Missouri Extension. "Project opportunities include computers, robotics, foods and nutrition, horticulture, large and small animals and much more. Agriculture projects continues to have strong enrollment for members in Barry County 4-H with many of the top projects being in the livestock areas, like beef, market goats and poultry."

New in Barry County this year is the Shooting Sports project. Leaders are certified in Smallbore Rife (.22 caliber) and will start practicing in early spring. Youth are trained in gun safety and precision shooting skills. Competitions happen at the county, state, regional and national levels.

"We know that active youth enrolled in 4-H are more likely to go to and successfully complete college education, and are more likely to return and contribute positively to their home communities," said Elliott-Engel.

Missouri 4-H is University of Missouri Extension's youth development program. The program is designed to help to create opportunities for young people to be valued, contributing members of their commu-



Of the 135 teens that died in a car crash on Missouri roads last year, only 22% were wearing their seat belt. It is the hands down, number one safest way to protect yourself in a car."

After the initial check, Computer Applications students did research on the importance of buckling up and created flyers that were posted around the high school.
