Roaring River WOWs crowd

The Wonders of Wildlife (WOW) held their National Outdoor Recreation and Conservation School this past weekend at Roaring River State Park. The event took place October 11 through 13 with a half-day on Friday and two full days on Saturday and Sunday.

This is the organization's 17th year holding the events, and its 16th year at Roaring River. The event hosted over 200 participants in the 60 plus classes available.

“It was a great weekend with great weather. The rain all stopped before any of the classes took place,” Misty Mitchell from WOW stated. “We offered everything from black smithing to kayaking.”

Participants in the school

paid \$60 per person, which allowed them to try out new skills without having to worry about all the expenses affiliated with the class. The students also received a t-shirt and were invited to a fish fry dinner on Saturday night.

Many of the National Outdoor Recreation and Conservation teachers come from all over the state. Teachers came from state parks, Bass Pro and other individuals as volunteers. “Many people who have been participating in the Wildlife Schools for the past 15 years have now learned enough about the particular skill to become instructors,” stated Mitchell.

Dr. Larry Quinalty has been an instructor at the

WOW events for approximately 12 years. Dr. Quinalty teaches an array of dutch oven cooking classes as he's

spent 20 years perfecting his skill. “I enjoy being an instructor, because I get to build confidence in the par-

ticipants so they can dutch oven cook on their own, while camping or at their

Tip leads to two arrests for meth lab

Two were arrested on Friday, October 4, for allegedly cooking methamphetamine near Seligman in a family member's home.

The Seligman Police Department received information that methamphetamine was being manufactured in a residence on Westview Road outside of Seligman in Barry County. The Seligman Police passed the information to the Barry County Sheriff's Office and the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force.

Agent John Luckey, SWMO Drug Task Force and Barry County Deputy Justin Ruark went to the home to conduct a knock and talk investigation.

Debbie Oplinger, the tenant who rents the property with some of her family, was unloading her vehicle when officers arrived. Officers heard movement inside and saw two subjects running from the trailer to the woods line.

The two, later identified as Shawn Marie Short and Jessie Oplinger, were ordered to stop. Jessie was carrying a red bag containing what officers identified as the components to make methamphetamine by the shake and bake method.

The bag, carried by Jessie, contained a shake and bake bottle with granular residue, lye, a pill grinder, plastic tubing and other paraphernalia. Short's purse contained a baggie of crystalline substance that field tested positive for

methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia.

Debbie Oplinger stated that Jessie and David Oplinger (her grandchildren) occupied a center bedroom in the trailer. Inside the room was methamphetamine paraphernalia, lithium batteries, a 2-liter bottle with solvent, propane torch and aluminum foil with burned residue.

A search of the premises also yielded a hydrogen chloride gas generator made from a plastic bottle, one gallon of muriatic acid, a Pyrex dish with white residue and lithium battery remnants.

Both Short and Oplinger are being held on \$25,000 bonds in the Barry County Jail.

Council tables tax hike proposal

At the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday, October 14, the group tabled a resolution that would put a sales tax rate hike up for voting on the April 2014 ballot.

Resolution 2013-284, proposed by Alderman Terry Heinz, would add a ballot measure in April of a city sales tax increase of 3/8 cent to build a fund for street improvements within the city. Heinz argued that there is no current budget in place for street resurfacing. He went on to state that the current funding can only repair minor issues, like pot holes, but does not leave enough to complete major resurfacing projects.

As it stands, the City of Cassville receives around \$110,000 from the state to do road maintenance and repairs. However, over \$61,000 goes just to pay the salaries of the employees in the department. Around \$85,000 from the general fund is supposed to be directed to road work

since the Walmart debt has been paid down, a payment that was around \$65,000 annually.

During the discussion of proposing such a ballot measure, Alderman Ann Hennigan suggested that the additional \$65,000 the city has in the general fund that is no longer going to debt repayment be sent to road work. Heinz responded, “That is still only patchwork on the roads, not major repairs.”

Hennigan went on to state, “We need to look at the current budget and stick with it.” She also said she was more concerned with other more pressing issues, like the sewer system upgrades and other problems in the city.

Heinz stated that the budget has never included roads as part of it, and that needs to change in the future. Heinz said, “This would be a big step in making Cassville a better place to live, work and play.” He continued that the roads leave a big first impression to people visiting the

area whether that be good or bad.

Alderman Darrel Ledenham made a motion to table the discussion, suggesting the council members wait to hear from community members before making a decision to put it on the ballot for April. Hennigan seconded the motion, successfully tabling the discussion until next month's meeting.

If the council moves to pass Resolution 2013-284, a ballot measure will be added to April 2014's election. The deadline for the resolution to be included for a vote is the third week in January.

Heinz stated that the proposed 3/8 cent sales tax increase would generate \$300,000 in sales tax revenue annually to improve roadways in the city of Cassville. The current city sales tax is two cents on the dollar: one cent for the general fund, a half-cent capital improvement tax and a half-cent parks and storm water tax.

Cassville fall clean up Oct. 21-25

The City of Cassville's annual fall clean-up will be held October 21 through October 25. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills, patio furniture, outdoor furniture, sofas, dressers, loveseats, recliners, desks, televisions, bundled

guttering and beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs.

Wood pallets, waste from small remodeling or wood projects, and other materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked, sinks, toilets, cabinets, vanities, carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled, fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents

set at their curb side large appliances for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee to Republic Services in order to schedule the pick-up of the appliance. The following large appliances will be accepted after the \$15 fee has been paid: dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters, and stoves. Republic Services will also accept refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners that display a tag from a licensed technician proving that all freon has been removed from the item.

Yard waste will be accepted as normal at the Yard Waste facility behind the Cassville Aquatic Park.

Churches step up for Kindness

It isn’t too often that a Baptist church, a Methodist church and an Episcopalian get together for a big event together. It might seem like the lead-in to a joke. However, Pastor James Weaver, of First Baptist Church in Cassville, had an idea that would do just that, no jokes, and he brought the idea to the Cassville Ministerial Alliance.

On Sunday, October 20, many area churches are getting together for an event that they hope to be an annual event. Kindness in Action will be a day for the church members to band together to serve the community through their actions. Weaver stated, “Our community needs to see churches come together across denominational lines in the name of Jesus Christ.”

The goal of the event is for participants to demonstrate the love and principles of Jesus by going out into the community and volunteering to help with a variety of projects.

Weaver’s hometown in

Oklahoma had a similar event. Then, when he saw a news story on two baptist churches doing a collaborative effort in Bolivar, the wheels started turning for more group efforts in Cassville.

He suggested the concept of the churches getting together to United Methodist pastor Andy Lambell, then the Ministerial Alliance. Weaver stated, “There ought to be more that we can do together as churches.”

When Lambell was asked why his church decided to participate, he stated, “We feel like we need to show God’s love to our community and that disciples of Christ can work together for a greater purpose.”

The first nontraditional event with the group of churches was the Back to School Block Party held in August of this year. In 45 minutes, the group passed out over \$1,000 worth of school supplies in about an hour. “We want to demonstrate the love and kindness of Jesus Christ in the com-

munity. No strings attached. I hope that this will become an annual event for us,” explained Weaver.

This year, the First Christian Church, Nazarene Church, Cassville United Methodist, Spiritual Streams, St. Thomas A’Becket Episcopal, Emmanuel Baptist, First Baptist of Cassville, and The Point of Cassville are all meeting on October 20 to step out into the community and perform random acts of kindness.

The churches will be meeting at the American Legion grounds at 10:30 a.m. to receive their project assignments. The volunteers will then meet back at the grounds at 2 p.m. for lunch and a closing gathering of worship at 3 p.m.

Some of the acts of kindness will include providing full-service gas service to the community with pumping gas, cleaning windshields and checking tire pressure at area filling stations, doing painting and repairs for select individuals, work for the schools, clean up of the Greenways trails and yard work for those unable to do it themselves. Some will be checking furnace filters and smoke detectors in senior housing and sitting with people in nursing homes

who may not receive regular visitors.

Weaver stressed that this was not going an helping those in the church families but to the whole community. The churches are not seeking projects suggestions for Sunday, but they welcome any additional volunteers from the community who want to help in their efforts.

If you would like to help out, you do not need to be a church member to assist. To help, contact First Baptist Church of Cassville if you would like a t-shirt and lunch the day of the event. If you don’t care to eat or need a shirt, you’re welcome to just show up the day of and volunteer your talents to the drive.

To date, over 400 people have signed up to volunteer with the group. The entire project is an effort to build rapport with the community and work in service on a day when, normally, people would be listening to a sermon about Jesus, they are taking action and stepping out to help those in need in the spirit of him.

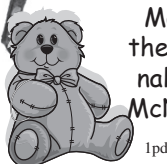

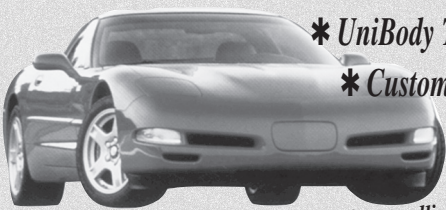

The Southwest Trap Team is one of the top ten teams in the nation. Their success is due largely to support the team receives from community businesses in furthering the sport.

This year, sponsors are hosting the Southwest Trap Team Turkey Shoot. The event will hold three major shooting events: the poker shoot, pattern shoot and a clay shoot.

The poker shoot, an event where a person shoots five cards on a target to select their hand, will have ten people per round. The top hand in each run will win a free turkey. The top hand of the day will win one of two Mossberg 702 plinkster 22Lrs. The top five will shoot again with the winner receiving the other gun.

The pattern shoot will allow one shot from 75 feet with the closest single pellet on the target winning a turkey from each group.

The day will also hold a silent auction, concessions and an inflatable BB gun range provided by Daisy.

For the event, bring a 12 gauge shotgun, and all shells

will be provided. Guns will be on hand for those who cannot bring their own.

Terry Burgess, sponsor of the event, stated, "We want to keep the sport going and allow for kids who can't afford it to participate if they want to." The Southwest Trap Team does not receive any funds from the school district and is run entirely on donations and fundraising efforts.

The trapshooting program began in 2001 under the coaching of Kevin Jackson. The current coach, Mike Vining, took over midway through 2002 and has coached the team since.

Under Vining's direction, the team has won multiple competitions, including the National Championship in the AIM (Academics, Integrity Marksmanship program) in 2009.

Two members of the Southwest Trap Team, Alan Treadwell and Goldie Pippin, have made it to Olympic-level competition thanks to the training from the team. Drew Nickols, Lindsay Hutson and Brittany Wright were all invited to attend the Olympic Development Camp in Colorado Springs. Assistant coach

Rick Wright also attended as a coach.

The trap shooting season begins in January, with the team planning to compete in the Missouri Winter Games, the SCTP (Scholastic Clay Target Program) State Shoot and the SCTP National Championships.

Coach Vining stated, "I believed then [when I took over as coach], as I do now, that the trap shooting program gave our students, who maybe were not so much interested in the mainstream, interscholastic activities, an opportunity to represent their school and community."

Last season, the team had 25 shooters ranging from fourth grade through seniors. Kids can participate in elementary, middle school and high school on the team.

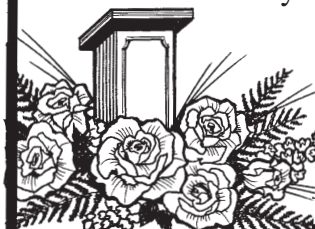

Fire breaks out at Seven Valleys Realty Man charged with theft, forgery over mowers

Flames broke out in an interior room in the Seven Valleys Realty office on Highway 112 in Cassville on Wednesday, October 16.

The Cassville Fire Department were out to extinguish the flames around noon after receiving a call that smoke was coming out of the build-

ing.

The Seven Valleys Realty office is owned by Stormy Pierpont, a realtor. Police and firefighters blocked off the highway for an amount of time to give firefighters access to a hydrant and run a hose to fight the fire. Traffic was redirected from the highway through the Ameri-

can Legion grounds.

According to Millard Andrews, Cassville Fire Chief, the fire was confined to a small room within the building. He stated that the firefighters extinguished it, but there was heavy water and smoke damage to the building. No cause was released at the time of interview.

Samantha Barberio

David Gibson, age 34, from Monett, was charged with a class C felony stealing. On July 5, Monett Officers were dispatched to the Race Brothers Home and Farm Supply, regarding a forgery and felony theft that had occurred on June 14, 2013.

The female suspected of the crime entered Race Brothers and purchased a new Husqvarna zero turn lawn mower worth \$2,599.95, with a check in the name of Kathryn Goldberg. After she purchased the lawn mower, a male suspect, later identified as Gibson, loaded the purchase in the back of a pickup at Herds' Truck Stop located next to Race Brothers. It was

later discovered that the suspect was not Kathryn Goldberg and they did not have any permission to pass her check.

On July 5, Gibson returned to the store and was then identified by employees. On June 18, a female entered Race Brothers purchasing a new Cub Cadet Zero turn lawn mower worth \$2,699, and other items. To pay for the items the suspect passed a check in the name of Tawanna Mahone. A male suspect was waiting in the

parking lot to assist with the purchased items.

Officer David Haskins met with Gibson in Verona four days later. Gibson stated at the time that he had not loaded or hauled any lawn mowers from Race Brothers. On that day, Officer Haskins stated that Gibson was seen driving the same red truck identified at the scene by employees.

Gibson is currently in jail until defendant is able to post the bond of \$25,000.

Meth shopping trip results in two arrests

Two were arrested on Friday, October 11, following two calls that the suspects were purchasing materials used in the manufacture of methamphetamine.

said she did not have a prescription for.

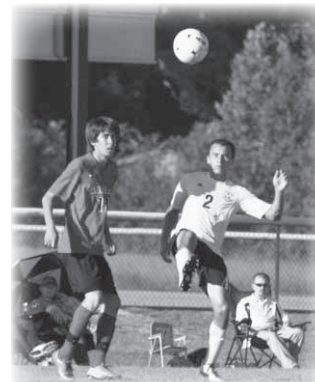
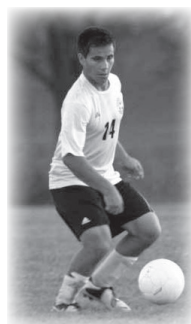

4-H Alumni needed

4-H members are less

likely than their non-4-H peers to participate in risky behaviors and are more likely to go to college and return to their local communities, according to a study done by Tufts University.

Missouri 4-H is University of Missouri Extension's youth development program. The program is designed to help to create opportunities for young people to be valued, contributing members of their community.

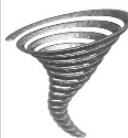

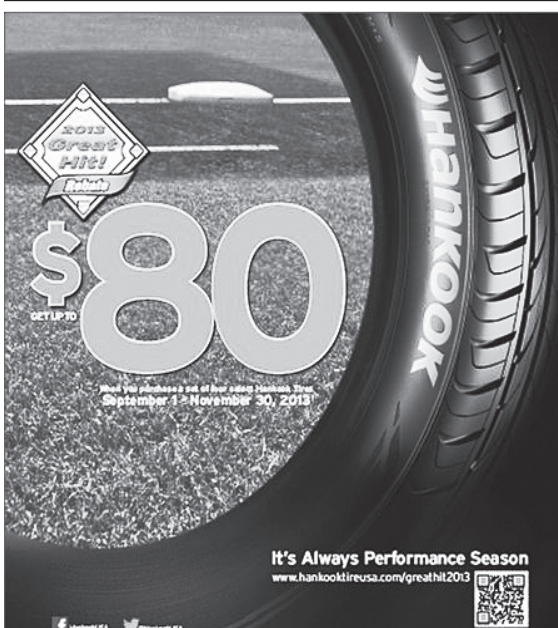
