Tip leads to two arrests for meth lab

Two were arrested on Friday, October 4, for allegedly cooking methamphetamine near Seligman in a family member's home.

The Seligman Police Department received information that methamphetamine was being manufactured in a residence on Westview Road outside of Seligman in Barry County. The Seligman Police passed the information to the Barry County Sheriff's Office and the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force.

Agent John Luckey, SWMO Drug Task Force and Barry County Deputy Justin Ruark went to the home to conduct a knock and talk investigation.

Debbie Oplinger, the tenant who rents the property with some of her family, was unloading her vehicle when officers arrived. Officers heard movement inside and saw two subjects running from the trailer to the woods

The two, later identified as Shawn Marie Short and Jessie Oplinger, were ordered to stop. Jessie was carrying a red bag containing what officers identified as the components to make methamphetamine by the shake and bake method.

The bag, carried by Jessie, contained a shake and bake bottle with granular residue, lye, a pill grinder, plastic tubing and other paraphernalia. Short's purse contained a baggie of crystalline substance that field tested positive for

methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia.

Debbie Oplinger stated that Jessie and David Oplinger (her grandchildren) occupied a center bedroom in the trailer. Inside the room was methamphetamine paraphernalia, lithium batteries, a 2-liter bottle with solvent, propane torch and aluminum foil with burned residue.

A search of the premises also yielded a hydrogen chloride gas generator made from a plastic bottle, one gallon of muriatic acid, a Pyrex dish with white residue and lithium battery remnants.

Council tables tax hike proposal

At the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday, October 14, the group tabled a resolution that would put a sales tax rate hike up for voting on the April 2014 ballot.

Resolution 2013-284, proposed by Alderman Terry Heinz, would add a ballot measure in April of a city sales tax increase of 3/8 cent to build a fund for street improvements within the city. Heinz argued that there is no current budget in place for street resurfacing. He went on to state that the current funding can only repair minor issues, like pot holes, but does not leave enough to complete major resurfacing projects.

As it stands, the City of Cassville receives around \$110,000 from the state to do road maintenance and repairs. However, over \$61,000 goes just to pay the salaries of the employees in the department. Around \$85,000 from the general fund is supposed to be directed to road work

since the Walmart debt has been paid down, a payment that was around \$65,000 an-

During the discussion of proposing such a ballot measure, Alderman Ann Hennigan suggested that the additional \$65,000 the city has in the general fund that is no longer going to debt repayment be sent to road work. Heinz responded, "That is still only patchwork on the roads, not major repairs."

Hennigan went on to state, "We need to look at the current budget and stick with it." She also said she was more concerned with other more pressing issues, like the sewer system upgrades and other problems in the city.

Heinz stated that the budget has never included roads as part of it, and that needs to change in the future. Heinz said, "This would be a big step in making Cassville a better place to live, work and play." He continued that the roads leave a big first impression to people visiting the

area whether that be good or

Alderman Darrel Ledenham made a motion to table the discussion, suggesting the council members wait to hear from community members before making a decision to put it on the ballot for April. Hennigan seconded the motion, successfully tabling the discussion until next month's meeting.

If the council moves to pass Resolution 2013-284, a ballot measure will be added to April 2014's election. The deadline for the resolution to be included for a vote is the third week in January.

Heinz stated that the proposed 3/8 cent sales tax increase would generate \$300,000 in sales tax revenue annually to improve roadways in the city of Cassville. The current city sales tax is two cents on the dollar: one cent for the general fund, a half-cent capital improvement tax and a half-cent parks and storm water tax.

Cassville fall clean up Oct. 21-25

The City of Cassville's annual fall clean-up will be held October 21 through October 25. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills, patio furniture, outdoor furniture, sofas, dressers, loveseats, recliners, desks, televisions, bundled

guttering and beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs.

Wood pallets, waste from small remodeling or wood projects, and other materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked, sinks, toilets, cabinets, vanities, carpet that is cut into fourfoot lengths and bundled, fencing that is cut into fourfoot lengths and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents

However, Pastor James Weaver, of First Baptist Church in Cassville, had an idea that would do just that, no jokes, and he brought the idea to the Cassville Ministerial Alliance. On Sunday, October 20,

many area churches are getting together for an event that they hope to be an annual event. Kindness in Action will be a day for the church members to band together to serve the community through their actions. Weaver stated, "Our community needs to see churches come together across denominational lines in the name of Jesus Christ."

The goal of the event is for participants to demonstrate the love and principles of Jesus by going out into the community and volunteering to help with a variety of projects.

Weaver's hometown in

Oklahoma had a similar event. Then, when he saw a news story on two baptist churches doing a collaborative effort in Bolivar, the wheels started turning for more group efforts in Cass-

He suggested the concept of the churches getting together to United Methodist pastor Andy Lambell, then the Ministerial Alliance. Weaver stated, "There ought to be more that we can do together as churches."

When Lambell was asked why his church decided to participate, he stated, "We feel like we need to show God's love to our community and that disciples of Christ can work together for a greater purpose."

The first nontraditional event with the group of churches was the Back to School Block Party held in August of this year. In 45 minutes, the group passed out over \$1,000 worth of school supplies in about an hour. "We want to demonstrate the love and kindness of Jesus Christ in the community. No strings attached. I hope that this will become an annual event for us," explained Weaver.

This year, the First Christian Church, Nazarene Church, Cassville United Methodist, Spiritual Streams, St. Thomas A'Becket Episcopal, Emmanuel Baptist, First Baptist of Cassville, and The Point of Cassville are all meeting on October 20 to step out into the community and perform random acts of kindness.

The churches will be meeting at the American Legion grounds at 10:30 a.m. to receive their project assignments. The volunteers will then meet back at the grounds at 2 p.m. for lunch and a closing gathering of worship at 3 p.m.

Some of the acts of kindness will include providing full-service gas service to the community with pumping gas, cleaning windshields and checking tire pressure at area filling stations, doing painting and repairs for select individuals, work for the schools, clean up of the Greenways trails and yard work for those unable to do it themselves.
