McDonald's opening breaks company record

Since the Cassville McDonald's burned down on March 10 of this year, residents have eagerly anticipated the restaurant's return. Big changes were in store for the restaurant with a total overhaul of the design both inside and out. The community showed up in droves, breaking the owners' company record for most sold on opening day.

McDonald's premiered the new building on Monday, September 30, for a special VIP luncheon. They opened from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. and served free food to the community. Bill Mathews, one of the brothers who owns the local franchise, said they served over \$6,000 worth of food in that short three-hour span.

Mathews stated, "Our people did really well. I've been in this for 40 years, and this is the biggest VIP luncheon we've ever had."

Now, the new McDonald's is open for business. The public was welcomed in beginning at 5 a.m. on Tuesday, October 2, just a bit over six months since the original

building burned down due to an electric fire.

The new store boasts the latest design for the McDonald's chain, a plan that comes from the JBI company out of California. Walking in the doors, it does not feel like the traditional McDonald's of yesterday.

The inner design concept is clean and fresh. Mathews stated, "A lot goes into the interior. It's a very modern and contemporary design. There are no more fiberglass seats in any McDonald's, only upholstered seats. They're a lot more comfortable."

Inside, the large digital menu is displayed above the counter, but the whole look of the counter space is cleaner, with no graphics or clutter. It was designed intentionally that way to aid people in making meal choices without distractions.

Along with a dual-lane drive thru, the building is about 20 percent bigger than the prior space. One noticeable difference is the lack of a play place. McDonald's opted

Marijuana candy found locally

With Halloween and trick-or-treating just around the corner, the last thing parents want to hear about is the possibility of drug-laced candy circulating in the area. Unfortunately, Sheriff Mick Epperly is urging parents to be very careful with what candy their children collect this year, because the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force recently confiscated marijuana-laced candy in the area.

The candy in question came in the form of lemon drops, raspberry jellies, brownies and sweet n sour gummies. However, right on the label, the ingredient list includes the amount of THC, the euphoric chemical in marijuana, that is in each package.

The confiscated package was being shipped through Joplin and headed to an address in Pineville in McDonald County. When carriers became suspicious of the package, the Drug Task Force was brought in. Along with the various candies were also sealed packages of marijuana and hash.

Epperly said that delivery personnel become very

familiar with the areas they work in, and they never deliver to known vacant addresses, such as the one on the recovered package. Delivery staff can also offer tips to law enforcement when they see a package that seems

suspicious.

Epperly said the Drug Task Force recovered the package that originated from Colorado awhile ago, but

Community remembers Flonnie Henry

Flonnie Henry, of Exeter, passed away last Tuesday, September 24, following a car accident. Henry was well-known in the community, having worked for Cassville School, Boatman's Bank and Security Bank.

Henry lived her entire life in the area. She grew up in Washburn and graduated from Southwest High School. Of her three children, the two living still reside in the area.

A member of the Exeter Church of Christ, Henry was actively involved in the community and will be missed by many. Her husband passed away in April of this year.

The family received visitors on Thursday, September 26, to commemorate Flonnie who was 77 when she passed away.

Graveside services were held on Friday, September 27, in the Maplewood Cemetery in Exeter under the direction of Fohn Funeral Home of Cassville. Rick Hendrix conducted the services.

to increase the bathroom size and seating space instead of constructing a play place, which would have added a quarter of a million dollars to the price tag of the new store.

Instead, the dining room offers three digital touch-screen Kidzpace game consoles, free WiFi and multiple electrical outlets to allow patrons to plug in their computers or tablets. Referring to the gaming systems, Mathews stated, “It’s not just entertainment, but also trivia questions for different age levels. It’s pretty cool and educational.”

Making the building more accessible for technology users is a goal for the chain, including the addition of communal tables. Mathews said, “You get to visit with other people at those tables.” The addition of those features turns the space into a comfortable hang-out for customers instead of just a place to eat.

Behind the counter, big changes were also made. Before the fire, the Cassville location had around 60 employees. Now, the business

has 108. Twenty of those were retained from before the fire where some worked for other locations until the new building was ready.

For the employees, the improved break room, equipment and storage is a big advantage. The new store has an automatic beverage system that is hooked into the cash registers’ computers. Instead of an employee picking a cup, getting ice and filling it, the machine does it automatically. A worker only has to put a lid on it.

The fry dispenser works similarly. When a basket is placed underneath, frozen fries are dispensed directly. Mathews said, “By the fries staying frozen up until right

before they go in the fryers, they taste much better.”

No food in the building is cooked by sight, instead the grills and all cooking equipment are timed. That ensures that every item is cooked exactly as it is supposed to be.

Even the storage area got an upgrade. All the shelving units are on tracks and rollers to maximize space. It allows the items in storage to fit neatly together.

Mathews owns 34 McDonald’s restaurants with his brother, Walter. The Cassville location is the only one they own in Missouri, most being located in Arkansas.

The grand opening celebration for the new location will be held on Saturday, October 19. Ronald McDonald will make an appearance with the Hamburglar and Grimace from 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. Happy Meals will be only \$2 each. A grand opening prize will be drawn for at noon. There will also be a live radio remote broadcast with 93.3 FM The Eagle from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m.

they had not released any information on it as they were trying to locate the person the package was addressed to. The name on the package was a nickname, and the residence to which it was addressed was vacant.

Sheriff Epperly stated, “It is legal out there in Colorado, and this is labelled for medical use, but this is the problem Missouri could have with other states legalizing drugs.” It is possible that people in states where marijuana is illegal will try to buy it from states where it is legal, like Colorado and Washington.

The packages of candy varied from 25 mg of THC to 250 mg each. “One of the harms is if a person was using medical marijuana, children could get a hold of it. Marijuana is a gateway to more serious drugs,” the

Sheriff said.

The Sheriff’s Department and the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force are urging parents to always check the labels of any candy their children have access to. The confiscated candy was labelled from an actual business in Denver and Green Cross, Colorado. According to the company’s website, they have locations in Colorado, Washington and California, but little other information is available.

Sheriff Epperly is mostly concerned with getting the word out so that parents know what to look for and can keep their children safe. He stated, “Why we are trying to get this out to the public is that we want to keep the children and grandchildren safe.”

He went on, “Every year come Halloween, we have is-

sues and try to warn parents to choose good neighborhoods to trick-or-treat in. We’ve stopped sex offenders from passing out candy with a law. They need to be aware of what could be out there. Always check the packaging.”

Any candy that is not in a sealed, labelled package should be discarded. Parents should sort through any candy their children collect. This is the first time they have found marijuana-laced candy, and they hope that this is the last of it. However, parents should still be cautious with anything handed to their children.

If the candies fell into children’s hands, it could make them ill. If you suspect your child has ingested any laced-candies, medical professionals say to contact poison control or go to the emergency room.

grandchildren and many great grandchildren and great-great grandchildren.

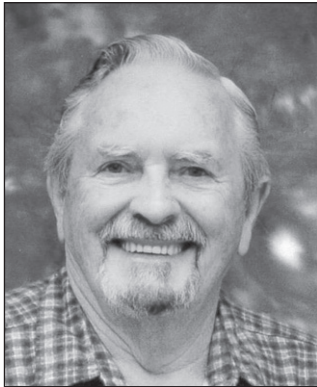
Maynard is preceded in death by his wife, Betty; brothers Edward and Lyle; sister Mildred; and grandson Darrin.

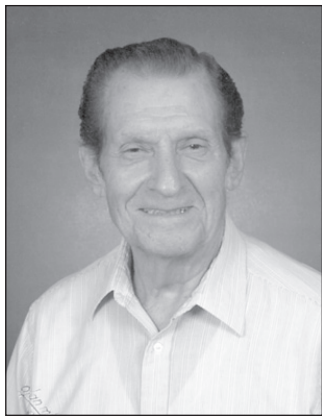

One woman's journey...

One of Just As I Am's clients, Catilya Meshell, knows first hand how helpful the Look Good Feel Better programs are. Meshell was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma in 2009.

Meshell went through radiation and chemotherapy after she was diagnosed. Today, she is cancer-free and has been in remission for four years. However, when she was receiving treatment, the program was instrumental in helping her through the disease.

Meshell lost her hair after her second chemotherapy treatment. She also suffered from the sensitive dry skin caused by the harsh drugs. Look Good Feel Better's workshop did its duty for her. "They make you feel special, like it's just your day. You need that when you're so sick," she stated.

The program helped her learn how to choose and put on a wig and tie scarves to conceal her hair loss. Patients often lose their eyebrows as well, and they are taught how to paint them on. Each participant receives a bag of new cosmetics and skin care and makeup tips from licensed cosmetologists.

Messhell said, "Your body goes through so many changes that you need help." One major component of the program is providing them new products that are clean. Makeup is often dirty after being used for a few months.

Meshell said, "Cleanliness is a big thing. Your immune system is basically bottomed out from the chemo, and your makeup can make you sick." When Meshell found out that her hair stylist was participating in the Sexy Hair Cut-A-Thon, she was excited to support her since she had been through the program.

"Last year, I was proud to support her by getting my hair cut for [the Cut-A-Thon]," she said. Meshell is encouraging everyone to make an appointment to support this cause by visiting Just As I Am on October 21 through 23. "When you're sick and throwing up, you don't get to feel girly, but [Look Good Feel Better] feeds you lunch and helps you feel that way again."

Haunted mill to benefit breast cancer patient

Dee Reynolds, an Exeter/Ridgeley resident for 25 years, was diagnosed with breast cancer seven months ago. Since then, she has undergone a mastectomy as well as rigorous cancer treatments. The whole experience has been a whirlwind for Reynolds who does not have any income or transportation.

She relies on family and friends to take her to her chemotherapy appointments. While her treatment is covered by Medicaid, all of the expenses to get her to treatment have been a burden.

When Clifton Wells found out that Reynolds was battling breast cancer, he felt

the drive to do something for her. Reynolds' son works for Wells, but he had also known her for years.

Wells had participated in breast cancer fundraisers before, but his idea was to benefit Reynolds directly.

Wells and many volunteers have converted the Wheaton Feed Mill into the Wheaton Haunted Feed Mill for five days this October, and all of the proceeds from the haunted experience will go directly to Reynolds to help her during her cancer battle.

Wells stated, "I wanted to do something to help." He arranged to have the owner of the feed mill, currently vacant, allow the building to

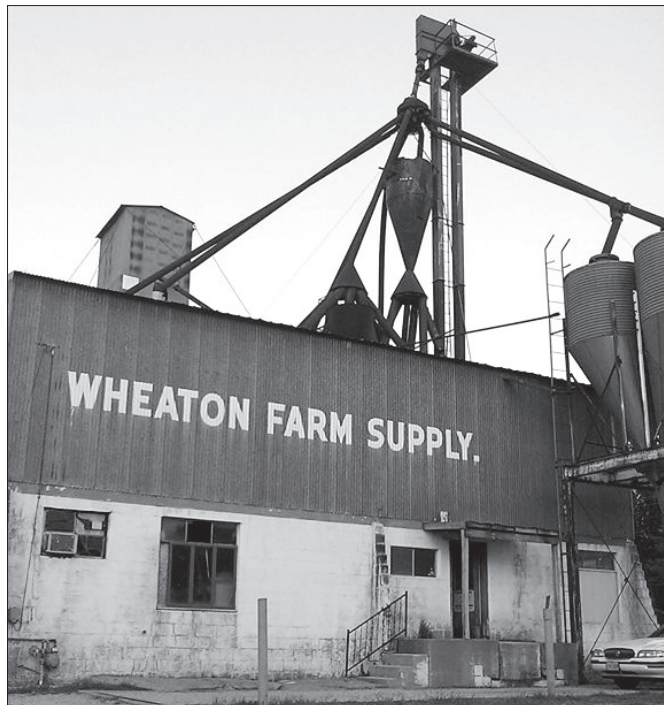

E911 holds board meeting Shakin' Dog Contest winners named

The E911 Center held their Emergency Service Board Meeting on Monday, September 30. The first order of business was the financial report. The total income of the center is predicted to be \$369,012.64 from July 1, 2013, until June 30, 2014. Most of the budgeted income will be from the sales tax revenue.

Board member Steve Gash from Eagle Rock has resigned from the board. Gash recently moved to pursue other job opportunities. There is currently an opening for the southern area position. People are being considered and the decision will be made by next meeting.

The next order of discussion was the Director's Report. Senate Bill 23 was passed last year. The bill places out-of-state sales tax on the registration on automobiles, boats, etc. Sometime after November 2014 and before November 2016, political operations funded by sales tax will be required to place a ballot before the people in order to keep collecting the tax. This may take place individually or by county.

The E911 Center sends staff to additional training when available to keep the staff up to date and learning new skills. The goal for the center is to send everyone to

at least one outside training course. The staff attended APCO training two weeks ago.

The training at the event included: dealing with mentally ill callers, customer service, critical information from child callers, using degrees and minutes and seconds/mapping and staying motivated. "The staff is looking forward to upcoming training," stated Mike Phillips, executive director of E911.

The City of Butterfield has now been completely mapped and added to dispatch. Conservation areas and trails are being added, and the center is currently working to add a business layer on the map for identification purposes. The center has also started mapping safe room/tornado shelters at the request of fire departments. This program is completely voluntary, and the information received would only be used in an emergency situation.

"If we had a major disaster and had search parties out looking for citizens, it would be important to make sure that they are looking in the right spot. Some fire departments are going to be asking people in their areas if they would like to be a part of this and then notify us (E911 Center)," Phillips stated.

The E911 Center has successfully negotiated an upgrade price for their CAD equipment. They have run into some compatibility issues with the phone software and hardware that has forced the center to upgrade the software from Zetron. The price for this would total in at \$24,000.

Director Phillips asked the board to reallocate the maintenance savings to the upgrade for this year, from \$10,000 to \$20,000. This budget change would allow the equipment to be covered if anything breaks and gives room for any additional equipment needed. This was approved by the board.

The center has also started a community outreach. They have partnered with the Eagle Rock Golden Mano Fire Department and spoken with local kids on how to dial 9-1-1 and when to dial. This was a part of the Barry County summer reading program. The center spoke with approximately 30 kids and gave out activity books and pencils to take home. The center also attended the Back to School Fair in Cassville also giving helpful information.

The next emergency service board meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 17, at 6 p.m.



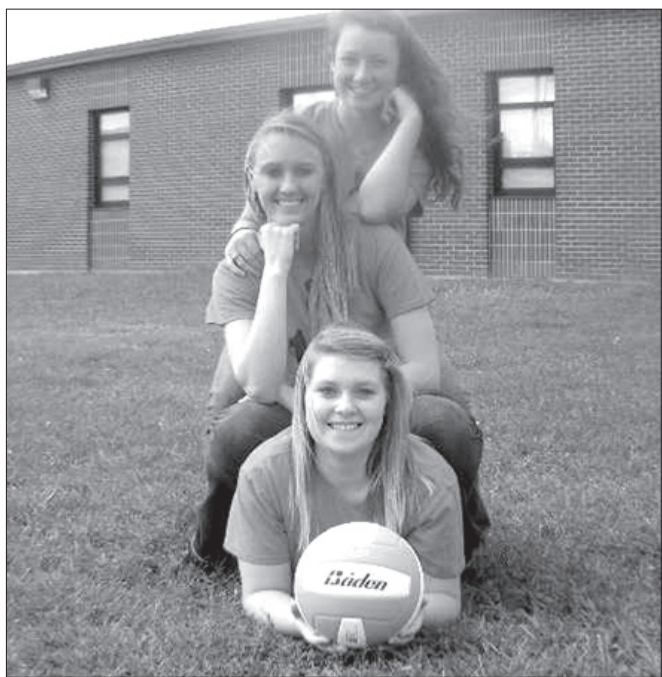

Local man gives CPR, saves life

When you walk into the same store you go into every week, you don't expect to need to save someone's life, but for James Asher, that is exactly what happened just over a week ago.

As Asher was checking out at the cash register of L&L, Connie Woodall of Eagle Rock handed him his receipt and immediately dropped on the floor, suffering a massive heart attack.

Asher moved Woodall from behind the counter and began CPR. This lasted for approximately 5-10 minutes until the Eagle Rock Golden Mano Fire Department ar-

rived. Donna Lunsford, first responder with ERGM FD, was first on the scene and administered CPR until Mark Pierson and Pam Stillwall, also with the ERGM FD, arrived to hook up the automatic external defibrillator and administer it seven times before ambulances and a helicopter arrived.

Woodall was transported by helicopter after seven shocks to the heart for immediate double bypass surgery.

On September 23, James Asher was awarded a certificate of appreciation at Holiday Island's board meeting for his life saving act at a L&L store in Eagle Rock.

Asher, just days before, had

taken a refresher CPR course for his job with the road department. Holiday Island Suburban Improvement District's policy has been to provide on-the-job first aid and CPR training to all employees. The course was on Tuesday, and on Sunday, Asher put his knowledge to work.

No one who has taken the course has needed to use the CPR training until now. "Any community would be much better off training employees in case of these events. I'm glad that the district stepped up and got them trained," Holiday Island Assistant Fire Chief Bob Clave stated.

"It's something you train for but never hope to do, but when an emergency presents itself, you just take action," stated Asher, "I just wasn't ready to say bye yet." Asher and Woodall are actually good friends and have known each other for quite some time.

Woodall is currently recuperating from the surgery and didn't know of any symptoms before the attack happened. She currently has an external pace maker and will undergo additional surgery in three months for an internal pace maker. Woodall is very grateful for the help that Asher and the ERGM FD provided in saving her life.

We once had an Iron Horse

Periodically, residents of Cassville are reminded that, once upon a time, the town had its own Iron Horse...

The Cassville and Exeter Railway Company ran for 4.6 miles from Cassville to Exeter where it connected with the Frisco Railroad.

When the railway was dedicated on the fourth of July in 1896, over 5,000 Barry Countians turned out for the ceremony marking the completion of the line.

Over the next 60 years, the train's engine would pull the freight cars uphill to Exeter, and since the small

line did not have turntables at either end, the train crew would lower the steam pressure on the engine and simply coast back to Cassville backwards.

One of the periodic reminders came to the Advertiser last week when Karen Jennings, who is the

new City Clerk, delivered a letter from a man named James Burke. While in his late eighties, Burke wrote a two volume work published by San Juan Publishing Co. in San Juan, Colorado, entitled "The Iron Horse and I," which covers a large number of the nation's railroads.

His letter, accompanied by photographs, follows:

Cassville, Missouri, in the fall of 1950, was a quiet little Ozark town. On our way there, I had determined that the town had no railroad by checking my maps of The Missouri Pacific and The Frisco and The Kansas City Southern, and that's all the railroads there were in Southwest Missouri. Right? Wrong. So I had resigned

myself to fishing at Roaring River with the rest of the group.

We stopped in Cassville for some supplies, and as I was crawling out of the car, the mellow tones of a steam whistle filled the air. I looked up to see an aged Iron Horse backing slowly across Main Street. A moment later, I was trackside watching the old engine shove a tank car into a spur. Above the unlikely number Twenty Six Forty Four stood the name Cassville & Exeter Ry.

My interest in fishing drifted away with the cloud of fragrant soft coal smoke. The three man crew soon finished their switching and eased the old gal back to bed in a somewhat haunted looking engine house. I

talked with them as they prepared to go home. "Come ride along with us to Exeter tomorrow." My neck strap caught my camera.

I was there early, as was the crew, and before it was time to depart, the engine house was filled with tremendous fish such that there was little room left for The Twenty Six Forty Four. But she seemed to be accustomed to such stories and was not disturbed.

At the appointed time, or thereabouts, we rolled out into the bright October morning with a great hissing from the cylinder cocks and muffled soggy exhausts form the stack. We nosed into the

tank car on the spur, pulled it out and shoved it across to the depot where we stopped for our "orders."

The ensuing conversation inside the depot was attended by all company employees - my presence brought the total attendance to six - and dealt with fish, firewood and local politics as well as the possibility of a run to Exeter. There was much thoughtful puffing on pipes and quiet contemplation of red and yellow leaves floating down from the trees across the track. The ticking of the "standard" clock grew ominous. Today, such serenity would delight me. In 1950, I was growing

anxious.

Eventually, the major issues were resolved and we climbed back onto the engine. I stood aside as the fireman heaved half a dozen scoops of coal into the firebox. The hogger cracked the throttle, and we rolled away at what turned out to be our top speed. The rails creaked and groaned as The Twenty Six Forty Four found them in the grass at four miles an hour.

We roll unobtrusively through a half busy saw mill and an abandoned chicken farm. The rails ahead were totally invisible at times, and the ends of the ties could only be seen where a meandering ditch had undercut them. To photograph our passing,

I simply dropped off the engine, jogged ahead, and waited.

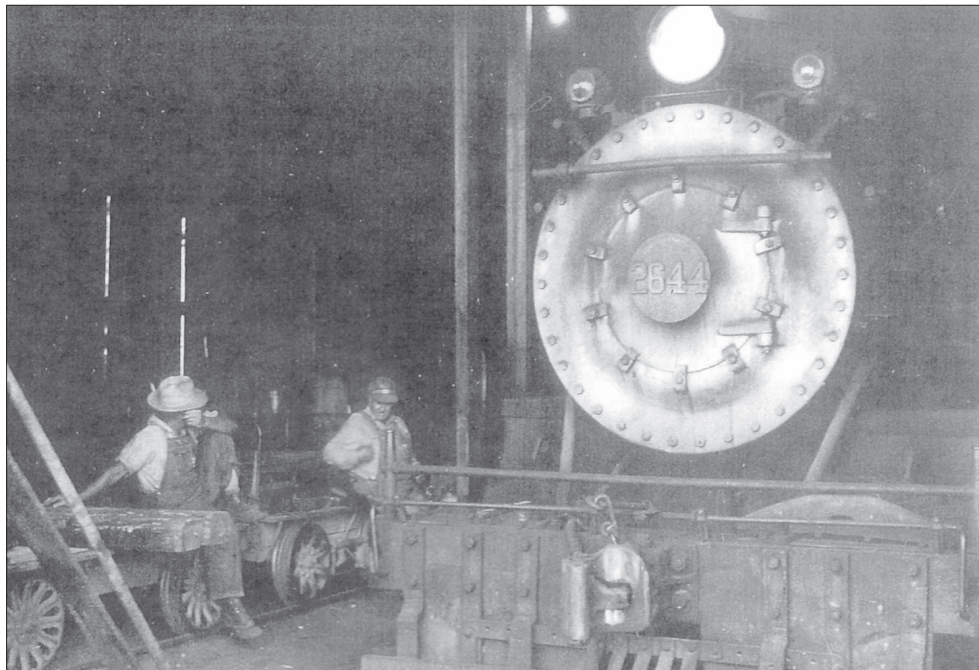
At one point, where a dusty road would down and crossed the rails, the hogger grabbed the whistle cord and started an official warning moaning across the hills. But midway through the second moan, the whistle cord parted with a snap, abbreviating the warning. With an air of great urgency, the hogger leaped forward, grabbed the dangling cord, and completed the specified signal. His entire public seemed satisfied and went back to grazing on the hillside. I had to look away.

We were more than an hour out of Cassville when we creaked up to the Frisco

depot at Exeter. We backed away from the tank car and spotted the engine on the house track. In a neat little nearby cafe we found food. Returning leisurely with toothpicks and cigars, we nosed the engine into a boxcar and a tank and promptly eased backward out of town. The engineer expressed his regrets that we had no occasion on this day to go out onto the Frisco main line where he said he could "really open her up." Feeling uncertain, I said I was sorry too. Except for a stop to clean the fire over a "soft spot that needs some ballast," the return trip was a replay in reverse with only three scoops of coal. It was downhill all the way.

There was plenty of time to enjoy the autumn color and talk about better days on The Cassville & Exeter. The engineer proudly assured me that many had been the days when he ran the six miles from Cassville to Exeter in twelve minutes and, with just a little work on the track, he would do it again.

After they backed the little ten wheeler into the haunted engine house at Cassville, I thanked and said goodbye to three of the friendliest and proudest railroaders that I have ever met and walked away with fine and enduring impressions of The Cassville and Exeter Railway.

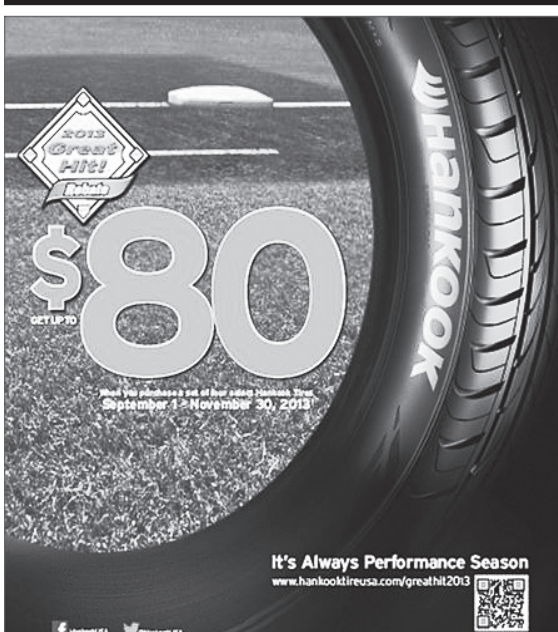
