Churches give big to community on Kindness Day

For around 400 people on Sunday morning, instead of dressing up in their finest dresses and suits, they donned work jeans and boots and headed over to the American Legion grounds to get their hands dirty in the name of God.

Kindness in Action was a day inspired by Pastor James Weaver's, of First Baptist Church of Cassville, hometown tradition. He and United Methodist of Cassville's Pastor Andy Lambel took the idea to the Cassville Ministerial Alliance.

First Baptist Church of Cassville, Nazarene Church, United Methodist, Spiritual Streams, St. Thomas A'Becket Episcopal, Emmanuel Baptist, First Christian Church and The Point all joined together to spend a day serving the community they work, play and live in.

Projects ranged from mowing and lawn service, to painting, picking up trash, pumping gas and bussing tables. The purpose of the day was to serve all members in the community in some way, not just the members of the churches in question.

One of the recipients

of the acts of kindness was the Cassville R-IV District. For the Birds donated some shrubs and flowers for church members to spruce up existing flower beds and create new ones for the school. The crew also weeded and cleaned the gravel parking lots, pruned shrubs and the school lots were cleaned. Jill LeCompte, of Cassville Schools, stated, "The help that the area churches provided was very much appreciated. Those small acts free our maintenance staff to work on bigger projects."

Other church members worked at the Habitat for Humanity house currently under construction while another group distributed 1,200 homemade chocolate chip cookies. It took people of all walks of life and talents to truly serve the community in ways that showcased what they were capable of.

For many, the simple act of kindness of having a visitor at their nursing home when they don't often get one was enough to make the day worth it. To some, having their groceries carried at Ramey or their shopping cart returned at Walmart might seem a small act, but

when you combine them all together, the churches made a huge impact in the community.

The day concluded with a lunch that served between 250 and 300 volunteers with a worship testimony by Bob Zamastil of Bonsai Creations in Garfield, Arkansas.

When asked what made the day successful, Pastor

Weaver stated, "A large group of Christians coming together across denominational lines to give of their time and resources to show the love of Jesus Christ to perfect strangers, expecting and receiving absolutely nothing in return except the joy of serving and bringing glory to God."

Many are hoping that the event turns into an annual

occurrence in the community. Whitney Kloss, a Kindness in Action volunteer, stated, "I had the opportunity to serve at Sunrise Café. It was great to come together with other believers in our community and serve. Hopefully this will be come an annual event, I would be honored to serve again."

Severe crash kills one on Hwy. W



One man was killed and six others were injured in a four-vehicle accident at approximately 6:30 a.m. this morning (Wednesday).

According to Missouri Highway Patrol reports, the accident occurred on Highway W, half-mile west of Butterfield.

According to Patrol re-

ports, a 2003 Chevy Trailblazer, driven by Jennifer Moerer, 34, of Wheaton, was eastbound when she crossed the center line and struck a westbound 2003 Ford Ranger, driven by Antonio Luna, 73, of Rocky Comfort, head on.

The Trailblazer then struck an eastbound 2005

Chevy Malibu, driven by Amanda Walker, 27, of Purdy, causing the Malibu to rotate out of control and cross the center line, and then was struck by a westbound 1998 Dodge Durango. The Durango was driven by Suzanne Morin, 34, of Butterfield.

Knife threat sends one to jail, \$50K bond

One man was arrested on Monday, October 14, in connection with a domestic disturbance call. Detective George Daoud, with the Monett Police Department, was dispatched to the residence at 210 North Kyler, in Barry County. The suspect's girlfriend, Maria Barrientos, reported that the her boy-

friend, George Daniels, had kicked in the back door of the home and threatened her with a knife.

Barrientos was in the residence with her three children, all under the age of 12. She alleged that Daniels would not let them leave the home, blocking the door and swinging the knife at them. One child received a nick

on her arm allegedly from Daniels thrashing the knife in the air. Officers noted that the minor wound had fresh blood on it that was red and shiny.

It was also accused that Daniels attempted to choke one child with her jacket. One child claimed that Dan-

Porter murder probe extends into Barry Cty.

A man already facing murder charges connected to the 2011 double homicide of his nephew and his wife is facing additional charges after authorities from multiple jurisdictions and at least one state agency. Multiple simultaneous search warrants were executed on two separate properties near Purdy last week.

Authorities didn't use the traditional knock and talk method to execute the warrants at 201 Caledonia and a residence on Highway C. Instead, the Barry County Sheriff's SWAT team used a

flash/bang diversionary tactic to gain the upper hand, according to a neighbor.

The Caledonia property is owned by Robert Campbell, according to court documents. The other is owned by a family named Petit, according to Robyn Poyner, who witnessed authorities bringing evidence out of the home.

Authorities allegedly recovered two VIN plates that had been removed from vehicles during the search, according to the probable

cause statement.

Rusty and Becky Porter lived on land adjacent to Campbell near Willard when they went missing in April 2011. Campbell and Rusty Porter had each filed orders of protection against each other prior to the couple's disappearance, and they were allegedly engaged in a land inheritance dispute when the couple went missing.

The couple's skeletal remains were found three months after they vanished in Taney County on property that Campbell's brother-in-law, Tony Friend, was "very familiar with." Autopsy results show the cause of death was gunshot wounds to the head.

Friend and his cousin, Dusty Hicks, are facing first-degree murder and felonious restraint charges connected to the double homicide.

Windy Friend, Tony's wife, is also charged with murder. His son, Phillip Friend, has already pled guilty to second-degree murder and felonious re-

straint. He is currently serving a seven year sentence for felonious restraint, but won't be sentenced on the murder conviction until he testifies at the upcoming murder trials.

Taney County prosecutor Jeff Merrell announced last month that he would not seek the death penalty against four of the defendants, but that "the death penalty was still on the table for Tony Friend."

When Campbell was apprehended at Lowe's in Monett on Wednesday, October 16, he was allegedly in possession of a stolen semi truck. The tractor trailer was stolen in 2006 in Bentonville, Arkansas, and belonged to Josh Taylor, of Willard, another relative of Campbell's.

Court documents say that authorities discovered that the big rig's serial number had been altered during a search of the vehicle.

Campbell has been charged with receiving stolen property and removal or altering a vehicle identification number. If convicted of

the class C felonies, Campbell could face up to seven years in prison.

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said authorities recovered two guns, business documents and phones in the raids. Two stolen tractor trailers were also recovered, according to Epperly.

Barry County prosecutor Johnnie Cox said he believes Campbell and his wife moved to the area after he was released on bond after he was charged with murder.

Campbell is being held in the Barry County jail in lieu of \$150,000 cash-only bond. Federal charges could be filed against Campbell, who is a convicted felon and was in possession of a firearm, according to an investigator involved in the raids.

The search warrant applications and returns associated with the Barry County raid have been sealed by the court, according to Cox.

The Missouri Department of Revenue's Criminal Tax Bureau, the IRS, the Greene County Sheriff's office and the Purdy Police Department were involved in the raid on the Barry County properties.

iels had threatened to burn the house and car down with gasoline as well.

Officers recovered an

18" knife on the steps where Daniels had been standing when they arrived. Another witness stated that he saw Daniels on the porch of their home, as well. The witness also claimed that he saw Daniels swinging something toward Barrientos and the children in the home that appeared to be a knife.

When Daniels was interviewed by officers on October 15, he admitted to kicking the door in to the residence and that he had an argument with Barrientos while waving

the knife around, but that he was not waving it in a threatening manner. He denied causing any injuries.

Daniels was taken into custody and transported to the Barry County Jail. He was charged with class C felony of assault in the second degree and three class C felony counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond.

Two-year old Monett boy dies of E. Coli

Sawyer Doss, a two-year old boy from Monett, was pronounced dead by the Lawrence County coroner of an E. coli infection.

Health officials were not sure where Doss came in contact with the germ, but

it is commonly found in undercooked ground beef and cattle.

The boy was in Mercy Hospital when he died. Initially, the infection appears to be a stomach virus.

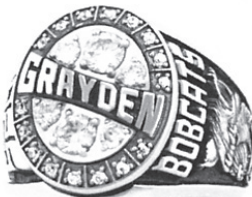

Cassville PD to take back prescriptions

On October 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Cassville Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its seventh opportunity in three years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous, expired,

unused and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your medications for disposal to Cassville City Hall, Council Chamber/Municipal Court Room, at 300 Main St., entrance in back. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Last April, Americans

turned in 371 tons (over 742,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at over 5,800 sites operated by the DEA and its thousands of state and local law enforcement partners. In its six previous Take Back events, the DEA and its partners took in over 2.8 million pounds, more than 1,400 tons, of pills.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet.

In addition, Americans

are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines, flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash, both pose potential safety and health hazards.

The DEA is in the process of approving new regulations that implement the Safe and Responsible Drug Disposal Act of 2010, which amends the Controlled Substances Act to allow an "ultimate user" (that is, a patient or pet or their family member or owner) of controlled substance medications to dispose of them by delivering them to entities authorized by the Attorney General to accept them. The Act also allows the Attorney General to authorize long term care facilities to dispose of their residents' controlled substances in certain instances.

FAQs

Q: Should we accept the containers as well as the drugs? Yes, you may. No need to separate the drugs from the vials. Plastic and glass are acceptable. Just no needles.

Q: May we accept pre-loaded syringes? Yes, as long as the needle has been removed by the patient. Epi-pens are acceptable since the needle is sheathed by design in heavy duty plastic.

Q: What advice should we give those who bring syringes with needles that we cannot accept? Believe it or not, the following advice comes from the waste disposal industry. Advise the user to place the syringes in an empty plastic laundry detergent container. Screw the cap back on the container, mark the bottle "SHARPS" with a pen and dispose in the trash.


Q: May we accept veterinary drugs? Yes. ALL Rx and OTC drugs are acceptable, including veterinary medications. The species of the "consumer" does not matter.

Q: My local pharmacist says we have to remove the Rx label from the vials before we can accept them per HIPPA privacy rules? No. HIPPA does not apply to you or this situation. This is a voluntary project that is consumer driven. You are under no obligation to remove anything from any label. The consumer should remove or deface the label if they are concerned before placing the vial in the box. All material in these containers will be incinerated. You may reassure the public that their privacy is being protected.

Q: May we accept inhalers? Would prefer that you don't because we are incinerating. We don't want any pressurized containers to "pop" or explode at the facility.

PUBLIC NOTICE

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The Southwest R-V School District assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The Southwest R-V School District has developed a Local Compliance Plan for the implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed by contacting the Special Services Department during regular school hours.

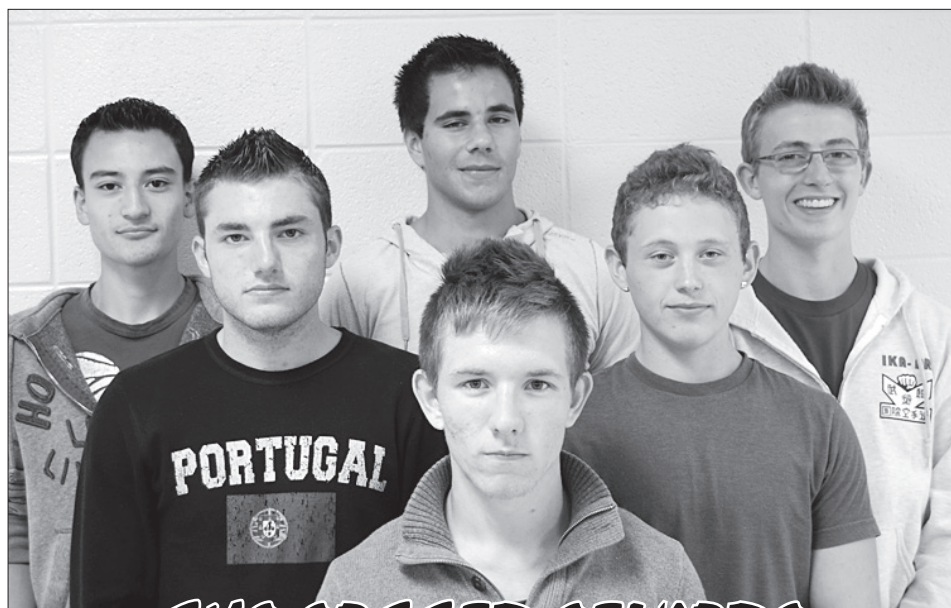

Cassville JV finishes season

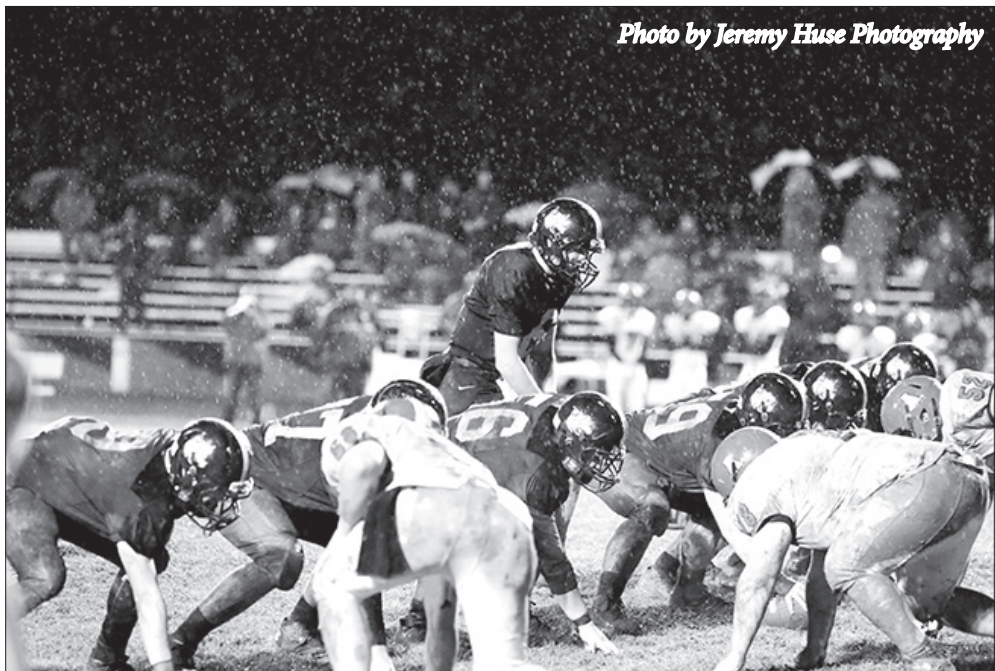

Monday night’s game was a lot like this as the Cassville JV visited the Aurora Houn’ Dawgs. The Wildcats would come out and initially take several shots in the teeth from Aurora but held fast, and in the end would get the game ending strike.

The Houn’ Dawgs were ready to play from the onset of the football game. They would take the opening kick-off and steadily move down the field.

Aurora ran their split back veer offense for 5-6 yards a pop as their quarterback continued to make the correct reads.

Although they Dawgs came out ready to play, Cassville was not going to lie down without getting a few scratches on their opponent.

The first scratch came when the Cassville defense forced an Aurora fumble and stopped the drive cold.

Aurora would quickly force the Wildcat offense to punt and much of the first half would continue like this.

Cassville struggled to get anything going offensively and the ‘Cat “D” would stop

them deep in their own territory, implementing a bend but-don’t-break philosophy.

The first quarter would end without either team on the scoreboard.

The second quarter wasn’t much different until the last position of the half for the Cats. Cassville had a big pass play on a screen pass to running back Josh Brown from quarterback Leigh Cox. That was on a third and long from the midfield.

From there, Cassville would slowly pick up yardage down to the eight yard line and then freshman River Phelps gave the Dawgs another scratch to bandage up.

Phelps received the pitch on a sweep left and outran everyone to the pylon for six points. The extra point was missed and Cassville would go into half ahead 6-0.

Despite the scratches of the first half, Aurora did what dogs do and came back for more in the second half.

The Cassville defense stepped up and stopped the two-point conversion.

The game was now a stalemate at 6-6 and that is how it would stay until the final three-and-a-half minutes in the game.

The Cats would start a

march down the field getting several third down conversions to prolong the game winning drive.

On second down, from the Aurora eight-yard line, Cox would roll right and step up to avoid a blitzing linebacker and make a spot on throw with a defensive end draped all over him, to the running back in the flats.

The throw had to be perfect and it was as Phelps nabbed the throw out of the air and turned it up into the end zone.

The Cats failed on the two-point conversion but were now in the lead with 51 seconds to go in the game, 12-6.

Aurora would come out throwing with all three timeouts to use. The Cassville Defense would allow some yardage on the return and a little more on a pass to start the drive. The defense stopped completions and would make Aurora throw an interception on the two- yard line.

Hunter Stringer was the culprit that would deliver the game ending swipe with 13 seconds to go. He returned the ball out to 30-yard line, Cassville would get in the victory formation and win the game.

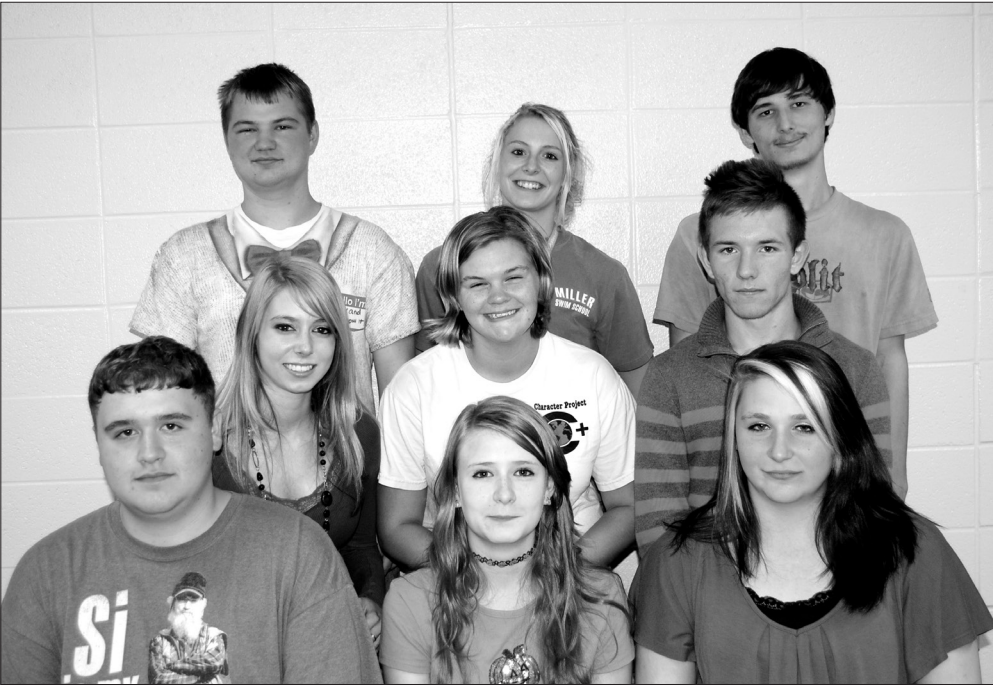

Open enrollment for 4-H clubs is underway now and runs thorough December 1. As the largest out-of-school youth organization in the world, 4-H is open to all boys and girls, ages 5 to 18. Children who are five to seven years old are eligible for 4-H Clover Kids, an introductory program. Youths who are 8 to 18 years of age can select from a variety of 4-H projects and activities that stress social and life skills in areas such as decision making, communication, social interaction, civic responsibility and physical skills. “You do not have to live on a farm to join 4-H,” said Velynda Cameron, 4-H youth development specialist with University of Missouri Extension. “Project opportunities include computers, robotics, foods and nutrition, horticulture, large and small animals and much more.” Jeremy Elliott-Engel, Barry County 4-H youth development specialist, stated, “Agriculture continues to

be a strong project area for members in Barry County 4-H with many of the top projects being all in the livestock areas, e.g. Beef, Market Goats and Poultry.” New in Barry County this year is the Shooting Sports project. Leaders are certified in Smallbore Rife (.22 caliber) and will start practicing in early spring. Youth are trained in gun safety and precision shooting skills. Competitions happen at the County, Regional, State and National Levels. Elliott-Engel explained, “We know that active youth enrolled in 4-H are more likely to go to and successfully complete college education, and, are more likely to return and contribute positively to their home communities.” Follow us online on our Facebook page, Exeter Trailblazers 4-H Club, to know what is going on. Missouri 4-H is University of Missouri Extension’s youth development program. The program is designed to

help to create opportunities for young people to be valued, contributing members of their community.
