## Wildcats hand Monett first loss in Barry County Brawl

Friday night's victory over the Monett Cubs couldn't have come at a better time for the Wildcats. After falling to 1-3 on the season, and as frustration began to rise, the Wildcats knew they needed a win.

As the Monett Cubs travel down Highway 37 Friday afternoon, their plans were to spoil Cassville's homecoming, take home the Barry County Brawl trophy and bragging rights, and put up their fourth win of the season. The Wildcats had something else in mind.

"The win Friday night was huge and we're moving forward in the second half of the season," stated head coach Lance Parnell.

The Wildcats did what they needed to do to secure a victory over Monett. Their defense stood strong, and their offense converted in the 27-0 win.

"I was very pleased with how we played on defense. Our kids have worked hard to improve defensively, and

it was good to see them come out and play with great intensity and emotion on the defensive side of the ball," said Coach Parnell.

"Offensively, we did a good job running the football and playing much more physical up front on the offensive line."

Coach Parnell is pleased with the improvements the Wildcats are making over the course of the season.

"We have played much more physical on both sides of the ball the last couple of weeks. I was very pleased with the play of our special teams Friday night. Bradley Lueckenhoff kicked the ball very well, and our coverage teams showed improvement."

With that, Coach Parnell and the Wildcats are still focusing on some of their weaknesses as they prepare for East Newton and the second half the season.

"We must eliminate the little mental mistakes we are still making at times like penalties and turning the

football over. Defensively we must improve in the secondary and continue to play disciplined each and every snap," Parnell stated.

With Friday night's Barry County Brawl win, the Wildcats record improves to 2-4 as they handed the Monett Cubs their first loss of the season. The Wildcats will retain the Barry County Brawl

trophy until the two teams meet again next season.

The Wildcats will be back in action Friday night as they travel to East Newton for a conference match-up against the Patriots.

## Gov't shutdown affects BC residents

For many Barry County residents, the government shutdown may seem to not affect them. That may be true for some, but a variety of public services are in jeopardy after Congress failed to pass a federal budget for this legislative session.

Until Congress passes a budget, programs through a variety of federal agencies are shutdown until further notice. Included in the list of what the government considers nonessential programs are national parks and forests, the USDA, call centers and help lines and more. Currently unaffected are active military personnel, the USPS and social security benefits.

On the local level, jobs through the USDA and Forestry Service are furloughed until further notice. Upon calling the local USDA office in Cassville, you'll be greeted by a recording, stating that as of October 1, the office is

closed and employees have no access to their e-mails or voice-mail during that time. The USDA controls food inspection services, as well.

Other county-level operations, such as the Barry County Health Department and Family Services Division, are wholly unaffected by the shutdown as of now. According to Rebecca Woelfel, communications director for the Missouri Department of Social Services, "We have been informed that there is sufficient funding to continue Food Stamps, WIC benefits, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and child care payments in the short term."

Woelfel continued, "We will continue to monitor the situation. If an agreement is not reached soon, we will no longer have federal funds and these programs will be impacted." In other words, the future is not guaranteed for any public assistance programs unless a budget is

agreed to amongst the House and Senate.

Certain programs will be unaffected because they are not included in the annual budget, but rather have funds appropriated to them separately. Examples of those programs are Social Security and Medicaid. Since funds for those programs are allocated by direct deductions from employees' pay, they stand alone in their operating budgets.

The Barry County Health Department will be offering flu shots, medical services, environmental services, like food inspections, and others as normal. The only potential program that could be affected if the shutdown is prolonged would be child-care facility inspections, but they do not expect that to be a problem in the near future.

Certain groups, like the U.S. Army Corps of Engi-

## Seligman Police Dept. busts meth lab

The Seligman Police Department made their third meth lab bust in the last two months on Saturday night around midnight. Officers Ray Earnest and Tony Downs were dispatched to the resi-

dence at 27727 Eggleston St. in Seligman for a domestic disturbance.

A woman called, claiming that the Bart Jermain, who she lived with, tried to run her and another woman over with his vehicle. She wanted

the police to determine if he was in the residence.

Once police were inside, she claimed that he had a meth lab in the bathroom. Officers found drug paraphernalia, a coffee grinder, propane torch and an empty

box of cold compresses in the home.

The shed behind the house was found to have a methamphetamine lab inside. The police officers called in the Southwest Missouri Task Force and Seligman Police

Chief Garry Thornton when evidence of drugs was discovered.

Jermain came home while officers were present and was taken into custody. He is currently being held on a \$25,000 bond at the Barry County Jail.



# Cassville as it was in 1870

The Civil War had been over for five years when the 1870 census was taken of those remaining in Cassville. Cassville had been a heavily battered town during the Civil War, particularly before the Union gained control here in 1863 and occupied a part of the old courthouse. The census lists 55 houses in the city of Cassville but fails to give a population figure.

Among the places of business in town at that time were six dry goods stores, five blacksmiths, five carpenters, four doctors, four lawyers, four farmers, two grocery men, one minister, a harness maker, a brick maker, a photographer, two teamsters, two school teachers, one mail contractor, four public officials and a publisher.

A publisher probably was of the early days of the Cassville Democrat. The competing paper, which was the Cassville Republican, did not come onto the scene until 1872.

The two teamsters were generally referred to in those days as people who freighted goods in and out of Cassville.

neers, found out later than others about their status. Upon speaking to a representative at the Army Corps office in Branson, as of Wednesday, October 2, at 8 p.m., Campbell Point Marina, Mill Creek and Old Highway 86 are all shutdown until further notice.

Normally, those marinas would be open through October. Other points, like Eagle Rock and Big M, were already closed September 15 when their season ends. Other select points are open through October or year-round. They do not know when they will be reopened this year, if at all. For now, the office for the Army Corps remains open.

One problem for Shell Knob residents is that the marina shutdown resulted in a postponement of the 34th annual Homer Sloan Buddy Bass Tournament, Table Rock Lake's longest-running, continuously open bass tournament. The tournament was still on until The Army Corps of Engineers were notified that the marinas would be closing on Wednesday night.

National parks and forests are also closed until further notice. Mark Twain National Forest is directly affected. Until budget money is allocated to the Forestry Department under the USDA, all public use areas in the forest, as well as park offices, will be closed. State parks, like Roaring River State Park, are not impacted by the federal shutdown as they are state parks.

So for Barry County residents, mail will be delivered as normal, and for now, none of the public welfare programs many citizens rely on will be impacted. However, for the almost 7,000 county residents that rely on food stamps and the MOHealthNet program each month could eventually be affected if a budget decision isn't made soon.

Starting October 15, the “Medicare Assistance Program” offered by Medicare trained volunteers at the Central Crossing Senior Center will begin. The enrollment will be October 15 through December 7. During that time, you can change your providers on Part D coverage and also change providers on your advantage plan.

There are many changes in Medicare this year. Many providers are changing the prescription drugs that they will cover, changing the tiers, plus changing the cost for certain drugs. For seniors that do not use an independent review program, they may get caught with some of these changes, and it could be very expensive.

At the Medicare Assistance Program offered last year, there were 148 seniors who took advantage of this service. They had a total savings in their Medicare costs of \$40,985. This is the sixth year for this program, and each year seniors have benefited from the counseling and many have had significant savings.

This service is free. To make an appointment, call (417) 858-3456. Due to the high number of seniors benefiting from this service, it is necessary that you make an appointment for the counseling service.

We do have limited counselors that are volunteers participating in this senior service. It would be best not to wait as the scheduling gets very difficult during the later time of the enrollment period. 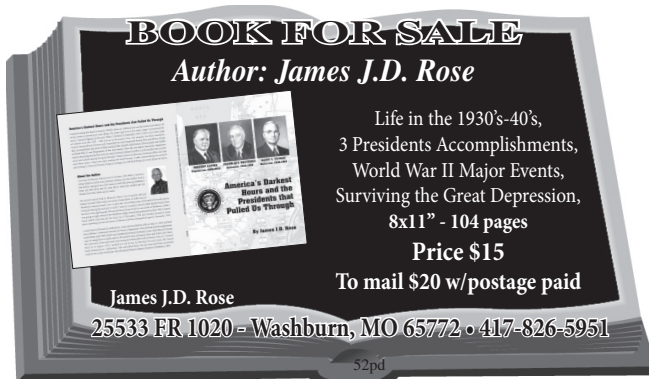

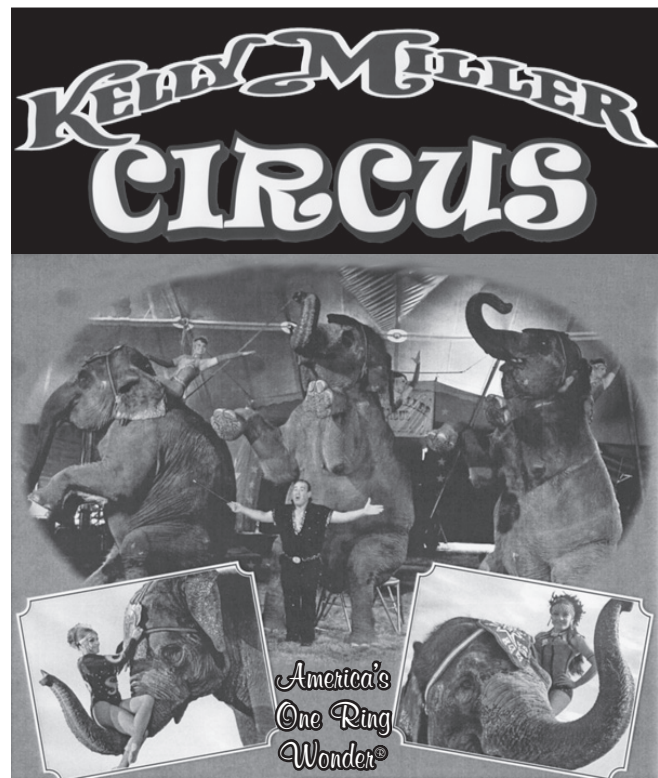

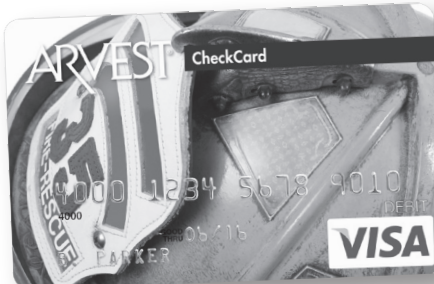

# Ozark Chinquapin to be protected in BC

A decision has been made regarding the revitalization of the Ozark Chinquapin Tree, native to the Barry County area. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service had determined in 2010 that the tree may warrant protection as an endangered species. The Ozark Chinquapin was first proposed for protection 38 years ago in 1975 based off of a recommendation from the Smithsonian Institute. However, this proposal was never finalized, and the species has deteriorated without protection ever since.

The Ozark Chinquapin tree is a native of the Ozarks, as it is the preferred growing site with its numerous hill-sides and hill tops. This species typically grows on acidic rocky soils and are usually found amongst pine, oak and hickory trees. Chinquapins produced a vast amount of highly prized nuts every year and was sought as a food

source not only by wildlife, but for humans as well. The wood from this iconic tree is also rot resistant which makes it valuable for esthetic reasons as well.

The chinquapin's slow decline is due to the threat of the chestnut blight, a fungus that has threatened many tree species in the eastern United States. Because of this fungus ,the chinquapin is limited to sprouting from its roots.

Roaring River State Park has an Ozark Chinquapin Nature Center which is named after the tree species that once flourished in the area. There is also an Ozark Chinquapin Foundation that has been in operation for a year. This foundation is working to cross pollinate the tree for future planting. They want to raise awareness on what is happening to an important part of the Ozarks.

The foundation is taking pollen from already existing, large Ozark Chinquapins

that are producing nuts and exhibiting signs of resistance from the blight fungus to help in the fight to strengthen the future of the species.

The Ozark Chinquapin Foundation is finding success in its hard work. The chinquapin trees they're finding now have somehow resisted the detrimental fungus. In fact, 11 large surviving chinquapin trees are showing some light resistance.

"The Ozark Chinquapin nuts were delicious, and we waited for them to fall like you would wait on a crop of corn to ripen; they were that important. Up on the hilltop, the nuts were so plentiful that we scooped them up with flat blade shovels and loaded them into the wagons to be used as livestock feed, to eat for ourselves and to sell. Deer, bears, turkeys, squirrels, and a variety of other wildlife fattened up on the sweet crop of nuts that fell every year. But starting in the 1950's and

60's, all of the trees started dying off. Now they are all gone and no one has heard of them," stated a 93-year old Missouri outdoorsman, describing the trees before the chestnut blight reached the Ozark Mountains found on the Foundation website.

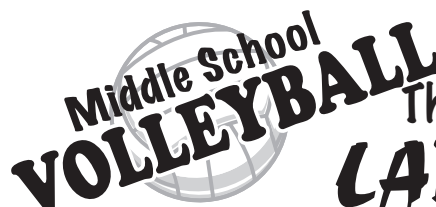

## Purdy shows dangers of distracted driving

Purdy High School students and staff experienced a devastating tragedy on Friday, September 20, as they observed the death of a fellow classmate, the arrest of another and the injury of several others as a result of an automobile accident caused by drinking and texting while driving.

Thankfully, the tragedy was a simulation and not the real thing, but the docu-drama, sponsored by the Purdy Family, Career and Community Leaders of

America chapter (FCCLA), was a stark reminder of the realities of distracted driving.

Students quietly filed by the simulated scene and then witnessed emergency personnel in action as they responded to the accident. The drama featured Purdy High School students Jesus Perez, Lucas White, Jazmine Rodriguez, Jennifer Hernandez, Dana Cunningham, Ashley Lowery and Stephanie Gaucin. Lea White, Lucas's mom, made a guest appearance as a mother grieving the tragic loss of her son.

Following the docu-drama, students attended a spe-

cial assembly and listened to speakers from various emergency response teams address distracted driving. Students learned that a driver's eyes leave the road for up to four seconds while sending or reading a text.

They also watched videos featuring grieving family members who lost loved ones to accidents caused by texting and a young man who will spend the next several years of his life in prison because he caused a fatal accident while texting.

Purdy High School Senior Rocio Rodriguez noted, "It was just so sad. Even though I knew the docu-drama wasn't real, I just can't imagine losing my friends like that."

# Sen. Sater's Capitol Report: SWEPCO

Senator David Sater

Many of you may have heard about a recently proposed Arkansas power line that could pass through southern Barry and McDonald counties. Numerous property owners along the proposed route and citizens in the area have contacted me to voice their concern. After finding out about it, I immediately contacted the Missouri Public Service Commission, the regulatory body responsible for oversight of power delivery in our state, to see if SWEPCO had filed any paperwork or proposed any plans in Missouri.

They informed me that no request for a transmission line through southern Missouri had been filed by SWEPCO. However, it was aware of the proposed route and informed me that even if Route 109 was approved in Arkansas, it would also have to be approved here. I then learned of a meeting of the Arkansas Public Service Commission on August 26 in Little Rock where the three proposed routes would be discussed. As I had already scheduled a meeting with constituents, I sent my Chief of Staff to sit in on the meeting and report back.

Since the Missouri route would be longer and more expensive, would require the

approval of the regulatory agencies in both Missouri and Arkansas, and was the least discussed route at the Little Rock meeting, I think we can stop worrying for now.

However, I will continue to monitor the issue closely and will share any new developments with you. If Route 109 is back on the table or is pursued by SWEPCO, I will work with local officials and members of the Legislature to determine the best way to oppose it. In the meantime, if you are affected by the proposed Route 109 or have concerns as to the impact to our area, you can submit a public comment to the Arkansas Public Service Commission at [www.arkansas.gov/psc/](http://www.arkansas.gov/psc/), click on the "Public Comments" tab on the right side of the page and select the docket 13-041-U.

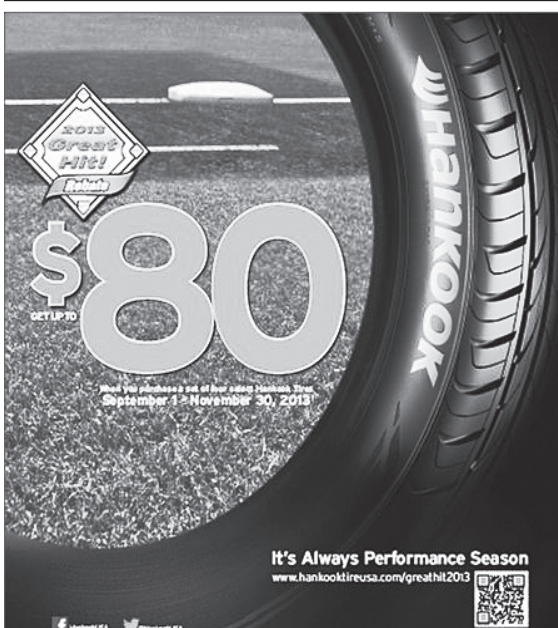
