## Wildcats hand Monett first loss in Barry County Brawl

Friday night's victory over the Monett Cubs couldn't have come at a better time for the Wildcats. After falling to 1-3 on the season, and as frustration began to rise, the Wildcats knew they needed a win.

As the Monett Cubs travel down Highway 37 Friday afternoon, their plans were to spoil Cassville's homecoming, take home the Barry County Brawl trophy and bragging rights, and put up their fourth win of the season. The Wildcats had something else in mind.

"The win Friday night was huge and we're moving forward in the second half of the season," stated head coach Lance Parnell.

The Wildcats did what they needed to do to secure a victory over Monett. Their defense stood strong, and their offense converted in the 27-0 win.

"I was very pleased with how we played on defense. Our kids have worked hard to improve defensively, and

it was good to see them come out and play with great intensity and emotion on the defensive side of the ball," said Coach Parnell.

"Offensively, we did a good job running the football and playing much more physical up front on the offensive line."

Coach Parnell is pleased with the improvements the Wildcats are making over the course of the season.

"We have played much more physical on both sides of the ball the last couple of weeks. I was very pleased with the play of our special teams Friday night. Bradley Lueckenhoff kicked the ball very well, and our coverage teams showed improvement."

With that, Coach Parnell and the Wildcats are still focusing on some of their weaknesses as they prepare for East Newton and the second half the season.

"We must eliminate the little mental mistakes we are still making at times like penalties and turning the

## Gov't shutdown affects BC residents

For many Barry County residents, the government shutdown may seem to not affect them. That may be true for some, but a variety of public services are in jeopardy after Congress failed to pass a federal budget for this legislative session.

Until Congress passes a budget, programs through a variety of federal agencies are shutdown until further notice. Included in the list of what the government considers nonessential programs are national parks and forests, the USDA, call centers and help lines and more. Currently unaffected are active military personnel, the USPS and social security benefits.

On the local level, jobs through the USDA and Forestry Service are furloughed until further notice. Upon calling the local USDA office in Cassville, you'll be greeted by a recording, stating that as of October 1, the office is

closed and employees have no access to their e-mails or voice-mail during that time. The USDA controls food inspection services, as well.

Other county-level operations, such as the Barry County Health Department and Family Services Division, are wholly unaffected by the shutdown as of now. According to Rebecca Woelfel, communications director for the Missouri Department of Social Services, "We have been informed that there is sufficient funding to continue Food Stamps, WIC benefits, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and child care payments in the short term."

Woelfel continued, "We will continue to monitor the situation. If an agreement is not reached soon, we will no longer have federal funds and these programs will be impacted." In other words, the future is not guaranteed for any public assistance programs unless a budget is

agreed to amongst the House and Senate.

Certain programs will be unaffected because they are not included in the annual budget, but rather have funds appropriated to them separately. Examples of those programs are Social Security and Medicaid. Since funds for those programs are allocated by direct deductions from employees' pay, they stand alone in their operating budgets.

The Barry County Health Department will be offering flu shots, medical services, environmental services, like food inspections, and others as normal. The only potential program that could be affected if the shutdown is prolonged would be childcare facility inspections, but they do not expect that to be a problem in the near future.

Certain groups, like the U.S. Army Corps of Engi-

## Ozark Chinquapin to be protected in BC

A decision has been made regarding the revitalization of the Ozark Chinquapin Tree, native to the Barry County area. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service had determined in 2010 that the tree may warrant protection as an endangered species. The Ozark Chinquapin was first proposed for protection 38 years ago in 1975 based off of a recommendation from the Smithsonian Institute. However, this proposal was never finalized, and the species has deteriorated without protection ever since.

The Ozark Chinquapin tree is a native of the Ozarks, as it is the preferred growing site with its numerous hillsides and hill tops. This species typically grows on acidic rocky soils and are usually found amongst pine, oak and hickory trees. Chinquapins produced a vast amount of highly prized nuts every year and was sought as a food

source not only by wildlife, but for humans as well. The wood from this iconic tree is also rot resistant which makes it valuable for esthetic reasons as well.

The chinquapin's slow decline is due to the threat of the chestnut blight, a fungus that has threatened many tree species in the eastern United States. Because of this fungus ,the chinquapin is limited to sprouting from its roots.

Roaring River State Park has an Ozark Chinquapin Nature Center which is named after the tree species that once flourished in the area. There is also an Ozark Chinquapin Foundation that has been in operation for a year. This foundation is working to cross pollinate the tree for future planting. They want to raise awareness on what is happening to an important part of the Ozarks.

The foundation is taking pollen from already existing, large Ozark Chinquapins

that are producing nuts and exhibiting signs of resistance from the blight fungus to help in the fight to strengthen the future of the species.

The Ozark Chinquapin Foundation is finding success in its hard work. The chinquapin trees they're finding now have somehow resisted the detrimental fungus. In fact, 11 large surviving chinquapin trees are showing some light resistance.

"The Ozark Chinquapin nuts were delicious, and we waited for them to fall like you would wait on a crop of corn to ripen; they were that important. Up on the hilltop, the nuts were so plentiful that we scooped them up with flat blade shovels and loaded them into the wagons to be used as livestock feed, to eat for ourselves and to sell. Deer, bears, turkeys, squirrels, and a variety of other wildlife fattened up on the sweet crop of nuts that fell every year. But starting in the 1950's and

60's, all of the trees started dying off. Now they are all gone and no one has heard of them," stated a 93-year old Missouri outdoorsman, describing the trees before the chestnut blight reached the Ozark Mountains found on the Foundation website.

### 4-H animal projects develop life skills

People raise animals for human use or benefits like food, clothing, work, research, companionship or entertainment.

Youths enrolled in 4-H use their animal projects for the same reasons and to develop life skills, according to Jeremy Elliott-Engel, a 4-H youth development specialist with University of Missouri Extension.

"Four areas that I draw on from my own seven years as a 4-H member raising market lambs and dairy goats are responsibility, financial management, self-confidence and understanding of the circle of life," said Elliott-Engel.

A 4-H member with an animal project is no longer responsible only for themselves. They are now required to be in tune to the needs of their project on things like food and nutrition, water, housing and health.

Even with short-term projects like market poultry, where a 4-H member raises the birds for only a few weeks, the youth learn to care for another living thing.

"As the child learns that they are in charge of the wellbeing of their animal, they will see success whether it is earning a blue ribbon at the county fair or having a happy and healthy animal to enjoy," said Elliott-Engel.

Members of 4-H also learn financial management when they have animal proj-

"From an early age, I remember standing at the kitchen table presenting my business plan to my parents so they (the investors) would let me buy chickens, a goat or market lambs. We rarely made money, but I knew where and why I lost money," said Elliott-Engel.

As 4-H members work with their projects, they are required to fill out annual financial records that document the success of the project. These records are worked on throughout the year and serve as the overall budget of the project.

"As my college advisor always said as we worked in the college barns, 'If you have livestock, you have dead stock.' That quip is an accurate assessment of a livestock project and youth have to face not only the joys of sharing an animal's life, but also face mortality as well. Youth see the ups and downs of the circle of life and grow to understand the natural world," said Elliott-Engel.

Members in 4-H that are enrolled in an animal science project are exposed to age-appropriate teaching strategies to help understand good production strategies through project curricula, experienced producers and Missouri Show Me Quality Assurance.



I learned not to get in a





## Sen. Sater's Capitol **Report: SWEPCO**

Senator David Sater

Many of you may have heard about a recently proposed Arkansas power line that could pass through southern Barry and Mc-Donald counties. Numerous property owners along the proposed route and citizens in the area have contacted me to voice their concern. After finding out about it, I immediately contacted the Missouri Public Service Commission, the regulatory body responsible for oversight of power delivery in our state, to see if SWEPCO had filed any paperwork or proposed any plans in Missouri.

They informed me that no request for a transmission line through southern Missouri had ben filed by SWEP-CO. However, it was aware of the proposed route and informed me that even if Route 109 was approved in Arkansas, it would also have to be approved here. I then learned of a meeting of the Arkansas Public Service Commission on August 26 in Little Rock where the three proposed routes would be discussed. As I had already scheduled a meeting with constituents, I sent my Chief of Staff to sit in on the meeting and report back.

Since the Missouri route would be longer and more expensive, would require the

approval of the regulatroy agencies in both Missouri and Arkansas, and was the least discussed route at the Little Rock meeting, I think we can stop worrying for

However, I will continue to monitor the issue closely and will share any new developments with you. If Route 109 is back on the table or is pursued by SWEPCO, I will work with local officials and members of the Legislature to determine the best way to oppose it. In the meantime, if you are affected by the proposed Route 109 or have concerns as to the impact to our area, you can submit a public comment to the Arkansas Public Service Commission at www.arkansas. gov/psc/, click on the "Public side of the page and select the docket 13-041-U.






