Park vandalism ongoing problem

Last week, the Cassville City Council tabled an ordinance that would have changed the wording of the current loitering ordinance. The wording change was in response to the Public Works Department's new "No Loitering" signs found at some of the Cassville City parks in response to growing issues of vandalism.

The hope was that the signs would deter vandalism and littering that congregations of teenagers are responsible for in town. According to Cassville Chief of Police Dana Kammerlohr, "Park vandalism has been an ongoing problem, and this last August there was damage done to a picnic table by the tennis courts. This brought up a discussion of how we can reduce or deter vandalism in the parks area."

She continued, "This is

costly to the Parks Department in repair or replacement of the items that have been vandalized. The City parks are there for people to enjoy, and we hate that restrictions may have to be put in place to reduce vandalism."

Steve Walensky, director of the Public Works Department, said the vandalism has been a growing concern over the last two years or so. Initially, Walensky said the damage began when people were tampering with the timers for the basketball court lights. Eventually, they had to take the timers down for fear that the tampering would cause someone to be electrocuted.

Then, the wooden tables were targeted, costing the city in repair costs for new wood slats or paint. Walensky stated, "We couldn't keep replacing the wood. Some of the vandalism was simple, like hearts or initials carved, but



some of it was more graphic. The aluminium tables we replaced them with stopped it for awhile."

However, now vandals are taking to burning the aluminium tables that cost around \$1,300 each. Walensky said,

"We are asking for help from the Police Department, because we are trying to make the park better and give these kids something constructive to do. We put in the volleyball area with donated sand and leftover piping. Nothing

seems to help."

The vandalism also hits the 13th Street bridge with drawings and profanity painted underneath. The ide-

Chad Yarnall, of Cassville, was presented with a new F-150 Ford truck at Les Jacobs Ford last Friday. The truck was a raffle item provided by Missouri Ford Dealers to benefit the Missouri Farm Bureau Foundation.

Yarnall learned that his raffle ticket was the winner when Toby Keith announced his name just before taking the stage at the Missouri State Fair in Sedalia in August.

Farm Bureau president Blake Hurst presented the Yarnalls with the keys to a

crowd of around 20 on September 13.

The raffle hosted by the Missouri Farm Bureau raised the largest amount in the program's history bringing in \$54,382 in tickets sold. The funds go to agricultural scholarships, educational and leadership programs throughout the state.

Hurst said, "There were hundreds of Farm Bureau members who enthusiastically took part in the single biggest fundraiser the Foundation has ever had." He went on to add, "We are extremely grateful to the Missouri Farm Dealers for their

generosity. We have a great working relationship with Ford, and we very much appreciate our partnership."

The Foundation for Agriculture was created 17 years ago. Since then, more than \$1.7 million has been raised to further agricultural education.

After being presented with the keys, Yarnall said, "I'm just ecstatic about winning this truck. I'm grateful to both Missouri Farm Bureau and the Missouri Ford Dealers for making this possible. It's going to be fun driving it."

SWEPCO claims not pursuing Route 109

Southern Barry County residents have been concerned about a possible power line being built through Missouri. As of now, it appears that Barry County will not be affected by the proposal as the company is hoping to choose a more practical route.

On August 26, a meeting was held in Little Rock, Arkansas, regarding recent plans for the major power company Southwestern Electric (SWEPCO) to build a power line route in the area. Many residents in the northwest Arkansas (NWA) area have been battling the issue, and questions arose about re-directing the line up into southwest Missouri to avoid the heavily populated area in NWA along I-540.

SWEPCO has proposed five different routes for the project, debating which would be more feasible for the company. Careful decisions must be made regarding the lines because of the possible damage it would cause the land. The lines would claim a 150-foot-wide path, and the electrical transmission towers would be 150-feet-tall and travel 25 miles though Missouri. If the lines were built in Barry County, many residents and businesses would be forced to move.

During the meeting, Route 109 (the re-directed line set to go through Missouri) was one of the lowest ranked alternatives out of all of the route, and Route 33, going through NWA, was the preferred choice. As of now, SWEPCO is not a public utility in Missouri, and if that route is chosen, there would be additional delays. A power line cannot be built in the state without serving Missouri customers.

"SWEPCO commissioned an environmental impact study; the study included southern Missouri to provide opportunities to avoid congestion issues in the northwest Arkansas area," said a statement taken from SWEPCO's application to the Arkansas Public Service Commission for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need.

As of now, SWEPCO has only been seeking permission from the Arkansas Commission because that is the preferred route. They are aware of additional meetings if the decision is made to use Route 109, and land owners would be notified. Peter Main, public relations specialist for SWEPCO, stated, "We are aware of the chal-

lenges of dealing with a route in both states.”

“During the August 26 meeting, SWEPKO indicated that Route 109 was not preferred. There would be additional cost, and there was little to no mention about this route. However, Senator Sater is concerned for Missouri residents, and specifically, for the property affected with no

benefit from the power line,” stated Tucker Jobs, chief of staff for Senator Sater. Jobs attended the Arkansas Public Service Commission’s meeting last month.

As of now, there is no direct concern for Missouri residents regarding the SWEPKO-proposed power line.

ology was that if the “No Loitering” signs were displayed, then the police can confront the vandals without being accused of harassment.

At last week’s City Council meeting, Alderman Ann Hennigan made the motion to have the signs removed, but it was not supported by the other members. The issue remains that something needs to be done to deter the damage being done at city parks.

Walensky has called other cities to brainstorm about what they do to prevent vandalism. He said, “A five or six year old child at the park shouldn’t have to see some of those images on the park tables. It isn’t fair to the people who use the park for its purpose.”

Surprisingly, Walensky said, “Some kids are becoming our biggest allies after doing this and serving community service. They are

speaking out about it to the other kids.” Walensky has worked with kids in the past who were caught tearing up the grass with their cars. Instead of pressing charges, he had the teens come and reseed the grass.

“I told them since they did it, they had to fix it,” he said. Obviously, if it is a repeat offense or extremely damaging, he is in favor of prosecuting the culprits.

The bottom line is that fixing all of the equipment being vandalized is costing the Public Works Department money that could be spent elsewhere improving the facilities or creating new areas for the public to enjoy. Walensky stated, “This is not a good use of park resources.”

However, city officials and police officers are not the only members of the society dismayed at the vandalism issue. There are teenagers who go to the park to use

the facilities that have felt the change since the vandalism has increased.

When asked if they noticed the new signs, some Cassville High School Students said that they had. The group claims that the police have asked them to move in the past since the signs were placed. “Cops have questioned us when we’ve been here about the vandalism. We’ve seen it, but we don’t know who does it,” stated Bridgett Elkins.

Jacob Lannum, another student, said, “This is the only place we have to hang out in Cassville without looking suspicious. We don’t want to lose the tables.”

The group says they try to clean up the trash that others often leave behind, claiming that they don’t want the park to be a mess since they use it everyday. Lannum went on to say, “Where else are we supposed to loiter? We don’t want to lose the park.” Elkins agreed with him, “I wish people weren’t so immature.”

The Cassville City Council plans to discuss the loitering ordinance again at their next meeting in October.

Presidential Major Disaster Declaration

Five Missouri counties were designated as contiguous disaster areas due to damages and losses caused by severe storms and flooding which occurred August 8 - 14, 2013. The five counties are: Barry, McDonald, Ozark, Stone and Taney. All counties listed above were designated disaster areas on September 4, 2013, making all qualified farm operators in the designated areas eligible for low interest emergency (EM) loans from FSA, provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible counties have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Loans for physical losses must be used to replace or repair damage to buildings, fences or to compensate the farmer for losses of basic livestock, stored crops, or supplies on hand, equipment, etc., that was lost due to the disaster. Loans for production losses may also be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock or to make payments on real estate or chattel debts. Generally, loans for production losses cannot be approved until crops have completed their production cycle or have been harvested.

In order to qualify, a farmer must have suffered a 30 percent loss that was essential to the successful operation of the farm.

USDA also has made a variety of other programs available to assist farmers in recovering from the disaster, including the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP); Federal Crop Insurance; and the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program.

It isn't too late to plant a fall garden if you know where to start. The growers with the Garden Sass Farmers Market of Cassville offered up some helpful suggestions for planting a fall garden if you're just now getting around to planning it.

Jay Reed, a market vendor from Exeter, said, "The best time to plant a fall garden is mid-August, but it isn't too late for some things like leafy greens."

The best time to grow some leafy favorites is when the weather turns

cool, and you aren't fighting with the heat to keep them watered. Now is the time to plant lettuce, spinach, kale, mustard greens and turnip greens. Some greens tend to go bitter in the heat from lack of water, but that isn't the case with fall crops.

Reed suggested planting pansies and lettuce together in a front planter for aesthetics and sustainability. "It is relatively inexpensive to get a few packages of pansy and lettuce seeds, and in three weeks, you have a beautiful, edible container."

Pansies are a pretty, edible addition to salads and other sides. Kids especially enjoy eating flowers as a novel idea.

Sherry Tucker, another Garden Sass member, suggested arugula this time of year. She stated, "Arugula is really popular right now. It adds a nice spicy flavor to your salad."

With rising food costs, growing a small fall garden, even if you live in town, can save you plenty from your grocery budget. Certain herbs like cilantro thrive in cooler weather as well.

If you're thinking ahead for next year, Reed added that it is a perfect time to condition your garden's soil.

Any type of bulb start, such as garlic, shallots and tulips, can be planted now and will be ready next year. Garlic and shallots planted in September will be ready the following June.

Many transplants like trees and shrubs also do well in cooler temperature. It gives the root structure time to establish without struggling for hydration from the heat of summer.

Finding your favorite fishing hole might now come with the touch of a screen with the new apps developed by the Missouri Department of Conservation. Two apps are now available for both Apple and Android users through the MDC.

The first app is called Find MO Fish. The app shows locations of MDC public boat ramps for all major lakes, rivers and streams in the state of Missouri. It also shows the locations of underwater fish structures, making it easier to find locations of fish you may be

looking for.

One new feature of the preexisting app is the Best Bets feature. Best Bets lists certain fish species and allows you to click on a guide to show where either other anglers or MDC staff members report there to be good fishing.

If you click on the Best Bets button, a list appears of areas popular for that species with a current weekly fishing report or an annual fishing prospects report for each area.

The other app that created by the MDC is the MO Fall Color app gives users fall color scenes

from all over the state. It also allows you to post your own pictures and share them with Facebook friends or others. Each photo provides GPS navigation information as well. The app automatically provides weekly fall color reports for various areas in the state. The app will become active from September through November.



Override for Volunteer Health Services Act

Two arrested for violent bar fight

Cassville's Senator David Sater's Volunteer Health Services Act, also called SB 129, gained momentum in Jefferson City in recent weeks. The bill, vetoed by Governor Nixon in July, received an override by the House and Senate. The bill will now go into effect on October 11, 2013.

State Representative Eric Burlison, R-Springfield, led the effort to override the veto in the House. On Wednesday, September 11, bipartisan super majorities in both chambers voted to override the bill.

SB 129 was spearheaded by Senator Sater as a way to make free healthcare services available to low-income Missourians without increasing costs to the state budget. In an interview, Sater questioned Governor Nixon's motives for vetoing the bill when it would save Missouri taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars over time.

The Volunteer Health Services Act will make it

possible for health care professionals to provide free medical services to Missouri citizens without being licensed in the state. Currently, if a doctor or nurse is licensed in another state, they cannot volunteer in Missouri because of malpractice concerns.

SB 129 provides clear rules regarding malpractice claims, protecting the state from having to provide legal services to personnel licensed elsewhere without putting citizens at risk for not being able to pursue damages for negligence.

Several other states have similar bills with no negative effects to healthcare received by residents. Nixon's original complaint was that the bill did not provide ample discourse if a volunteer provided sub-par care. Sater offered a rebuttal that the bill did have precedent for such a situation.

Burlison stated, "SB 129 eliminates a barrier that has long hindered volunteers trying to provide professional health care services in

Missouri. By harnessing the benevolent spirit of Americans across the country, we can provide free medical care to the needy and disaster-stricken of our state."

Many volunteer organizations that provide services near Missouri's borders are excited at this new opportunity. Remote Area Medical, a charitable Tennessee-based group, provide events that offer weekend-long opportunity for the under-served in various states to get free dental, eye and general healthcare. It isn't unusual for people to drive hours and camp out in their cars overnight to ensure their spot in line at the events.

RAM showed up after the tornado in Joplin, but volunteers were turned away because they were not licensed in Missouri. The prospect of volunteers serving Missouri citizens has the capacity to improve quality of life and also save taxpayers money.

Sater said, "Senate Bill 129 is a big step toward addressing access to care in Missouri. I look forward to more doctors, nurses, dentists and pharmacists now being able to donate their time and talent to help their fellow citizens."

Two men were arrested late Saturday night for allegedly assaulting a man behind Diamond Lilly's Bar in Cassville. The victim sustained serious physical injuries and needed medical attention.

Cassville Police Officers were dispatched to the bar around 10:30 p.m. on September 14 for an assault. The two suspects fled on foot while officers found the victim requiring medical attention.

Witnesses indicated that the suspects, Ricky Robinson, of Rogers, Ark., and Jerrod Johnson, of Seligman, were hitting and kicking the victim behind the bar. Both victim and witnesses identified the suspects. The two men were friends with the victim and had arrived with

him at the bar earlier in the evening.

Both suspects were found within two hours in the area near the bar. Police indicated that both were covered in blood that was not their own and highly intoxicated.

Neither suspect was interviewed because of their intoxicated conditions. The

victim sustained serious physical injury due to kicks and punches according to the affidavits of probable cause.

The victim is believed to have a broken nose, jaw, ribs and possible kidney and internal damage. Injuries confirmation is pending further evaluation and testing.

On January 23, 2013, the defendant violated his terms and conditions of an order of protection by being at the victim's residence and stealing items off of the front porch.

Among articles found were many projectile points (arrows), implements, including scrapers, drills, anvils, hammers, mortars, pottery shards and other items, including one human burial.

Stones from cemeteries in this area were re-located to other sites. The old bridge constructed in the late 1920's at the site of the old Morris Ferry was destroyed and travelers, including school children, were ferried across the lake by boat until the new bridge was built.

The construction of Central Crossing Bridge between Shell Knob and Viola was approved July 11, 1957, with the federal government con-

tributing \$1,208,800 and the State of Missouri \$519,300 to cover the cost of building the bridge and its approaches. The bridge was completed and dedication services were held at the bridge September 25, 1960.

In the new Shell Knob, few landmarks remain from the old days. A log cabin or two, a few old houses, and some store buildings remain. The old Painter Cemetery, established before the Civil War, still serves the needs of the community. The earliest marked burial is that of Elisha Painter with the date of death 1862, for whom the cemetery was named.

County, Missouri near Hartsville. Eli served in the Civil War from Aug. 20, 1862, until Dec. 31, 1864.

Family stories say that his horse's name was Bullet and that Bullet would charge when he heard a bugle call no matter what Eli Washington wanted. This was the reason Eli was caught behind enemy lines where he was shot and sent to the General Hospital in Little Rock, Arkansas.

He developed pneumonia and never recovered his health. He was discharged as a disabled Veteran. He died three years later of lung disease. Special Census shows Eli was a private in Company 5, Regiment 5, 16 Calvary.

During the war, Eli Washington noticed a girl about eight years old following the soldiers and scavenging food left over from the horses. Eli told this girl to go to his place in Hartsville and tell his wife that he had sent her and that she was to stay with the family.

Elinda was not happy, saying they barely had enough food for their own, but if Eli sent her then she could stay. This girl was Manecia "Caroline" Cuthbert. Caroline stayed with the family, marrying Eli and Elinda's oldest living son, John Savage, on the April 9, 1871.

Emory Melton's book *150 Years*, available at the Barry County Advertiser in Cassville.

After the establishment of at least two physicians and Shell Knob Post Office in 1872, the town began to grow. By the turn of the century, a hotel, drug store and two or three mercantile establishments were present. Perry Epperly was the local blacksmith. In 1914, at one of the fourth of July celebrations, a man named Holman was shot and killed.

The turning point for Shell Knob came in the 1950's with the establishment of the Table Rock Lake. There were county roads connecting Cassville to Shell Knob built in 1932 that the state made a Farm to Market Highway, which connected Cassville to Viola just east of Shell Knob. Bridgeway Plaza was developed in the early 1960's. This was the first commercial area which is now called Shell Knob.

Shell stories over time

John Thomas “Tom” Hardman, 1876-1945, son of John and Mary (Carmichael) Hardman married Sarah Britton Jan. 6, 1896. John Hardman was instrumental in getting a bridge over White River at the mouth of the James. Disabled in a farm accident, he was Judge of Eastern District of Barry County.

The Shell Knob Tomato Cannery was owned by William Amos Lloyd and his wife, Sylvania (Clark) Lloyd. It was located down what is now 39-5 out of old Shell Knob.

Isaac Epperly became a partner in the cannery. After the death of his wife, Sylvania, William found himself in financial trouble, and Isaac took over the Cannery.

Isaac moved the cannery into Shell Knob

(across from where the old Epperly and Cupps Store now sits) and changed the name to the Epperly Tomato Cannery. The equipment was later sold to Ashley Mixon who had a black-eyed pea cannery in Texas.

Mrs. Kimball, wife of Rev. Virgil Kimball, was thrown from a buggy and killed in a run-away about one and a half miles south of Shell Knob on a Thursday morning. Mrs. Kimball had spent Wednesday night at the home of J. W. Brock attending her grandson, Willis Brock, who was sick with typhoid fever and was returning home in company with her granddaughter, Miss Mayme Brock, when the sad accident occurred.

Mrs. Kimball was driving their family mare with a bridle without a throat

latch. The mare, being in a dissatisfied condition, worked off the bridle, causing her to become excited and run away. Mrs. Kimball and Miss Brock were thrown out of the buggy. Mrs. Kimball was advanced in age and her injuries proved fatal within a short while after the accident. Miss Brock was only slightly injured.

At one time, the Shell Knob area had five schools. Viola had two. One set on the Stone County side was called Hideout. A storm blew down the school in around 1913. The students met at the Masonic Lodge in Viola.

The second Viola School was next to the Viola Cemetery. When it was moved in 1913 to across from where the Green Shores entry is now, it was doubled in size. Therefore, it was called the Long Again School.

A brief history of SK

Shell Knob was so named for the family of Henry Schell, Sr. Henry Schell, Sr. married Elizabeth Yoachum, Oct. 17, 1835, the same year Barry became a county. Henry and Elizabeth Schell established a trading post at the foot of the mountain (now on YY Hwy.), which became known as Schell's Trading Post.

When the Post Office was established in 1872, the name Shell Knob was chosen from the list sent in to Washington.

The first settlers to this area built their log cabins by or near a spring, planting grain and vegetables in the rich fertile soil of the bottom land along White River. Later, settlers built near the creeks and on the upland away from the river.

We do not know the names of the earliest settlers. We know Native Americans occupied the land there before the settlers moved in. Abundant evidence of their residence was found by early settlers and up into the present history.

Shell Knob is located in Township 22N, Range 25W, Section 9 &10 on Table Rock Lake. Goodspeed's 1888 History of Barry County, Missouri, has a record of the first land buyers in this township. The settlers who had preempted land (located on the land and built improvements) were given first chance to purchase. The land was offered for sale Sept. 20, 1847.

Construction of Table Rock Dam brought about a drastic change in the small town. Ground breaking for Table Rock Lake was held at Branson on October 10, 1954. The dam was completed in August 1958.

In 1954, an archaeological research team from the State of Missouri, composed of Robert T. Bray, Richard A. Marshall and James Haswell, began excavating Indian shelters along the White River. Prior to the impoundment of water of Table Rock Lake, evidence of three separate cultures were found.

One of these the so-called archaic societies existed as long as 5,000 years ago.

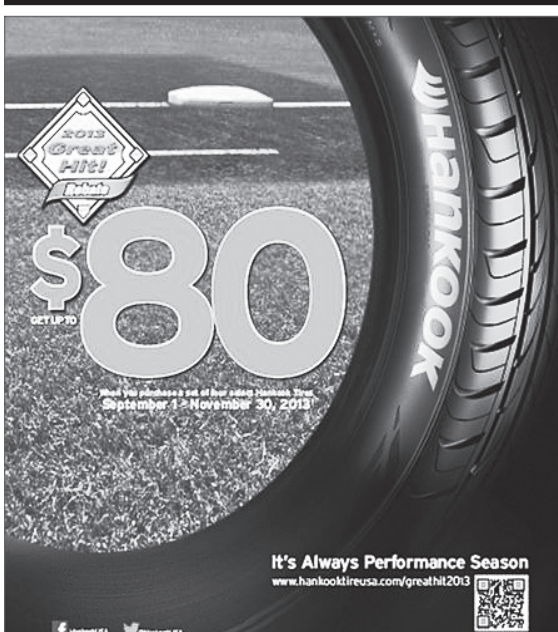
