Shell Knob Festival a Shakin' success

Last Saturday, September 21, Shell Knob saw another successful Shakin' in the Shell Festival. The event saw between 4,000 and 4,500 people, an increase from previous years. It took 78 volunteers to make the event possible, generating money to provide funding for a variety of local charitable causes as well as funds to support the Chamber of Commerce.

The event came to life with a car show, 52 craft vendors and 11 food vendors. There was also a beer garden, a root beer garden for the younger crowd and an activity area.

Essential to the amount of funds raised was the decision to cut expenses and rely more heavily on volunteers this year. By utilizing community volunteers, there

were no expenses for the car show judging, ticket selling, drink sales or shuttling of people from the parking area to the event. The result was more revenue generated for the Shell Knob area.

This year, Shakin' had two bands and a DJ for entertainment. The children's area was made possible through a \$5,000 donation from Rick and Marcia Perkins of Paradise Cove Camping Resort. Kelly Prohaska, owner of Nonna's Nummies, organized and ran the children's activities, including dressing as a clown for entertainment and operating the dunk tank.

The event featured multiple inflatable bounce houses, pony rides, a rock climbing wall and other rides. Tickets could be purchased individually for the activities, or people could buy a wrist-

band to include all of the activities for as many times as they wanted.

Overall, it was a successful day that provided family entertainment for people

from all over the area.

Facilities open to Industrial Tour group

The number of industrial plants in the area is often overlooked by those unaware of the many businesses that take root in Cassville. Part of the industrial success of the area is due to the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC).

To showcase the work that the IDC does, they paired with the Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce for an industrial tour that included All-Points Recycling, J and M Pallet and the new FEMA shelter.

The IDC's first meeting was in 1955. At that time, there were 2,000 shares at

\$25 per share. The IDC had 30 to 40 shareholders at that point. Today, the IDC is still very active, but only 20 shareholders are still active and living in the area.

According to Stan Kelley, chairman, "They formed to aid, facilitate and try to promote jobs via industrial development to bring job opportunities to Cassville." Today, it seems clear that the IDC has brought many different businesses to the area."

Their objective is usually to get businesses to come to or expand in Cassville. Examples include: Fasco, Justin Boot, ThorCo, Arning and Lucky Strike.

Kelley went on to say, "Today's environment is harder to bring businesses to smaller communities because of the competition. Sometimes success means just maintaining current jobs."

The day started out with breakfast provided by Devon and Annette Henderson at the United Methodist Church on 7th and Gravel in Cassville. Mindi Artherton, of the Chamber, gave out door prizes to kick off the tour before Kelley spoke to the group.

The first stop on the tour was All-Points Recycling. Leslie Smith owns the business with her mother, Brenda Fletcher. The company began in 2006. The office is run by Smith and Fletcher, along with two more family members.

The all-woman run company continues to expand beyond the space they have. The company moved from Hilltop to their current location at 800 West Street because they outgrew their previous facility.

All-Points does full service recycling and also acts as a brokerage firm for materials that they cannot break down. One of the only materials that they do not accept is glass, simply because no recycling plants will pay for it.

At this point, the facility owns 30 trailers that act as

Habitat benefit raises big funds

The Habitat for Humanity of Cassville hosted its annual fundraiser last Saturday. The event saw around 75 people attend, which was slightly down from prior years. The event auctioned off gift baskets, held a raffle for a Branson vacation, watched the Texans and ate a meal to raise funds for the non-profit foundation.

Habitat auctioned off different themed baskets at the benefit, including a car wash basket, scrap booking basket and more. The auction alone brought in around \$340.

The event also held a raffle for a Branson Getaway that included two tickets to the Sight n Sound Theatre, two tickets for the Showboat

Branson Belle, two tickets to Dixie Stampede and a motel of the winner's choosing for three nights. The winner of the raffle was Brad Shoer of Cassville.

Even with the attendee numbers down slightly, the event still raised around \$1,600, up \$600 from last year.

The event was catered by The Family Room, of Monett. The Texans, formerly of The Passion Play in Eureka Springs, performed music and offered up laughs for the adults and kids alike in the audience.

The benefit also welcomed in new board members for the local Habitat

business drop-off bins and 2 semi-trucks to transport the containers to the facility. While they prefer domestic business, six to seven containers a month are exported due to a lack of desire for the materials in the United States.

All-Points has four employees in the office, nine in the plant and two truck drivers. The plant employees process from community bins that individuals can drop items into but also large quantities from businesses that fill trailers for the group.

The different machines at the facility all have different names to help identify them, but the names give the machines personalities. Maxine, a densifying machine for Styrofoam, processes 400 pounds of material an hour on her own. That means a lot of product to ship out.

At this point, Smith says in order to keep up with the amount of Styrofoam they could process, they would need a night shift and have the densifying machines running all the time.

The next stop on the tour was J and M Pallet Company owned by Jeff and Michelle Bolton. Jeff began the company 15 years ago with a hammer and sack of nails. Today, the Christian-based company has 13 employees and will be adding an additional 8,100 square feet of space to their shop soon.

J and M makes pallets as small as 10 inches and as large as 14 feet depending on what the customer wants. The company sells their pallets mostly to the Monett area, not expanding beyond an hour travel time. However, their customers ship pallets all over the world.

One way the company expanded their market was by purchasing a large kiln to heat treat the wood, something necessary for pallets to be able to be exported. The machine will run at 195 degrees for two and a half to three hours to make sure the wood is safe for travel.

One machine in the shop can make 20 to 25 large pallets an hour and up to 50 smaller pallets in the same

time frame. They also do three to four semi loads of pallet repairs a week. Part of their broken pallets come in from All-Points.

The turnaround for most orders with J and M is the same day. Beyond pallets, they also ship picnic table kits and wood for park benches. Anything their customer requests, they will produce if they are able.

The final stop on the industrial tour was the Cassville School District's FEMA shelter. The shelter allows for a capacity of 1,580 people to safely occupy the space in the event of a tornado.

Richard Asbill, superintendent of the district, led the group through the facility. A crew was on-site putting together the chair-back bleachers at the facility.

While the primary purpose of the shelter is for the safety of the students in the event of a disaster, the building is also used as a community building for the district. The district provided many upgrades to the building to make it more functional

for school and community events.

Everything about the building, even the angle it was constructed, was to ensure the safety of students at the Cassville Elementary, Intermediate and Middle Schools.

The Fall Show in October will be held at the FEMA building. That will be the first

opportunity for the community as a large group to see the facility and all of its features.

When drilled, the entire student body evacuated from their classrooms and made it to the shelter in less than four minutes. Most tornadic events, such as Moore, Oklahoma's storm, gives about thirty minutes warning,

meaning Cassville students will be safe in the event of a major storm.

The IDC's industrial tour had around 30 people from the community attend. It provided a lot of information on what a variety of local industries do and how it provides jobs for the community.

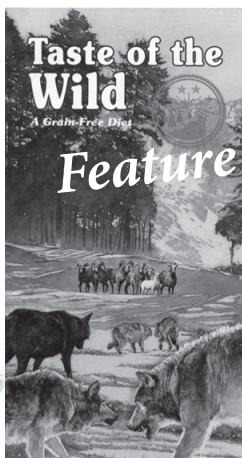

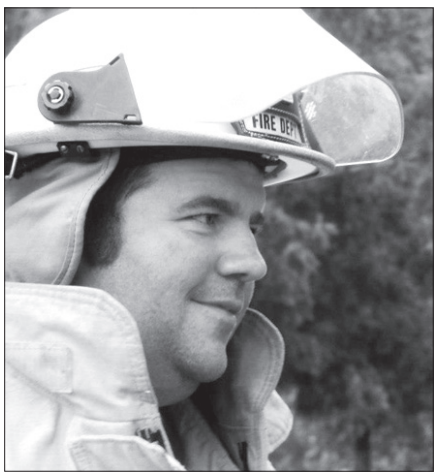

Tommy Ray has been with the Butterfield Fire Department since 1998, serving alongside his father for years. His family has a big presence in the community, and

many are banding together to help raise funds to cover the medical bills accrued during Tommy's hospital stay.

A benefit will be held on Saturday, October 5, from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. The fundraiser will be held at the Butterfield Community Center City Park. Admission will be \$6 for adults and \$3 for children under ten. They will be serving BBQ, hamburgers, hot dogs, chips and drinks.

There will also be a car bash, pumpkin painting activity, a dunk booth, horse rides, a duck pond, face painting and karaoke from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m.

The Point offers a place to stay for the needy

The Point Church in Cassville has been helping families overcome hardships for three years. The church provides six bungalows for families to get back on their feet.

They offer shelter for the homeless, those who have just left jail, are in between stations in life, recently unemployed and struggling married couples. The church doesn't just provide people with shelter, they also show them a new way of living.

"We try to teach them that you don't have to keep on doing the same thing you always have. There's a different life you can live," stated the Point Church pastor Dallas LaCaze. The bungalows are one bedroom and one bathroom with a kitchen. Five are newly remodeled.

However, the bungalows have been there since the 1950's and are in need of some restorations such as new roofs. The Point has also started a garden program to feed residents and raise chickens.

In an attempt to help the visitors re-enter into society, the church helps residents get jobs. They must spend the money wisely and learn how to save it as well.

The bungalows are funded through the church and donations.

Several churches help by taking care of a bungalow. Emmanuel, First Baptist of Washburn and First Baptist of Cassville all each fund one house. Dallas LaCaze and his wife, Lindsay, have been with The Point for three years with their six children. They originally come from northwest Arkansas.

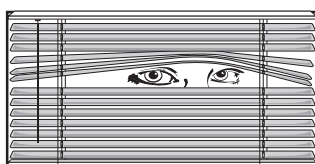

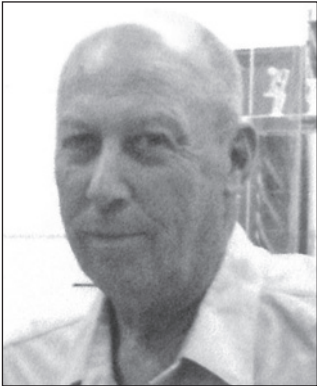

Sexual predator sentenced by BC jury

In a two-day jury trial at the Judicial Center last week, Jerry Don Bilyeu, a 31 year old Stone County resident, was tried in the Probate Court as a sexually violent predator. Bilyeu had previously been found guilty of a sexually violent offense: child molestation in the first degree. Upon serving his sentence at Farmington, Missouri, in the Missouri

State Prison System, he was charged with having been a sexually violent predator by the State Department of Mental Health.

He was previously charged in Stone County, but the case was moved to Barry County on a change of venue.

The jury, made up of six men and six women, heard the two days' worth of testimony, mainly coming from

witnesses for the state, relative to the mental capacity of the defendant, but deliberations were brief when the jury heard the evidence and the court's instructions and went into deliberations.

The case was presided over by Probate Court Judge Robert Foulke, and in keeping with the jury verdict, he entered a Judgment and Commitment Order on Jerry Don Bilyeu, who will be transported back to Farmington. His judgment reads as follows:

"Respondent has been found, by clear and convinc-

ing evidence, to be a sexually violent predator under Mo. Rev. Stat. 632.480, by a unanimous jury verdict on the 20th day of September, 2013.

"It is therefore ordered and adjudged that Respondent is a sexually violent predator and, as such, is committed to the custody of the director of the Department of Mental Health for control, care and treatment until such time as Respondent's mental abnormality has so changed that he is safe to be at large."

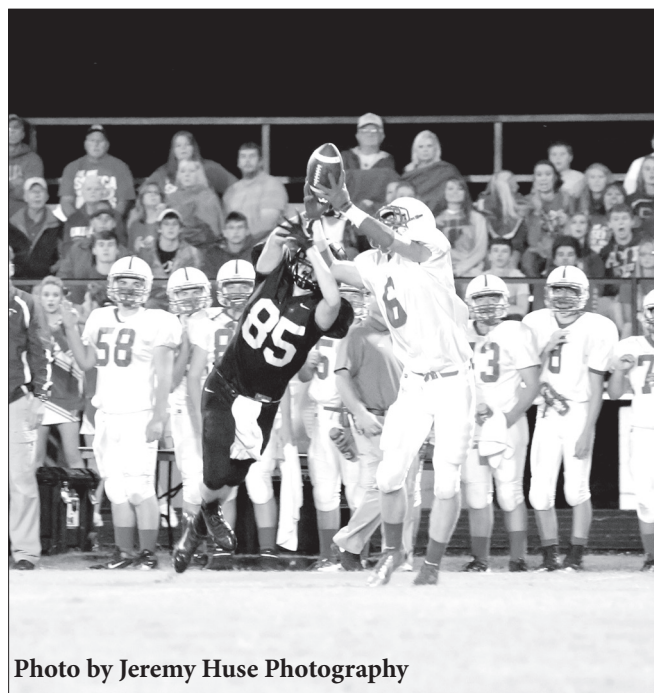
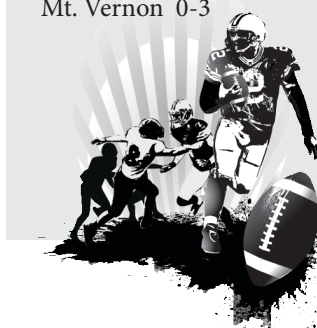

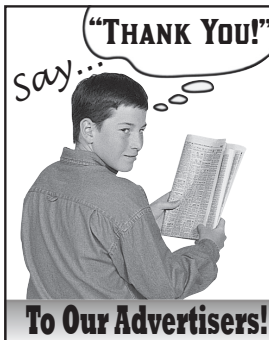

Free insulin course for local diabetics

For diabetics, the notion of progressing to take insulin can be a scary prospect. For locals, one of their peers can help educate them on how they can better manage their diabetes without feeling like they are failing to manage their disease.

Local Corps-run parks face funding loss

Local parks such as Campbell Point, Mill Creek and Old Highway 86 within the Table Rock Park system are concerned with the current decisions being made by the U.S. Corps of Engineers leaders in Washington, D.C.

On Friday, September 14, the Corps issued a press release stating that, "Corps have performed a legal review of all cooperative joint management agreements with nonprofit, cooperating

associations and determined that the Corps is operating outside of its authority."

The Corps entered into a lease agreement in March 2012 regarding eight parks including ones that would effect Barry County. Fees from this agreement with the Corps for the 2012-2013 year are \$1.6 million, which is the cost to operate the Table Rock Lake park system.

The agreement was canceled on Friday because the foundation is no longer able

to operate the Corps properties or conduct tours of Table Rock Dam. The foundation was notified on Monday, September 16, that after Friday, they could not spend any of the fee money collected on the Corps. Without being able to conduct tours, the foundation will no longer be able to operate. While they're still allowed to run the gift shop in the visitors center, this will not pay to keep the foundation up and running. With three full time and

ten part time employees, it would not support the continuation of their jobs.

Many are shocked by the three-day notice given to the parks on the new decisions. As of August 25, 2013, the Foundation will no longer receive payments from the National Recreation Reservation System. Of the 34 to 36 parks affected, 29 are in the southwest. The funds being taken away will be sent to Washington, D.C. to go into U.S. Treasury funds.

Local Arvest Banks collect food for needy

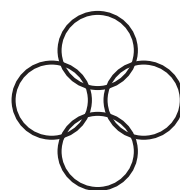



Circuit Judge sends 14 to prison

Elwyn N. Brown, age 57, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to class C felony possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance and class C felony possession of a controlled substance. He was sentenced to four years incarceration on September 16.

On July 15, 2011, Sheriff Mick Epperly, Agent Luckey and Deputy Cobb went to a residence on Farm Road 2210 in Shell Knob and searched the premises with permission of the owner, Shaun Nicholls. Located in the residence occupied by Brown was one plastic baggy with ½ gram of residue that field tested positive for methamphetamine, two used syringes, two marijuana pipes, 12 unidentified pills, hemostats, rolling papers, a propane torch, a lithium battery, two bottles of lye, two boxes of cold compresses, digital scales, one bottle of muriatic acid, Coleman fuel, two mason jars with clear solvent, one empty cold pack with ammonium nitrate removed, used white coffee filters, large metal pot with residue, plastic baggy with corners cut out and one baggy of marijuana seeds. There were remains of manufacturing equipment on the exterior of the home. Law enforcement officers also discovered eight marijuana plants.

Brown's initial charge of possession with intent to

manufacture was changed from a class B felony to a class C felony upon entering his guilty plea.

Stewart Carr, age 33, of Bella Vista, Arkansas, pled guilty to class C felony possession of a controlled substance and class C felony possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance. He was sentenced to four years incarceration on September 16, 2013.

The charge was changed from the initial class B possession to a class C possession upon entering his plea. He was originally arrested on June 23, 2013.

David Clark, age 32, of Rogers, Arkansas, pled guilty to a class C felony of stealing more than \$500 but less than \$25,000 on September 8, 2011.

He was sentenced to four years incarceration, but was paroled on February 20, 2013. His probation was revoked for violations on September 17. He will be serving an additional four years incarceration.

Lance Curran, age 30, of Exeter, pled guilty to a class D felony DWI-alcohol on July 19, 2011. He was originally sentenced to three years incarceration.

He went on parole on October 16, 2012, but his probation was revoked on September 17, 2013. He will be

serving shock incarceration until January 14, 2014.

Crystal Louise Fields, age 34, of Rogers, Arkansas, pled guilty to class C felony arson in the second degree and class C felony possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance on August 1, 2003. Her probation has been revoked until July 17, 2014.

Gregory D. Fitzgerald, age 29, of Purdy, pled guilty to class C felony possession of a controlled substance, tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and burglary in the second degree on September 16, 2013. He was sentenced to four and a half years incarceration.

On April 16, 2013, Officer Ryan Hutton, of the Monett Police Department, observed the driver of a vehicle turn away from him as if to hide while he was driving. When the officer checked the license plates, the plates came back as stolen.

When the officer attempted to stop the vehicle, the driver continued for another half of a mile, swerving into oncoming traffic lanes. Once the driver stopped, he told the officer that he did not know the plates were stolen.

The driver was identified as Gregory Fitzgerald. While doing an inventory search, the officer found two Xanax in the front of the vehicle.

The driver failed a field sobriety test and told officers that he had smoked methamphetamine prior to driving.

Garry Hinson, age 56, of Exeter, pled guilty to class C felony of possession of a controlled substance. Hinson was on probation prior to the incident, his probation was revoked and he was sentenced to three years incarceration.

Erin Johnson, age 30, of Pierce City, pled guilty to failure to register as a sex offender on May 31, 2011. She was released on probation, but her probation has been revoked as of September 17, 2013. She will serve 3 years incarceration.

Annber K. Moss, age 26, of Seligman, pled guilty to attempt to manufacture a controlled substance on April 16, 2012. Her probation was revoked on September 17, 2013. She will be incarcerated until October 17, 2017.

Mark Pinner, age 60, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender in 2009 after running over a man with his 1985 Isuzu Trooper while intoxicated. The event took place outside of a bar in Eagle Rock. Pinner also left the scene of the crime without reporting the

incident.

Pinner served time and was allowed out on probation; however, his probation was revoked last week due to violations. On September 17, 2013, he was sentenced to two years incarceration for his crime.

Jeremy Rusher, age 36, of Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance, and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. He was sentenced to eight years incarceration.

Rusher and his girlfriend were arrested on August 20, 2013 when officers were investigating a claim that the couple were manufacturing methamphetamine in their home while their children

were asleep. The three children in the home were ages five and under and were placed in protective custody.

Gary David Taylor, age 43, of Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and class C felony stealing in 2006. He was then allowed release on probation.

Taylor's probation was revoked on September 16, 2013. He will be serving five years incarceration.

Jimmy Lee Taylor, age 34, of Exeter, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree on October 16, 2012. He was allowed release on probation.

His probation was revoked on September 17, 2013, and he will serve five years incarceration.

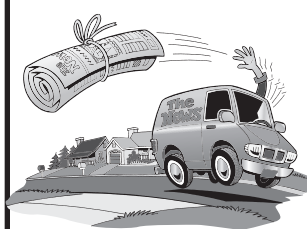

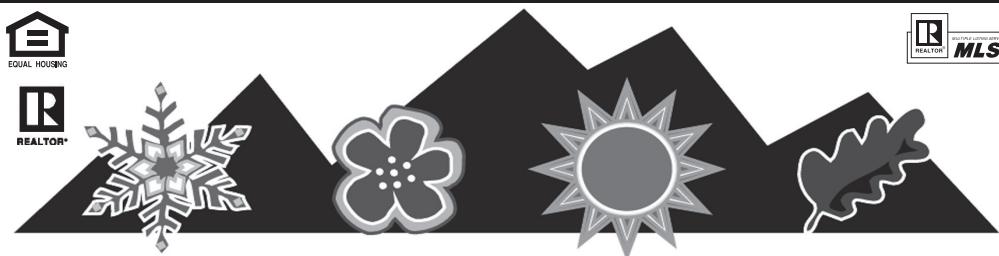

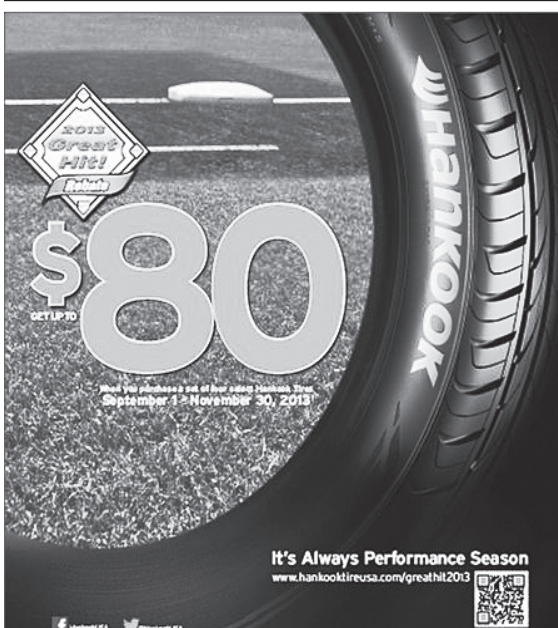
