KY3 celebrates 60 years at Roaring River

On Wednesday, August 28, KY3's cameras were rolling for the news, but instead of a newsroom in the background, Cassville's beautiful Roaring River State Park was the backdrop. Around 450 people in the community came out for the event, according to Dusty Reid, Roaring River's park superintendent. The turnout was better than anyone could have expected.

KY3 chose Cassville as one of the nine small communities within the KY3 viewing area to spotlight during their 60th anniversary celebration. Steve Grant, Emily Wood and a large group of behind-the-scenes news crew set up across the river from the CCC Lodge at the park.

Many from the community were featured in the 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. newscasts to showcase the personalities of the area. Emory Melton

spoke with the crew and revealed one of Cassville's booming businesses is located below Melton's law office: Litho Printers and Bindery, in business for over 50 years.

Dr. Larry Quinalty cooked some of his famous peach enchiladas on camera with Steve Grant and Emily Wood. The Smiths of Smith's downtown spoke of what a joy it is to run a business in such a small, close-knit community. Perhaps that was one reason why the turnout for the Cassville broadcast surpassed all of the other on-site airings. Residents care about this area and what happens here.

Many gathered around to watch the broadcast and enter into the drawing for a free 60" TV provided by KY3; others were happy just to fish the peaceful banks of Roaring River, somewhat removed from the hustle and bustle of the news crew around them. That in and of

The City of Cassville paired with KY3 to shoot a commercial featuring Mayor Bill Shiveley and destinations around the area. It helped to

Rotary Club tours FEMA building

The Cassville Rotary Club welcomed speaker Richard Asbill, Superintendent of Casville Schools, to showcase the new FEMA building at their meeting on Wednesday, August 28.

Asbill opened the newly constructed building to the group for their luncheon as a show of thanks for the support the Rotary Club offered in getting the building completed. While a few details remain, the structure as a whole is finished.

2 1/2 years ago, the grant was written to request money from FEMA for a tornado shelter for the school. Asbill stressed, "We have made multiple upgrades to the security of our schools. Parents want to send their kids to school knowing that they are protected. This is designed to keep you alive and safe and should ease parents' minds that, 'Hey, my kid is safe' at school."

The project was no easy

feat, nor did it come with a small price tag. The original FEMA grant was for between \$1.1 million. The district had to match funds of \$388,063 to comply with FEMA's requirements. However, Asbill said that money was strictly for constructing a cement box. The district provided \$997,115 in additional funds for building upgrades to make the space more multipurpose.

Asbill stated, "We felt that we owed it to the tax payers to say that we spent a dollar of your money, but this is what we got out of it." While the original FEMA grant offered up a safe structure, by utilizing additional district funds, the building was upgraded for other uses for much cheaper than if they built a new structure.

The district had run into issues accommodating all of the programs put on by the school in the space it had available. Asbill stated that often the staff was rushing

to get an area prepared for a special school program, displacing students from their normal areas. In general, the elementary, intermediate and middle school were out of room for all that the district has going on.

As a tornado structure the building offers a safe zone for all of PreK through eighth grade students, school faculty plus additional members of the community. Any residents within a certain radius will be sent an official invitation from FEMA stating that the shelter is their official evacuation point in the event of a tornado warning.

When a tornado warning is issued, the new building's doors automatically unlock and the generator kicks on. At that point, the first person to enter the doors triggers the motion-activated lights, and the shelter is ready to go for anyone to use for safety.

The building will not be used for any other type of emergency because the structure must always be available for a tornado warning. If the community would need a temporary medical center or shelter for displaced residents in the event of a separate disaster, such as a flood, other school structures would be used, leaving

Man arrested for shooting at children

Troy Hinkle, age 35, was arrested on Monday, August 26, for allegedly shooting at two children in their backyard from a vehicle between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. outside of Monett

Deputy Kerry Hedrick, of the Barry County Sheriff's Department, was dispatched to the residence at 5683 Farm Road 1057, Monett, at 6:52 p.m. for a report that a vehicle had driven by and someone inside had shot at children playing in their yard. The parents of the children, Edna and Wesley Bricker, said they were inside their home when they heard a gunshot from behind their house.

Once outside, the couple saw an older model maroon station wagon turn north onto Farm Road 1057. As the vehicle drove away, the couple claimed they heard another gunshot.

Upon questioning, the two children told the deputy that a passenger directly be-

hind the driver extended a black handgun with a large barrel out of the window and fired at them while they were playing.

Missouri State Trooper Sargeant Gary Horton located the vehicle at Herds Truck Stop on Missouri Highway 37 in Monett. The vehicle, a maroon Buick Century, still held the 45 caliber pistol and a magazine. Samuel Johnson, a passenger in the vehicle, claimed Troy Hinkle fired a shot while they were driving.

Another officer, Detective Doug Henry, spoke with a woman jogging on Farm Road 1057 who also claimed she heard a gun shot around the time of the reported incident. She then stated she heard a vehicle accelerate in her direction and another shot was fired while the car was in motion. The jogger said she noticed four individuals in the vehicle and that they had firearms.

Hinkle was transported to the Cassville Police Department where he gave a test that showed his blood alcohol content to be 015. Hinkle is charged with class B felony unlawful use of a weapon. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$50,000 cash-only bond.

Several small community meetings have been held regarding the rising number of cats and dogs roaming the streets of the Cassville area.

Cassville Alderman Jan Anthony, Cassville Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr, Cassville Alderman Ann Hennigan, Cassville city clerk Karen Jennings, and concerned citizens have organized the meetings to discusses possible solutions to improve the situation for both the community and the animals at risk wandering the streets.

"There is a lot of ground work to be done and a lot of logistics to be worked out. There will be nothing in line for at least another six months," Hennigan states. The committee is looking into enacting a leash law to deter residents from allowing their animals to run

Dogs are territorial animals, and the more time a dog spends roaming and establishing its perceived territory, the more likely it is to become aggressive about defending that territory. A roaming dog will constantly expand those boundaries farther from home as it leaves scent marks.

The animal will be put under constant stress to defend that territory against other dogs. Even the sweetest dog can become more aggressive in temperament as the roaming continues. If a dog was not well tempered to begin with, it can become an extremely dangerous animal, and its territorial aggression can include attacks on wildlife, cats, other dogs and humans.

Young children are particularly vulnerable because they don't behave in ways that dogs expect, making

them more likely to be bitten. Dogs who have not been raised around children may not even recognize them as humans because of their erratic behavior.

Compounding problem in Cassville is that multiple roaming dogs tend to form packs, and dog packs can become far more aggressive than one dog roaming alone.

Concern about the number of stray dogs in the Cassville area has been an issue for years, but there is little that can be done about it. Currently there is no leash or licensing law on the books in the city, and even if there was, there is no animal shelter to house

On Tuesday, August 27, two people were arrested for selling drugs from their home in Seligman.

Robert Gonzales, Jr. and Whitney Vardeman were each charged with possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, use or possession of drug paraphernalia and endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree.

Gonzales was additionally charged with unlawful possession of a fire arm.

Officer Raymond Earnest, of the Seligman Police Department, was dispatched to the residence at 7186 Rolling Hills, the residence shared by Gonzales, Vardeman and their infant son, for a complaint of a fight in progress.

When Officer Earnest arrived, Gonzales was in his vehicle. The officer asked for his identification, but Gonzales denied having it with him. The officer then saw a wallet on top of a bag of marijuana

sitting on the passenger seat of Gonzales's vehicle.

After searching the vehicle and home, officers found the pair to be in possession of 2.7 grams of cocaine, 44.4 grams of marijuana, a small glass pipe with residue, a set of digital scales, two containers of marijuana seeds and \$500 cash. They also found an unregistered 9 mm pistol inside the home. Gonzales cannot be in possession of a fire arm because of a prior felony conviction.

Police Chief Gary Thornton stated that Gonzales had also been arrested on July 11 of this year in Oregon for a similar charge. However, his Oregon arrest was for an alleged possession and distribution of 37 pounds of marijuana.

Since Gonzales and Vardeman allegedly distributed drugs from the home where their infant son lived, both were charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree. They are currently being held in the Barry County Jail on \$10,000


29. Don Pluff, of the Central Crossing Volunteer Fire Department, was fighting cancer after experiencing many tragic losses in the last year.

Many of the building upgrades are not yet installed, including the 450-470 chairback seat pull-out bleachers. By purchasing collapsible bleachers, the building maintains its larger capacity for evacuations, but can also be used for events. Other upgrades include a 40' x 40' portable stage, acoustic panelling and a light and sound system.

The first public event to be held in the FEMA building will be the annual Fall Show this October. The area should hold 750-800 people for any given event.

On a daily basis, the building is open in the event that the classrooms need an indoor recess area, complete with rubber floors and basketball hoops.

"We are excited to be able to offer this to our students and faculty, but also to our community," Asbill stated. "Rotary Club has been one of our biggest supporters, so we wanted to open it up for them to see first."

While the building has many upgrades and improvements to make it an appealing building, where it counts is safety. When the school Samantha Barberio



Barry County Tax Sale results

Charlea Mills

Each year, the Barry County Collector auctions off property owing back taxes to the county. This year the auction was held in the historic courtroom in the Barry County Courthouse on Monday, August 26, at 10:00 a.m.

Janice Varner, Barry County Collector, offered 146 parcels of land to Missouri residents this year, a dramatic increase from 113 parcels in 2012. This year, 50 parcels sold, totalling \$22,185.95, over \$5,000 more than in 2012.

Of the parcels of land sold, all but two were sold to Barry County residents. The other two buyers purchasing land were from Joplin and Carthage. This year, 21 bidders took home the 50 properties offered at the sale.

While the primary purpose of the sale is to pay the taxes owed that are delinquent, other fees are included in the starting bid. Each parcel is offered for the amount of the back taxes owed against it, the publication fee

and recording fee as required

When a property sells for above the starting bid, the money is set aside to be distributed to the school district that each property lies in. The county does not see any profit from the auction.

The county has not sold every parcel offered at the sale in recent years. Prior to 2008, the county sold every property available.

In 2008, 65 parcel were offered. In 2009, the number jumped to 83. While each year fluctuates, there seems to be an upward trend of properties owing back taxes. In 2010, 62 parcels were available and 2011 had 75.

If a piece of land is not sold, it will be auctioned the following year. 96 of the parcels offered in 2013 did not sell and will be put up for auction again at the 2014 sale.

Barry County law day court cases

Anthony Lee Barnett, of Cassville, age 35, was charged with burglary in the 2nd degree. Barnett was sentenced to four years incarceration for his crimes.

On May 17 - 18 from 8 p.m. until 7 a.m., Barnett and an unknown accomplice kicked open the door of victim Dortha Clow's home on Farm Road 2070 in Purdy. They proceeded to enter the building and steal two lock boxes full of paper work belonging to the victim.

Jessica J. Biggs, of Cassvile, age 34, was charged with passing a bad check and received five years supervised probation for the crime.

On March 19, 22, 23, 25, 26 and 27, 2010 the defendant passed several checks totaling \$692.19. The checks were drawn upon 1st State Bank and made payable to Ball & Prier Tire and Shumaker Tire.

Biggs knowingly wrote checks that could not be paid. She must pay \$6,789.58 in restitution at \$125 per month beginning the first of Octo-

Charles C. Fonteneau Sr., of Seligman, age 45, was charged with assault in the first degree. He was then sentenced to five years supervised probation after receiving suspended execution of sentence for five years incarceration.

The felony took place on June 25, 2009, when the defendant attempted to cause serious physical injury to Charles McGarrah by hitting and cutting him with a knife.

Darien Hamm, of Marionville, age 19, was charged with stealing a motor vehicle. He was sentenced to four years incarceration on August 20th. On May 1, 2012, Hamm stole a red 2002 Hyundai Accent from Rheya Thomas. Hamm must also pay \$125 in

Kenneth Ray Hopper, of Cassville, age 52, was charged with assault in the 3rd degree. He was then sentenced to two years unsupervised probation after receiving a suspended imposition of sentence for two years incarceration. Hopper must also have no contact with victim, Chris Reagan.

On August 30, 2011, the defendant possessed a brown rifle, ready for use, and had an angry and threatening manner toward Reagan.



Steven Bradley Hunter, of Cassville, age 26, was charged with three felonies: burglary in the 2nd degree, tampering with a motor vehicle and property damage motivated by discrimination. Hunter was then sentenced to four years incarceration for

his crimes.

On March 31, 2008 the defendant entered a concession stand owned by the Cassville Booster Club and stole items. On April 2, 2008, Hunter defaced a 2007 Chevy Impala. On April 2, 2008, the defendant knowingly damaged a 1995 Toyota 4-Runner located in Cassville. Hunter spray painted the vehicle. The crime was motivated by the victim's race.

Anthony Larson, of Cassville, age 23, was charged with property damage in the 2nd degree. Larson was then sentenced to two years unsupervised probation after receiving a suspend imposition of sentence of two years incarceration.

On April 8, 2012, Larson was driving on 13th Street in Cassville in a 1995 green Chevrolet Camaro. He was attempting to pass another vehicle when he lost control of his vehicle. The Camaro travelled off the right side of the roadway, struck a barbed wire fence and a water hydrant before overturning.

The City of Cassville sought restitution for the damages on the hydrant totaling \$4,420.91.



Purdy church celebrates 130 years



Meeks Shakin' Gold Sponsor

Meeks, of Shell Knob, is Shakin' in the Shell's Gold Sponsor for the 2013 event. Store manager Eddie Davison offered some answers as to why Meeks chose to support the festival this year.

Davison stated, "We support any event that goes on that brings people to Shell Knob. We used to joke that Shell Knob is one of the best kept secrets on Table Rock Lake, and I think to some extent, that is still true.

"It's the right thing to do to support the Shakin' in the Shell to bring exposure, someone sowing the seed out there by participating, maybe we can add a little fertilizer to help it grow. The life of Shell Knob still today is people moving to the area and building their home. That is our industry. If we stop exposing Shell Knob to people, then our growth will stop."

Davison's history with Shell Knob provides him valuable insight. He moved took many different jobs, including working part time at one of the two lumber yards, as well as doing dynamite work for swimming pools, septic and road ditches.

In the summer of 1975, the local manager of what was then Shell Knob Lumber asked if he would be interested in coming to work. That began Eddie Davison's decades-long career in the lumber yard/home improvement business in Shell Knob.

Eddie said the current Meek's building was constructed in 1969 by the Putnam family, of Carthage, who at the time had around 25 lumber yards scattered around southwest Missouri and eastern Oklahoma. In 1976, a campaign was initiated to bring all of these stores under one umbrella and name: Tapjac.

The next owner, E. C. Barton, out of Jonesboro, Arkansas, bought Tapjac in May 2000 and operated until May of 2010 when Meeks bought the Shell Knob store along with six others in southwest Missouri. In its first year of ownership, Meeks made a substantial investment in the store itself, including changing out all of the store's fixtures and the addition of some 7,000 items to its in-

In the last 10 years, Eddie has seen a major change in the products used in homes,."For a long time our business was strictly new construction but now there is a lot more remodel/rework being done, even some situations where homes built on nice lots are torn down and new homes being built just because really nice lots are hard to come by."

Eddie observed, "Shell Knob has grown. It used to be if we had a really good crew built up during the summer, Shell Knob would fold up in the winter, and I would lay

Branson would score their final touchdown in the third quarter advancing themselves to a two-touchdown lead.


The Wildcats wouldn't



Purdy Schools go green with solar panels

After a grueling three-year process, the Purdy Recycling Project took a big environmental step on August 21st toward further energy independence.

With assistance from a Coover Grant from the Community Foundation of the Ozarks, the building, operated by the Purdy High Spanish School Club, now has a chance to produce all the power it needs from 18 solar panels mounted on

the roof. The project was completed by installer Derek Fulp and Davis & Son, LLC electrician Jay Biloki.

The Empire District Electric Company conducted field tests on the installation and then installed a net meter which records power consumed and power fed back to the Empire grid. The system initially generated about 1.3 kilowatts and has gradually increased to 2.2 kilowatts.

It appears to be generating more power than the machinery in the building will consume, although it will take a month to see where the monthly bill ends up. The club hopes that the monthly bill will be reduced as much as possible by selling excess power back to The Empire District Electric Company.

> The direct current produced by the panels runs through a Kako inverter, which converts it into alternating current like that of the existing power grid. Several key safety features are built into the inverter so that it will shut down during a power outage.

> All of these features had to pass a battery of tests before the connection could be completed. After an hour of consultation between all parties, the net meter was installed and the final testing was conducted. Electrician Jay Biloki noted, "Davis & Son, LLC is glad to be a part of the Purdy High School Spanish Club's Solar Project. We support renewable energy and are happy that people are looking into it."


"It was an amazing exer-

cise in careful collaboration," said Spanish Club advisor Gerry Wass.

"We learned so much from working with Empire today, and it was fascinating to be part of the whole process. The Empire workers, including Nate Morris, Tom Kirsch, Mike Havnes and Wade Palone. really impressed us with their professionalism and intense curiosity."

The building, which also powers the school sign and the baseball scoreboard, currently uses between \$38 and \$111 of electricity per month, depending on the season. So there is new reason to focus on shutting off every switch when workers leave the building.

The Spanish Club is proud to have completed the first known schoolaffiliated, commercialscale renewable energy project in southwest Missouri, helping Purdy distinguish itself in the areas of environmental consciousness and innovation.






