Universal Declaration of **Human Rights is 75 Years Old**

This Sunday, Decem- Roosevelt. ber 10, 2023, marks the Members of the 75th anniversary of the United Nations adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, UDHR. The creation of this document was accomplished by a committee of 18 members from various backgrounds over the period of two years and its culmination is widely credited to the efforts of for-

fledgling United Nations, which met for its first General Assembly in 1946, were still reeling from the horrors of the Second World War and were determined to never allow such atrocities to ever happen again. In addition to the UN Charter that established formally the coalition of coun-

mer first Lady, Eleonor Three Corners Firearms burglarized in early morning hours of Thanksgiving

Suspects are still at large for the burglary of a firearm store, which occurred in the early hours of Thanksgiving, in Washburn.

Three Corners Firearms was burglarized just after midnight on November 24. According to Barry County Sheriff Danny Boyd, the suspect(s) initially tried to enter through the rear of the building but were unsuccessful. They did enter the business through the front after prying through three separate doors. The thieves got away with eleven guns total, which included handguns, AR rifles, and shotguns.

Shop owner Steve Pendergraft stated that the thieves also took approximately \$275.00 from his cash drawer and a cell phone and money from his daughter-in-law's beauty shop, which is next door.

On December 1, the Sheriff's office was notified by an anonymous caller that a male subject had tried to sell some of the firearms at Ozark Beverage Company Convenience Store on Highway E in McDonald County. The caller stated they gave the information from one of the firearms to a Benton-

Three fatalities and two seriously injured in **Barry County crashes**

Pea Ridge woman dies in Washburn crash

A Pea Ridge, Arkansas, woman was killed just after noon on Monday, November 27, in a two-vehicle crash on Highway 90 in Washburn.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report filed by Cpl. K. Knight, the crash occurred when the eastbound 2020 Ford Transit, driven by Autumn Horton of Duneweg, was attempting to make a left turn, when the 2008 Jeep Cherokee, driven by Phillip Fonsworth McCorbey, of Pea Ridge, Arkansas, tried to pass Horton and was struck and traveled off the roadway and overturned. Fonsworth-McCorbey received moderate injuries. His passenger, Kimberly Rogers, of Pea Ridge, Arkansas, was fatally injured in the crash. Neither were wearing safety devices, and both were transported to Mercy Hospital in Springfield, where Rogers was pronounced dead by Dr. Yisang Wang just at 2 p.m. The 2020 Ford Transit received extensive damage; the 2008 Jeep Cherokee was totaled, and Brice's Towing of Cassville towed both.







Cyclist killed in Washburn crash







