# Wheaton Fastrip robbery suspect apprehended

Johnathan Worthington, 38, of Wheaton, has been apprehended following an armed robbery that involved the theft of approximately \$211 from the Fastrip convenience store in Wheaton.

According to a statement of probable cause filed by Wheaton Police Chief Clint Danforth, on January 5, 2023, an employee of the Wheaton Fastrip reported a robbery to the Wheaton Police Department. The individual reported that a male subject entered the store, pointed a firearm at him, and demanded money. The witness stated that he complied and reported the event to the police. Management from Fastrip stated that approximately \$211.00 in cash was taken from the register.

Per a follow-up report, it was concluded that in addition to Worthington, a second subject was also in the vehicle that was used for the robbery.

This individual was interviewed at the Barry County Sheriff's Office. During the interview, they stated that Worthington went into a convenience store to get money and, while pointing a gun at the clerk, took money from the store.

Worthington reportedly circled the store once, pulled back in, and put on his mask. He retrieved a firearm from under the driver's seat and entered the store.

This report matches the video surveillance footage obtained by Fastrip cameras. Additionally, the vehicle in the footage, a black 2008 Volkswagen Jetta, was recovered at a residence in Verona and belonged to Worthington.

After an investigation, it was determined that the subject was Jonathan Worthington, Chief Danforth states.

Worthington has a previous criminal history of domestic violence in California and was prohibited from possessing a firearm at the time of the robbery.

Worthington stands charged with one count each of robbery in the first degree, armed criminal action, and unlawful possession of a firearm. He was booked into Barry County Jail on the day of the robbery with a bond of \$100,000.

Osteoporosis develops with loss of bone mineral density, and bone mass decreases. This may lead to loss of bone strength and increased risk of fractures. It is a "silent" disease because there are typically no symptoms. It is the major cause of fractures in women after menopause and in older men. The most common sites are the hip, spine, and wrist. Bones may become so fragile that everyday stresses such as bending, lifting, or even coughing can cause a fracture. Last week I reviewed risk factors and some preventive steps. To diagnose osteoporosis, a bone mineral density (BMD) needs to be ordered. The dual-energy x-ray absorptiometry (DXA) measures the BMD of your skeleton, usually the hip and spine. If your BMD results are below a certain level, you will be diagnosed with osteoporosis, and your provider may recommend lifestyle changes to promote bone health and/ or medications depending on how low your BMD results

Treatment goals are to slow or stop bone loss and prevent fractures. Common recommendations are proper diet, exercise, quitting smok-



**Temporary WIC benefit** increase extended

Missouri WIC has announced the extension of the temporary increase of the Cash Value Benefit for Fruit and Vegetable Purchases (CVB) which began Jan. 5, 2023. The new amounts will be \$25 per month for child participants, \$44 per month for pregnant and postpartum participants and \$49 per month for breastfeeding participants. WIC is the Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children.

Eligible participants need to contact their WIC local agency to schedule an appointment to load the additional benefits on their eWIC card before redeeming any January benefits. Participants who redeem any January benefits before receiving the increase will not receive the increase until February.

Missouri WIC provides quality nutrition education, breastfeeding promotion and support, nutritious foods and referrals to health services. It is also one of the most successful, costeffective and important nutrition intervention programs in the country. 



**Bumpy Dirt Roads** "There's a bumpy dirt road before you get to the paved road." Rough dirt roads were part of my everyday life while growing up in the country. To get about anywhere, you first had to navigate a bumpy road before getting to the good one. I expect the market in 2023 to be a lot like that, bumpy in the beginning leading to a good ride.

U.S. stocks ended 2022 down, making it the worst year for stocks since 2008 as the market wrestled with high inflation and a potential recession.

Investors have started 2023 nervous about whether the Federal Reserve can tame inflation without damaging the economy too much. Economic growth and inflation seem to be slowing, encouraging investors that the Fed could be close to slowing or ending its rate hike policy. However, in the December 2022 Fed meeting minutes released on January 4th, the Fed officials said that rates might need to remain high for a while. Their statements seemed to be an attempt to squash investor optimism.

I think the markets in 2023 will be a "two-sided coin." The first side would be when the Fed raises rates at least one more time, making the first part of the year more

challenging. The second side would come after the Fed announces a policy change giving us the chance of a strong rally for the rest of the year. So this year is about when the Fed stops raising rates, not if.

The stock market has always recovered through many downturns, recessions, and political crises. Investors who are patient and can take advantage of market declines are usually rewarded.

Since 1950, the S&P 500 Index has averaged 15% and been positive 15 out of 18 years following down a year, according to LPL Research. LPL thinks the S&P could end 2023 at 4,400-4,500, which would be a 15-17% increase from now. So if we can endure the bumpy road in the short term, there is a chance we could get rewarded by year-end.

I enjoyed driving on dirt roads when I was first driving, especially sliding the rear end of my car around the corners like I was on the Dukes of Hazzard. There aren't as many dirt roads today because the counties keep paving them. But if you find yourself on a beat-up dirt road, just endure it because a smooth paved road is just ahead. I think it's the same with the market this year; we will need to endure the beginning to get to the smoother ride up ahead.
