Purdy Eagle Echoes to Sing in NYC

The Purdy school district's Eagle Echo choir has been afforded a great opportunity in an invitation to perform with other schools in New York City's famed Carnegie Hall in an event hosted this mid-June. The National Concert Chorus, hosted yearly, will showcase a variety of schools and their choirs.

Echoes director Christina Harmon says that the school received an invitation, she brought it up in last year's September school board meeting, and received support.

The school district is currently raising money to facilitate the costs for their performance. Through donations and every effort to earn money, the Purdy Eagles in grades 4-6 have surpassed \$57,000 of their \$114,000 goal.

"We are spending all our time raising money and practicing," Harmon said.

"Small schools can do great things, too. It doesn't matter where you come from, or who your parents are, or aren't. Each person has the ability to do incredible things with their lives, so we're trying to do an incredible thing that no would expect students from Purdy to do."

"My husband and I don't have kids, but I love them, and I tell the students frequently that they're my kids."

That's part of the passion and drive behind it. I want to give them the world if I can."

Cassville wastewater improvements update

The City of Cassville will begin construction of wastewater improvements this week with the first excavations near the intersection of 11th and Fair Streets and progressing northwesterly along 11th to Main Street. This portion of the project consists of burying new pipe and manholes.

All excavation will occur within the driving surface of 11th Street. To facilitate construction, block lengths of 11th Street will be closed to through traffic, beginning with the section between Fair and Harold.

Contractors will try to keep access open for local traffic, but there will be times when equipment or materials will block individual driveways. Residents in construction areas should inform someone on the construction crew if they need to come or go as this portion of the project may be very disruptive in the immediate areas of excavations.

Work on the trenchless rehabilitation is also expected to start this week with cleaning and CCTV Inspections of the sewer pipe that will be relined. This work should cause no more than minor disruptions to drivers with short isolated lane closures.

"Between the thin red line and the thin blue line, Lies the thinnest gold line. This gold line represents those who rarely are seen but mostly heard. The calm voice in the dark night; the golden glue that holds it all together. Dispatchers."

MDC reports 117 new cases of CWD

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reports that it sampled and tested more than 33,000 deer for chronic wasting disease (CWD) during the 2022 CWD surveillance year between July 2022 and April 2023. Of the more than 33,000 deer sampled, 117 tested positive for CWD. CWD is a 100% fatal disease in white-tailed deer and other members of the deer family. The disease has been attributed to significant deer population declines in other states. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd. Those 117 deer bring the total number of CWD cases found in the state to 409 since the first case in wild deer was confirmed by MDC in early 2012. Including recent sampling efforts, more than 243,000 tissue samples from wild deer have been collected

for CWD testing in Missouri since MDC began CWD surveillance in 2002. Nearly 19,400 of the 33,000-plus deer tested this past CWD surveillance year were sampled as part of MDC mandatory CWD sampling efforts in select counties during the opening weekend of the November portion of firearms deer season, Nov. 12 and 13. Most of the remaining samples resulted from MDC's voluntary sampling efforts conducted throughout the deer season in partnership with taxidermists and meat processors throughout the state. Of the more than 33,000 samples, about 3,500 were collected during MDC's targeted culling efforts conducted in cooperation with landowners on a voluntary basis after the close of regular deer season in localized areas near

where CWD has been found. Through targeted culling, 41 CWD-positive deer were removed to help slow the spread of CWD. "The goal of targeted culling is to remove CWD-positive deer from the landscape and reduce deer density in these localized areas to slow the spread of the disease and protect Missouri's deer herd," explained MDC Wildlife Health Program Supervisor Deb Hudman. "Targeted culling is a proven method to slow the spread of CWD and Missouri is one of several states that uses it to manage the disease." Of the deer tested, MDC found CWD-positive deer in 23 counties: Adair (3), Barry (1), Barton (9), Carroll (1), Cedar (1), Crawford (2), Dallas (1), Franklin (22), Gasconade (1), Hickory (1), Jefferson (7), Linn (15), Liv-

ington (1), Macon (13), Perry (4), Putnam (3), Ray (1), St. Clair (1), St. Francois (1), Ste. Genevieve (20), Stone (4), Sullivan (3), and Taney (2). Hunters and landowners are critical partners in the fight against CWD and can assist MDC by continuing to deer hunt, by participating in CWD sampling, by following regulations designed to slow CWD spread, and by cooperating with targeted culling efforts. Babysit: If you like kids, babysitting can be a fun way to put money in your pocket. Hourly rates vary by location ranging anywhere from \$10 to \$40 per hour. To find jobs or advertise your services, use sites like as Care.com and Sittercity.com.

Consult: If you have a lot of valuable expertise in a particular area, offer your services as a consultant through a firm or on your own through

freelancer sites like Upwork.com, Fiverr.com, Freelancer.com or Guru.com.

Translator or interpreter: If you're fluent in more than one language you can do part-time interpretation over the phone or translate documents or audio files for \$20 to \$40/hour. Try sites like Translate.com, ProZ.com or Gengo.com to locate translation jobs.

Public events: Sporting events, festivals, concerts and shows need ticket takers, security guards, ushers, concession workers and more. The pay is usually \$10 to \$20/hour. Contact nearby venues to apply.

If you don't find these options appealing, try FlexJobs.com, which lists thousands of flexible work-at-home jobs from more than 5,700 employers. Membership fees start at \$10.

First Quarter Review
Never count the Flying Farmer out. One of my childhood heroes was a dirt track racer from my hometown named Ken Essary, nicknamed, The Flying Farmer. He was famous for his come-from-behind wins. One, he was racing with seven laps to go when some cars wrecked in front of him, and he spun out to avoid it. It made him go to the back of the field of almost 25 cars. When the green flag dropped, he started passing cars in the backfield. Then, to the shock of everyone in the stands who had written him off, he passed the lead car on the final corner of the final lap with just a few feet left to win the race. Never count out the flying farmer. The market had a nice come-from-behind win this last month too.

The stock market's impressive come-from-behind performance in March was dramatic, even with several market disruptions, including a mini-banking crisis. The S&P 500 finished the first quarter up 7.37% and Dow 0.77%, according to JPMorgan.

Patient investors found value in the market as stability returned. Not only did the March rally put the market in positive territory for the first quarter of the year, but it also showed us that investors can look beyond current negative headlines and look ahead.

LPL Financial believes the market might be about to start a new bull market later this year as the Federal Reserve finishes this cycle of rate hikes. The Fed is hinting that it is close to its final interest rate hike, which should help encourage the markets.

Two potential positives that could fuel a new bull market, lower interest rates, and a weaker US dollar, are coming into focus. First, the lower interest rates would

restart the housing market and business growth because more Americans would begin taking out loans. A weaker US dollar would help US companies with heavy export businesses succeed more in the global market.

Not only are market conditions looking better, but we should also remember that it's very rare for markets to have negative returns two years in a row. Of course, we could still see some near-term rough market days, but overall, I think the market will end strong.

The economy could hit its stride after the Fed's rate hiking campaign ends, and for investors to benefit once it does. Much like the March rally, a second-half rally could have us see double-digit stock returns for stocks this year. The S&P's 7% in the first quarter puts us well on our way to a double-digit year.

Overall, the first quarter of 2023 was one of growth and opportunity for the investors who stayed invested and adjusted their portfolios with the ever-changing market conditions. It will be interesting to see how these trends continue throughout the rest of 2023 and what adjustments investors may need to make to navigate them. Hopefully, the market

will finish strong. Literally, my money is on them to win this race.

My hero ended his racing career with over 900 wins and ended up in the National Dirt Late Model Hall of Fame. The Flying Farmer was a dependable winner. I hope the market continues to be too.

Now is the time to apply spring preemergent herbicides

Missouri's unpredictable spring weather makes it tough to decide when to apply preemergent herbicides on lawns, says Manoj Chhetri, University of Missouri Extension horticulturist.

Preemergent herbicides, a form of chemical weed control, prevent germinated weed seedlings from growing. Preemergents must be applied at the right time of year to be effective, says Chhetri.

Preemergent herbicides are applied mainly to control crabgrass. "Hence, some folks call it a crabgrass preventer," he says. "But the reality is that it will stop many grassy and broadleaf weeds."

Germination of weeds depends on soil temperature. Research shows that crabgrass germinates when the mean soil temperature at a depth of 1 inch reaches 60 degrees Fahrenheit or above for several days. The preemergent product is most effective when the mean soil temperature at 1-inch depth reaches 50 to 55 degrees Fahrenheit for five days in a row.

edu/weather indicates that this is the time to put down preemergent in southern and central Missouri. "The optimum window would last until the end of April, but the earlier the better," says Chhetri. "For northern Missouri, the window would extend one to two weeks later."

The split application of the recommended amount at 30-45 days intervals would provide more long-lasting results than a single full dose, he says.

Products containing prodiamine, dithiopyr, pendimethalin and mesotrione effectively control crabgrass. Corn gluten meal derived from organic sources can be an alternative preemergent for organic lawns. Follow label directions for mixing and application.

Two-way granular products (fertilizer plus preemergent) are common, but Chhetri does not recommend them since the timing

for fertilizer and herbicide do not coincide.

Cool-season lawns in Missouri need spring fertilizer in May; early fertilizer would increase the chance of nutrient leaching and runoff, creating environmental pollutants. Slow-release nitrogen-containing fertilizers would remediate the potential pollutant problems, as these are less likely to leach.

"Herbicides are just one of many practices to manage crabgrass and other weeds," says Chhetri. "Growing dense, healthy turf with proper fertilizer, irrigation and proper mowing practices are equally essential to compete against weeds."

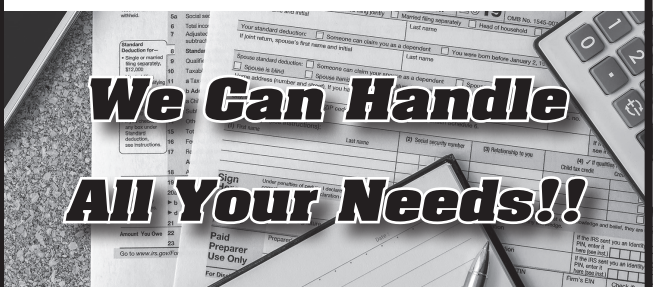

Missouri farm income projected to decline in 2023

Missouri’s net farm income is predicted to fall in 2023 following a record-setting 2022, according to the spring 2023 Missouri Farm Income Outlook report.

The report, released by the Rural and Farm Finance Policy Analysis Center (RaFF) at

the University of Missouri, provides comprehensive insights that can equip industry stakeholders and policy-makers with information to understand the state-level impacts of economic factors, weather and policy initiatives on the agriculture industry. One factor that could explain this projected drop in farm income is the state’s livestock receipts, which were impacted by the country-wide drought that reduced cattle inventories and supported Missouri marketings, which is the physical sale of live animals, said RaFF interim director Scott Brown.

“Our report projects that Missouri net farm income is tapering off from a record high in 2022,” Brown said. “Production expenses remain stubbornly high while cash receipts decline under the as-

sumption of average weather resulting in a squeeze to Missouri producers’ bottom line. Missouri follows the national projection for a downward trend in the near term.”

In the report, a 14% decrease in net farm income is forecasted to occur across the state’s agriculture industry this year, compared to a projected 19% decrease in U.S. net farm income.

The report’s key predictions include:

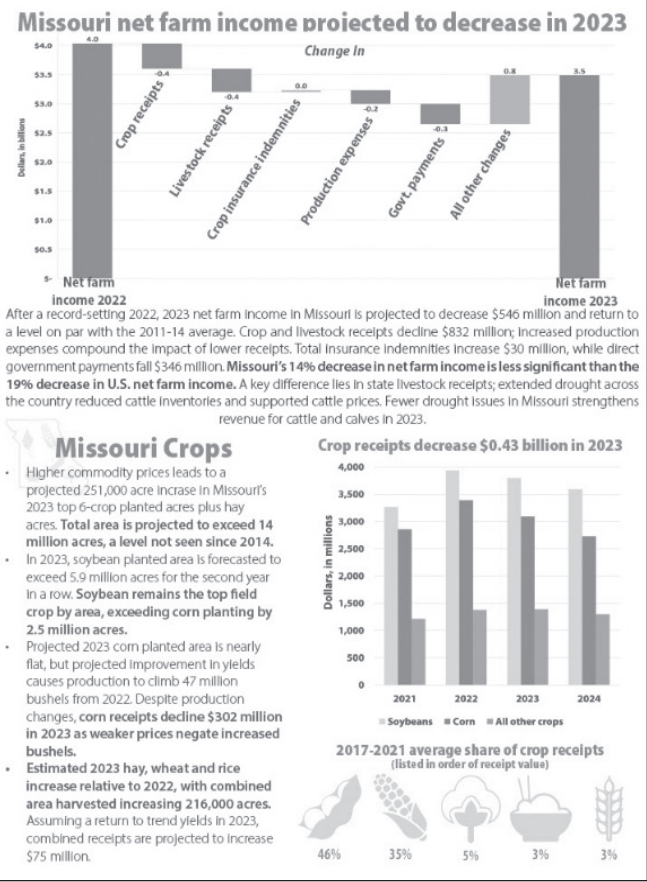
Crop receipts are projected to decrease by \$430 million in 2023. Statewide-planted acres sit at 14 million with soybeans making up nearly 6 million acres. Corn-planted area remains flat while hay-, wheat- and rice-planted acres experience slight increases from 2022 to 2023.

Livestock receipts are expected to decrease by \$400 million in 2023.

Inventories for cattle, hogs and poultry make a rebound from 2022.

Production expenses are forecast to increase by \$230 million in 2023, despite a slight decline in fertilizer, feed and fuel costs.

“RaFF’s state-level insights are critical for decisionmakers,” said Brown, who is also an associate extension professor of markets and policy in the College of Food, Agriculture and Natural Resources. “By understanding how farmers’ and rural communities’ incomes are impacted by various factors, these individuals can be equipped with insights for program and policy discussions.”

MU Extension tips on prevention of black vulture damage

Missouri Quilt Museum opens

Missouri’s growing population of black vultures has led to increasing attacks on vulnerable livestock. Black vultures often inflict damage to the eyes and tongues of young livestock, kill and feed on domestic fowl and scar animals that survive.

A new MU Extension guide provides information for livestock producers to prevent and control problems with black vultures. “Controlling Nuisance Black Vultures in Missouri,” available at extension.missouri.edu/g9466, was developed by MU Extension state wildlife and fisheries specialist Bob Pierce and Travis Guerrant, Wildlife Services state director for Missouri and Iowa at the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA APHIS).

The guide details non-lethal damage control techniques, including the use of effigies, lasers, pyrotechnics or loud noises to scare vultures, and provides livestock management recommendations such as moving cattle with calves nearer to protected areas, Pierce said.

“Black vultures are legally protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918, so a permit to use lethal control methods is required,” he said. The guide outlines the process for obtaining a permit should it be warranted.

USDA APHIS Wildlife Services is charged with responding to conflicts with migratory species, including black vultures, Guerrant said. He advises Missouri livestock producers who suffer damage from black vultures to first contact the Wildlife Services state office in Columbia at 573-449-3033, ext. 10, to discuss the problem and/or schedule a site visit for a customized damage management plan.

If warranted, livestock owners who have experienced depredation from black vultures may obtain a permit to use limited lethal measures through Missouri Farm Bureau.

Turkey vultures are also common in Missouri, but tend to be less aggressive than black vultures, which are known to gang up and prey on calves, piglets, lambs and newborn goats. Both species are native to Missouri.

Vultures do play a critical role in the environment as scavengers of carrion, reducing the risk of diseases spreading from dead animals, Pierce said.

“While black vultures can be found all the way to Canada, I don’t think that is common,” said Guerrant. “Ten years ago, we rarely saw them in Missouri. Now they are in the state nearly year-round in the far south of the state. I think the warmer winters and food availability are contributing to the northward expansion of their range.”

“As with other wildlife species, they will take advantage of resources that are available to them,” Pierce said. “This can cause issues when it involves conflicts with human dwellings and, in some cases, livestock operations.”

The Worlds Tallest Spool of Thread is on the museum grounds and visitors can add their own thread to the spool.

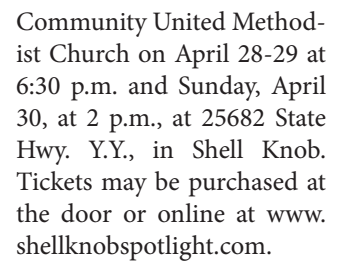
