Friday night pursuit leaves two dead in Monett

According to a probable cause statement issued by Missouri State Highway Patrol Trooper T. Royster, on Friday, June 23, at approximately 10:02 p.m., Royster was dispatched to assist the Lawrence County Sheriff's Office with a vehicle pursuit southbound on Farm Road 1070 near US Hwy. 60. The vehicle pursuit ended at the intersection of State Hwy. 37 and US Hwy 60, in Monett at approximately 10:13 p.m., when a 2006 Chevrolet Silverado 1500, driven by Rafael Contreras-Maldonado, 19, of Monett, ran a red light and struck a 2013 Hyundai Elantra in the intersection, causing the death of two oc-

cupants in the vehicle. Larry Brock, 53, and Lydia Shorey, 61, both of Crane, were pronounced dead at the scene by Barry County Coroner Gary Swearingen just after midnight on June 24 and were taken to Fohn Funeral Home in Cassville.
Contreras-Maldonado was taken into custody and remains in Barry County Jail awaiting a bond hearing set for June 29 at 10 a.m. Maldonado-Contreras has been charged with three felonies, including DWI-Death of two or more, possession of a controlled substance, resisting/interfering with arrest, and two misdemeanors and three other infractions.

Grandma used to say, “Plant every day, and you’ll eat every day.” My grandma lived by faith. She believed that if she did her part, the Lord would do His part. Her part was to plant the seeds. During the Great Depression, those seeds planted and the food they produced made the difference in whether grandma had food to feed her family or not. Grandma often talked of how good a meal of corn on the cob was for supper, and she meant they only ate corn on the cob for supper—or tomato sandwiches. Grandma loved a big ol plate of green beans. They were thankful. They knew the food was a gift from the Lord. They prepared for winter by canning the extra. They did not waste what the Lord so graciously provided. Canning parties were common, where several women got together, prepared the produce together, and shared the outcome. Beans were snapped on the front porch with kids at foot, each learning to snap beans themselves. I grew up snapping beans on the front porch with my grandma. As a kid in the 60s and early 70s, I spent a lot of time with my grandma. She was a major influencer in my life.

So what did grandma plant this time of year? One of the things was green beans. Grandma planted green beans every two weeks from summer until mid-August. She planted bush beans which mature in 55 days. That meant she had fresh beans all summer. During the drought periods, she saved her dishwater and laundry water to water those beans. Green beans were very important to my grandma. Grandma raised bush beans. I remember picking many a bushel with my grandma. She made it fun; we sang songs as we picked. We recited bible verses as we picked. We had contests on who could find the longest bean. We had races to see who could fill their bucket first, taking care not to damage the vines. And then we'd sit on the porch and snap those beans. Grandma sat in a rocking chair, and us kids sat cross-legged on the floor of the porch with a bowl in our laps for the snapped beans. Grandma would tell us stories about when she grew up, stories about her brothers and sisters, my Aunts and Uncles.

After we'd finished snapping the beans, we'd throw the discarded ends to the pigs or chickens because we didn't waste anything. Grandma would cook the beans in a big pot, seasoning with leftover bacon grease. They'd cook slowly for several hours on the back of the stove, making the house smell so good. Back then, there were no such things as "air fresheners." The aromas of home-cooked foods were our "air fresheners." To this day, when I smell home-baked bread baking or green beans simmering, I think of my grandma. My grandma knew how to cook! I think in our fast-paced world, we miss out on a lot of those "old-fashioned" joys. It's time to bring some of those joys back into our homes. I encourage you to plant a row of bush green beans and start your own tradition.

Cute critters by day, gardeners' worst enemies by night.

Most gardeners know the frustration of having a beautiful garden decimated by wildlife, said University of Missouri Extension horticulturist David Trinklein.

"Our four-legged 'friends' can be more formidable garden foes than insects, diseases and weeds," said Trinklein. "Because of their size and our inability to control their numbers in urban and suburban areas, deer probably are the most formidable offenders."

Deer and other critters like food that is tasty and convenient, he said. A garden is wildlife's equivalent of a fast food drive-thru. Gardens are especially enticing to wildlife when they cannot find food in their native habitats, such as during drought.

Avoid animal pests by putting barriers in their way, Trinklein said. Pungent smells and unpleasant tastes may dissuade wildlife such as deer.

Some gardeners choose chemical repellents with repugnant odors. Spray these around the edge of the garden. Keep in mind human and pet safety, plant toxicity and expense when considering these options, he said.

There are numerous homespun remedies for repelling wildlife. One of the easiest is a mixture of 20% whole eggs and 80% water. Reapply monthly. Some commercial repellents contain capsaicin, the chemical that gives the fire to hot peppers. Other homespun remedies include sachets containing dog hair and highly perfumed soap.

Objects such as scare-

crows, foil, aluminum pie plates, predatory bird figures and mirrors can help deter deer, raccoons, rabbits and other pests. These are most effective when moved frequently, said Trinklein. Animals become accustomed to them if they're left in the same place.

More drastic methods include fences, netting and small cages over individual plants such as tomatoes. These can be effective but expensive, he said. Using 36-inch-high chicken wire buried 6 inches in the ground can exclude smaller wildlife such as rabbits and squirrels. For deer, fences must be 8 or more feet high to be effective.

Electric fences also are an

Gardening has many rewards, says David Trinklein, state horticulture specialist for University of Missouri Extension. "One of them is the satisfaction of sharing your plant knowledge with others."

The MU Extension Master Gardener program is designed to do just that, Trinklein said. "Its motto, 'helping others learn to grow,' emphasizes service to others as the program's main objective."

A new session of online Master Gardener training begins Aug. 14.

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds deer hunters to apply online during July for a shot at more than 100 managed deer hunts throughout the

option. Deter small species with two strands of electric fencing 2 and 4 inches above the ground. Larger animals require taller fences. Trinklein recommends clearly labeling all electric fencing to avoid accidental contact by humans.

Plant selection is another way to deter wildlife. Common garden flowers considered to be deer-resistant include ageratum, geranium, marigold, morning glory, nasturtium, salvia, snapdragon, Shasta daisy, canna, liatris, petunia, phlox, verbena, vinca and yarrow. tension horticulture specialist Sarah Denkler teach the 14 online sessions. “These classes represent a viable option for people who can’t take the weekly classes in person,” Trinklein said.

Classes are delivered through the Canvas learning management system as a series of scripted and narrated video presentations. Students work at their own pace. A composite score of 70% on chapter quizzes is needed to pass the course.

Topics include basic botany, soils and plant nutrition, vegetable gardening, fruit production, landscape

design, woody ornamental plants, herbaceous ornamental plants, turf management, insect and disease management and pesticide safety.

Core training is the first step toward certification as an MU Extension Master Gardener. Trainees must also complete at least 30 hours of volunteer service, Trinklein said. Local Master Gardener coordinators can help online trainees find volunteer opportunities to meet the service hour requirements.

The deadline to register for the fall session is Aug. 13. For more information, visit mg.missouri.edu.

state for archery, muzzle-loading, and modern firearms from mid-September through mid-January at conservation areas, state and other parks, national wildlife refuges, and other public areas. Some managed hunts are held specifically for youth or for people with disabilities. Hunters are selected by a weighted random drawing.

Draw results will be available Aug. 15 through Jan. 15. Applicants who are drawn will receive area maps and other hunt information by

mail.

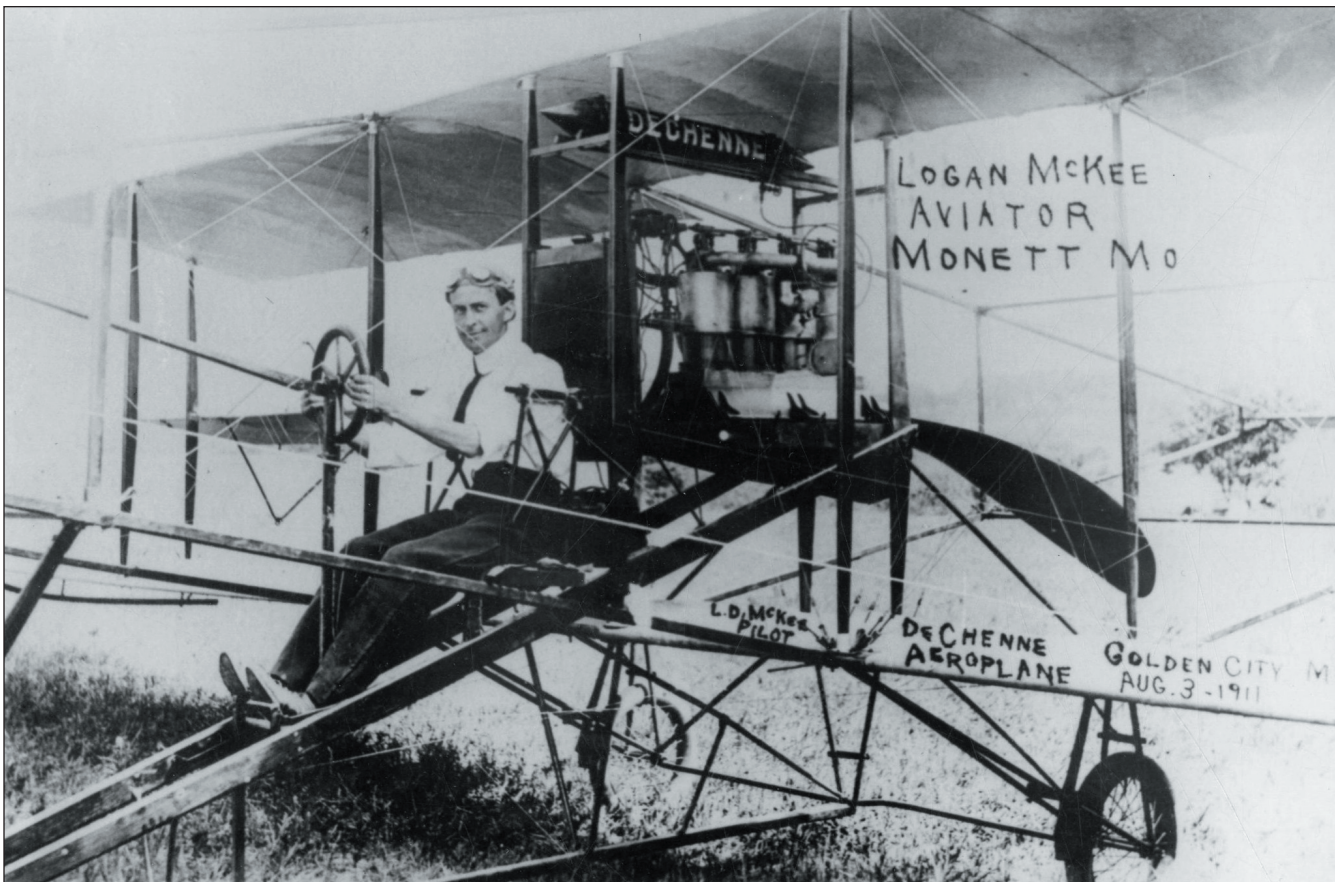

How to Locate Interesting Volunteer Opportunities in Your Area

 Can you recommend some good organizations or websites for locating interesting volunteer opportunities? I've been doing some volunteer work since I retired last year, but most of the jobs I've tried haven't been very fun or satisfying.

 For many retirees, finding a volunteer opportunity that meets your interests, utilizes your talents and fits your availability can be challenging. To help you find some interesting and satisfying volunteer opportunities, here are some tips and online tools that can help you search.

Volunteering is a great way for retirees to make a positive contribution to their community and stay actively engaged, not to mention it's good for your health too. But how can you find the right opportunity for you? Start by asking yourself some basic questions like: What types of organizations or activities are you interested in? What kind of skills can you offer a volunteer organization? How much time are you willing to give? What do you want to gain from your experience (for example, meet new people, learn new skills, help those in need, exposure to a particular issue)?

Once you get a general idea of what you'd like to do, there are dozens of volunteer websites that can help you search for different opportu-

nities in your area and virtually.

Most sites work like search engines that let you choose an area of interest and type in your ZIP code or city and state. The sites will then give you a list of opportunities that you can check into. Depending on your interest and expertise, here are some top websites to help you get started.

To find a wide variety of volunteer opportunities in your community that serve causes like children, animals, seniors, education, health, the arts and more check out sites like VolunteerMatch.org, Engage.PointsofLight.org, IdeaList.org and United-Way.org.

If you're interested in opportunities targeting older adults and retirees, some good options include AARP's CreateTheGood.org, along with AmeriCorps Seniors (AmeriCorps.gov/serve/ameriacorps-seniors), which matches retirees with community projects and organizations that need experienced volunteer help.

AmeriCorps Seniors offers three different programs: RSVP, which has a variety of volunteer activities with flexible time commitments; the Senior Companion Program that brings together volunteers with homebound seniors who have difficulty with day-to-day living tasks;

Apartment Surge
 "I forgot to mention it's on the third floor." My sister conned me into helping her move into an apartment several years ago and didn't tell me we'd have to carry her oversized couch up three flights of stairs. I smashed my hand carrying it but eventually got my revenge. She later moved out and bought a house, but today's young people prefer staying in apartments.

Several reports in the last few days show improvement in the housing market. But, the most interesting report was the one that pointed to young people preferring apartments and condos to houses. This might suggest a cultural change among Americans.

The US Census Bureau reported that more multi-family (apartment/condo) units are being constructed now than single-family houses for the first time since the early 1970s. In the last year, multi-family (apartment/condo) construction starts increased by about 25%.

In comparison, construction starts for single-family houses decreased by about 25%. Young families aren't moving out of their apartments, so more apartments are needed.

Demand for apartments and condos from younger generations is strong and should continue to support construction spending in the coming months. The housing market is a solid part of our

economy.
 According to the US Bureau of Economic Analysis, Americans' spending on housing represents almost a fifth of our total US economy. My main point is that the millennial demand for apartments and condos will continue to give the economy a needed shot in the arm through construction activity in the coming months.
 This helps investors in two ways. One, with more apartments coming online, it should drive down rent prices by the end of the year, which will help inflation numbers. Secondly, as rent prices start going down, it could give the Federal Reserve a good reason to continue pausing or lowering rates.
 Housing expenses are a significant shelter factor in calculating inflation. When rent prices start falling, it will be harder for the Fed to justify keeping interest rates so high.
 A few years ago, I tried to get revenge on my sister. The coroner position in the town we both lived in was being voted on, and there was an option for a write-in candidate. I wrote in my sister's name and started a social media campaign to get her elected. She lost the election, but it was close enough to scare her a good scare. May-

be next time, she will have someone else move her.

Cassville Public Works waste water rehabilitation closures

This week, wastewater construction work will continue in two locations: County Farm Road/West 10th Street (Farm Road 2172) and the 16000 Block of Farm Road 1120. Sewer construction work East 10th and 8th Streets was suspended temporarily as a manhole the engineers designed for installation was not suitable and the contractor had to order a new one. We expect that work to resume in 5-10 days and take a day or two to finish up.

At County Farm Road and West 10th Street: This portion of the project started out with a complicated tie in to the existing sewer and an encased creek crossing. The new alignment parallels 10th Street and construction will impact a number of commercial driveways. Individual driveways will be inaccessible for short periods of time but there is enough connectivity between parking lots/buildings to ensure that each building will always be accessible. Work in this area is expected to last ten days to two weeks and may be halted briefly to allow this crew to finish up work between East 10th and 8th Streets.

A second crew continues working in the 16000 Block of Farm Road 1120 near the Wastewater Treatment Plant. They spent last week clearing vegetation along the project alignment and should start excavating/installing manholes/pipe this week. This section of the project replacement requires the use of a bypass pump and above ground piping to keep sewerage flowing to the treatment plant.

The following traffic restrictions should be anticipated through the week:

- Intermittent lane closures or restrictions in the 700 Block of West 10th Street.
- Road closure to through traffic in the 16000 Block of Farm Road 1120.
- Through traffic is advised to heed the “road closed ahead” signs and find an alternate route around the construction site.

Local traffic will be able to access property, however, the direction needed to arrive or depart may change over time depending on the location of the construction activity.

The contractor will try to keep access open for local traffic but there will likely be times when equipment or materials will block individual driveways. If residents need to come or go, they can simply inform someone on the construction crew, a city staff member or the project inspector and they will get you in or out as soon as possible. This portion of the project may be very disruptive in the immediate area of the excavations. If anyone has questions or concerns issues, please let us know.

Pipe cleaning and inspections for the trenchless rehabilitation has been completed. There is no timeline yet for the installation of the cured in place pipe or manhole relining.

Notice of Potential Violation of Livestock Market Regulations



Livestock producers who recently sold animals at Schubert Livestock Sales, LLC and have not received payment from the sale should file a claim with the United States Department of Agriculture.

There is concern that Schubert Livestock Sales, LLC, in Sarcoxie, has not fulfilled the obligation to pay producers selling livestock at their auction facility.

Any person damaged by failure of a livestock buyer (referred to as the Principal) to pay for livestock purchased in a transaction subject to jurisdiction under the Packers and Stockyards Act has the right to submit a claim against the financial instrument of the Principal.

Producers not paid for livestock have 60 days from the sale date to file a claim against the bond. This includes non-sufficient funds (NSF) checks.


The claim form is available online, as are submission instructions. Contact the Missouri Department of Agriculture Animal Health Division with any questions at (573) 751- 3377.

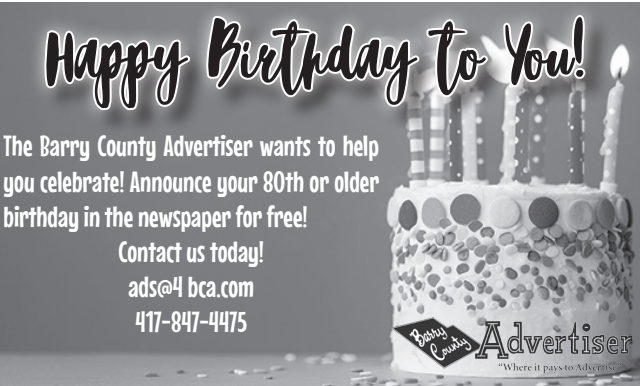
Mid South Writers Announces Fiction Contest

Find a Shady Spot – Avoid harsh sunlight when possible...stay under an umbrella, tree or

other shady shelter.

Beware of Heat Related Illnesses

Heat-related illnesses occur when the body is overheated and cannot properly cool itself and can be life threatening. They can be life threatening and can also cause damage to the brain and other vital organs.

Many people are eager for Independence Day celebrations in early summer. There is much to be excited about, as festivities often begin in the afternoon with barbecues and pool parties, and commence late at night after fireworks shows that light up the night sky.

Still, not everyone enjoys the extra noise and busy nature of July 4th parties, particularly furry members of the family.

Animal control services often report an increase in lost animals between July 4th and July 6th. That's because the excitement of the holiday puts pets out of their comfort zones.

While pet owners need not cancel their July 4th

plans, they should take heed of the many ways to keep their pets safe during the festivities.

Update identification

Be sure prior to any July 4th events that pets are wearing collars with current identification information. If an address or phone number has changed since the last time you updated microchip records, be sure to check the account is current.

Be careful with alcoholic drinks

Party hosts typically serve beer, wine and cocktails. Alcoholic beverages have the potential to poison pets, says the ASPCA. Animals can become very intoxicated, severely depressed or go into comas if they drink alcohol.

Keep spirited drinks well out of reach.

Check with the vet

Many pets are prone to anxiety from loud noises, such as thunderstorms and fireworks, and lots of commotion — something that occurs in spades come July 4th. Some veterinarians recommend a small course of anti-anxiety medication or a sedative to help pets cope with the stimuli.

Create a quiet space

Allow pets to ride out the day in their comfortable, quiet and cozy retreats. If necessary, create a space in an interior room. Cover the pet crate with a blanket and offer favorite toys or bedding to create a soothing environment.

Pick up debris

Firework debris can rain down on properties even if you were not shooting off the fireworks. Curious pets may pick it up or eat it, which runs the risk of an upset stomach or even an intestinal blockage. Check your yard before letting pets out to play.

Keep an eye on the grill

Pets can be opportunists, and those burgers and chicken drumsticks smell delicious to pets. Pets that get too close to the grill can become injured. And if pets eat leftovers, they may end up with digestive distress or even be poisoned by foods that are toxic to cats and dogs.

Use caution with fireworks; drought conditions increase fire risks as July Fourth approaches

As drought conditions worsen in Missouri, the Division of Fire Safety is urging Missourians to put fireworks safety first as they prepare for Independence Day celebrations. Over the last three months, the percentage of Missouri considered abnormally dry or in some state

of drought has grown from 7.5% to 93.3%, according to the U.S. Drought Monitor released June 22.

"Public fireworks displays offer the best sights and are the safest, and this year the fire risk posed by fireworks has increased because of drought conditions in much of Missouri," State Fire Marshal Tim Bean said. "The risk that sparks from fireworks

could lead to grass and natural cover fires is elevated this year. These fires can spread rapidly and pose risks to structures as well. We urge everyone to consider local conditions and use extreme caution if they choose to use consumer fireworks."

Across the nation, July 4th is not only the busiest day of the year for fireworks, it's the busiest day of the year

for fires. About 40 percent of Independence Day structure fires are the result of fireworks, according to the National Fire Protection Association. Across the U.S. in 2018, fireworks started an estimated 19,500 fires, including 1,900 structure fires, 500 vehicle fires and 17,100 outside and other types of fires. These fires caused five deaths and \$105 million in direct property damage, according to NFPA. About 250 people go to emergency rooms each day with fireworks-related injuries in the 30 days around July 4th.

Sparklers are a good example of how people underestimate the danger of fireworks. Sparklers burn at about 2,000 degrees — hot enough to melt some metals. They can quickly ignite clothing and leave young children with severe burns. According to the NFPA, sparklers account for more than 25 percent of emergency room visits for fireworks injuries.
