What began as an exploration into the mysteries of the Roaring River Spring at Roaring River State Park in May of 2021 ended in tragedy a year ago this past weekend, with the death of KISS Rebreathers Exploration Diver Eric Hahn at the spring cave site.

Family, friends, community members, and the KISS Dive Team gathered at the Emory Melton Inn and Conference Center on Saturday alongside Missouri State Parks representatives to memorialize Hahn and recognize the team for their achievements of mapping the Spring and producing underwater foot- Dive Team included Hahn, KISS Re-

age of the exploration dives, which gave the Spring the title of the deepest cave spring in the nation at 472 feet. (Brett Hemphill with the KUR Dive Team recently broke that record at the Phantom Springs Cave in West Texas at 570 feet, tragically losing his life a few weeks ago.) The dive team reached the record depth at Roaring River in November of 2021, but all exploration of the Spring was halted after Hahn's death in October 2022, with no bottom found, so it is still a mystery how deep the Spring is.



MU field day for sheep and goat producers set for Nov. 17, Mount Vernon

University of Missouri Extension's Small Ruminant Field Day or sheep and goat producers is noon-4 p.m. Friday, Nov. 17, at the MU Southwest Research, Extension and Education Center in Mount Vernon.

Extension sheep and goat specialists from Lincoln University in Jefferson City will join MU Extension specialists to talk about managing parasites, pastures and profitability of small-ruminant herds, said David Brown, MU Extension small-ruminant specialist.

"Small Ruminant Field Day provides an opportunity for sheep and goats producers across the state to learn current and relevant information that leads to successful farming operations," Brown said. "Pasture management and economic losses from poor-performing animals will be discussed. New and https://extension.

From MU Extension established producers and anyone interested in diversification with small ruminants should attend."

Topics include:

• Forage and pasture management for sheep and goats.

• Integrated parasite management control.

• Economic impact of low-performing animals.

• FAMACHA system and Five Point Check demonstration.

Exeter receives Clean Water Engineering Report Grant

Exeter is one of two Missouri cities awarded a \$50,000 Clean Water Engineering Report Grant from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MoDNR) to evaluate the city's wastewater system.

The grant offers funding to qualified communities to help cover the engineering costs for evaluating wastewater system improvements needed to meet permit requirements, reduce stormwater infiltration into sewer collection pipes, and continue reliable service to the community.

According to MoDNR, Exeter's improvement plan should be complete in March 2025.

"Infrastructures such as wastewater systems are crucial to every community," said Dru Buntin, Missouri Department of Natural Resources director. "Through this grant, we can help communities like Exeter identify the changes needed to maintain and improve their wastewater systems. In turn, this will help protect public and environmental health and help improve the quality of life for Missourians."

Investing in Turbulent Times: Israel's 9/11

"They aren't training; those jets are armed." Several years ago, four low-flying jets came out of nowhere while I was climbing a hill in southern Israel. I assumed they were training, but my Israeli friends told me that because Israel is surrounded by enemies, its military is always on high alert.

implications that need addressing. Stocks fell early in the morning the first

day the market was open after the attacks but shook off the fears and rebounded later in the day for a daily gain. The most affected were Crude oil prices, defense contractors, and gold. Oil went up 4% initially but fell later; however, the stocks of defense contractors are I am praying for those 5-10% more than before the attack. Gold, a popular investment in times of world conflict, rose only by 1%. Interestingly, oil and gold are lower now than a month ago, which shows the limited impact of the conflict so far.

> Most of the stock market hasn't been affected by the attack on Israel, but that could change if the Israel-Hamas war grows into a larger multinational war. Something like this could strain oil flow out of the Middle East, which provides a third of the world's oil supply.

The worst-case scenario would be if Iran were to get more directly involved and declare war on Israel. This the world's oil supply is shipped, narrows to only 21 miles wide at the Strait of Hormuz on the shores of Iran. I would adjust my portfolios to add more oil stocks, defense stocks, and Treasurys if there were an actual Iran-Israel war.

Historically, attacks on Israel haven't moved the stock market much, and any initial market reactions are often reversed in a few days. Except for the 1973-74 Yom Kippur War, which led to the oil embargo, the Iran-Iraq war in 1979, and Iraq's invasion of Kuwait in 1990.

Though barbaric, this latest attack on Israel isn't likely to cause harm to long-term investors. An investment portfolio's long-term performance depends more on economics than geopolitical conflicts. Investing in times like these must be done strategically and without emotion. Don't get caught up in the emotions of the headlines. Instead, stick to your financial plan and stay focused on your goals.

count of the day Hahn lost his life and how it has affected her over the last year.

Linda and Gordon Hahn, parents of Eric, spoke about his life and his natural need to explore from a young age, his genuine personality, giving spirit, and the legacy he will leave behind.

The first public viewing of the short documentary filmed by the dive team, Abyssal: The Exploration of Roaring River Spring, was shown. The documentary will be used at the nature center within the park.

In 2022, Texas A&M marine biologist Dr. Fernando Calderon Gutierrez joined the team to study the biology of the cave fauna, more specifically, the DNA and species of isopods and amphipods, and how weather affects the minute creatures that inhabit the Spring. Samples were taken by Gutierrez back to the Texas university for study, and he gave an overview of his findings at the event in Hahn's memory.

Justin Adams, representative for the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Ozarks Region, discussed DNR's plan to display the new mapping of the cave at the nature center and at the spring cave location and the installation of a bench in Hahn's memory near the Spring at the Deer Leap trailhead.

To further expand Hahn's legacy and his love for all things outdoors, the Eric Hahn Scholarship for Roaring River Outdoor Education has been set up. Donations can be made at www.cfozarks.org/donate. Type "Hahn" in the "other funds" search box. The Scholarship funds will cover the cost of one family each year to attend the annual Bass Pro Shop's Wonders of Wildlife (WOW) School held at Roaring River State Park.




