The Missouri Department of Conservation and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources held the annual Kids Fishing Day at Roaring River State Park on Saturday, August 19.

This year's event saw 562 young anglers fighting for the top catch, with the 2023 top spot going to Jesus Aldaba and his 6.25-pound rainbow. This year's largest catch was well over three pounds shy of last year's, which weighed 9.92 pounds. Hanna Smith placed second with her 6-pound rainbow, and Trey and Tryston Holt tied for third this year with their 5.25-pound rainbows.

Several volunteers and representatives from local businesses and agencies gathered under the big tent and the surrounding area to support young anglers with free bait, crafts, and conservation classes. After attending three classes, children were entered into a drawing held later in the day.

According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report investigated by Msgt. J.E. Givens, assisted by Cpl. T.L. Coffey, at approximately 1:30 p.m. on August 19, David Ocain, 56, of Golden, was traveling northbound in a 2002 GMC Sierra on Route J in Golden when the vehicle traveled off the right side of the roadway, over corrected and returned to the road, then traveled off the left side of the roadway and struck a tree, ejecting Ocain. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Barry County Coroner Gary Swearingen at 2:45 p.m. and was transported to Fohn Funeral Home. He was not wearing a safety device. The vehicle was totaled and towed by Schraders Wrecker of Shell Knob.

Water is still cloudy, and the CFS is 57. It should continue to clear in a week or so and be in great dry fly shape again.

Kids' Day went great this year. There were lots of happy kids, and the Conservation Department put out lots of nice big fish.

Kudos to Brad and his crew at the hatchery. As usual, they did a great job.

Friday's dry fly fishing was decent, and Saturday's was quite a bit better. The trout are still taking beetles, ants, and hoppers. Crackle backs did very well for a few Saturdays, and I had a few people were catching trout on caddis and bluewing olives in the afternoon.

Mop flies, mega worms, san juan worms, thread jigs, and glo balls did very well, as they do when the water is offcolored. But pheasant tails, copper johns, and burlaps did very well fished under an indicator. We mostly use 6X on the nymphs, and 7X is still best for the small dries. I try 6X when throwing the bigger hoppers and beetles. 9' leaders are still best for both. Marabou jigs were great this week. We had to go a bit heavier on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, but we were back to micros and little Ozark jigs by Friday. Black/ yellow, white, olive, and tan were all good colors. Pink and white caught a few also on Saturday. Plastic baits are still the easiest way to catch a mess of trout. The pink, white, and yellow worms were good all week. The yellow and pink 1" crawlers did great all week, and the white, orange and the pink eggs did very well all week.
