MOAG awards local agencies with Community Partner Award

Missouri Attorney General (MOAG) Andrew Bailey recently award eight law enforcement agencies and two medical facilities in Barry County a Community Partner Award.

The Barry County Sheriff's Office, Butterfield Police Department, Cassville Police Department, Cox Monett Hospital, Mercy Hospital in Cassville, Monett Police Department, Purdy Police Department, Seligman Police Department, Washburn Police Department and Wheaton Police Department received the award for their help with the Attorney General's SAFE Kits Initiative, which assists with clearing untested sexual assault evidence backlogs.

"We want to recognize our partners who have assisted in clearing the backlog of untested sexual assault kits throughout the state. These recipients and their efforts are vital to achieving justice for every victim of an unspeakable crime," said Attorney General Bailey. "We would not have made it this far without them."

The Sexual Assault Forensic Examination (SAFE) Program covers the cost of gathering, collecting and preserving evidence during the forensic examination for victims of sexual crimes that occurred in Missouri. As of January of 2022, the MOAG SAFE Kits Initiative had collected an inventory of 7,020 previously unsubmitted sexual assault kits.

A Stone County woman is turning her personal fight against breast cancer into inspiration to help others.

Nicole Turner, a mother of six and breast cancer survivor, from Stone County, hosted a 5K walk/run last weekend to help raise money for the community and to raise awareness about the toll breast cancer has not only on the individual but the families of breast cancer patients.

The Inaugural Boo for Cancer 5K Walk/Run took place on Sunday, Oct. 22, at the Reeds Spring High School parking lot, located at 20277 State Highway 413 in Reeds Spring. the Stone County Christmas programs and a new scholarship fund for area students.

Turner was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2021 and said during her fight she felt the warmth and encouragement of the community for her and her family.

"I was diagnosed with breast cancer in the fall of 2021. I battled with it, did chemo and then got the all clear," Turner said. "I was only three months

in the clear before I got slapped with the diagnosis again. I did a total of 18 months of chemo. That's financially hard. It was emotionally hard. My out of pocket cost was between five to \$8,000 depending on if I needed medications to offset the chemo for nausea and dizziness. During this, our community, Reeds Spring, really, really rallied around me. People were

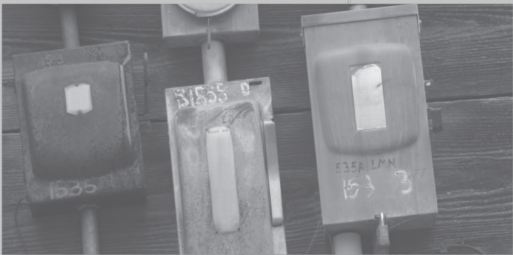

Changes coming to CDL Testing

From Missouri Dept. of Revenue

The Missouri State Highway Patrol and Missouri Department of Revenue wish to inform potential future Commercial Driver License (CDL) applicants of an upcoming change in CDL testing procedure. The new modernized testing standard being adopted by Missouri will begin on December 4, 2023, and will be utilized by all CDL examiners in the state, including at all Patrol examination sites and all third-party examination sites.

The changes in testing procedure include a more streamlined pre-trip examination and more efficient basic skills course.

Current testing procedures will remain in effect statewide until December 1.

It is important to note, per federal guidelines, applicants must pass the pre-trip and basic skills using the

same testing model, meaning if an applicant passes the old model pre-trip, they must pass the old model basic skills test to be eligible for the road test. We encourage training schools and applicants to consider this when making plans for testing.

Jumping Hurdles: Stocks & War
"She stopped in front of the hurdle." My cute wife had a good high school track career, but hurdles were not her event. Her friend jumped like a gazelle, but the one time my wife tried hurdles, she slid to a stop, too scared to jump. Right now, stocks are jumping over two major hurdles. With the S&P 500 up just over 4% as of October 17, stocks are having an October to remember on the heels of a September to forget. Savvy investors saw the September market lows as a buying opportunity and raced in to buy the dip. But of course, there are those two lurking hurdles: interest rates staying higher for longer than expected and the Israel-Hamas war. First, the market may have to live with higher interest rates for much

longer than anticipated. It seems there won't be any significant rate cuts until the middle of 2024. However, there are reasons for optimism. The Federal Reserve chairman said on October 19 that they are probably finished raising rates, which isn't as great as a rate cut but is still good news. The second and most interesting storyline is the current Israel-Hamas war. Following the hospital bombing in Gaza, oil prices have moved higher, but only slightly. Though this war has the potential to escalate and upset global markets, the stock market has coughed it up to the Middle East being the Middle East. The stock recovery doesn't come without risks and some timely maneuvering because of the monetary policy uncertainty and escalating tensions

in the Middle East. I have pulled back on some on international stocks in the accounts I manage from a slight overweight to a more neutral stance while increasing my large-cap value holdings. I do this mostly because of weakening European economies, better-than-expected economic growth in the US, and a strengthening of the US dollar. With an expectation of solid earnings reports this quarter, oil prices remaining in check, and interest rates at least holding, we could have some upside opportunities in the remaining months of this year. After all these years, my wife continues to be faster than me but is still a timid jumper. Right now, stocks are doing well jumping the hurdles, maybe not like a gazelle, but good enough for a solid month. Let's hope they

bringing groceries to the house and my kids were adopted for Christmas and my bills are being paid without me knowing. I would go to pay and I would get there to find out they had already been paid. Someone paid for an entire month of treatments for me. I still don't know who that is. My family made it because, when they say it takes a village, it really takes a village to get through something like that."

Turner said some of the worst times during the 18 month fight were moments she felt she didn't have the strength to take care of the needs of her children.

"I had multiple breakdowns, but I had my husband who I could lean on. I had people that I could call and they'd be at my

house at three o'clock in the morning. You know, helping clean me up. Talking me off my mom ledge because at one point my son's birthday was coming up and I was like, I don't know how I'm gonna do it," Turner said. "Then on his birthday the cake was here. The party was planned and paid for and I didn't have to do anything. I didn't know anything. Gifts were bought and signed that they were from me and my husband. The school readiness fair, some of the proceeds from the 5k are gonna go to the school readiness fair, got my kids back to school stuff. My kids were adopted through the Christmas program and they got gifts from the community. So I want to give back now."

Turner rang the bell to signify the end of

her treatment at the end of March 2023. She said now she has a passion to help those who helped her and also to make sure no one feels alone when they are battling cancer in her community. She has already begun the process to start her own non-profit.

"I already have the name approved and am working on the paperwork to start The Turner Family Cancer and Community Foundation," Turner said. "Our mission will be to give back to the community. Let's say there's someone in the community that is battling cancer, or, you know, their kid is sick and they just need something, they can easily just call me and I'm gonna have this foundation set up and it's just like, Hey, maybe I could give \$200 to help the electric bill or

I could go grab some groceries for them. So I want this to just build and build and build. So no one in the community has to fight their battles alone."


Having a sense of reassurance and support is what Turner hopes to be able to pay forward to those around her.

"The one thing I felt was like I needed constant reassurance. I had never felt more alone. You feel alone," Turner said. No one knows what you're going through. So to have the constant support, the constant text messages, the constant phone calls, the constant communications, those things really meant a lot to me. Even if it was just, 'Hey Nikki, I just wanted you to know you were in my heart and I'm praying for you.' Those little things are what got me

through what I went through. My husband used to say a phrase and it drove me insane. But it was so true. It was, 'How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time.' I don't think the community realizes as someone who is going through that it's hard to think just one day, just one day, at a time. At the end you're

like, am I even gonna make it out of this. So just have that constant love and support and just telling someone you're there for them can go so far."

Water is 15.5 CFS and low and clear; 2 lb is recommended, as 4 lb is too heavy. You can still use a 4 lb line, like a rooster tail spinner, for the first 30 or 40 minutes in the morning.

Dry fly fishing is still very good. There are good amounts of caddis every day, blue-wing olives every afternoon, and beetles and ants are still pretty good. Pheasant tails, copper johns, and tan or gray scuds are doing well. Crack-le backs, black woolly buggers, and olive woolly buggers are all working right now. San Juan worms, cham-ois worms, and mop flies are all pretty good right now.

Marabou jigs have been catching lots of trout; olive green, black/yellow, white, tan, and brown have all been good. Plastic baits are still working well. The 1" grubs have been good all week, and white and cheese yellow worms and white plastic eggs have been good all week.

Good luck with another nice week ahead for the last few days of the season.
